And then we walked America, Stonehenge and I love Dennis I've been able to interview him a bunch of times. And we we actually did a short documentary. Michael Michael did 99% of the work. But in it, it's pretty exciting. Because the mereka Stonehenge documentary that he put out, it was really us both there at the site. But he packed this thing up, but he actually found something that not even Dennis had noticed on America's Stonehenge site. And anyway, anyway, if you go to dark our paranormal, it's on the on their YouTube page, too. But what was really interesting as the site is it spans acres. It is pretty spectacular. Like you said, there are at least evidences to show that it's over 1000 or 9000 years old.

And, you know, like we said, with, with Dennis on the show, even whenever you go back to the earliest recorded, run across of it, of the local population, when they found it, and put it into the local record, it was like, What's this thing that we ran across? We asked the local Indians and they're like, I don't know, it's been there for years. Like, what's the Indians didn't even have lore about it? No, no. So it's obviously not something that they took the effort to build otherwise they, I mean, they got a pretty good social memory, you know? They do. They do. So yeah, it's just one of those like, it is an utter astounding mystery to get into.

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It is and even when you're there at the site, I asked Dennis something that I thought was very curious. The indigenous in the area for years had been burning out the valley, there were no trees for miles, because they wanted grasslands for the grazing animals that they had. So they practiced controlled burns, and they would make sure that that entire valley that you come up

into that's wooded now, in fact, when we did our lecture when I did my lecture, Dennis was completing 18 acres of tree removal, because the trees were destroying the site. And as we were looking at, like you set up on the very peak of the site when you're when you're looking off across to the other Valley side, which is almost 20 miles away, and you're looking and I looked at Dennis and I just said, Dennis, are there corresponding megalithic mounds on the other sides of the valley? And he goes, boy, you are bright. And I'm like, I'm going to repeat that story. So I could say that I'm right. But if he said yes, there are Dolman like America hinge. Like just like on a Lord of the Rings where they're like the the beacons on every mountaintop that they could see. Apparently a bunch of these equinoxes, solstices, these key points on that hill, they do correspond to other ruins across this valley by miles away, which would have been easy to see because there was no trees.

Yeah. So many people aren't, you know, this whole thing, by the way started with me and Gary from everything imaginable. Somebody had said something and I was in the middle of planning my South American research trip. And I'm a climber. I have a group of climbers I, you know, I'm not the best climber but I'm a solid climber and I'm with a group that has the skill set and has all the equipment for us to descend or ascend the what should be the Kincaid caves from the rim. It's about 1500 feet down based on distance. Objection, or it's about 2000 feet up from the floor. So at this point, the Grand Canyon is 3480 feet in height. And it's in a very specific place, right near the clogau and rapids. And so it just got really lit because I'm like, Look, there's all these people doing adventures around the world. And they're just, yeah, you know, you're climbing a tall mountain. That's great. But there is the entire northwest area of territory of Canada, most of Antarctica, and quite a bit. Now here's one for you. The Grand Canyon has toured 70 plus miles of tunnels of caves, sorry caves. Of those, only 150 Miles has been explored. And the professor who actually runs Carlsbad made a point to say in an interview about two weeks before we went out here for the week that we were there and said that there are more caves in the Grand Canyon than Carlsbad. Idea. There's 120 Miles 18 feet wide. The canyon is sorry, 80 miles wide, the canyon can be up to 25 miles give or take. It's it's massive and whip. And it's 6000 feet deep. And there's 120 miles of on explored charted caves. And to give you an idea of one of the caves, one of the 150 miles of caves that they have gone into, was found to have over 40 miles of cave in it. Wow. And that's one cave. Out of the period of the 150 miles they have explored so the Kincade cave. I'm like, Look, I have a whole group. We have all the gear. I am over people talking about a cave that's supposed to. Like Kincaid comes back. No Kincaid officially was actually retained. To do. He actually had worked. What's very interesting is that he worked for someone who worked for the Smithsonian. But Kincaid was a photographer that had learned to do nature photography, and what has somebody who had it? Well, anyway, the point is he possibly locates the opening. By the way, there is stained in the articles, there's two articles for him, and you have them up. And in short, the articles describe that he saw a discolored cave wall. Well, the canyon wall is layers and layers and layers of hardened sand. And the canyon is different colors everywhere, everywhere. So okay, maybe he saw a different color. And, and we're not talking just advanced hiking, and he has he could have had stakes and ropes and made his way safely up there. But to ascend to 1000 feet, and to do that is an accomplishment because this wasn't a yes to steep hill. So he gets up there and he finds a cave, which the story goes he found a over 80 mummies, that they were oriental in appearance that there was a Buddha, that it may have been Egyptian, but in reality, the majority of what he described was Asiatic. And let's just say it was there. He said that there was a gate and there was stairs that were near the entrance. Well, we came Rex from leek project and I and some of the I did some broadcast from on my not aliens YouTube channel. I did do some broadcast from the rim of the canyon right there. So we were with a Navajo guide on

Navajo Nation land exactly where the cave is supposed to be. There's no going around it. Based on the description of those two articles. This is where the cave is supposed to be. And we spent a few days and what we did we methodically photographed the exact point in the wall where the Kincade cave is described to be. It is not there. There's your big drumroll. Oop, drumroll it's not there. Let's not there G cake. Now, some people have pointed out some very smart people have pointed out like let's say that the say the concave cave was there but then they collapse the entrance. So the one thing I will tell everyone is that for sure the Kincaid cave is not at that point. And rapids it's it's a very specific point. Now the wall is very big, but I can tell you, we have very extensive photography of the Kincade cave wall, but it's not there. And so what we could do is So that say the Smithsonian came took everything out. And it really did happen. And then, oh, we're gonna get to the crashing. By the way, do you know that the start of the FAA is because of the Grand Canyon. What's really interesting is I've learned, okay, so I'll back up. So the biggest craziest thing I learned about the Kincade cave is two things. One, there are 600 open rate, just just to go look for uranium, there are 600 Open permits. Oh, wow. Now, of uranium, there is also an open pit storage of uranium and contamination in the Colorado River. And it's quite spectacular. And I can go into that in a minute. But also, it was tragically two planes ran into each other, and 128 people died between the two planes. Now, believe it or not, World War Two happens. We, you know, pan-am Catch Me If You Can, Leonardo DiCaprio movie. Air traffic is very innocent, they just assumed that it's a really big sky and no one would run into each other. So once upon a time, it's 1956. They're both flying at 20,000 feet. And these two flights, it was a TWA Flight, I think but into each other. And so they end up having, of course, they do their best to recover all the bodies. But the wreckage did not get a full clean up until the 70s. And that means that there are mysterious looking crane platforms, there is remnants of interest prior, not only of where they did the cleanup of the wreckage, because it landed all over sort of around this area. And then there was also other tourist locations. Canyon, all of it was there for people to visit the canyon in ways that we've forgotten about already. And it means that there are a lot of aspects to the canyon that are very mysterious that lent to people thinking that oh, well, this is a crane platform for the concave case. And to finish one thought before I tell you about the amount of uranium in that in the canyon is that of the of the concave, so the concave may have been collapsed. And we would need a thermal imaging, something at night to get the temperature differential of where there would be an opening to a cave. Yeah, so that is something that we're considering is going back with thermal imaging. So that that's the only part about this for those listening that might be off is that we obviously can't see what may have been collapsed. But we will catch the temperature differential hopefully. And now, excuse me as we are looking for the cave. I'm telling you I did a lot of prep before we did this trip and this whole trip by the way this expedition and by the way, it is an hour and a half of hard four wheel drive driving what for you to go out to this point in the canyon. You need an all wheel drive vehicle you need some experience driving an all in all actual off road but this is intermediate to advanced off roading. We are an hour and a half from a gas station at 40 miles an hour. And that's a scene from a documentary. But the but at the end of the day, we're doing all this research on it. Now those are all nano structures by the way in that picture that you're looking at those are actual nano manmade machines. But we start looking into it and there is

It's Horseshoe Bend is in Page, Arizona. And I don't know why I couldn't think of like Powell, but it's like Powell. So of the buckets of uranium, right, which sounds asinine, right? So picture this. You need to do 1000s of tonnes of ore to just get a pound of uranium. Yeah. So here's Lake Powell. It's a lot like for those of you who go to the Hoover Dam, which is so low, it's just bananas. Right? Oh, but yeah. So Lake piles in page where Antelope Canyon is, and Horseshoe Bend is and it's a beautiful little town. It's really fun. And Lake Powell, which is a dammed up water reservoir. Well, there's here's the reason they made Lake Powell. They're digging up uranium, and they're like, where are we going to store it all? Do you want to guess where I'm going? Yeah. The fun part is going to be for everyone listening because really, this is worth the build up. How much uranium mining Okay, so when you mind something for those of you who aren't a gold rush fan, because gold rush is kind of fun. Yeah, so you have mining tailings which are the crushed up remnants of the rock They crushed to get the gold or to get when you're crushing up an ore. The remnants of what you don't want are called tailings so they can be basically it's a pile of classified gravel, sometimes smaller, sometimes bigger, but it's the tailings and they have to stick it somewhere they have to stick the piles of the unwanted rock and debris. So officially, there are 36,000 tons of uranium tailings at the bottom of Lake Powell. Because they thought if they stuck it down there and stuck some dirt over it, and stick it in water. It would keep it in cased. Wow. It this is coming from the Kincaid trip, I learned a lot more. We're gonna also talk about dinosaurs. But 36,000 tons of radioactive material is in the drinking water recreational lake, which winds its way down to Colorado, which doesn't even include a very large uranium mine, which was over the border in Utah, on the Colorado that has and by the way, there's multiple ones but they actually have a uranium tailing. Oh, you're gonna love the the explanation on mining the government there was a settlement for a couple of the indigenous tribes that had been breathing radioactive dust and the settlement in 2008 was over a half a billion dollars and they still haven't been paid \$1 Why and there's a lot to be said I did not know I was going to turn into a semi raise the alarm but the the uranium laced groundwaters because so for instance, what I was about to say is there's a mine an old mine

and the tailing pond is a few 100 feet from the river, which I when I say tailing pond, think of just a giant used open pit quarry sort of thing. And they Yeah, and then they they just filled it with water and Okay, so they you have radioactive

and the quote from the Center for Biological Diversity quote the big question now is whether contaminated water is removed from the mind into deep aquifers that feed Grand Canyon Springs say Grand Canyon trust program director, Roger Clark, quote, once polluted remediation of the aquifers would be impossible. If agencies cannot insure against that pollution, which they can't, the mining should not occur. This was from from a press release from the Center for Biological Diversity from August 4 2014. Yes, from the Sierra Club. You got as you couldn't find somebody? Honestly, more care if I'm not mistaken, was it not the Sierra Club that was partial sponsor of the original trip that supposedly found the underground city?

But I think rather than saying you guys are idiots for not taking care of it. I think for all the times they take money when they think we don't want to pay for it. I don't think anyone wanted to wait two years, by the way. So it's weird. If you talk about the Grand Canyon, you just say I want to go it's really easy. You go to Vegas, you take your car ride or you or you know, maybe you're in Arizona, but it's easy to go to the South Rim and go to the Skywalk and stop at that indigenous center and go stand on the rim. And you know, go to Guano Point where there was a mine that actually had a cable that went across to another cave that they mined for over a decade from bat guano and, and that's at the same place at the Skywalk is well you can go there as a tourist no problem. However, I cannot believe how hard it is to get on the internet. I spent hours trying to understand like, how do you get on the river? How do you get on a canoe? Who are these people kayaking, like how to do it. And I gotta be honest with everyone, I'm sure there's a crowd out there that are like, full time hikers and they're into hiking, like I've been a climbing and maybe I would have known if I was a in quotes, real hiker something sure but if you're an average, like if you're even just a semi

bucketlist interested in, hey, I want to I want to get down the Grand Canyon River, I want to I want to get on one of those little kayaks around the Horseshoe Bend. It's really hard to do unless you're there and suddenly there's all these signs that say, outfitter will, will will put you five hours on the river for honestly pretty cheap to \$300 like finding a way to do it. When you do I can tell you there are multiple Outfitters, you generally only have to be booked out two days to seven. And you could get in a kayak it near page, and you launch from the river. And you get to go around Horseshoe Bend, and then they they zoom on down with motorboats. They pick you up, and you sit in a boat and you go back through Horseshoe Bend. And that's not a bad deal for a couple 100 bucks. Yeah, but good luck trying to figure it out. If you haven't done it or been there. It's really frustrating.

And ironically, it has like four of the biggest fast food places you could think of, but it has a really cool little local espresso shop. It has a Starbucks in their grocery store. But this town is literally about a mile long on the main street with hands Extra chickens. It has at least one. It has a Taco Bell. It has a McDonald's. It has a subway. I think it has a really okay. I happen to like pizza. I don't care that it was the only thing in tuba, one of the only they had a pizza place that was really, really, really good. And it was an and there's only one mile in tuba so you guys won't miss it. It's by the grocery and the independent espresso shop they have in town. Here's what's really cool. It's right by the Navajo. When talkers Museum. Oh, wow. And unfortunately, that wasn't open. And for those that don't know, I'm a huge world war two fan. My grandfather was a tank commander that landed at D Day in a tank and was in a tank through Belgium, Holland, France for a battle the balls and all the way to Berlin in a tank. Wow. And I'm a huge history fan of that era, that kind of actually what for those that didn't need to know, that's what from from the minute I could pick up a book. I started with picture books when I was really young. But for the minute I could go to the library and learn about history. I was into dinosaurs right away, like I don't know if it's like genetically built for boys. But I or just young kids in general. I was researching about this from the beginning. So the wind talker museum was closed, unfortunately. And I really, really, really wanted to go in that because it was right there at tuba. And they have a field that was one of the inspirations for and what are the reference points for Jurassic Park. And it is a bog that, of course has hardened after millions of years. And this bog has footprints, it, it's insane. It has so many different kinds of dinosaurs footprints, and dyno poo, rocks and rocks of dyno poo everywhere. And here's a picture this guy's a pterodactyl comes flying out of the sky. And when they land, you know, they don't nail it on on one like they don't stop, they hop. And I got taken by my guide to where the

pterodactyl landed, hopped three times, and then he could tell where it started walking. There's that much detail Wow in Tibet, and this site folks is free. You just have to go. You just have to go. They have the locals have booths set up and they have some of the most beautiful, locally sourced stones generally locally sourced stone, so like stuff from the grand canyon itself. But but it's all handmade, native art, and it's stunning. All of its stunning, and there's something and even if you're not like if you're thinking it's going to be just very like wild and eccentric. It's not there. Despite when you think of it being like, oh, it's gonna be Southwestern art, some of it. And I do design build, I gotta tell you some of its very contemporary, and the range and you get to tip so here's the etiquette tip, your tour guide, and they take you out and as long as you want to stand and I got lucky it was freak weather in Arizona. Most people know it's over 100 It's incredibly hot. While we were in the field, Rex and Shawn del our guide, and I enjoyed the perfect most beautiful at Forest degree days while we were at the rim of the canyon, and about Tuba City. Right out of town paths that cool pizza place is the dinosaur tracks. And, and when I say track at all, there was a track there that was from one of the biggest not a Brontosaurus. I apologize it it's bigger than a Brontosaurus. And they said it shook the earth when it walked. And there are also footprints there from that spitting dinosaur from Jurassic Park. There There are tracks from Oh, there are potentially I did I asked to see them. But there are three footprints that look like human heel half human footprints. And ie up so that that should be my standout part of the conversation or Yes, so this is this is some of it. And now Now if you look on your left there, those are bones there are bones on site, there are whole bone sets still at this site. And folks, I'm not under exaggerating this field as far as Okay, so if you pause right where you are now, that one that you're circling on, that's kind of like they built by the way they use dyno poo a lot of the rocks that are around the Dyna Sir bones that you're looking at that picture are actually pieces of old dinosaur poo. And then but what else I wanted to point out as far as you can see in that photo, its tracks there every square inch their their tracks on top of tracks, you get to walk right on them in them. That big one you're looking at in the middle is one of the ones that shook the earth and they had a tremendous amount of amazing Well, it's like they're that picture on the right below the wall with the guy with the hand there. The next photo that kind of starts to give you an idea how many tracks and it's incredible and there's so it goes on for acres and acres and acres. And as I am there, and I'm looking around now in the distance so yeah, you roll up you can see almost one of the one of the there now the etiquette is they take turns deciding who's going to guide you out into the field. And what they're doing, you know, when when you ask how far you're interested in, in going. I had elven Yahzee and he is Navajo and has lived in this valley for 17 generations. And Elvin does also private tours. So here's something else I would tell you that's off the beaten path. And if you weren't listening to this show, and us talking, I don't know how you would know about this, but Elvin is a private guide. And if you want to go up into the hills, he's been there for 17 generations while Navajo and there are hilltop abandoned, Anasazi ruins and bones Anasazi Way before the Navajo. There were Anasazi. And one of the things I asked all that was, I explained my book that we're looking for ancient megalithic ruins. And I think one of the most underlooked areas in our entire country is America or in the world is our country, America, that the dolmens in Montana, the singing rock mountains, there's more than two, and that there is just this solid indicator that there must be larger pre Clovis advanced abandoned ruins. So I asked him I said, Are there anything rock cut? Is there anything that looks like it was from another era that doesn't match? Navajo or on Anasazi? And he goes, yes. And they're up in the mountains. And he goes, I know I based on your description. I know what kind of ruins you're looking for. And I asked Alvin, what do you do and, and one of the things I'll be releasing, is Elvin talking about all of this. His encounters with UFOs. Ironically, how's this one for you UFO people out there. That field of dinosaur footprints is and has been by his by the way, I did not explain anything to do and I'm, I'm an ancient history. I'm an ancient true seeker as far as like, field researcher, I'm not looking for UFOs I said nothing about UFOs. I haven't even given him

the title of my book yet. I don't think he volunteered that there is a tremendous amount of UFO activity over this dinosaur field. Wow. The Anasazi ruins are real and they're in the they're in the bluffs of surrounding this field. And so that along with the uranium tailings, and a missing Kincaid cave, led us down to looking at some other areas for Ks. This is a set set to climb over the course of a couple of days. And it's not a make a cool hard route. It was how do we make a safe descent 2000 or 1500 feet? Yeah, to just get down and photograph an interesting cave, right? Well, we never, we never found it. And that that initial trip will now lead us into a new trip where we go for the thermal imaging. You know, Machu Picchu has not been discovered rediscovered yet. Colonel Percy Fawcett has not lost his but again, in the Brazilian Amazon, you know, that's still pending, you know, in 1907, you know, you're dealing in an era of this heightened frenzy of

archaeology in Europe in Egypt, you know, in rediscovering and really, really, really going after the pyramids, Flinders Petrie is, I don't know if he's even alive by 1907, Flinders Petrie has done much of his work. But if this society, again, if you just look at the facts on the ground, so the large buildings, the antiquity of man, like these Klerksdorp spheres, going back two and a half, 3 billion years, if you look at all the things that indicate that a human society was here in an advanced state, well, we also then have to jump to is they've already left the planet that they already had satellites that they already had space traveling activity. And obviously, Earth is but what are we going to find when it comes to archaeology? If you could throw any TV show I'm a sucker for space archaeology, you know, anything, you can combine archaeology and space archaeology and the idea of advance, you know, like altered carbon stuff? Yeah, I, I would think that there's going to be a point very quickly. Well, they've already they're literally it's like a shaggy song. They're standing in front of the most advanced crap on the planet going, it wasn't me. And I was like, No, seriously, that was you? I caught you red handed. No, it wasn't me. I mean, it's like, advanced humans. Are there aliens, it's easier so that we have two fronts. One is, we're not admitting that very ancient advanced humans made it on this planet.

And two, we're not very far now from having to say, and I think here's what's annoying to me. They are more quickly going to say, well, there's bacteria live on. On Mars, there's bacteria, which we've already they've already said it. Yeah. And that hasn't made anyone. We

And so our idea of a satellite or clunky metal technology, versus a solid state propulsion and anti gravity, what looks like a space rock, the reality is that I am making bricks out of fast growing mushrooms. But the I do think, are dealing with this ancient advanced human race, having gone out to the moon, possibly, you know, the Black Knight satellite, or Erich von dannegan, I got the privilege of speaking with him a few times. Its trajectory was too odd. The way it came in and out of orbit was too strange,

everything. And to think that once again, much much like our good guest, Stephen Myers points out to think that our ancient relatives did not or could not have this technology or knowledge is is the purest form of haughtiness.

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It is because that technology on the ground indicates it ancillary technologies that would be as advanced so if you're cutting up giant 1200 ton stones and matching them to earthquake technology and frequency and energy work, and you're doing genetic material elation. You're doing planetary terraforming, you're using crystal silicon technologies. You sure the hell are building satellites and you're doing a lot of other work that is probably in the world of weapons terrifying. And if you're living 10s of 1000s of years, or not dying indefinitely, and managing carbon emissions planetary for a population that was probably much larger than where we are now. Here's the scary thing. We're so primitive. When we think of satellites, they've done two things. So we assume ancient people would have done two things, they would have made a satellite that floats around the earth because we need television. And two, they would send out satellites, like Voyager that would eventually run into stuff that would be recovered by William Shatner and Star Trek. But for that sarcasm, think about it, folks, if you're a society that lives through multiple cataclysms, and even with all your advanced technology, what if you've already learned as we are starting to that impacting a floating or an asteroid in space takes many, many millions of miles to correct its course. What if you had a very ancillary, weird orbit of like an object that passes by our planet in a very strange trajectory, as was just described by our host that was in an orbit that was always orbiting 4000 years, or 1000 years or 13,000 years, one of the orbit of that probe was an alien, but was the early warning system to avoid planet killing 65 million year old dinosaur destroying Greenland 819 mile diameter impacting off the southern coast of India, you want to see a terrifying impact we had look at the crater off the south coast of India. And so when you see a picture, it's an artistic interpretation is really just radio signals bumping into things. Yeah. So the this thing that skimmed the earth was probably if it was unintentional, elliptical, advanced ancient satellite.
