Because not a lot of people might be familiar with not only the topic of cryptozoology, Craig, but your involvement in the field and your involvement in research when it comes to Bigfoot, especially here in Texas, other cryptids and chronicling these things across the country and across the globe.

Well, I you know, I had a, an experience. Well, even going farther back than that, I was interested as a young kid in law, I certainly didn't know it as cryptozoology back then. But, you know, the first thing that really got me interested was, you know, I grew up in the DFW area, lived there my whole life until just recently, but The Curious Case of the Lake Worth monster in the summer of 1969. was, you know, a well it was it was called a Goat Man. But, you know, I think that it was just a Bigfoot, you know, like colored albino or white or gray Bigfoot. That You know, hung around that area, especially that summer, I mean, it was seen by hundreds of people at what used to be, you know, just like a place where the kids went parking you know, and made out and, you know, drank beer or whatever. And it's now basically a city park owned by the City of Fort Worth, it's a nature center and refuge. And they host what's not annual anymore, but every five years, like worth Monster Bash there, that celebrates the, you know, the, the history and the story of the Lake Worth monster, which is pretty cool. I help out with the city of Fort Worth, they actually came to me wanting to put this on for the 40th anniversary, which was in 2009. Oh, wow. and held it 2009 10 and 11. Then they decided to do it every five years. So then it was 14 and 19. So in, you know, two and a half years, it'll be time for it again, in 2024, but that's what started my interest was the story of Eddie was on the front page of the Fort Worth Star Telegram, the local newspaper on July 10, and July 11, which you know, is only nine and 10 days before we landed on the moon for the first time, and the front page story on the newspaper was about this hairy monster that was out at the lake. You know, we're counting down to blasting off to the moon. And that was, you know, capturing people's interest and, and

then I read a couple more books as a kid. And then, you know, the, the legend of Boggy Creek about true life events that happened in south Arkansas in surrounding areas that came out in 72. But it was 73 before it had national distribution. So I saw it in 73. And so that, you know, really got me interested in the in the subjects. But in 1994 Memorial Day 1994 May 30 I was coming back from going with friends to New Orleans. You know, this is before Google Maps before GPS before Mapquest before any of that stuff. So you just laid out, you know, a road atlas and plotted your core. So it looks like you know what was shortest. And that's what we did. We left Dallas at about 530 in the morning on a Friday morning. And by the time we were in central Louisiana, it was, you know, it was mid morning. So there wasn't, you know, really anything. And then when we last we there was 12 people that actually went and five different cars. So we caravan down there. But on Monday when it was time to go home people left at different times. And my vehicle was the last one to leave at about nine o'clock Monday night on Memorial Day. And so my girlfriend was riding with me and a friend who lived in the same building that I did rode in the backseat, she had to be at work the next morning, so she slept. And we set off from New Orleans and you know, headed towards Dallas and you know, rat work round around Baton Rouge and heading towards Shreveport. And now this road that was a state highway and marked as such was a two lane unlit road out in the middle of nowhere. And you know, we're just trucking along and you know, it's very, very, very dark out there. It's about 1130 at night now and my girlfriend and I see an upright figure off to the right of the road. On one side, it's real swampy, and on the other side, there's a tree line about 30 feet out. And we see an upright, figure on two legs covered with hair. It looked to be gray in the headlights, you know, walking parallel to the road about 20 feet off the road. And, you know, in my headlights, we saw it, you know maybe seven or eight seconds until we passed it but as soon as we passed it we we said you know we looked at each other and said Did you just see what I just saw and we agreed that we had and I was like what do you think you saw and she goes well I think we I saw a big foot as well. We got to stop and she used a few choice words but basically did not want to stop. So we didn't. We drove a little bit through I then entered a small town called bunkie. Louisiana. Yep. And there was nothing. It was 1130 at night, the sidewalks were rolled up. Nothing open, no nothing. So we drove through town. And on the way out of town saw a small church off to the right, we pulled in the parking lot there to talk about what we just, you know, no more than 10 or 15 minutes, did we talk about it? My friend had to be at work that next morning, so we were still, you know, five and a half hours, six hours from Dallas. So we got back on the road and, and didn't even really talk about it, we just drove, I was just something weird that happened. When we got home, we didn't talk about it. I mean, some of your viewers are probably younger than I am will probably think it was weird. But you know, this is in on May 30 1994. And I was still three years from getting on the internet. So you know, when I get on the internet, you know, in summer of 97, you know, that's one of the first things I looked up was Bigfoot, and saw, you know, certainly not near the information that's out there on the internet now, but, you know, there were made monthly message boards and forums and such with people talking. And so I went on there and shared my story and, and, you know, met people and, you know, met a gentleman that, you know, wanted to start up a research group. And so we did, I mean, I wasn't an outdoorsman, or a hunter or anything, but I just wanted to try and find answers to what I had encountered. And so we started up the Texas Bigfoot Research Center, and coming up, we'll be it was a 99. So what is going to be the 23rd, recent 23rd anniversary soon. So we put up a cheesy website, you know, a free Angel Fire website with blinking animations and stupid stuff. But, you know, people came to it and, and, you know, started reporting things that they had seen or encountered, and, and wanting to get involved with what we were doing. So, you know, that's how it really took off. And in, in April of 2000, we went up to Ohio, to the Ohio Bigfoot conference, and network with people up there, and I saw, you know, that they were doing this conference, and I was like, Well, you know, there's nothing like this in Texas. I bet I could, you know, I bet I can pull this off. And so when I went to pick

places Jefferson just stood out, my folks had been living there for a couple years and had bought a bed and breakfast. And my mom was on the events committee for the bed and breakfast Association. And there was a history of sightings in the area, and cattle Lake and everything. So we started it up there. The first one was September 15 2001, which was unfortunately only four days after 911. But we still had over 130 people that showed up that Saturday. And, you know, we just took off from there. And kept promoting and we were courted by different cities. Athens, and Tyler, Texas, both quarter this one is to bring it there.

And after the 2008 conference, because we you know, we brought a lot of people to town, a tourist town there. And by then we rebranded as a nonprofit 501 C three, and everything was, you know, really up to me anymore. It was all done by committee. And so I got Tyler got picked to go to Tyler, and did it there three years. And then I decided I needed to focus on other things. So I dropped out of the organization, but my interest did not drop out or anything. And they, the organization, skipped a year and then moved it to Fort Worth its Tarrant County Convention Center and still, you know, didn't draw any more people. So they kind of gave up on the event as an annual annual fundraiser. So I decided in 2014 to take it back to Jefferson is the original Texas Bigfoot conference originally organized by me originally in Jefferson there, and so we started a backup in 2014. In 2018, Jefferson, the mayor signed a town proclamation proclaim I mean Jefferson as the Bigfoot Capital of Texas. You know, we've had all kinds of different people speak there from Bob Gimlin to Loren Coleman, Jeff Meldrum, you know, just a long list of people John Bender novel before he passed away. You know, we've had tons and tons of people that have showed up to speak and, and, you know, my folks always wanted me to move to Jefferson, but I couldn't because of work, but I've since retired and only organizing events and such. And so I decided, when I was planning to move in not knowing where I was going to move to. I was like, Well, yeah, what about Jefferson? You know, because if not now when, you know, yeah. It just made sense to me. And when I thought about it to my events are there you know, I've been wanting to open up a Bigfoot museum for years and years and, and always lived hundreds of miles away. So now, I've moved there. As of January 1, I'm actively seeking a location to put in the Texas Bigfoot Museum and got people willing to help out with artifacts and such and helping to design the museum and plan the floor space and all that. So I'm working on that.

On the road, it was like I would I would hear him all the time on Coast to Coast talking about how he lived there. And it was like, Man, I am keeping my eye out. I'm looking for him. And I would see his car putting around every once in a while. And he's actually

You know, like, Texas has some stuff that's pretty not pleasant to but but we didn't necessarily just like, Yeah, you know, we didn't do that. We didn't like repress people under

creation of the Bigfoot Research Center because of course, like you said, you had your own experience that kind of led to that but right, but since then, how has meeting other people and networking with other people? So gladly since the beginning of the internet and founding crypto moonbot like crypto Moon row is how I found out about cryptozoology.

I mean, you know, people used to submit all kinds of weird shit to us. I mean, weird creature sightings. Weird. You know, one of the big one of the most popular thing was a weird postcard that, that Lauren had come across with some weird fish that looked like it was, you know, on the on land, at, you know, with palm trees look like in the South Pacific and, you know, meeting guests after guests after guests or guests what the mystery fish was, I mean, yeah. You know, and, you know, we got plenty of wild stories. You know, it ended up getting covered on I'm trying to think, one of the series that was on Monster quest, I can't believe I know, oh, monster quest that was on the Hill. Yeah. There you go about, about some kind of weird, prehistoric seal with a trident shaped pail, I mean, that was featured ended up on bonds request, but it first was on Cryptomundo the guy sent, you know, a drawing, you know, sent a CD with photographs and videos. And, and, you know, we posted that, you know, way back, way back when, and it ended up being on a episode of monster quest. You know, there's all kinds of there was an awesome and awesome report that we investigated here at an East Texas with the, you know, became known as the hog Hunter report, that a guy that was out hog hunting, you know, was up in a tree stand and, and, you know, there was some hogs around, and he heard some weird sounds. And, you know, he claimed that, you know, he saw Bigfoot and that it was actually like, leaping between trees and ended up you know, basically putting a hog in a headlock and slamming it against a tree until he killed it, and then threw it up over his shoulder. And he was freaked out, you know, in a tree stand. And as the thing locks off, it looked over his shoulder and looked right at him and let out he said, This ungodly howl. And not only that, but you know, from behind him, he heard similar vocalization from something that was apparently answering it. And, you know, he was really, really, really in fear for his life. We had another guy, this was a bow hunter that was up in a tree stand up near Fouke, Arkansas that was there early early in the morning, and he was you know, concealed wearing all black and you know, as this sun started coming out, he saw what looked like cows a cow coming up under his tree stand and pretty soon the cow stood up being there wasn't a cow, but it was actually a Bigfoot. And was, you know, fairly up close to him by the time it stood up, that it

actually reached up and touched the broadhead on his arrow. And it was so sharp it cut its finger and it's he said that it just screamed basically, in his face, you know, close just a couple of feet away and you know, freaked him out. But, you know, I've, you know, out there where I'm living now, near Jefferson, I've investigated several road crossing. Reports of people, you know, seeing one cross the road in front of or behind their car. Plenty of hunters that have seen them out there when they're hunting. And, you know, I've had one one, especially that I remember telling me up on the Red River that he said that he saw what he thought was a burned out tree stump until he looked through his scope and when he saw it through his scope, he said it was, you know, a tall ape like creature that was standing perfectly still and He said that it was standing in about, you know, I would say three foot, three foot tall grass weeds area, he was deer hunting. And he was set up on the on the bank of a creek where he had seen some deer rubs on the trees. And he looked at this thing through his scope. And he said, I felt like I could have approved it once and for all, and shot it right between the eyes. But he said, he didn't know what hit it was. And as hunters are our gun AR told, you know, identify your prey before you know what you're shooting at. And he did what he was shooting at. So he didn't

what's beyond it. And shortly, shortly after that he heard a vocalization from over his left shoulder. And he said that he turned around to look and didn't see anything. And when he turned back, it was gone. He felt that it did not have time to actually run for cover in the woods, he felt that it had dropped down into the grass, out of sight, which, like I said, crept the hell out of him. And he just left everything there and ran to his vehicle and left. Left is he you know, his gear everything there. You know, so? Well, I don't know, do you do a

Yeah, you have three things for, for, you know, basically for animals, wild animals, you have to have ample food source, you have to have ample water, and you have to have cover. So when you're out there, you know, in West Texas, you know, there are riparian areas where where rivers, you know, come through, and, you know, vegetation is less, you know, right there. You know, basically the riverbanks but, you know, it's, you know, other than right there, where there is wildlife, there's water, there's, you know, food sources. You know, and they may travel those routes, you know, the Colorado River, whatever out there. But they, you know, apparently from reports, you know, sighting reports that we get, there's not a lot of things seen, but, you know, you have to have two things for a Bigfoot sighting report. Not only do you have to have the Bigfoot there, but you also have to have a person there to see it. Yeah. So I mean, it says, I guess the same thing as you know, if a tree falls in the woods, and nobody's here, they're here. It doesn't make a sound so Bigfoot out there, but there's nobody to see it. Then there's not going to be a reported sighting. And, you know, reported sightings are generally just a, a, you know, just a sliver of time. And that creatures activities for the day. So, you know, for people to say they do this and they do that, you know, because they had a split second sighting, you know, 810 20 seconds. I mean, that's such a small sliver out of the that whole 24 hour period. And what that animal may have been doing, you know, foraging for food or, you know, whatever it may be doing. So, it's, you know, like I said, I, you know, and I've talked to, I've had to talk to over 300 people over the years, telling me that they had seen one of these, they found tracks, you know, it's seen, you know, one or even more of these, I mean, it's rare, but, you know, people do report seeing, you know, groups of them, which, you know, only make sense, you know, it's obviously not the one Bigfoot wandering the whole country. I mean, it's, you know, it's got to be a, you know, population of them that, you know, can breed yet staying in a population of them. You know, it may not be, you know, that many of them. And, you know, veteran researchers have estimated, you know, is, you know, maybe two to 6000 of them in North America. So, yeah, you know, that's spread out over, you know, that may be, you know, 100, in the whole state of Texas, maybe, you know, I don't know, I mean, and people say, Well, you know, why don't we get them on game cameras, there's all these game, you know, Braille cameras out there. And it's like, you know, in the turn remember the exact in the four state region of Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Louisiana, there is Do you know, what's bigger a square mile or a square acre? Do you happen to know, square

And, you know, so I actually contacted the gentleman who was in charge. His name at the time was Dwayne Slitter. He's retired. I don't even know if he's still alive. But he had conveyed to me that what we were doing at the time, which was a five year long camera trap study, we actually worked with governmental agencies, we had worked under the, under the permission of the Nature Conservancy in southeast Oklahoma. We were, we were working with Texas Parks and Wildlife


to we had hair snares up in southeast Oklahoma, that we never got what was suspected a Bigfoot hair, but we got lots of black bear hair. And they had contacted us and wanted us to send them their black bear hair. So they could see, you know, do DNA studies to see where the bears were coming from back into East Texas, whether they were wanting to eliminate, you know, were they coming in from southeast Oklahoma, because that's where we had our hair snares, or, you know, coming over from Louisiana or, or what, but we actually had permits from the National Park Service to operate long term camera studies in the big ticket, which is governed by the National Park Service for a cameras trap study, looking for Bigfoot. And we actually permits permits from the National National Park Service to allow us to put our cameras out there. The only thing is, we had to issue a report at the end of the year, at the end of the fiscal year, and include a copy of every photograph of wildlife that we captured. Yeah. And give

You know, these were high dollar cameras that we had 650 of them and we have like 40 of them yet. The Baylor University had sponsored us and bought
