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our guest today, less well as many many years spent working with MUFON hand in hand coming up with protocols for field investigators, things like the abductee team, the experiencer team, which are good friend and guests. self talk is a member of as well as co founder of the organization for paranormal understanding and support. Welcome to the show. Les Velez. How are you doing today, sir? Great, Chris. How are you doing today? I am more than fantastic. I'm very excited to have you on tonight. Well, I'm thrilled to be here and I look forward to our chat. You know, Terry Lovelace is a very, very good friend of this podcast. And me personally, we have numerous conversations off air. And I remember when he was coming aboard with you guys and telling me about y'all.

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And the amazing work that you guys are doing over Opus, one of the things that we try to do on this show, I mean, of course, in my in my heart of hearts in in the fabric of my soul less. I am a believer, all right.

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But like Carl Sagan said, with with great claims come the need for great evidence come the need for higher scientific standard. And also come the need of support. Because something that we talk about with people like Terry Lovelace all the time is how hard it is to come forward with the story like his especially if you're in a position like his, you know, where he was an active lawyer for years like that could have jeopardized cases, all kinds of things. So the fact that you have come out with the organization for not just paranormal understanding, but support of those who have experienced, I think, is a beautiful, beautiful thing.

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Thank you very much, Chris. And one of the things you know, as you said that people that are having these types of experiences,

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oftentimes do not know who to talk to, or they start to talk to people, they, these people feel that they might be crazy. And it's, it's a very negative type of reaction that a lot of cases happens to these people. And so you can understand why people are reticent about coming out with their stories. However,

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you know, this was something that we realized very early on. Opus was founded in 1994, by my co founder, Dr. Eugene Lipson, who was

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subsequently as passed away. Unfortunately, he was a wonderful man. And, you know, we recognize the fact that, you know, you need to be able to support these people. And so, you know, based on the cases when I first started with MUFON, in 1991, most of the cases that I investigated were not only sightings, but

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turned out to be abduction type cases, people saying that they had contact with non human intelligences. And so, you know, what, what do these people do, they can't turn to their family members, in a lot of cases they can't turn to they can't go to a regular psychologist or psychiatrist because most of the mental health community is not open or, you know, they don't have the experience with working with people like that. So we saw that there was an

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Need for this type of an organization to be set up, where we can support these people with a online support group, or a referral to hypnotherapist that are familiar with the topic or mental health practitioners. So yeah, there's this. It's, it's an incredible phenomena. And we've found through various studies that these people do not have a psychopathology, they're not crazy.

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They're not fantasy prone,

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you know, all the debunkers talk about all these various things, you know,

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that, you know, whether there is Sukh, sleep paralysis? Well, he was thirds of all the cases, whether whether in the bedroom or not, did not involve sleep paralysis. Fantasy proneness, as I mentioned,

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is not not a factor, the American Psychological Association nor any mainstream psychological diagnostic system has either ratified or proven such a diagnostic. And then a fantasy produce, as I mentioned, we found was not



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a factor in the Omega three study. I don't know if I said fancy produce twice what I meant was false memory syndrome was,

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was the American Psychological Association, finding that was not ratified or proven. So anyway, the bottom line is there's something happening. And then the big question is, what is it? You know, what the hell is going on with these people? And it's, it's a, it's a phenomena that is so widespread.

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It's just mind boggling. I mean, you know, the Roper organization back in 92, published a

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report that was

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set up by Budd Hopkins, and David Jacobs and funded by Robert Bigelow. And at that time, they said six out of six, 6 million people in the United States had experiences like this. Well, if you move forward in time, and understand that this is a worldwide phenomenon, and we do have people in our support group from literally all over the world we have from Australia from, you know, Europe. So

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my latest theory on all this is that we've all had an experience, but most of us don't

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consciously recall it.



And I've, I've been told that I've been on board a ship twice. It was a support group meeting that I had, and a person said, I've seen it before. They said, We're at a UFO conference. No, I saw you on board to craft. Well, I kind of blew it off. I you know, because I've certainly didn't have any conscious recollection at that time. And it was a year and a half, two years later that somebody said the same thing. And said, Yeah, you were sitting on a bench on this craft, and

you were naked, and you were freaking out, and they told me to go over to you to calm you down. So after that one, I said, Okay, I'm gonna go get regressed. And I went, and had three separate regressions. And I found out nothing along those lines. However, I had multiple past lives, multiple past lives. And one of the one of the stories in my book by

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Adam Burns.

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talks about his his conversations, you know, telepathically with these aliens that talk about reincarnation, and then it's a universal factor. It's just the way the universe works.

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And so, you know, our energy our souls, if you will, you know, don't die when our physical body dies, we go on and on and on. Yeah, that is that is something that we proclaim and talk about on this show regularly is the fact of Biophysics, energy cannot be created or destroyed, it can only be changed.

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The fact that right now, despite our distance, apart from each other, less we are sharing an electron shell

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by all rules of physics, my kid 25 feet away from me in his room, we're sharing one and I'm sharing one with my dad, hundreds of miles away and you 1000s of miles away. You know, this table that's underneath me is just a repulsion of electrons that I'm feeling. It's all 90% empty space. So

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yeah, it's for me. It's more strange that like you said that people haven't had one. Then have and we had a comment by

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by a gentleman who is what we have a lot of T eyes targeted individuals that listen to this program. And he just got finished saying that the TI community could use this kind of therapy could use this kind of just open hearted listening because like you said, um, you would think

that going somewhere with people of like mind even growing up in the same family that you might be able to go to somebody I'm friends with, frequently you're not. And we just had that discussion. Last week with

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Mary Helen Hensley, talking about the bad side of Indies, you know, near death experience, and people who come back. And you always hear about the bubble gum fantasy and people who go to the other side, and they see a light and they come back in my life has changed, and I have a purpose. There are a lot of people that that is not the case. There are a lot of people that when they have the the, quote, Extra Terrestrial experience, my friend they are they are petrified stiff, it's not an enjoyable experience, much less something that you want to quote and write home about. Well, that's the interesting thing about this, this phenomenon is the fact that yes, there's just like three stages to it. The beginning stage is definitely traumatic, there's no question about it takes you out of any normalcy that you can possibly think of which that is the the status quo of experiences that you've seen in your many, many years is that most of them are traumatic to begin with doesn't matter.

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The majority, the majority are traumatic. And if they get it, then then depending upon, you know, the frequency that then occurs afterwards, it starts to phase into a real acceptance of what's going on. And then things change as far as the the perception of the the phenomena where it becomes a more loving situation. In a lot of cases, it's a more

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communicative type of situation. And then in the final stages, when it stops, it's almost like the Stockholm syndrome, where people say, Well, how come? How come they're not coming back for me, or they're not talking to me anymore.

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And what we've found through through various studies,

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we have one of the studies on our website is called the Omega three study that I actually was funded by MUFON that I was the facilitator for it.

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And we, you know, we talked about,

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you know, the fact that we had 71 people that claim that they had contact with non human intelligences and compared them to 50. Yeah, if you go all the way, scroll all the way down to the bottom, you'll see the Omega three study, and it's all the way at the bottom.

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That compared to 51 Act or control group. And it's, it's amazing that these 70 to 80% of these people want these experiences to continue. It's only that minority that

want it to stop because it continues to be a negative experience. Interesting in you know,

I share my experience regularly which which was not with any extra terrestrial craft, I love the fact that you are the organization for paranormal, understanding and support and especially understanding the fact that so many of these topics bridge together and are connected in a fractal way. And really in a in a spoke of a wheel way. Mine was a paranormal experience, honestly, like, in in church, and when I got amongst people who you think would be of like mind like, I can't think of anybody more of like mind than actively entering the seminary.

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Yeah, and going and sharing my experience to see the number of people that looked at me with like, saucer dies and went, Oh, really? Yeah, yeah. Okay.

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You hit the nail on the head. We're really with the when you say paranormal because it encompasses so many different things, whether it's your ritual, whether it's kundalini awakening, you know, poltergeist activity, near death experiences, I mean, all these are interconnected. And it's funny as it turns out, to be

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jority of things that we are dealing with seem to be the nature of contact with non human intelligence.

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One of the things we found we just finished the first phase of the

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Omega form project, which I'm doing now with with a psychologist friend of mine. And

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we sweat we did is we sent this questionnaire out to therapists that are working with

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experiencers and what we found was that the number one thing that people were dealing with were the greys Okay, the second thing that they they were dealing with are orbs. The third thing interdimensional and the fourth thing were ghosts. And, and so you'll have quite an interesting mix of, of entities if you will, that are being talked about. And the one thing that involves with the greys oftentimes are Tall Greys, the short greys Of course, Mantid type people reptoids, Nordics and military and and so there's, I've often thought about the fact that all these different races are utilizing the greys is there some kind of a large supermarket out there or Apple store that sells raised to be

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to abduct people because we're a violent race, and I've had people tell me,

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from our support group that they bid people, the grace, one one person totally ripped an arm off of one.

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And so it's,



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it's amazing, it's amazing that they all seem to be utilizing these basically biological, robotic type things that most people talk about that, you know, they're not, they're not like a Reptoid or romantic type of creature, special utilitarian type of a creature. Okay, okay, much more of a much more like a specially built

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app apparatus that they, yeah, bring themselves through. And, you know, with with that in mind, I'd like to, especially with your years of work as a MUFON field investigator as a co founder of Opus, I'd like to address a couple of the things that were brought up in in today's

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intelligence briefing that really the first ever public intelligence briefing regarding UAPs people are regularly read in on this topic in Congress. And but this the first time that there was ever a Senate hearing where there were numerous people in there were cameras, and they were asking questions about UAPs and I thought it was very interesting that at one point

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they made it very clear that some of these things may not be physical



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that the great majority of these sightings are physical and can be explained but some of them we don't we don't really know what they are and not only do we not we know what they are but they don't seem to be something physical. They seem to be something ethereal. That's there.

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What do you make of that? Yeah, I think it's a multitude of different things. Just just as you know, are these things extraterrestrial? Are they interdimensional? Are they time travelers are they are a military

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certainly interdimensional craft, it would certainly seem to be non physical. A matter of fact, I had a case that's in the book

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of a couple that were picnicking in a state park, north of Santa Cruz, California. And they noticed this object over over the ocean and this bright light basically at first and as it got closer, they noticed that it was a triangular craft, about the size of a small yellow color jet. And



and this thing proceeded into a canyon behind them and they noticed another light over the ocean and this craft finally got over their heads and it was the same type of aircraft and the first one they were looking at it the second one they felt there was looking at them and they became frightened at that point.

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This happened five more times.

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And these crafts were sitting in this canyon, just kind of fluctuating the kind of the butterfly effect, you know, where they hover and seem to go back and forth. And all of a sudden, they all went up on their side. And it's like they went around the corner, but there was no corner.

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They just totally disappeared.

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And then this couple also had missing time, in the process of they, they, when they came out of the park, the last thing they remembered was that they were coming out of there. And they ended up at a restaurant, which was only five to 10 minutes away from where they were, but it was three hours later, and they had no recollection of how they got there. So, I mean,

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you know, these are just some of the things that

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I have bought 25 stories from experiencers in the book, that are quite interesting, and shows a lot of different different things that are possible when people have contact with these intelligences. Well, and I find it interesting because I also choose the term experiencer. And I don't think

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I don't think I'd really thought about it as as deeply as you had when you when you go through your

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learned explanation as to why you use the term experiencer after your many years of field investigation dealing with abductees dealing with Close Encounters of first, second, third, fourth kind.

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You came to use the term experiencer because it was literally the most politically correct. Yeah, so I feel it's neutral. You know, because, you know, abduction is has a negative connotation, contact has a very positive or a positive type of a connotation, where experiencer, you know, it kind of opens up your possibilities it can be it can be either or both, or, you know.

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So that's why I kind of use it right now. I don't want to offend anybody.

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So I mean, for me, I use it because of the fact that, yes, I am an experiencer it may not be a UFO, but it was definitely an identified presence.

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That I was that I was there not just once but numerous times in my life and what I know, in my life to be the presence of God, that just happens to be the filter through which that came to me, you know, had I had a different filter growing up, it may not have been God it, it may have been a totally different concept. Sure. And that's very important that we do filter things through our upbringing, how, you know, the experiences that we have when we're young. I mean, one of the things that we found is that there's been for a lot of experiencers, there's been childhood trauma of some sort that has gone on, which caused them to dissociate in a way, and and that dissociation seems to open people up to having these types of experiences.

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So, you know, there's the second part of the Omega four study that we're doing, we will go out to the clients of these therapists to get more information about about the experiences, because I think it's, it's, it's something that we're trying to really find ways to help these people. And if we can find that, quote, unquote, formula, if you will, that will will make these people

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have a better understanding, and also to be more comfortable with what's going on. I think this points to the fact that I don't I think this has been going on since since you know, man has been present on this planet.

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We were we're not at the top of the food chain. This whole structure has been going on for millennia. Yeah.

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We were just kind of waking up to it in a way or some of us are waking up to it in a way. There's many people you know that get up in the morning, have breakfast, go to work, come home in the afternoon, have dinner, watch some TV, go to bed. Next day, they do the same thing over and over and over again, which

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You know, that's not a bad thing. I mean, they got to take care of their family, they got to gotta do, you know, put food on the table.

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And so it's important, but when you have something like this happen, it shakes up your worldview. And people worldview changes dramatically after this, you know, they come back with a message that, hey, we need to be better stewards of the planet, we need to take care of our air and our waters and, and we need to be better to one another, we need to be more loving. And, you know, these are all wonderful, wonderful traits, you know, are statements that the come back with these ideas, I should say. And, and that, you know, how back in that day, but I mean, there's a school of thought that all these aliens are bad, you know? And then there's some people that feel they're all good. Well, I think you need to be careful with that. I think we have just like we here have here on earth we have.

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We have good people and bad people. And I think the same thing is going on out there, even within the species, because I've heard reptilians you know, people say they're all bad. Well, I've had people say that they've had wonderful relationships with with the reptilians.

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Just asking honestly.

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Now, the bottom line, is it

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experience was was positive for them. And, you know, so, you know, I, I think we just have to be careful in characterizing, you know, them as either all good or all bad.

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And I think you have to go with your gut. When this type of a thing goes, I know, for me, it's always been my gut, you know, telling me, it feels okay, then I go forward, if it doesn't I back off.

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it's, it's, we don't understand, you know, we don't have a definitive answer on all of this. There's no question about it. You know, scientifically, we're trying to, you know, maybe with this UAP Taskforce, they're going to try to do this, you know, more scientifically and try to understand what's going on. But, you know, I think that, you know, I had lunch a couple of years ago, before COVID, shut everything down. With Terry Lovelace and Louella Elizondo, and and Lou is there interviewing Terry for the unidentified show that was on the channel, which never got aired, for some reason, it never got aired. And

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so I just heard the other day that the Lou said something, cuz somebody asked him, Well, what do you think about this abducted abduction stuff? And he says, Well, we have investigated military personnel being abducted. Well, I'm just wondering if it was Terry.

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But, yeah, but then he said he couldn't talk about it anymore. That, you know, based on his security clearance, he can't say anything more about it. Well, you know, this is a thing that's so frustrating. And, you know, talking about that, that congressional hearing today, that there was a lot of good answers of excuse me a good questions, but a lot of crappy answers.

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A lot of very, very well phrased answers. Yeah, yeah.

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And

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that as, as we were discussing, in our pre show, just discussion that were a little bit disturbing. One of them that we played in the clip earlier, was them saying like, so. So what are the repercussions of anybody spreading misinformation? About or disseminating conspiracy theories about UFOs, UAPs, anything like that? They literally said, well, there, there are none. And you guys should think about that. Maybe you guys should write a law. You know, God, no.

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What are those like? Okay, there's the opening that in the fact that one of the first things out was they might be a national security threat. But yet at the same time, when taken to task by the good senator, about Malmstrom, one of the biggest known incidents ever were like an orb above a military base knocked out the power and functionality of 10 nuclear warheads like back in the 60s 70s. You know, yeah. Well,

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we didn't look into that. But yeah, what do you mean you didn't look into that? You're just now you

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You're saying that they're possibly a threat to national security, but you didn't look into that known case? Right? Well, you know, Robert, Robert Salas had had a press conference at the National Press Club this past year, and talking about that incident. And I also met



Robert and his wife at the MUFON symposium in Las Vegas because he was one of the

speakers there. And I had made a presentation to the experiencer group on Saturday morning of the show of the symposium, and he came up to me after he says, Can I speak to you afterwards? I said, Sure. And so I had a table there where I was talking the book, and

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he sits down with his wife, and they start telling me about his his experience. They both of them had been abducted. And they both had actually a positive experience. Wow.

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And his wife became a healer after that experience. And this is another thing that goes on with with people that have these experience. Some of them are healed, some of them become healers. We just saw

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with Kathleen Martin. Yeah. And in the fact that many people laughter their experiences, just it's like they are participating in a higher vibrational level.

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And people become psychic, have psychic abilities afterwards, or after a near death experience. I mean,

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one of the one of the things that actually started opus on its path was, I got written up in the Monterey Coast weekly paper, as you know, talking about the things that I was doing with MUFON.

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This woman who was also written up in it, contacted me afterwards, he says, I want to find out what's going on with my brainwaves when I'm in contact with with these offers, like entities. And so I said, Oh, that's interesting, and drag scratching my head to see how I could possibly help her. And then she said she was working with an emergency room doctor down in Carmel. And so that's when the bells started to go off. And I have doctor friend, Dr. Eugene lips, and who subsequently became the co founder of Opus with me. And he was interested in contacting other doctors that were interested in the phenomena. So I called him up. I said, Let's go down there and talk to this lady. So we, we did, we went down to her home, and we walked in and on the wall, there was a picture of her standing on the back of a rather large vessel and, and I

asked her, I said, What's this all about? And she says, Oh, yeah, that's when I was down in the Caribbean helping these treasure finders, I said, You were How did you help these treasure finders, just while I was in contact with the captain of the galleon that had gone down.

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Oh, wow. So So anyway, that started the afternoon off and subsequently, we found out that

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they are she had a near death experience and became psychic after that incident. So it's, it's

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anyway, we came away that afternoon, say how can we help people like this and that's when Opus was hatched. And then in 1994, we officially became a 501 C three

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nonprofit recognized by the good old IRS. So

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that's what I love is that you guys are out there doing this work for the right reasons you're out there gathering data and

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just recording experience to the best detail that you can

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which is really all you can do you know, one of the things that we mentioned on the show all the time, I have people whenever I'm on the road, or people people that I know of

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I guess normal brain wave length, got a lot of friends they aren't all on that wavelength, you know

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of conversation. And last me like what, man like why did you have that person on the other day talking about this, this? What they would think is crazy thing, you know, crazy experience that they had or abduction or experience with the paranormal. And I'm like, Man,

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if I didn't believe my experience, I don't know where my life would be.

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Yeah, you will be having a hard time. Yeah. It's literally a part of how I define myself. And has been since the day it happened. Now. Now granted, that defining of myself has changed over time, much like you said, and much like Seth has said, Whenever seven talk has come on, and I love the fact that she is out

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as an advocate and part of the experience or contact group, because she really can attest to that. Listen, my experiences were scary when they started to.

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They are in a different place. Now. I'm in a different place. Now, spiritually, I'm able to do this now because of these experiences. Yes. No, I mean, it's, this whole thing is a spiritual journey.

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That's the way I, I characterize this whole thing, it's a spiritual journey. It's bringing us to a whole nother level. Okay, that if the entire population of this planet were of this mind, then we wouldn't have the wars that are going on, we wouldn't have the famine that's going on, we would be able to breathe the air and drink water, clean water, breathe clean air. You know, it's it's,

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there's just so much that is wrapped up in this thing. And so this realm that we're dealing with, whether it's interdimensional, whether it's time travelers, whether it's extra terrestrial nature,

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there's, there's this drumbeat that's going on for so many people



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that they need to come out, they need to write books, they need to get on shows,

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like your mission right now, too, is you are an integral part of this process. Absolutely. And, and in what you're doing is so important. So thank you,

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for what you're doing and helping get the word out that there's another way to think there's another way to act. And, you know, these horrible things that have happened in this country with these mass shootings, you know, the war the Ukraine, all this is so important, and maybe maybe these UAP

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hearings, things will start us in some way shape or form down a path once we understand perhaps, who these people are, because I think they need to understand who's driving these things.

They said that they made no attempt to be like, Hey, you urine us airspace Who are you know, attempts? Hi, John. Nice to meet you. Not.

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So like they made zero attempts. Granted, they fired no weapons either. They said, but I'm just given the data at hand and your years of experience. Where do you come down on the current full disclosure? As it is? Yeah, I think I think that

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blue had to take the path of probably the path that would get him the farthest and getting getting the government to really take a look at this thing.

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Most real attention on it that would have hooks. Yes. Yeah, I, you know, it's, oh, if you if you take Steven Greer's attitude that they're all wonderful and loving and all of that, then I think that his effort to to garner any interest in moving forward with investigating these things would have probably fallen on deaf ears. 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you know, Linda Howe, who's also on our advisory committee, Preston Dennett. Yeah. And so,



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yeah, there is and I think they need to talk to experiences and I'm sure they're already doing it. You know, Allah, you know,

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Gary Nolan at Stanford and Kip green have interviewed experiencers and



looked at their abilities from a psychic standpoint and

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things of that nature remote viewing capabilities.

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But so there they are talking to

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experiences, but it's not in the public domain yet. And there's so many facets of coming out, if you will, because then what is the rest of the population that does not?

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Or has not had an experience like that look at these people and say,

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These people have these abilities, and we don't, so should we, you know, you got the white supremacist out there. So now you're gonna have the anti alien people, you know, coming straight up into an X Men equation immediately. I hate to make the analogy, but it's so entirely true. And we make the differentiation on the show all the time, the percentage of 8020

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out of 100% of the population living in America, less than 20% took part in the American Revolution.

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The other 80% were like you're a crazy person, stop what you're doing.

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So it's not like we have to convince 90% of minds to this wave form, or to this idea that this might be a thing less, we only have to get one out of five.

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You know, you only got to shoot a 20% average here to to actively make a big enough ripple to make a difference. You know, and it's interesting to me how, oh, since 2017, that those December footages, I remember being at my family Christmas and pointing at my cousin and going, Ah, look, it's on CNN.

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Yeah, um, and it's been since then that you now hear the media using the terms UFO denier, you know, things like that, though, those typical buzz words that start coming along. And

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once again, to to hear the words, threat come about, yes, it will probably be the easiest.

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It's definitely getting a lot of attention online. It's something that I think people are equating to some kind of cave to more

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this maybe an artifact that has been made at some point in the distant past. And I think that aside from if they're already natural explanations, I think that there have been a few proposed by Sure. A few individuals, I think that it implies a lot to think that maybe if in the event that we this or something else that we eventually can come across is found to be an artificial construction, some kind of structure or artifact that who whoever has made, which is another interesting idea that I think there's a lot of incentive to look into this from something that we can call Astro archaeology, or eco archaeology, Zeno archaeology. And this is basically dealing with structures that could be found in other places in the university or in other worlds that weren't necessarily made by people I feel here on Earth. And I think that's an interesting notion to think that, you know, if there are civilizations out there that are advanced in our technological in any capacity like our own, then I think that that should be something that we can probably make detections of, and we're obviously making some efforts to try to do that. And I think what's interesting is to find shapes, patterns, sequences in nature, we do that here. And as you mentioned, you know, a lot of times people have this idea that there aren't any right angles in nature are something that affects and like you pointed out, I mean, we do have a lot of really incredible things going on that nature is capable of, but I think that people are discounting of nature, unfortunately in a way

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If we think that it can't be done, and I think that sometimes nature can do way beyond incredible things that we wouldn't expect it to, sometimes in absolute surpasses our expectation, but in the case of something like this,

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you know, some people have said, well, what's the scale? And I think some numbers have mentioned that maybe it's only three or so feet tall. And the interesting thing about that is that, of course,

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which comes with that the rhetoric that some have actually said, even scientist said, Well, I guess that means that Martians really were, like little green men are really small, you know. So it's kind of a fun idea that I think you know sometimes gets dismissed, but actually opens the

its kind of a fait face that i think, you know, sometimes gets distributed, but actually opens the doors to more Matific opportunity, it certainly does match that popular trope of the gray, you know, that between three and a half, four feet tall or something like that. And once again, when you look at this picture, folks, I'm, I am more apt to debunk than to accept Daniel and we have had this conversation more than once, as the great Carl Sagan would say, with with,

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with a great claim comes a greater need of evidence, you know,

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and the demand on the evidence is bigger, and I think it's definitely something that needs to be explored, there is definitely a huge shadow coming down.

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Inside the image, whenever you blow it up, you can see the shadow from the sun on one side, and that, that's how you can tell it's, it's not entirely too deep, like you can see the back of the carving, you can see the back of it, but if it is a carving, so to speak, but it definitely

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I don't know, um, with with the type of wind erosion and everything else that's there, you would kind of expect to see the same kind of erosion. Even inside

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of that structure, if it was something that was natural, and was was, you know, human that way, by nature, you would see the same kind of erosion inside that you do on the outside. And that's not really the case here. It looks as though it's smooth, it looks as though it has been cut out of that eroded rock. Whenever you look at the side right here, things like that. Now, this is just coming at it as someone who spent some time in the rocks and minerals club, cutting rocks, you know, with a rock saw things like that.

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This is a this is just my limited experience as a rocks and minerals fiend,



and collector. But it definitely looks like something happened there not not like it is a perfectly natural structure.

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Yeah, I think it catches a lot of attention because of how similar it might appear to some of these ancient ruins we see here on Earth. And I think that if we even had the opportunity to detect any of these types of structures, these potential constructs made by other people, you know, in the universe, or wherever else it is, in this case, maybe on Mars at one point, it's interesting to consider that while a lot of other organizations like NASA SETI are looking to try to find radio waves and different forms of bands of frequency and things that are way out in Deep Space. Because the likeliness of detecting something like a physical structure out there, right now is is very improbable just because of our ability to see that far. And so I think that obviously, with close planets,

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especially Mars, or even the moon, if we are, you know, able to find things like that, that's probably going to be the most likely opportunity for us to see physical structure rather than to detect Deep Space radio frequencies. And so the interesting part about all of this is that the idea of structures on both the moon and in this case, especially Mars, is is not a new concept, because people have claimed that there are structures on both of these celestial bodies and I think that that's something that while it has been widely dismissed in some circles, and mainly the the mainstream scientific circles in other alternative communities and people who are at least open minded enough to see that there is

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there there are discussions on this, that you have things that go back to what some refer to as the face on Mars absolutely do any and all of these different patterns with people you know, try to make sense of in a way that seems to express a form of geometry or sequence and ratio that

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It's maybe, you know, more common in nature than than most realize. And this idea that maybe there are these sort of pyramids on Mars or obelisks on on the moon and or all of these other things that maybe we're trying to relate to something that we've seen here that people have done that we have our as our ancestors have done. In the distant past, I think that maybe there's this interesting idea because of the the lore, and the mythology behind a lot of Ancient Astronaut Theory, and just the modern scientific direction of is it possible to find and detect any of these things, if they exist, and how that may bridge together can show us that, okay, if all of these stories or if it released, any of them have some kind of confirmation that we can detect, by way of, you know, discovering these structures on another planet. My next idea might be, well, even, aside from any super top secret, classified black projects that could get us there, and back or whatever, in some amount of time, or have some kind of clandestine, you know, group go out there, let's say in the most conventional sense that this structure or one like it is found, and then plugged publicized all over media, the internet, we said, okay, then what do we do to get people there, if we do it all, you know, if we look at what NASA or SpaceX or any of



these types of big space industry companies are doing, it would seem like it would take years for us to even tangibly send anything out next to, you know, having people would be astronomically longer. Because, you know, this whole idea, I think, gets at this

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whole reason why we even know about this in the first place, which is because of the Curiosity rover, which is there, because people can't seem to be there, according to what we're, you know, shown and told, and what's conventionally available, it seems like, we probably wouldn't be able to get people, you know, boots on the ground in the field, so to speak, to examine it for a really long time. Although, if we do have the technology to do it sort of behind closed doors, I think that that's something we have to consider that if this is made public, you can only imagine what isn't. And if there has been something discovered in a way that's like this, that I mean, maybe there have been expeditions like that, taking place, this whole time that you know, what would be one of the most incredible parts of our hidden reality. But I think that that's, you know, getting into the realm of speculation. But with what we're seeing here, if this is a real object, in the sense of it being artificial, and all of this, it's, it's hard to say how we could proceed in a tangible way that can, you know, extrapolate more data or information from that area, other than taking more pictures from the same.

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The same rover, you know, and any efforts to try to get people up there. Just for that, I think is a good idea. But also, it's like, there there probably other reasons why they want to get people up there first, I think that would be a good reason to, if not anything else, to try to make sense of, okay, if we find something that's definitely not made by humans, at least that we know of, in modern times. That's like a world changing event. I think that that's something that of course, you know, there it stratifies our strike here on the planet. But I think that, you know, that's why people say, Well, why would we want to go to outer space and Mars and we have when we still have hunger and all these other things, too. So I think that's something we have to consider. Oh, yeah, no, and absolutely, and that that's what they start out with is going to this place that they found on Mars, from a rover and then things go haywire.

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But what this reminds me a lot of is actively the work of Richard C. Hoagland, especially when you start bringing up Cydonia

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and the Cydonia complex.



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There there was the long held theory by Kichard to hot even was still long held theory by Richard C. Hoagland that it is an intelligently made complex on the surface of Mars, that is where of course, the face of Mars was first photographed.

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And when you look at it, all kinds of polygonal structures,

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pin tag pentagonal structures, hexagonal structures, many things that look from the air, akin to the Bent Pyramid of Khufu on Earth, things like that. So, the once again, like you said, the idea of

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might we find something might we come across technology of either a lost civilization or

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civilization that has relocated?

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Sure, definitely within the realm of possibility.

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Yeah, I can recall,



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an interview with Hoagland who had mentioned being in the control room and NASA with Carl Sagan. And he had said that, at one point, when they were looking at early renditions of the surface, and the landscape that basically, he,



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they were given orders to change the hue and saturation of the imaging quality, to go from a nice, sort of a pale blue sky to a reddish, dirty, you know, round type of coloration. And it's interesting to think of, if that's if that's actually in everything he says, is true, then a lot has been changed and doctored, before it ever reaches the public. And it makes you wonder, I think that there are probably some decent reasons as to why there has to be image editing, to, you know, get a nice, good picture, but at the same time, that seems like that's kind of a different direction, that's almost like concealing some kind of,

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you know, imaging or something that otherwise could be very different than what we're told. And I think that maybe, if, as you had mentioned with the structures that he talks about,

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that could be a really big deal. And it makes you wonder, okay, if, if that is true, and they discovered these pyramidal structures, and then there's a lot of geometry and the ratios between all of these structures, shows some kind of connection with, with intelligence and maybe intelligent design, by some one some civilization or something, you would think that maybe, why would America not want to say, hey, we discovered, you know, ancient ruins, and we're going to go up there and set the flag down and say, We did it first. You know, it seems like the really American type of thing to do, you know, American thing to do.

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But it's not happened that makes us wonder, you know, in the case of something like this, what, what is the agenda or if something does finally become

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not discredited, and not debunked, and not falsified? What do we really do? And I don't know if there's something set in place for that to happen because of how intangible it seems outside of sending more robotics, you know, and that might be what we have to do for now. Well, well, you know,

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this, this is one of those prime examples. I Richard C. Hoagland does a dream interview of mine, I have followed his work for years and years and years, and to, to see

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the way that science has literally driven him out



because of these theorems, and that's all that they are, they are theorems. And that's how we

get science, you know, you have to be willing to think outside of the box, you have to be willing to accept what may not fit your paradigm.

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And at the very least explore the possibility. And I have always allotted him for that. And with with his work on Cydonia, and things like that, I think it's the fact of he might be striking a little too close to home for a lot of people in science to be able to accept

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that I think it's one of those issues where if, you know, just I think as Sagan pointed out, and if he was privy to all of this as well, who had, you know, for anyone that follows or has known about or heard about, Richard Hoagland work, that pales compared to the license of someone like Sagan, who, as you mentioned earlier, you know, with even what we know, is the Sagan standard.

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With these, you know, Extraordinary claims require extraordinary evidence. And I think that that's something that let's say, Okay, if he was there, and he was aware of these things at NASA as well,

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then it would be a real challenge for him to it. I mean, and of course, some people think of him as some somewhat of like a denier a debunker. I think that he's probably the biggest proponent of extraterrestrial life, probably more than than almost anyone else, just because of how much of a popularizer of that, but aside from that, I think he was he's scrutinized things in a way that thing CAC to be when you're funded by a lot of these different institutions or agencies or, or in any official capacity to also, you know, share certain information and to not share other information. I think that's maybe what we're dealing with, because there's a lot of conjecture about things that he had said off the record about,

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you know, if only the people actually knew you know, what all the stuff that's really going on and what they're hiding and all this and

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And of course, you know, that's a little bit of rhetoric. But I think it's one of those things that I think that you have to consider that if he, if someone like Sagan was also privy to this, that, you know, he's holding back, a, you know, a floodgate of just all of this information that maybe he

was told not to discuss in any way, publicly, and that makes you wonder, with all the stuff that he could say, and he did say, what maybe you know, is less there, in the haystack, you know, where we might be able to find those needles of truth, so to speak, I think it's interesting to think of someone like that or Hoagland or any of these people who have known about the Mars research for a long time, because most people now only know about it, because Elon Musk wants to go there, you know. So that's another challenge is that we lose information over time, and most people only know about it now because of the work of these people.

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And it's, it's sad to see, I mean, you you yourself, were very good friends with the late great Jim Marrs

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there's quite a bit about the JFK assassination that we would not know were it not? For the work of Jim Marrs.

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And, and that's the sad thing is that we know the information, but we tend to forget the source. And so many times, especially whenever you're talking about people coming through with testimony people coming through with Hey, this is what's been happening for a long time. Someone like Richard C. Hoagland was there with with the Viking programs. You know, he was there when we first landed on Mars when we were first making the passes to go past Mars. And he he had been ringing this bell for a long, long time. And to know that now we are getting to the fact of considering these things, we're getting to the fact of looking into things greater and with, with what you may or may not think folks about the face on Mars, things like that. The the arrangement of these things in this Idomeni or region, and the shape of them, things like that are strange. They're interesting. And they definitely I think, no different than any placement of standing stones on earth or something like that, which may point to something.

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What if this does as well, what if this was something left? Even Even if not, by a civilization that is previously us? What have you but as a warning, or a message of some sort? From somebody, no different than a Nazca line, or anything like that.



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Fully within the realm of possibility and I think fully within the realm of needing to be researched. I don't think that Carl Sagan disbelieved in the potential for alien life, he would not have put the effort into the Voyager discs that he put in, if he didn't believe

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that that's just my own personal thought for him on folks like

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Carl Sagan, Richard C. Hoagland, what they've done, for the cause of this research. And what they've done to help literally ring the bells of science to say, at the very least, we need to investigate, we need to explore and do the work of science.

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So right, I think that it's really important to see that, you know, if in the best possible scenario, let's say,

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you know, this is, whatever we're witnessing here, that's been publicized now for, for a little while, it's making the rounds online, getting people's attention on different social media networks and platforms. And they're already several ideas sprung up, who, you know, what this is, and what it could be,

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not necessarily by the scientific community, just by people making observations. So, you know, we can tell that people are interested in running with a lot of these ideas of, it's got to be something real, and that that maybe it shows signs of life and intelligence. And if that was the case, we can speak in hypotheticals and maybe say if this Okay, so best case possibility would be that this is a real structure, let's say a tomb, if, if we call it that at all, it states that, and not only, or maybe let's say not assume it's an active facility even better. I mean, if we went there, and we found that it was a real structure, and there was a real alien in there, that would be the best possible scenario. The next best thing would be to go there and find out it's somewhat of what like what we would call a tomb and there's the remains of something organic

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are tangible. Next to being alive, that's the best we can kind of go with. And from there, you know, it's like, okay, if there's not an actual body or remains, then we just find out, okay, someone designed this, that's, that's curious as well. But, you know, it's helpful when we find, let's say, structures here on Earth, and then we find bodies associated, or were the remains of people associated with those structures, we can kind of infer, an attempt to interpret the history, because a lot of archaeology is, is an attempt to interpret the past based upon physical remains physical anthropology. Yeah. And it's really trying to help fill in the gaps of what we know that's been documented versus what we're finding. And so sometimes, it's not always that what we what we think happened actually happened. We're just trying to piece it together



based upon the best available information. And the most likely circumstance, maybe this is Auckland's razor, which is, it could just be a pile of a fallen rocks or something. And I think that that, of course, makes sense. But it's not nearly as you know, an exciting explanation for anyone, of course, everyone wants it to be these ancient ruins of an alien civilization that could show us Oh, there are, you know, there are forms and signs of life. And guess what's not way, way out there. I mean, it could be but it's right here in our, in our own solar neighborhoods, so to speak. And I think it's something that if we have that, and we can find that out, and we're already sharing it with the world that should tell us something that what what has been found out that isn't, there has maybe enough of a seriousness to it by official, you know, organizations and agencies, militaries, things like that, that are actually looking at stuff under defense secrecy, that can't just outright share it with the world because of, you know, the secrecy issue. And I think that that makes you wonder, okay, if we're sharing stuff like this, and an amateur astronomers, and people think like, all you know, that there are a lot of ideas on astronomy and all this stuff. But astronomy is not one huge Working Body of, of unified people. I mean, you have a group like NASA, but you also have all these other independent space agencies and amateur astronomers, and people who are trying to do this work from all angles, it's not all, you know, a concerted effort that I think, seems still like, have a, you know, the same idea. And it's the same with science in general, as well, people kind of had this idea that, Oh, science says and does this. And so I really liked that. But I think that if you, if you look at the general overview of, of

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the knowledge base that we have of the universe, according to what we're told, and, and the data that we're finding, you know, there's a lot going on in the in, in the galaxy, and the solar system, and all of these things that show, okay, we're finding out new things all the time. And the possibility for life out there is, you know, being the attempt to try to determine and calculate that is an ongoing updating sort of formula. And sometimes that's been referred to the Drake equation, you know, to try to ascertain the number of advanced intelligent civilizations. And I think that if we, we somehow were to find that right here, not just way out there in the universe, but like, right here, literally next door to us. That should tell us something that maybe, I mean, there's probably a connection, it's hard to say that, you know, we were to find that aliens live right next door to us here. But somehow, after all, there's there's no connection at all. And we haven't found anything in the rest of the universe ever. But we just happen to find something right next to us. I think that there's got to be something that would show that okay, if we were finding something that close, we need to really revisit the past revisit what people were telling us, I think is a really good example. A lot of people really find the notion of ancient aliens or paleo contacts, what we call Ancient Astronaut Theory, really interesting and entertaining, because of, you know, media and things now, but one of the biggest proponents outside of Erich Von Daniken was Zechariah Sitchin who's no longer with us, but he wrote a series called The Earth Chronicles, which talks about Nibiru and the Anunnaki.

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And I think it's one of those things that you have to see is

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a big reason why a lot of these ideas were popularized, but he basically tried to translate these ancient Sumerian Mesopotamian tablets and texts that talks about these on inochi gods who came and basically started humanity coming from their own planet, which they called Nibiru, and they use this other nearby planet, which he referred to as Mars as a sort of waypoint to Earth. And if that all is true, and obviously there are some people who are very dismissive of his claims, but let's just say for the sake of this concept that if any of that or anything like what he's suggesting is true at any time.

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Why in our earthly history, that that there's a connection to Mars in the distant past, then maybe some of those things are still detectable, just as we find ancient remains of civilization here on Earth. I think that maybe if Mars is as Earth like, or earth, it says Mars, like maybe as we're told and shown sure, because all the things that we learned about Mars keep continuing to kind of develop towards this idea of it once being very similar to Earth, rather than it being the sort of desolate

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desert of rocks all the time that maybe at one point, I had oceans and, and waterways that we can maybe find traces of now anyway, I think that it's really important to see that if any of these ancient stories are true, and it have any connection to Mars, then maybe some of these things are still out there and tangible and awaiting our discovery,

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or, you know, in a way to really be something that can otherwise change the world in our understanding of what's been going on this whole time, and maybe who we are. And I think there's a lot to that, that helps us see that science in this direction, while oftentimes is is something that most people are we looking at this stuff, or can be dismissive of, I think could probably be the most helpful thing for us to really bring these ideas into the public awareness in the most effective way. Yeah, absolutely. And, you know,

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I was showing up on screen just a minute ago, and I'll show it now in a little bit greater detail, but you did get to handle what you needed to handle. Right, Daniel?

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Well, good. Yeah, we're good. I was showing up on screen just a minute ago, the close up of this quote, portal on Mars.



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And what I was flipping to, was actually the, the portal det irumbu. In, in Peru, and witches, which is like an unfinished doorway carved into the rock

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in in Machu Picchu. So

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interesting. Kind of a similar similar motif there going on with the fact of if it is something carved and it was unfinished, or if it was finished, then perhaps it was made to represent that whole unfinished concept.

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And,



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yeah, I think that we as people, period, have attend to and have a tendency to anthropomorphize things have a tendency to Yeah, and I was just having this conversation with somebody in in Orlando, and the fact of it is very naive of us. And Stephen Hawking was a huge, huge proponent of this, it is naive of us to anthropomorphize, anthropomorphize aliens. And think that, well, sure, we're aspiring to peace as a species, why wouldn't they, they're more technologically advanced, would go? Wouldn't we be better to each other and more peaceful, the more technologically advanced, we get, like in Star Trek? Um, well, that might be us. But that doesn't necessarily mean that the aliens are like that.

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You know, I think that it's something that it's, it's even in the scientific community, it's, there's a big division. Yeah, as you mentioned, Hawking had a very specific viewpoint, whereas someone else, maybe not necessarily on the other end, but like, somewhere on these,



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you know, areas of Yeah, of interests, or ideas or opinions, Sagan would have been sort of on the other persuasion of, maybe we need to try to contact alien life and try to figure this out. Whereas Hawking was an adamant opposer.

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You know, any sort of attempt at contact for good reason. I think they're both valid reasons for both of those ideas. But I think as you mentioned, you know, it's something that we do anthropomorphize these ideas, because we've always done that. And the concept, I think of what we see in the ancient past, with these deities that were told you're from the stars in the sky, people and they come down there, the mothers and fathers of humanity. Yeah. And they come from these places, and they did these things in the heavens.

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You know, and granted, a lot of that could just be something that most people just say, well, that's just, that's just a fun story that they need to tell people okay, if most people think that or most people have this idea of, of mythology and religion and how maybe some things can be historically based or not

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premised, I think of the progenitor or theory, I guess is something that really at you have to weigh in if these people were humanoid, and they were, in some form, bipedal and what we understand, to be sort of human, and the sense of, of what we are,

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I think that makes you wonder, or should make anyone wonder if there's any truth to any of that or there's any reality or factuality to any of that, then we should probably be able to find evidence or make detections of that actuality. And I think that's something that that challenges the idea of like, what Stephen Hawking was also getting as that, you know, we have no business. And this is basically what you're saying, yeah, he would think and others do, they think that we have no business trying to, you know, make into this human idea, anything that's alien, because it probably is not. And that might be the case that we could find life out there that totally

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has a totally different morphology and biology that, that we think, and that's why I think that the whole idea of like an unknown biology is really an important part of what we can learn about here. Because a lot of what we find, really, we are finding subspecies of, of major families of animal groups, it's not often that we find something totally off shoot from, like, main core, animal families. And I think that that's something that, you know, is a possibility. But we have kind of, now at this point, figured out a lot about what's here, in our own biome. I think that if we look at what's possible, and other cosmological biomes that have their own forms of light,

and frequency, and their own sort of planetary resonance that they have to live within, yeah, life could be much different. But at the same time, you know, there are these ideas that have been reported that, you know, maybe humanoid life is not just this weird thing that's happened here, like happenstance, very rare, but it could be a commonality. And that's, that's obviously a curious thought to consider, okay, if all these other people around the world in ancient times were saying the same thing, and they made depictions of that, I mean, yes, maybe some of them were anthropomorphize. But maybe some of them were literal representations. And we have to think, Okay, if we don't just are not immediately dismissive of that, that maybe there's something to that. And if we find the stuff out there, like these doorways, that seemed to be, you know, showing, okay, that there could be something out there, then maybe we need to also look at the other possible ways that this has been expressed in both modern and ancient times.

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Yeah, yeah. Precisely. And how those crossover how There you go, because

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one of the concepts that I bring up regularly on the show, Daniel is imagine being that alien civilization that has been the only thing you have is our transmissions, you have zero frame of references to where they come from, or how they originated. You're just getting all of our radio and TV and everything that's been broadcast since the beginning of broadcast. And it almost becomes I don't know if you're,

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I know you're right up around the same age as me but I don't know if you're as is hip deep in the in the pop culture of the 80s. But if you remember the movie, the Voyagers where the kids build the little spaceship

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and they go up and these aliens that they meet, talk like in TV, everything that they talk about is TV and radio and things like that. And how much of an influence would that have on any culture traveling for like years to get here?

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You know, like that, that is that was literally be unless they happened across the space probe that had the golden discs on it. They gave him some Chuck Berry and stuff.
