How is it that you came into the world of hypnotherapy to begin with, because that is a pretty specified field. But not just hypnotherapy, but hypnotherapy with those who have had contact with other beings. Well, indeed, I mean, it was a bit of a circuitous path. But the first thing I will say that I've pretty much all despite my showbiz career, I've pretty much always been involved with mental health care in some capacity. And, in fact, I put myself through university just by, you know, working at the state mental hospital as a psychiatric aide, and then later as a psychiatric technician, which is kind of

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kind of like a psychiatric nurse. So I have an and you know, I'm so bloody old Chris, I'm glad you've got the good shot of the prepared shot. But anyway.

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But I mean, it was so long ago that there were not even very many psychotropic drugs, they had not yet come out with Prozac. We had a couple things like Thorazine and everybody was over medicated. We still use straight jackets and padded rooms. It was incredibly

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draconian when you think about it, but I, you know, I was always interested in mental health care now. After many years in showbusiness, I began to feel that my you know, my purpose was was empty. I mean, that I wasn't doing what I was supposed to be doing and I mean, it really was a kind of a midlife crisis. Now. I didn't go get a red sports car and get a mistress who are or Mr.

Marbles, or anything like that. But my, my husband who was so insightful, he said, you know, what, I I think it would help you to have a past life regression, which of course, I believe I already accepted that. Completely that that is, that is a possible thing that you can do. Oh, why was it the you accepted that? If you don't mind me asking. I think my interest in metaphysics goes back almost to my earliest memories. And my grandmother was quite interested in metaphysical physics also, and I had read many, many books by that time. From you know, our, our great you know, writers Hans Holzer, and Oh, wow. And, you know, all of the wonderful writers that have been exploring a past lives and past life regression, so I was already into it. So I said, Great. And I went and had this beautiful process. Now

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Although it was fascinating, the biggest thing that I took away from that afternoon was that I

knew I could do that kind of work. I knew it. I think I had done it before. And I think I'd been involved in other healing modalities, but I absolutely knew that I could be a Hypnotherapist. So very soon after that, I took my basic hypnotist course at the Ontario Hypnosis Center, which was probably the most prestigious place to study at the Canada, run by Dr. Georgina Cannon, no relation to a Dolores Cannon. But Georgina Cannon is really my mentor. So

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as soon as I begin practicing, I also took further studies in the areas of past life regression and inter life regression. And

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right after I was certified to do that kind of work,

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I begin just getting people reaching out to me. And I mean, it was almost I mean, I think it's talking about the law of attraction. And at the time, I was working in a very upscale clinic, and about once a month, someone would call in and say, Well, I've got missing time or I drove down the road, I woke up four hours later, my shirt was on backwards, I mean, these kinds of things, people would call in about once a month, and no one else, excuse me in the practice,

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would touch this with a 10 foot pole. And it was my total fascination. So I just all of these Dear souls began getting directed my way instead of being turned down with a perhaps a mocking attitude, you know, so this, so I began seeing individuals and one thing that I will say

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is that, I believe that this phenomena, crosses every racial socio economic,

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religious, spiritual

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barrier, and, but the one thing that, that I believe after all these years, the commonality that all of these dear people have no matter how diverse their upbringings or their their cultural, social attachments, is, they have psychic ability.



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And I think in some cases, the psychic abilities is quite profound, and is even tracked, in a sense generationally, it is not at all unusual to find a family line, particularly the females in the line seem to be better carriers of this particular gene setup. I'm not sure I'm not saying there are not psychic men because There absolutely are. But the, in my experience the preponderance is, is women but at any rate,



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this is what I believe is the great commonality. And now I didn't reinvent the wheel here, I simply adapted existing past life and into life regression techniques taught by Georgina can and by way of Michael Newton, I just did an adaptation of of things that are already tried and true. And I'm very happy to say that I've over the years I've been able to help many individuals



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reclaim their, their belief in themselves as sane human beings and also integrate the experiences. Because, you know, if you remember part of something or something remembered as a child, that's not always going to be an accurate memory. And what we do it's with, in regression processes, it's like, it's like,



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psychological sodium pentathol. Really?



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Now, could somebody fool me? Maybe?



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Have I been fooled? And I think I was fooled twice, but twice and all these more than honest, it's not too bad. Oh, yeah. You know, I mean, there are people that are what we call test proof. They are able to,



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they're able to fool psychiatrists into thinking that they have a normal psyche. I mean, Ted Bundy syndrome. Yeah, I was gonna say, I mean, they're called sociopaths. Yes. And they're gonna pass any test that you give like I say it all the time. I'm I am a former Catholic seminarian. Oh, I spent my first year in college as a Catholic seminarian and stuff



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You go through quite an extensive background check. Yes. before you're allowed in. This was like 1992. Yeah. When I entered 93 and and



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92 when I was going through the process 93 When I went in, but yeah, there was a good three days of psychological examination, like Minnesota, multi-phase nickel, all kinds of things. So yeah, like, if you can pass that kind of stuff, and still be a so suit me like, you're a sociopath. Yeah, literally, literally, these people exist. Dead. Bundy is a classic sociopath. They're often high achievers. scholastically. But they can only maintain their artificial persona for a limited period of time. But, you know, and the question that you posed earlier, you know, I think that it would be very fair to say that not everybody who reaches out to me is an experiencer. And it is my job to determine if that's what's happening, or if perhaps the person is having a psychotic break, or now, in in Canada, and in the United States, as well.



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hypnotherapists are not even ones who have been psychiatric nurses like me, hypnotherapists are not allowed to work with individuals who have been diagnosed with a mental illness. Now, I'm



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not aware of that. That is That is very true. So this is something we have to always be on guard for if doing any kind of hypnosis, weight loss, I mean, anything we have to make sure. So



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generally, what I do is, I have a pretty involved intake when an individual calls me, and we, if possible, we jump on Zoom, but we can just talk on the phone. And after, after a good long talk, I am pretty sure what we're dealing with. And I will always I will always err on the side of caution. Because, you know, the Hippocratic Oath first do no harm. If someone has a very complex psychiatric history, some type of dissociative disorder



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these people are not candidates for regression. So I have to, you know, be really scrupulous. And as I said, if I have even a whiff of a doubt, I will not do a hypnosis process. But I don't just hang these dear people out to dry because I think it's possible to be, I guess, mentally unwell in our terminology, and still be a contactee. Yeah, you know, I don't think that one thing necessarily precludes the other. So thank God, I have some very dear colleagues, who are

psychiatrists, and psychologists and psychotherapists, who are all open to the, to the encounter phenomena. So I will absolutely refer someone on who can legally treat them. That's fantastic, because and

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now, I guess that that would be one part of the question is, of course, how do you how do you suss out who to treat how to be able to treat them things like that? Because, of course, like you said, medically, it could be the fact that you saw some lights in the sky, you have some missing time. This has happened to you a few times, have you had MRIs taken and looked into maybe having petit mal seizures, you know, things like that. And of course, those are the things that you need to make sure have been taken care of and been been looked into prior to doing anything now.

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At what point do you proceed with a past life because

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I had a good friend of the show who is who is a past life. regressor do one on me. And I recorded it. Oh, good. Yeah, very interesting. Some some interesting things occurred. I do not remember a lot about my experience being in there. So it was interesting.

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going back and watching it again.

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How often is it during a first session that

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revelation happens?

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About 99% of the time?

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I mean, now I think a good thing to keep in mind is that the people that come to see me or reach out to me off times I'm you know what we say in the States I'm the last chance Texaco

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Are many of these, really many of these people have been through elaborate neurological testing, MRIs, PET scans, you name it, they've had it done. They've gone into therapy. And, and the therapist says, or the psychiatrist says, well, there's nothing psychologically wrong with you. So I can't dispute this. But you, you know, you're not mentally ill, but they don't believe it. So when someone comes to me, on the first session,

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there are a couple of ways of of going on the journey. Now, I have a little bit of a rule of thumb, and I know so does Kathy Martin and and, you know, the other great people who I know who do this kind of work

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unless someone has at least a partially recalled memory of a, you know, it could be a physical or or astral experience, it doesn't have to be in the third density. But as long as there's a partially recalled memory, that goes a long way with, you know, having me work with them, because I really don't, I really don't go farther unless someone has a series of incidents, or at least one partially recalled memory. And,

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boy, I forgot what I was going to tell you. I got, I got going on the memory thing, and I sort of lost my own memory for a moment here.

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But what we what we find also is that,

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and this may be something you haven't heard yet, Chris, but

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in we're in the era of, you know, the real time mapping of the brain, and it is the most glorious of innovation to have happened during the past couple of centuries, I believe. And there have been, there have been a number of experiments involving hypnosis, and regression, and, you

know, hooking up, you know, an EEG or, or brain mapping or whatever, whatever they're doing, putting on the shower cap with all the little doodads. And interestingly enough, what has been found overwhelmingly, is that when we do regression work, the parts of the brain that are firing are more what I would refer to as the reptilian brain, the amygdala, you know, the ancient brain is the cerebral cortex. And, and also equally interesting is that, oh, I'm gonna sneeze.

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When there is just acceptance and no judgment. Yes. Right. And just one of those true moments of, oh, well, that happened to you. Yeah. Wow. Okay. I understand a little bit more about you now. And you just leave it at that like you don't have to take the conversation further people



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And I think a lot of people are kind of scared of that. Unfortunately, they're scared of that. 80% quantitative that they don't know. Yeah, yeah, no, it is it is 80%. And interesting, you should pull up that figure because I was speaking of Kathy Martin, I was just talking to her not too long ago, and I should probably Oh, lovely gal, I should probably mention that I have been and continue to be one of the hypnotherapists vetted by Kathy to be a part of her experience her research program. Oh, wow. And, and for 10 years, I was referred an awful lot of people through MUFON, both MUFON us and MUFON. Canada, there's not that many of us that do this work. So I am and I have worked a lot remotely too, obviously, especially in our COVID as we pass through that very, very tough COVID time. But I in, in working with these dear people who have come through MUFON, I can really relax about their mental wellness and their and their



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credibility, because they've already been through a experience with a field investigator was asked, you know, all those same kinds of questions. So it was always, it was always



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a wonderful experience to work with these individuals who have come to me through MUFON. And also, I also was part of the free experiencers research program. That was Dr. Edgar Mitchell's organization, it's now run by I believe Ray Hernandez, but I worked with them to but what both MUFON and free found out and this is after 10 years of intensive studies is that 10% of the people had spiritually euphoric wonderful experiences with beings of love or, you know, whatever that involved, it was magnificent. And what about the others? Well, another 10% reported, you know, frightening experiences, and you know, perhaps, you know, having some genetic material taken or some of these things that happened until we got into the 90s and 80s. So as you as you said, 80% of the experiences are, in fact, benign.



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So, they're interesting, but they are benign, there's nothing to be afraid of, nobody gets hurt. And,



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and often in these experiences, you know, the some of the beings that we engage with are very

capable of altering the timeline slightly. So, you know, that's why, you know, when people tell me that they were abducted as little tiny children, you know, my first thought is, well, where, where are the parents? Where's your mother? Why are you running around by yourself in the backyard? And then getting on a craft with this being that you know? Well, I think what happens is when the little children are taken, especially in the daytime, that they have experiences on board the craft, and then the timeline is slightly altered, and they go right back to where they were. And, and that may happen. That may happen a lot. fiddling, fiddling about with space time and doing things at the speed of thought. I mean, forget the speed of light. superluminal light is old news when you're talking about the speed of thoughts. So

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we are just, I believe, Chris, that we are just on the cusp of being accepted into a wonderful and diverse galactic family, intergalactic family, I really feel that and I feel that the beings that are that are speaking through the people I work with are giving messages the beings have become completely disgusted painted with our governments, with all of them. So the disclosure movement is really a grassroots movement. And nothing can stop the internet at this point. And that's how it's, that's how it's happening. And you Chris and any of us that work in this area of of, of people finding comfort and and

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camaraderie, and

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we're the midwives of disclosure. That's who we are. And that's going to be the title of my next book. It's going to be a roundup of a lot of the folks that are working in this unique field. Well in

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I definitely want to get to your next book as well as get to the topic of the seating and how, how it ties in with this. Okay. However,

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I have to ask the question real quick, with your years of working in this movement with your years of working with experiencers of all types, doing past,

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past experience regressions, not even necessarily past life regressions. But bringing these hidden experiences back to the surface for people.



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Are all of the messages Good?



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Are there bad messages? Are there? Are there experiences where people literally were the terrifying experiences founded? You know, because that we just recently had that conversation about near death experiences and the side of it where yeah, like not every come, not everybody comes back from a tunnel of light and love and smells, roses, and their life has changed. There's a lot of people whose lives are wrecked and destroyed.



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And they do not come back with happy messages, they do not come back with happy things, they come back with words of warning.



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Is that the same way in the experiencer community with, with the messages that you have seen people come back with through their regressed sessions?



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Well, I'm going to, I'm going to answer that in two parts, I think.



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Now, I'm sure that you know all about this, Chris. And I don't want to be redundant. But the types of experiences that people have had that have involved, you know, pain in the taking of genetic material, and God knows what was involved in this hybridization program. These are the zeta articulates the same gray hybrid beings that that took Betty and Barney Hill. And we have to go back to Roswell to understand where we are today with all of this. So I think it's important to remember that the Roswell crash was not a single crash, it was just, I believe, three crashes. And there were beings that survived. I believe we brought down the craft with some type of sound weapon, or something like that, that we were experimenting with at the time. And what happened as a result of the recovery of, of these beings, or some of them, is that a deal was brokered. And this is right at the end of World War Two. And as if anyone, any of your listeners are very interested in this period of time, there's a wonderful book called The Day After Roswell by Captain Philip Corso who's now passed, but that's, that lays it all out that I'm just giving you the Cliff's Notes version. So at any rate, there was a deal brokered where these particular ETS is aided particulates would share with us some tech that we could handle, and it's changed. They told Truman and his peeps that they were only going to take a very small amount of

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women and men and because they could no longer reproduce, they needed help. Well, the tech that we got, it's largely believed that that was really the beginning of what we call the secret space program, because the tech was all divvied up to the big superpowers of, of technology, and industrialism. So it's like no Hughes, skunk work. You guys have fiber optics, and you guys over here, you know, over at US aircraft, you've got, you know, you've got integrated circuits and you guys over there in Burbank, you've got Velcro, you know, so,

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you know, but it was, it was divvied up. There was no accountability. And they had basically the military had basically a fake office called the Department of Foreign technology. Well, it was foreign. All right. But I think probably most of the people who was who were working on these new

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you know, amazing developments probably thought it was Russian tech or something like that. I don't think the average guy who was bad Hughes skunkworks was was thinking in terms of ETs. I really don't. So not everybody who's been is is guilty of pulling the wool, right. So

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now this agreement, which involved some of the most terrifying things that I've ever heard, this, this kind of harvesting

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lack of human DNA and procreative material. This was a contract that had an end to it. And in fact, it goes into the Eisenhower era. But my guess is that somewhere around the early 90s, these activities with the data articulates ceased.

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If someone is coming to me and recalls the these type of experiences, it's usually from historically a rather early time in that person's life. So I don't see a whole lot of these really horrible, fearful, torturous things occurring much after the early 90s. Now, another point is that some of the worst things that I've ever heard happening to individuals have happened in what I would call collaborative programs that still exist between various ETs and various aspects of our military. But as far as messages that are coming through from the, from the people that I mostly am working with,



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you know, we've got to clean up our own mess. You know, it's really it's, it's a I know, this isn't very flashy or exciting, but a huge amount of the issues are, that are that people are bringing through our ecological. And this is we apparently this is this is a trial, we have to get it together, we have to use your point energy, we have to stop using fossil fuels, Mother Nature is, is a kind of spirit that's been being violated, I think. And only when we are able to do a few simple things like love our neighbors, we love ourselves and clean up the toxicity of our world. Only then will we be able to hold our scrawny little heads up and you know, interact with the Pleiadians and the Arcturians. And, and, you know, all of the other amazing beings that are already have already passed and survived their technological test. I think it's something every culture goes through Chris, I do. I think the internet and all these things are in a way, like training wheels, because things do function almost at the at the speed of thought, oh, that's almost instantaneous. So I think that every evolved called that's why they have compassion for us. They understand, I think, you know, and



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we say we say evolved culture, but I really don't think that even we as a society lezlie are more than two steps beyond the Pacific Islanders, that bill literally built big bamboo airplanes, thinking that the gods had come and landed for them, and praying for their return for like 50 years. That's right, the carbon coal, we are only two steps beyond that. That's only differences. We know how to use steel, concrete and gasoline. Like yeah, they're really the shittiest stuff. Pardon my French. Well, yeah, but but when I'll get down to it, and I think that this is a lot of the reason why, you know, you you've seen the things in the news about NASA, NASA bringing in theologians into the conversation, and the funding that helping fund that study. Because



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when an if, when endif,



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disclosure, capital D air quotes happens, you know,



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yeah, it's going to be something that whether you've had that come to Jesus in your world or not, your paradigm is going to be 190 degrees, it's going to be totally different. And whether or not you know, we've talked a lot on this show about whether or not the disclosure that we are seeing right now is really more our technology, and being done quite literally, like they just did in the congressional hearing where the first thing that pops up is national defense.



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National Defense fear, we need to make sure that this thing isn't attacking well. Well, have you tried communicating with them and asking them what their intentions are? Oh, no, absolutely not. Oh, well, literally their answer, like hey, you know, Have you have you even warn them like hey, just so you know, coming into us airspace coming in a little hot? Yeah, my name's James, what's yours? No, sir. We haven't. What? Well, yeah. Well, I don't believe any of that. You know, I really don't we have to parallel

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All space programs going and military programs going there are trillions of dollars that have been leached out of the US Treasury by this duplicitous thing. And this insulting thing of us being treated like children, that we cannot accept a mathematical probability that there are other beings and that they've engaged before. And, you know, think about the media that is now I mean, ancient, ancient aliens has been one of the top shows for like, 16 years, I have more faith in people that that we can learn and accept and grow. And especially when they you know, when people are able to see that many of our many of our cousins look so much like us, and I'm personally of the viewpoint that we have a lot of Pleiadians and other people just walking around, just just, you know, preparing, helping doing whatever they can do. But so, as far as our, you know, I'm going to call it the Godspell you know, our desire to venerate a being this is these are old Annunaki.
