And we ended up having mike on and we ended up having RAM Denison on who helped him produce the documentary money machine. Mike has some I don't know if he can announce the news about things working on on other ends of that right now. But here in a minute. We're gonna get with Mike turbot, we're going to we're going to kind of go back over the events of the route 91 festival shooting and all of the aftermath afterward the the hashtag Vegas strong campaign, the missing millions from the hashtag Vegas strong campaign, the rampant cover ups within the sheriff's department, all kinds of things, just huge missteps. And the fact that there is still nothing on record as far as motive with the FBI. They just kind of dusted their hands on it. Well, yeah, we're done. On to the next. That was that was an area of contention for all of the law enforcement. That was, you know, and doing the investigation, what have you lvmhd But primarily, the job of determining the motive was kind of pushed off to the FBI, who then subsequently pushed it off to the Behavioral Analysis Unit, the Bau, who subsequently pushed it off to some other people that they hired to come in and do a analysis of the data that was there to determine what the motive was. And I decided to do the same thing determine what the motive was, but for me, instead of going through data and trying to pick, you know, trying to get into the mind, I tried to get in the mindset of whoever's doing whatever so I can kind of do Get a feel for, for why something was done or how something was done. Or if there's some questions that weren't answered. If you get in the mindset, like, you'll even pace the number of steps, going from his room, back to the elevator, or back to the service elevator to determine which one was truly faster, you know, all these different holes, you go through your mind. But in this case, because it was so well publicized, that there was no motive, there was no note left concrete as as a couple of the conspiracy theories where there was, you know, some things looked around, but there was no note left. No one was called, you know, no one was texted messages, even saying goodbye or anything. And there was no real indicator that this was going to happen. And as that kind of went along with the theme, so to speak, after the shooting of and the police still have no motive, and it just continues on, and that makes people worried as well as they should be. Because when you don't know the motive, it doesn't really solve the crime. It doesn't tell you why the crime was, you know, happened. And since you don't have the motor, then you can't figure out how to prevent something like this to happen in the future. Yeah. But that being said, I decided to contact the theaters brother, Eric. And, and lo and behold, he contacted me back. He had a reporter that he was utilizing in Las Vegas at the time, that for one reason or another he lost favor to and unfortunately, that reporter was murdered two weeks ago. Yeah.

And I met him a couple of times, you know, we didn't like, you know, go out and hang out or anything like that. But I've met him a couple of times, and talked to him on the phone a few times. And nice guy, everything was really cool. But for whatever reason, Eric did not want to. I mean, I know the reason, for whatever reason, we'll just leave it at that. Eric did not want to utilize him as a go to person for you to talk to you about different things that may be going on or what have you. And you kind of wanted a conduit to media, but not necessarily that organization. So anyway, long story short, I ended up fulfilling that role. But I mean, it said, when an investigative journalist, which is obviously pretty much where I am to feel like I am but I kind of like do is taken out like that. And you start to look at like how many cases you've worked on that. You know, there might be some people out there that might go after you but the I've never had that fear. I've never like, had that. And I get I mean, Jeff was apparently exposing this person for all the transgressions that he allegedly did. And I guess it got to be too much. Now, maybe business suits. You know, so that has not really gone away, you're sure that stories about somebody taking someone out to the desert and blah, blah, blah. And yeah, and that's pretty much the city that you would get first comes to mind when I think that but you know, my thoughts, everything goes out to Jeff and

family and, and it's just a sad situation to to have that happen. But it does kind of make you stop for a moment and think that you might want to be more careful in the future about not necessarily what you say, because I'm gonna report. You know, I have no filter when it comes to doing that I'm gonna report when I see. And but you know, might be a little bit more cautious about how I, you know, hanging around places or having a

Then we had you on and really started breaking down the timeline of things that happened because that's that's where things get wonky. That's where things really start going crazy, is the literal timeline of response of the Las Vegas Sheriff's Department.

Yeah, and how how that information eventually got out is even a little bit more bizarre in some ways, depending on which side of the fence you're on here. But you know, once once you

started looking at the timeline and watching the press conferences, that happened after the fact. You would, you could tell there's something going on here. Tucker Carlson actually stated that when Catherine Lombardo was on his show, showing the video that I required, you know, the CCTV footage, he stated that it appears as though MGM is managing the timeline. And in court captain says that's almost exactly you couldn't have said it any better. And that seemed to be the case. And the question is, why wouldn't you? You know, we know the shooting happened. Everyone knows the audio of the shooting. So you can't argue when shot started when they stopped or anything like that, because it was quite clear to everyone in what was going on. But the internal situation, whether or not their security could have prevented this was the big issue. And that's when Things started moving around the timeline didn't did the shooting start at 1005. It started 959. Did you know what when did that extra start was it got so we're not internal down the hallways may not have been heard outside and in post. Hey Soos Campos when he was when he noticed the door had been had a hinge put on it or basically prevented him from coming through that door on the stairway. And that's when his timeline essentially started up something was wrong. And he radioed back and he came back down the hallway. And then of course, he gets shot out and gets grazed on the on the leg or thigh or whatever. But there was a lot of questions to that, as to what time was that? And if he would have done something at that moment, could that have been prevented? That's a \$64 million question that we'll never really have a good answer to. But it did bring up some other areas of contention. And that take down the line. What other pieces of the timeline? Are there questions about? And then why would there be questions about it. And that's when you saw the conferences. And that's when Laura Loomer who I was had done some stories with and she had some information on different times of things happening. And Sheriff Lombardo basically points out into the depressed area of where he was doing the conference and pointed towards her and asked her to stop asking her question. Of course he felt he she was interrupting a different person's question. But that whole tone. That day demeanor of the sheriff changed from the first time when he did his conference, which is right at the scene. And he basically calming everyone down, saying the of course you use the term we engage the shooter, which to me means that they shot the shooter, but apparently, obviously that was not correct. But he calmed everyone down and was very, very well spoken. And then the next one, he seemed a little bit off. And then the next one, it seemed a little bit more often almost seem like it wasn't him talking. It was almost like he was trying to remember what he needed to say properly, to convey whatever message was needed to be conveyed. And of course, standing right behind him was FBI, the local SAIC, Special Agent Aaron Ross. And so and, and you're like you always see him in the background, hearing down Sheriff Lombardo while he's doing his his press conference. And you wonder what is going on here? You just don't see this anywhere else? Yeah, you know, I don't know about you. But I've never seen a conference where it seemed like the guy behind him is really intent on making certain that he says the right thing. But yeah, there's there's so many this is not only is the largest shooting mesh in US history, it also created a bunch of conspiracy theories, because the information was not coming out. Not necessarily fast enough, but even accurate enough. And that, you know, when you don't have answers to questions, what happens is, is invariably people will start answering those questions themselves, or whatever, you know, whatever reason, and that's when we had multiple shooters, we had, you know, people shooting from helicopters, we had, you know, a guy was, you know, that you had Mike Adams in the new nutrient and nutritious guy, nutritious army, whatever, whatever his name was. Yeah, you know, making claims if I have the location of the second shooter, and he pulls out what appears to be a decent math scenario, which calculates the distance to the shooter, where he is and stuff like this, but it was, it was all wrong. And, yeah, it basically that puts fear in people because the issue I had because, and I don't mean to, like take over his job, because I'm just rambling now, but no, and, you know, the issue I had was that someone they know the shooter, as is gone, by whatever means whether they shot

him or whether he shot himself either way, that there's a certain comfort level, they're saying, Okay, well, the guy, and there's no one else. But when you start introducing new theories, multiple shooters, and of course, a lot of people had legitimate questions. I think you probably did too, at that time, because a lot of people just know, but they also weren't into the evidence, like some of the some of the others were, but at the same time, a lot of people didn't know what the answer was. And so the fear are of these people out there that were, you know, capitalizing on the multiple shooters theories. They basically were scaring people in Vegas, because they thought, wow, there's this, there's people still out here wanting to kill us for whatever reason. And that put a lot of people in fear I literally had someone called me. They were in a parking lot of a grocery store. And helicopters were flying overhead. And they were in full panic. And they asked me directly, because I you actually know them too. They asked me directly is, are these the helicopters? Or did they shoot from helicopters? Just let me know if you don't lie to me. And please tell me the truth. And I told them, you know the truth and what have you to calm them down a little bit, because helicopters had that form that direction before where they were where they were living? Yeah. And it was different. So and I get it. But yeah, last week, it changed my life. And obviously a lot of lot of others and you know, it. Good.

In that, and that's when you had, you know, sis LAC and Jerusalem Bartow basically pieced that together along with others. And the funds that were I think it was a round 12 million or something along those lines. And the funds were eventually dispersed. And, and I have the amounts that were, you know, a lot of people received, but, and I don't want to get into that, because I don't want anybody to know, the dollar amount. But the people eventually did receive the funds, but not in a timeframe that they actually needed it. They made it sound like

that was going to be an emergency fund something set up to help people like if they're, if they're about to be evicted, or if you know, their car, any situation that, you know, caused them to be in a financial predicament was supposed to be helped by this fund. And I'll never forget listening to one of the the women it's on the documentary, The documentary money machine, where she's talking about, you know, she needed her rent then and she was she lost her child was probably, you know, I don't want to get into their personal things of it. But it was a devastating time for this person. And they were losing things they were, you know, one they had PTSD, it was very difficult for them to get back to normalcy. This is not something you snap out of, you know, it's it's a devastating thing that people go through. And then people react to it differently. And some people shut down a little bit, and it's very difficult to get back to things as normal. And that was an issue as to why are these funds being dispersed in a timely fashion? Where are the funds, and then the funds got mingled in with another fund, and it got convoluted and of course, questions went out. What did he use this for his campaign? Yeah, there's a lot of questions about that. But

Put out Vegas strong firm plays page 12 Las Vegas shooting victims then stops And you can see right here, one of the 12 people who received settlement checks of \$14,800. Checks ranging in in amounts from 200 to 3900. Is what was put out, but 12 people out of \$22 million? Yep, that 2 million collected 12 People got checks out of that fund,

which means that basically should have gotten close to almost \$2 million apiece, but when you see the check them out 14,000. Where did the rest of the money? Where's that accounting it? And eventually, it came around, because after that article, the more funds were dispersed. But the problem is, there's a look at the timeline, look at the data, that article. Yeah. So if you, if you calculate how long before someone starts knocking on your door wanting to rent, or you know, your car payment, or maybe your some of these were financially in issue beforehand. And this is exacerbated. But you know, the bigger picture here is obviously, many lost their lives, husbands lost their wives, wives lost husband, people, children, and so forth. And the whole, you know, in the whole scheme of things, there were 60 wives 58, were lost that nine to additional. And some people may argue about whether or not that should be included in the total or not. But I'm going to include it in the total, because I think it stems from those injuries, whether they're physical or not physical injuries doesn't matter. And they're gone. Yeah. And it's all can be traced back to how a person was treated. The motive? Yeah, that's what everyone wanted to know, what was the reason and for some, the reason doesn't add up. The Bau hired 25, different professional, capable, and different categories. They had therapist, psychologist and stuff like this, to look at the evidence and determine what they felt the reasons were. And they came out with a report. Now, if you remember, if you if you look at the reports that have come out over say, say Sandy Hook, Parker's or, or halt and so forth, those reports are are detailed, they're lengthy, and the and the FBI gets into a lot of different details. They go deep on this one, this report from the FBI was two and a half pages. Whereas some of these other ones were like 1800 pages, 1600 pages, but at the same time, not in defense of the FBI. They were not the lead. As far as the actual investigative arm, it was actually the Ivmpd. So Ivmpd came up with a third report, which covers a lot of the bases, they had a lot of errors.



And what the FBI came out with was come out with the motive and they came out with this ad hoc, top 10 list. It was almost like watching a late night show, and the top 10 reasons why Steven paddock went out and blah, blah, blah, you know, yeah. And for me, it just rubbed me wrong. I know it rubs every everyone I know it was it was wrong. Yeah, you got it on screen. So when you go down the list, it's so obvious things. And it's some things that me and Eric agree with. That was the motivation. And some of the things that just don't really, you know, they don't factor in. But the main reasons were, he was when he was going to Lake Tahoe. He was basically a much bigger fish, so to speak in a smaller font, that's where Eric put it. And so he got treated very well. And he gambled lots of money. And that got him the cops. Bam, stay there and have friends and family and all this other stuff.

And he would know that if he played X amount of money, the odds are that he should hit a certain amount. And he may come out ahead, he may come out even. But either way, he was still ahead in his mind, because of all the comps and he lived, he lived like a king and his queen, because the Queen happened to be the host he had when he was in Lake Tahoe. And that was part of the damage. So when he would go to Vegas, he would expect these things. And when they started looking at him and saying, You know Mr. XR, we know you're in the tournament, blah, blah, blah, like, and we're not going to give you the three times points or, you know, they're sort of taking things away from him. I didn't know exactly what to do. But that's all doors are open the door and they're always on the 32nd floor. Yeah. And so, and I did that like 60 times. But I did it 27 times and finally took Laura Loomer with me. We put that on the local Fox News. But in doing that, not one was I ever approached by anyone ever and asked, Hey, what are you doing? We even brought up some of my Pelican cases which are classic cases that people would bring weapons up in and methods, not a word. So and why and the reason why that's important. At the time I did it was it was in January, as well after the shooting, and on November 17, Mandalay Bay, or MGM, but I noticed that since everyone was talking about the surface elevation, and how we got the weapons to the room, they would have guards at each of

the elevators. I never saw a guard, there was never a guard at the elevator, the service elevators, they put the guards at the actual guest elevators, which is not where he went to looking for weapons. Use a service elevator. There's a lot of cases that you brought there as 24 weapons were brought to the room. You know, so you're looking at all and only one was a pistol. So all the rest of the rifle so they're relatively large weapons plus 1000s of rounds of ammunition which which is very heavy. And he took the Bellman you know, 100 bucks to actually help him take the stuff to the room. And this is after they had a situation in 2013 I think I'm pretty sure it's 2013 a man I can't remember his name. I think his last name switches on or something like that. Another person had gotten what weapons into the room and a housekeeper walked in the room and noticed that there was a rifle there and then you know, that person got caught. So it wasn't like MGM or Mandalay Bay did not know that it's possible that people would be bringing weapons if the room and they and they supposedly put security measures in place that would handle that but obviously it didn't work on

And I believe I'm the one that found the last shot, the suicide shot. needle in a haystack to find that thing, but that was important. The attorneys needed that. And I heard from sources reps got it. So 1016 and 16 seconds is basically the last guy and then you go all the way to, you know, 11, whatever the time was, when they breached the room. That timeframe is a long time. Yeah. And they were officers were on the floor during the shooting. So with officers on the floor, the same floor he's on during the shooting, or the floor below. And in the case of a couple officers. What was going on the when you have an active shooter? What's supposed to happen, or what most of its most training scenarios play out, is that if you have an active shooter, you go to the shooter and you take them out no matter what there is no, there's no other protocol, there's no second guessing there's no thinking of you know, who cares? who's in the room with him? Who cares if he has a hostage at that moment? Yeah, this guy is shooting indiscriminately into a crowd below him from an elevated position, which is, which is like the most perfect scenario that you could play out for theater, to be in an elevated position with a whole bunch of people, and just shooting randomly, which a lot of people thought he was, you know, expert marksman or something like that. But now he used to literally just spraying the bullets down and hit a rather large percentage of people, which I agree is rather bizarre. But that's what happened. And during the shooting, those officers could have advanced, but was loosely except for one major officer who happened to be one of the training officers who had a trainee with him. Officer Hendricks, who froze on the floor just below in the

31st floor. And you see this on their their the body worn camera of the trainee, I believe is and who has the body worn camera. Yeah. And you can see him panicking on that floor. I don't have a direct issue with someone freezing, I don't have a direct issue with with essentially all of the motions that probably went through this person's mind to cause him to do that. That doesn't mean all the rest of the officers are going to have the same way. It's just like it's good Oregon. That's what the firm shellshock comes from where the heroes is the sounds and what's going on and the possible impending doom of their life, you know, as a whole, the whole scenario plays out in front of and then they just, and then, you know, there's not, but this officer is the turning up. And it caused all of the people that were around him, like he was believed to basically stop as well. But, you know, it can be argued whether or not that would have made a huge difference. Katherine and I looked at that, that volley of shots, and basically in our mind was said, you know, if they would have just distracted him, or garbage came down the hallway, but a couple of shots to go through the door, anything. And even though if there was a hostage on the other side, you know, you've got maybe a hostage in there, but you've got hundreds of people that are being shot at you so someone has to make that call. But that was that was not done. That wasn't the case. And and then of course, there was SWAT was nowhere to be found that the SWAT team that eventually made the breach into the room was an ad hoc team put together. A couple of people weren't even actual SWAT but Las Vegas had just the month prior or a couple of months prior, had announced that their SWAT team was one of one of the best trainers country and was on the Ready 24/7. And you and I've been around Vegas quite a bit, you know where that that South Station is? And how long a you and I could walk to Mandalay Bay from that station? Well, within the timeframe of the shooting, yeah. And so that, that wasn't done. But anyway, so much happened.

Till we find a planet that's water, we ain't gonna find life, not as we know it. We might find silica based, we might find something else. But life as we know, it does not exist without water. So we're looking for a planet with water. Gotta be at least half water like, bam, there it is. Like, yeah, it exists. It's out there. Like that is literally within the last week, September 13. That article came out.

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And I think that that's a way of preparing us.
