So, what was it that first brought you into the world of cryptozoology? And because there is it's, it's an interesting place. And and it's a very, very interesting community. I've had the great pleasure of visiting a lot of communities over the last year and there there really is nothing like the cryptid community.

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Well, you know, I got interested as a kid, you know, I was into weird shit. And, you know, cryptozoology falls under the heading of weird shit I believe pretty well. And so, you know, I, I had a, you know, I was into, you know, dinosaurs as all you know, kids back in the 60s were but you know, dinosaurs and just into weird stuff, you know, ghosts and UFOs and, and monsters, you know, I read all those eerie and creepy and you know, all those you know, and movie monsters all those things as a kid and, and, you know, it gets my interest in cryptozoology itself get started with, you know, a creature that was seen by hundreds of people. The summer of 1969 on the front page of The Four Star Telegram, July 10. And July 11, you know, we're talking 10 days before man landed on the moon the first time, wow. Or, or, or or faked it in a movie studio, whatever you Who your thought process is, but you know, that was the front page story in the four paper about this creature but like worth monster, and so my grandparents knew I was into weird stuff. So they saved those newspapers for me they lived in Fort Worth, I lived in the Dallas area. And so I was fascinated with that. And, you know, found a book by a local lady about a month later that wrote a self published book about it. You know, then I got a copy of John keels book, strange creatures from time and space about a year later with awesome Frank Frazetta artwork on the cover and, and then a couple years after that, I saw the legend of Boggy Creek in the theater when it you know, get its national, nationally distributed run, you know, in 1973, it came out, it's matter of fact, just two months ago was the actual 50th anniversary of the premiere. in Texarkana, and then the next night in Shreveport, August, I think 16th and 17th or 17th and 18th of 72. So, you know, it was just two months ago, the 50th anniversary of the legend of Boggy Creek, and, you know, all those events combined to just set me on this path, you know, of the weirdness.

Yeah, I mean, the site premiered. I believe it was September 27 2005. That post of mine about you know, the search for the rebuild woodpecker, which, you know, there's different aspects of cryptozoology, you know, you know, animals that are ethno known and not known science, but, you know, native populations know them formally extinct. Animals that are rediscovered, as

well as you know, the big ones, you know, Bigfoot, the Yeti, Loch Ness Monster, all those things. So there's, you know, it's a study of, of hidden or unknown animals and, you know, some of those other things are lumped in with it, you know, the reemergence of a previously extinct animal. I mean, you know, Lauren, Coleman's creature of choice for the International cryptozoology Museum is a coelacanth, which was discovered 65 million years after it was thought to have been extinct. Yeah. So there's, you know, many different aspects of cryptozoology. It's not all just Bigfoot and the Loch Ness monster.

Oh, yeah, absolutely. I mean, one of them that I'm bringing up right now is the the deer that was found with with flaps on its nose.

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Yeah, and that a month, muntjac or something like that?

Yeah, it was nice. Yep. Yep. And, you know, naturalists had been in the jungles for years, stuff like that. And locals talked about it and they were like, okay, yeah, what, whatever. And sure enough, there it was.

Well, you know, before pre 1902, the mountain gorilla was, you know, the same thing. It was known to the natives, but it wasn't cataloged by science. It wasn't known to, you know, outside populations other than the than the natives until I don't remember the gentleman's name but you know, actually shot and drug one out. I mean, you know, it was stories about a huge, hairy, man like creature, you know, not that far, unlike Bigfoot or Sasquatch, known to the locals, but unknown to others. So I mean, you know, there's still new animals being discovered 1000s and 1000s of species every year. Now, the majority of them are fish, you know, or are reptiles or amphibians or insects, but every now and then, you know, a good sized mammal. gets drug out into the light of day. And, and everybody is shocked that, you know, because science is, you know, pretty, you know, they're pretty arrogant as far as you know, they know everything. Well,

sure. And I mean, there there have been more than 500 species in 2021. As a matter of fact 500 species were were discovered, including beetles and all kinds of stuff. But that is just the round number of what was found in one year. And that hey, that was still a pandemic year, you know? So, when

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no telling how many, how many species got killed off by COVID that we didn't even get to discover before they were extinct? Oh, absolutely.

And and even the fact that a recent fossil find is possibly what they might think is like the Loch Ness Monster, a longneck reptile that lived in freshwater. You know, that's absolutely new here. In the last year, we have had the discovery of Dragon Man. Which, which was, you know, just talking about Bigfoot type of stuff that was literally a human that was seven plus feet tall. Yeah, with with the cranial size, about twice the size of a normal person. So like, these things existed? Yep. At one point, and, you know, we've had the conversation on the show, we've had the conversation privately, to me, it's, especially whenever you're talking about indigenous populations around the world, many of whom their, their histories are oral and fairly well unbroken. That they still talk about them in some of them American tribes talk about Sasquatch, like, they trade with them, they leave things for them, Sasquatch leaves, things for them, you know, all kinds of stuff, right?

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You're correct, sir.

So what was it that made you want to start actively doing events? Because event events it and really something that a everybody, everybody necessarily excels at? A fantastic job, by the way. Thank you, sir. I have yet to not enjoy one of your events. But what was it that wanted you to, I guess, start bringing people together to begin with?

Well, you know, the, it's not that far removed from why I started, you know, co founded a research organization. You know, I wasn't an outdoorsman, I wasn't a hunter. I wasn't a wildlife tracker. I wasn't a wildlife biologist. I wasn't any of those things. I was somebody that happened to have an experience that I couldn't explain away. And so decided to try and get answers. Like I said, it wasn't any of those things, but I had experience and expertise in organizing things. And so I organized an organization and built it, you know, with chess pieces that had skills that I did not have, you know, from military, law enforcement, wildlife biologists, you know, scientists, trauma surgeons, you know, just wildlife trackers, people that had skills that could, you know, fill in the empty spots from, you know, well, because I didn't have those skills. But I assembled a team that had those skills. And so, you know, I attended a Bigfoot conference in Ohio, of all

places in 2000. And, you know, I was very fresh, you know, getting into the Bigfoot world, very fresh and telling about my experience. And I felt accepted and welcomed. And, you know, I thought, you know, there's nothing like this going on in Texas. I bet that I could do this, and that I can put on a conference. And so I, you know, started planning and after attending the first one, it was in April of 2000. And then I attended that event, the next year in 2001. March or April. And I had already, you know, put the wheels, the wheels turning on my event, my first event which ended up taking place on September 15 2001, which was four days after 911. And we had speakers like Lauren that were unable to fly in. But we had, you know, cast and crew of local people to Texas that could, that were already scheduled to speak I had an amazing gentleman who passed away a couple of years ago, Dr. John fender Naugle who is, was a wildlife biologist that lived on Vancouver Island, and had been looking into Sasquatch since I believe the late 60s early 70s. And a degreed wildlife biologist, and he didn't fly. So he was he made like a five week road trip on the way down, we're talking, you know, on the ferry getting on the ferry on Vancouver Island, and taking the ferry over to the mainland and driving all the way down, and stopping and interviewing Bigfoot witnesses the whole way down, just potted his course. And so he was here. And he was he spoke at the first two events. And then again, in 2009, he spoke 2001 2002 and 2009. And, unfortunately, I believe it was 2018 when he passed away, but he was the most humble, genuine person I've ever met in Bigfoot, Sasquatch research. And so we the first year was a success. We have about 130 people that showed up four days after 911. And so we, you know, built from there co curated a couple of museum exhibits including one with the University of Texas that I co curated that our organization participated with two at the University of Texas San Antonio, one of their campuses is a museum that was built for the 1968 World's Fair, the Institute of texts and cultures and we did a 2000 square foot Bigfoot exhibit that was titled Bigfoot in Texas question mark. And it was very, very, very popular that summer we also did four half day conferences where we brought in people from all across the all across the country to speak at this event. From Loren Coleman to Jeff Meldrum to Jimmy Chilcott to we brought Peter burnin was kind of a homecoming for him because his Tom slick, a Texan who had funded the expeditions that that Peter Byrne first did in the in the Himalayas in Nepal, looking for the Yeti. Tom slick brought him over to the Pacific Northwest to lead those expeditions in the late the late 60s. Early Well, the early 60s. He was in the Paul in the late 50s Looking for the Yeti. And we had a at that event, which was really cool. Tom slicks nice had written a biography of Tom slick, and she did a book signing there. So we were able to put them her and Peter Byrne back together after many, many years. And like I said, it was very successful. So the conference last year was the 20th anniversary event. So I guess, wow, this year is the 21st annual the 21st annual event. So you know, it's still going strong attendance is down this year. You know, we've got tickets available. If people are listening to this and interested in they can find the information on Facebook, you probably linked stuff. And there are still tickets available. We've got a great lineup, we've got a great event plan, as always, with some cool information to be distributed. We're Chester Moore is bringing a young a young boy in that disadvantaged boy to that we put together a package for him to be able he you know, dreams about Bigfoot, he's going to come and and we're going to present him with a bunch of Bigfoot related gifts and he's going to be there for the conference. And that's just one of the things that Chester Moore does with his You know, in his set, you know, he's got several organizations higher calling and, and the ones were, I forget how many kids that they've, that they've gifted my memory doesn't serve me right at the moment to remember what that what that's called but you know, it's similar to other organizations that, you know, take kids to Disneyland, Chester does, you know, wildlife events with these kids that, you know, lost a parent or, you know, have have a terminal illness or such and, and so he's going to be bringing this young young boy and and, you know, treating him to the conference and Chester will probably talk a little bit about what he does. But so there's gonna be all kinds of cool stuff. Cool. You know, there's Lyle Blackburn perennial at the conference. My best friend

just wrote a book that I should have written years ago, but I'm a procrastinator, and he's not. So he wrote the Texas Bigfoot book, but you know, I did write the foreword for it. So he's going to be signing it, he's going to be signing and selling those. So you know, if you're real nice, and maybe slip me a five or so I'll sign your copy of it as well, if you buy one since I, since I wrote the full horse. Yeah, so there's gonna be all kinds of cool stuff going on. We got catered dinners, we got special presentations, we got, you know, just all kinds of cool stuff going on.

Once again, an amazing community of people that you've really helped bring together to know that. And there is someone who works in the event industry. It's not often outside of maybe a corporate event that you have a 20th anniversary. You know, like even Lollapalooza didn't last for 20 years.

You know, you can't you can't just have it like a scientific university lecture, because that's not going to draw a lot of interest. Just like, you know, finding Bigfoot and Expedition Bigfoot aren't necessarily you know, what Bigfoot research is really high. Because if the TV shows would never exist, it was about real Bigfoot research because a bunch of people sitting around, you know, with audio gear listening for stuff to happen. Yeah, when nothing's happening, because the majority of it not so you know, you gotta, you gotta spice it up, you have to put in, you know, you have to tell, you know, have some eyewitness accounts in there because people, you know, it's in October, people want to hear scary stories. And, and yeah, you know, but when I hear the eyewitness accounts, they want to see people seen on TV and stuff like that, you know, you can just have a very dry scientific lecture. Oh, yeah. And it's not going to appeal to the general public.

this last year, my wife came with me. And we overheard somebody as we were getting our vendor badges and sponsor badges that oh, this is this is no alien code. It's like well, no, it's not. This is like, like right now. They've got an eight hour long field training going on for field investigators man like this. It can go stand in line to get your picture taken with Giorgio sucralose. No offense to Giorgio Tsoukalos amazing researcher absolutely has to earned a lot of spotlight to a field of research Most definitely. But how do you how do you feel? Shows like that have impacted? Not only research, but I guess the public view of the research? Well, it's

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definitely brought it brought to the forefront to the public. I mean, sure, you know, kids love that. You know, you hear stories about kids going out on their back porch at night and doing their Bigfoot calls and stuff. And, and, you know, if, you know, us old guys are dying off, you know, you got to have new blood, you got to bring new blood and continue the study continue, you know? And, you know, like I said, These shows are not tailored to Bigfoot researchers, because first of all, there only be 5000 people watching, and there'd be no advertising money. So there would be no show. I mean, it's got to appeal to a broad spectrum of people, especially kids. And that's what it does. And, you know, the Bigfoot researchers, piss and moan about oh, you know, giving a bad reputation to Bigfoot research. Well, like I said, if it was real Bigfoot research, nobody would watch.

And yes, I think that the shows have definitely if anything, your ancient aliens, expedition, Bigfoot paranormal files, what have you, they have definitely turned a light for people's awareness of the topic and to possibly not ridiculing so outright. So I think if anything, it's open to that channel of understanding with their fellow person who, whenever they bring it up it like, oh, you're a crazy bird. Right. Which is, which is an important thing. You know, we have to make sure that we as people are open minded enough to hear somebody's story. Here's somebody's account. Whether that involves Bigfoot coming out of a portal or Bigfoot coming and stealing the hot dogs from their picnic table at night, you know? Sure. Because until we find out everything, you should try to throw everything at the wall and see what sticks. Well, and you know, that is that more important than then a lot of people may Eli's actually Craig, going around to a lot of these conferences, not just the conferences you put on, and other folks like the Southeast Texas Bigfoot. But going to the remote viewing Association going to going to the near death studies conference and a couple of others. The people that run these things, the people that are in charge of them, yeah, are literally just under the first rung of people doing the research. You know, so they're getting on up and yours. And when you look around the room, there aren't a whole lot of like, early mid 30 folks bopping around, you know, there's a lot more at that I've noticed at the paranormal conventions, and, and the cryptid conventions, then there are at like, the remote viewing Association, things like that. But to, to bring the younger generation in is what we need to be able to sustain the research for a long period of time. Because, yeah, I mean, I think right now is really, even though there's been research going on for decades now. Right, I don't think it's to the extent cooperatively that it is now and I don't think that there have been scientists of open mind, let's say, until now. And we have some, you know, some some, there's been some great work done out there. And even I'm trying to remember the scientists that that studies all the footprints, that is like, No, these are, this is a real thing. And we need to look into it. So it's nice to see that happening now. And it's taken decades for it to get to that point. And much like any science, it takes decades to get anywhere with it. So yeah, we'll we'll see what happens. I am I am excited for the future and where we're going with things where even technology is bringing us even drone technology, things like that. Because once again, most of those sightings at least here in North America. There's quite a few in the Big Thicket, region, things like that here, but the majority of them hover up around that big, dark, deep spot that you look at in a night map of the United States, you know, sure. So the fact that yeah, there aren't really people going there makes a big difference. So I hold out the fact that, yes, I believe that there is a large hominid species. There's too much anecdotal evidence for it. Whether or not we will find evidence, whether or not evidence will be accepted. That's a different story. Yeah, I want to thank you for coming on tonight, Craig. It's always a pleasure talking with you. Before we let you go, one last chance for shameless self promotion. 

Tell us a little bit about the property, the history and the mystery behind the place.

Sure, so it's got a lot of strange history to it. And apparently, there's a lot of active energy in the area regarding some kind of paranormal phenomena and a lot of unexplained things that happens when people go and do these investigations, as many shows have gone and actually tried to capture some evidence of and so it's been featured on a number of different television shows, and, you know, paranormal shows things like this, but that the Haunted Hill House itself has really been in, it's in Mineral Wells, it's been sort of a, a place where a lot of strange things have occurred since about the 50s, where it had connections with the baker hotel. And a lot of the people who are involved, were doing some underground work and kind of shady business with a brothel. And a lot of the ladies that paid there were not in the best condition, and they were not treated very well. And a lot of them ended up having kids that were taken, or had some really traumatic things going on. So that plays a big part into the history, the apparent activity that people described. And so this house has two stories, you know, got a downstairs and upstairs and I'd say probably some weird crawl spaces, attics, and maybe even underground tunnels, it seems to connect in some way, maybe even to the baker motel. So I first really heard about it, I guess a few years back, and it's been featured through media and things but I hadn't really ever been and really kept up too much with it. And as I mentioned, I am interested in the unexplained and paranormal things, but, and I have a lot of friends who are into paranormal investigations. And I think it's all very fascinating. But it's probably one of those areas I haven't done a whole lot of field work in and field investigations in. So I figured not only would be really cool to finally get a chance to come out to a really historic type of place. But a few friends of mine had been involved at this location for a number of years. And this would be teal Gray, and Martha hazards Decker and a number of other people who have gone and written about the history and been a part of this whole place for a while and bringing teams in. So the the owners and caretakers are some of the ones who basically, you know, invite people let people rent it out. And basically have them come and see what they can experience over the night. And so yeah, throughout the 50s and kind of coming up to the modern era. It had a lot of trauma, traumatic events, it seems to be inhabited by the spirits of the ladies and maybe some of their children and possibly even more than just deceased people. Some seem to think that maybe there are entities there as well that are not human and that it could actually have some What some people say is demonic presence. So pretty creepy stuff going on a lot of strange activity history, a lot of historic and antique objects, artifacts, things like that they've collected to kind of bring in. And I think that adds a little bit of concentration to the energy there. So pretty, pretty bizarre type of setting, but all the different rooms in the Haunted Hill House have a different theme. And so people can come in and choose to stay in different rooms, we've got all kinds of places to go in and kind of check it out and look at but each room has a camera set up and then the one of the areas they go in, and you can kind of monitor what's going on, see if you can watch your teammates or see the activity happening. And there are many dolls that are adults, like antique dolls all over the house. And it's very decorative, it looks really cool, pretty creepy. But some of these dolls are historic and had some kind of attachments or have done something like levitate. And some of them they leave notes and little bits of information next to some of these artifacts. And there's a lot of trauma there with some of the people who have lived there, or experience something with their child being taken. And so the people who ran the business weren't really very good to these ladies. And they would take their children and sell them off or do something to them, and who knows really what's going on there. But apparently, you can tell there's a lot of really challenging issues happening that really get imprinted into that location. So when people go in, they sent out these things, they there are a number of different ways and methods that people try to find, you know, evidence or try to get an impression about what they feel what they're tuning into. And you know, the sensations they get. So people come in as a sort of intuitive or even a medium. And really just trying to feel out what's going on where some people will use

tech and all the year you'll have microphones and cameras and all of that too. So you kind of have the whole gamut of different things to try to use when you're going into a place like this. And so what we had was an event last Saturday, and to the following day where a number of people showed up, which is kind of not something that really goes on a whole lot. I mean, they're they do have people who run out with teams, but we had probably about 30 people show up for this event where Kiel had said to me a few weeks back, let's put something together, where we're going to bring in, you know, people do a paranormal investigation overnight. But not only that, the owners are really interested and doing something with UFOs as well, because they've had some interesting sightings because it's connected to a property there, which is part of this place East mountain. And they have a lot of different interesting lore and history. There a lot of UFO sightings, apparently. And again, this is in Mineral Wells, Texas. Yep. So this place with East Mountain is interesting because there's this whole treasure story of hidden treasure that has tried to be found over the years. And so there's always some kind of strange connections between something like hidden treasure and strange activity and UFOs. It's always fascinating to see what types of connections can be made with this sort of stuff. But they said that, it would be interesting to have something like a UFO talk, as well as its sky watch. So he'll gray to come out and give a talk on Texas UFO mysteries, which is you and many of the people who follow along with the vortex and are tuning in here, the curious realm No, I'm really interested in the UFO subject and a lot of the different things that, you know, that kind of entails also. So you know, talking about UFOs, it's really cool. And we got to do that for the very first time as well as the Skywatch. And they were giving out actual, they're going through the grant processes right now and taking applications from people for communication with the other side, and verified communication with the other side. In more than one location in more than one instance, specifically, when Robert Bigelow on Skinwalker Ranch, they had numerous stories of portals appearing things coming through them, all kinds of stuff. So when you're talking about certain locations, even even somewhere like Haunted Hill House, you know, I am a huge believer in the magical concept of the egregore. And that is something that is created by a mass consciousness. And whether that thins the veil between places, because so many people go there expecting and believing and everything else? Or is it a situation like the Marfa Lights, where things have gone on there for at least 100 something years? You know, like before they were automobiles and stuff like that. So the, like you said, the similarity of these things, even even to go to the remote viewing conference and see that everybody involved with the founding of the science, and it is a repeatable science, the science of remote viewing every single founder of that science, other than Ingo Swann, who was a practitioner, and one of the lab studies, things like that. But all the all the people that

studied him and the science of it, all like particle physicists, you know, so even even now, with all the UAP stuff, Daniel, there is there is such a crossover and such, I guess, not even a crossover, but a commingling of the sciences. But I think it could be brought out of the fringes, and into the forefront of serious scientific thought and discussion. And just like you said, it's really cool to see how there are incentives now, for people to take this seriously try to figure out what's going on, through something like these grants, which, like you said, Bigelow has offered to fix, which I think is really cool, I followed along with that, I was really glad to see you were able to go to that event. And and, you know, it's something that I didn't get to make myself but like you said, you know, sometimes things in life, you know, kind of carry you in certain directions, but I hope to make it out there someday. These are people who have kind of researched this for a long time. And they describe that not only are the children active and playful, a little bit nicer in nature, according to some of the other, you know, experiences people have. But the more sinister things that have happened, which are things along the lines of people having objects thrown at them, people being drugged off beds, things like this. That really seems to fall more into an issue dealing with some of the sinister energies, possibly even the demonic presence that's there. And I find this interesting because they said that there's a demonic entity they refer to as Toby. At first I thought this was a little comical considering you know of all the demon names and all the different you know forms of literature out there and histories that Toby the demon was the one who's inhabiting, he'll help, but it was sort of a, you know, a modernized handle for who they refer to as as modius. And I thought this was really interesting because they were talking about how Toby is a pretty dark spirit and does some pretty harsh things. And people will leave with scratches and rashes and feeling burned or something in that. So it's not always very nice. So I'm just fortunate that we

walked away, relatively unscathed. So there's that but, you know, they talked about each room with a different theme has had a history of things happening. And so some of these rooms, where some of the ladies would be trapped in would say, the spiritual energy of this room does not favor men, it does not like masculine presence. So that would be a room where I don't mind kind of looking around, but I probably wouldn't want to stay in for too long. So I, you know, got to kind of look at some of the things and go through and say, All right, I'll continue on, not trying to rile things up. Well, it seems like a lot of the women that were part of this brothel and their children being taken, this all seems to have been going on at least, at least as far back as the 50s. And possibly even way earlier than that with some of the connections, because at least it's known that it connects with the baker hotel, and all this stuff, maybe with an underground tunnel. But a lot of the illegal activities that might have been going on, could have stemmed from other more nefarious things, as far as, you know, again, just people knowing the area had sort of this weird East mountain with the treasure and, you know, keeping things under wraps, as far as locations and using as a safe house to, you know, kind of be off the radar from any legal business. And I think that that's where a lot of the more sinister activity not even just spiritually, or however, you might think, just sort of, in dealing with what people come there to do, you know, are used to, right, so being that that has such a residual effect, it might have an implant on the feeling that people go in, regardless of the spirits, you're just in a place that is old, it's very antique, it has a lot of, you know, restoration over the years, but there's still parts of it that are from the original build the framework and things that, you know, really add to the history of the overall location. But one of the things that caught my attention was that you have different again, you have these different themes rooms, you have the X room, which is where apparently there's some really dramatic things going on with this idea that people had, you know, unfortunately, had this guy who came and was a not a very nice guy, but basically would carelessly do away with with people and and, you know, became sort of a seems like a murder and, you know, sought out his time there and use things like saws and, and really, really great stuff. So that's a big imprint on the trauma, I think experience there was a tub where someone had committed suicide, one of the ladies unfortunately just couldn't handle it, and decided to, you know, set her own departure off and you know, some of these things are a very traumatic part of location. There's also this carousel room where some of the children would go and they say they stay in there that sometimes people describe waking up with children jumping on the bed, you know, in a playful and gets way but they have dolls all around making dolls up and just everywhere and so little crawl spaces and adequate that children were locked in. And so

we went around and I mentioned earlier Sometimes people try to use different types of gear and tech and stuff. So we went around and since what we could kind of Naturally, but also were using, I was going around capturing as much as I could with video. And then also we use a parabolic like, we had a ghost clock going off, some people were using some apps to try to see if anything would come through, we had some night vision, and really just trying to use a variety of techniques to see what we could figure out if there's anything that we might be able to say, you know, adds credence to a lot of the different things and claims have been made. So one of the interesting things and I'll kind of come back, because I wouldn't say that nothing happened because at least the probably most notable thing that happened was, while we were interacting with the Ghost Box, and for those who aren't too familiar, a ghost box is a device that cycles through radio stations or other types of stations or FM stations that that can go and make a pattern that allows for a spirit or some kind of discarnate entity to be able to communicate. And we technically shouldn't be able to have something that you would hear, talk through it. Like if you got to a radio station, it will almost so quickly be on to the next station that you wouldn't really hear a full Senate. Yeah, you shouldn't be able to technically. But sometimes something will come through and you think, wow, how did that even happen? And so you can ask sort of not necessarily ask the ghost pocket itself, but you can ask the general area are the potential entities or spirits there, and they can use that as a sort of way, apparently to communicate. And so the ghost boss was nearby a little remote for what seemed to be an LED light. So it's one of those small little remotes with a bunch of color buttons on it. So you can press it to choose which color you might like your lights to be on. And I noticed that it didn't change any lights, because I guess it was out of batteries or wasn't plugged in or wasn't working. But we use this as a sort of a way a demonstration, a way to kind of see all right, we would ask what color? Which color would you like, and then very plainly out of the ghosts box, it said red, you know that that was really thinking and again over and over with the red. And again, this is cycling through radio stations, it's not supposed to really give you one station for more than a half a second half of a half a second maybe. Right? So you know for it to come very plainly thing red. And of course I press red. But you know nothing actually works as far as the lights changing or turning on. So A moment later, something falls onto the ground. And I thought maybe I did I don't think I did. But then it kicks something and I'm looking around what happened. Just another guy who was in the room next to us, picks out from the entryway. He says Did you just throw something? Did you guys throw something and we were all standing there just thinking No. Like, we thought maybe that came from your site? And they said no, it turned out to be batteries. So whether they fell in there somehow or they were thrown by something, I just think it was interesting, because I didn't consider this until later that that remote wasn't working. And maybe they thought it is better batteries. Yeah. Yeah, yeah. So are they to the batteries? That is to try to actually get it to work, I don't know. But having the Ghost Box is always kind of fun. And then the apps where people can try to ask questions and allowed to communicate as well. Parabolic mics are interesting because as you know, dealing with audio equipment, it picks up very sensitive, low levels of audio. And so it's something that helps out to hear some of the subtle sounds but some sometimes people see you can see you can hear the the subtle conversations or voices. When you're really tuned into the parabolic microphones. Night Vision, obviously, you can kind of see things that you wouldn't normally get to, especially if you're in the darkness. And so, at the times when it was just a few of us left after everyone had already gone after the event. We were in total darkness, all the lights were off in the whole building. And we were just kind of sitting in different sections. And they told me Well, since I'm about I'm the only one who hasn't been there before, it's sort of a rite of passage at the Haunted Hill House to go and sit in what they call the portal. The portal is a small closet, crawl space under the stairway that has a chair with a strange doll behind it that had a note on it with two mirrors on each side of the wall and the crawlspace on your right and your left of the chair. So it's a little disorienting. And so I decided to muster up the courage and

go in there and sit in there for a few minutes in front of that door because the chairs facing the doorway which you came in. It's a very small, tight, confined space. So anyone who's claustrophobic probably wouldn't like being in there. But uh, you know, it's a it is one of those things where you wonder, what is it? What is this portal doing? You know, is this what the entities are coming from? And is this something that has already been here? Or was it brought here that someone tried to open something up and so a lot of strange things with what's going on in that house, but we had a pretty good time overall, I don't think anyone felt like they had anything very traumatic happen. We did have that set of batteries thrown onto the ground, which was interesting. You know, some people might chalk that up to maybe they just rolled off or something, I don't really know, no one really saw that it's kind of in the dark. But I'd like to think that hopefully someone threw something, those batteries at it. So really interesting. But after everything else, staying up until about five in the morning, before the sun's coming up. We all decided to sort of turn in and I retired I into it to kind of choose a room of the few that were left. And I decided, well, it's either the carousel rim, which is the one with all the adults hanging around and has this hidden tunnel. And where the children jump on the bed, I thought, well, I don't know that I'd want to have to be bothered by a bunch of kids jumping on the bed if I'm trying to get you out to the press. So I thought, You know what, let's just crank it up a notch, and I'll go stay in what they call the Shadow Man room. So I stayed in the Shadow Man room. All

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Well, you know, I don't recall seeing any strange shadowy figures. But I forgot that by the time I chose that room, that that was the room that I look over to had the bathroom. And there's a panel above the bathroom that says suicide room and I thought, wow, I totally forgot that this is also the room with the bathtub with the unfortunately the lady so I thought well, maybe not that I can't but I just figured I don't know that it makes much sense to try to change things up. Now I'm just gonna settle in, really take it all in. They said the closet is also a portal. If you open it, it'll open for spirits to come through. So you know, I had to do that. The closet, I opened up the bathroom. I looked around at some creepy dolls that said that they were from different places that they had entity attachments, and some of them had levitated. So I greeted all of them. It might sound a bit funny, but I would go around with the dolls and say hi, hi, nice to meet you. And I'd shake their little doll hands. And I think the funny thing is my friend later on, she said, You know, it's probably good that you did that. Because otherwise it might not have turned out so well. But I actually, despite having stayed up for so long and been up into the early hours, I had a peaceful few hours of rest there in the Shadow Man room. And you know, it was a it was a pretty good time. I don't really remember any bad dreams. And it didn't really see any shadow figures or a shadow man or the hat man or anything like that. So some people described having seen a tall, eight foot hole a dark mass. And that sounds terrifying to some people. And I guess I'm fortunate that I missed out on as

as, as somebody who has had their shadow figure experience with one at the end of their bed.

Touching them. Yeah, it is it is more than terrifying. Man. That was one of my first experiences with night terror. And man, boy, is it visceral. Have you ever had an experience of a paranormal nature? So to speak, Daniel, and in that way?

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Well, you know, I think that one of the challenges we also face is that paranormal is such a big umbrella term, almost like UFO. Now it's something that, you know, so many things can fall under that. And I would say that, because of that, sometimes ambiguity that for sure. Yes, I would say that I have experienced a lot of strange things. I don't really use a lot of my own personal experiences as a platform. But it has served as a springboard of my interest and involvement into all of these things. But I have experienced sleep paralysis, I have seen shadowy figures through states of sleep paralysis. And I found that the best way at some of those times I can try to figure out or understand that to my ability was that the body was kind of going or you know, when we maybe go through a sleep paralysis or have like a sleep tear, Nightmare type thing that maybe the body is kind of going through one of those like a computer has a blue screen of death. It just can't comprehend what's going on. It fails. Just in there. And I think that our consciousness exists beyond that and that maybe we still perceive it. are aware of through that consciousness. But our body has no way to fully comprehend what's taking place and sort of shuts down and freezes. We're petrified and we sometimes can't move, you're in sleep paralysis, but we can still be aware. And that sounds really frightening. And unfortunately, it's something that has an effect on people and their ability to perceive something that, you know, does give them this trauma as well. That's where people describe these types of things like a shadow man or the hat man. Or just strange it to me, sometimes sinister and sometimes peaceful as well. Oh, it can move. So sometimes I think it's a little bit more than sleep paralysis. But I would say, outside of that, I feel like things that also kind of tangentially fall into the paranormal, I would say that sometimes we think of parapsychology as connecting with the paranormal. I've had a few strange poltergeist type effects happen. Around me, it was electronics and things and things, objects moving sometimes in a way that I kind of wondered, really questioning, is there, is there any other way that something could have made this happen? And because, you know, I, to me, I want to make sure I'm not just easily you know, just kind of taking it at face value, I want to make sure that there are other ways we can really try to see if there's something to it and not just just completely be dissuaded and say, Oh, it's there's nothing to be dismissive. But to think, Okay, are there ways that this can be done. So I try to be open minded, but I try to have a healthy degree of skepticism, but not be disregarding or just blatantly disbelieving just because of whenever. So, I think that some of those types of things and having these types of interactions and experiences when I was younger, helped to open me up to the possibility that maybe there is a lot of crossover, maybe there's some connections between these people, describing entities from other worlds, other even other dimensions or, or communing with, with the spirits of those who have passed or spirits, who don't seem to be regular types of people and have some kind of special qualities and, you know, from different realms, and I think that that makes us wonder about all the different ways the modalities of contact that we can have through UFO type experiences, through paranormal experiences and near death experiences or psycho active psychedelic experiences, you know, and so I'm curious about all of these things, I'm fascinated by it. And so that's where I think that like you said earlier, when we find that there are people who are interested in doing the research and helping to provide for more development, I think that's

going to help bridge the gap between some of these challenges we face. And, and both paranormal and ecology and all of this. So I'm excited to see kind of what connections can be made and where we can go. We've we've definitely

had as, as our bell would say, a quickening when it comes to people's want for these topics and people's open mind for these topics. There are now entire channels of cable television devoted to this stuff. So it's it's pretty phenomenal to have seen it in our lifetimes go from the world of weekly world news, and other tabloids and things like that, and relegated to things like Project Bluebook and other other black bags stuff from back in the day, you know, to an open conversation between science and government and researchers. It's been it's been pretty incredible to see that come about over the last few years. So I'm I am utterly thrilled with what's going on but at the same time, I'm weary, you know, it's kind of like and I would love to have Steven Greer on to talk about CE five and the protocols and doing that, like I've got the CE five app I've never been to a meeting. But it's also one of those like, I don't mind recording for EVP. But going around a supposedly haunted location and attempting to have a conversation I think could be a dangerous place to be you know, you could be possibly very easily deceived by something that is other all kinds of stuff so I don't know I don't know where do you fall in the in the communication with the other side? Are you are you a passive or an active

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Well, I think that it's a it's one of those things where I'm really interested in the ways in which we can establish a consistent interface. Because it seems like that's a big challenge across the board, whether it's paranormal, whether it's what some, like you mentioned careers CE five. And we did bring this up during our skywalk and kind of a mix of that with what others refer to as heights, human initiated contact with extraterrestrials. And I think that that's again, what CE five implies Close Encounters of the fifth time, we talked about the Hynek scale. You know, Dr. J. Allen Hynek, the civilian astronomer who worked with as you mentioned, Project Bluebook, was someone who came up with this scale to describe close encounters. Sometimes people just see an object in the sky, sometimes it comes down, sometimes they see a being or occupant in relation to it. Sometimes that object or that being affects that person. So sci fi was added, as most people know, the movie Close Encounters of the Third Kind. Well, there's also an really strange and intriguing movie called The fourth kind, which kind of implies that the C four. And then of course, now, it's been added, and popularized, later on by Greer, who discusses how we could do different things naturally, through meditative approaches through trying to sort of do thinking of the hemispheres, you know, some people call him and think, and using a few different wavelengths and sound effects and things to try to use our own intention collectively as a group, or maybe even individually, can to allow for a space to be afforded to both us and the recipient, to have a medium of contact, whether it's visual or audible. That to me is so interesting, just to see the correlations between that what people are doing in the paranormal community by way of investigating these locations with the posted haunted activity, or just any type of paranormal activity, because they're using similar techniques, maybe not exactly the same, but they're trying to establish something consistent. And that's the challenge is sometimes we just get one thing, one time. And we might be at a place several times, it might only happen once, or maybe never, or maybe a handful of times, or some people describe it happens all the time. So I think that there are certain things that we can try to do to help

strengthen that consistency of contact or communication. If we are going to try to do it actively, we're going out of our way to initiate that as heist suggests, human initiated, the five is where humans are going out. It's not where something just inadvertently happens to human. It's not where we're just, oh, look, there's something up there, you know, we're trying to call them down, we're trying to bring them into the space, we're trying to see if we can establish a medium through which we can all commune with something beyond. That sounds just like what a lot of paranormal investigators try to conjure up. And these types of phonics locations, I think that there could be some relation and connections, you know, we connect the dots, and maybe there's something that we've kind of overlooked and that these communities do have a lot of crossover and what they're doing by using techniques. So as I've mentioned before, and some of the past shows we've done, I'm really interested in a lot of this, by way of cultural anthropology, and by studying many of these different communities, to see what types of things they do not just to communicate the types of tools they use, the their approaches that they have the practices, know, their rights, all of these things and to participate as one of them, you know, in many of these different groups to really get a better understanding. So to me, this is all part of that experience in my research into all of these things until like I said earlier, I've focused a lot more on some of these other types of areas, ecology, cryptozoology, archeology and history, consciousness, to me has always been, you know, a fascinating topic and how we understand different events. So to really dive into a location with some significantly historic paranormal activity and and has been featured on a number of shows, I think having gone and spent the night over Haunted Hill House was a pretty great experience. It was phenomenal, to say the least. And I'd love to go back and see, you know, anything else might come up.

And I get these wild emails, like from all these different businesses and stuff, and it's crazy. And I think a lot of these guys are literally read into these things, on so many levels and topics because of their crossover. I think that the people researching it and funding it and putting money out there, government wise, probably most definitely realize the utter connection between these things be UFOs, and the paranormal UFOs and remote viewing the paranormal and remote viewing all that stuff there. There is an extreme crossover when it comes to the fact as we've discussed so many times before, Daniel, that it's all frequency.

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Definitely, and I think that there will continue to be more discoveries made. And it'll help to shed light upon some of these things in a way that, like you said, people can been talking about these things for years, they've been looking into them for so long, sometimes it's isolated, or it's focused into a very specific discipline. But as we continue, I think there will be a little bit more to work with in relation to some of the data that's been collected in many of these different areas of focus, whether it's ecology, Fantasma, ology, or spectra ology which is kind of a technical term for the paranormal, you know, in our attempt to better understand it, and many of these other studies in consciousness as well, I'm fascinated by all of it. So the, the

experience that I had, that I documented, I'm kind of piecing together a little bit of a montage of some of our time there this last weekend, and I'm gonna put together a video for some people to check out up on the vortex of how our night went. And, you know, the good time that we had,

And as with many social circles, also many disagreements about what's going on how do we interpret findings or experiences. So that's always interesting. And uh, but I think that everyone, for the most part who is involved with a conference like this is very open minded and very civil when it comes to

trying to figure out what's happening in a way without completely demeaning anyone or polluting or belittling anyone's beliefs or being disregarding everyone's, that's something that they can bring to the table and be willing to be open about. Because we're all learning. We were all trying to figure this out together, we might not all be in it for the same reasons. We might not even all be trying to do the same thing. But I think that we're all at least connected by the fascination with something mysterious, unknown and unexplained. And I think that with the amount of people that this type of event, Garner's the interest of everyone usually leaves with some insights, and it's going to be on the Bigfoot weekend, the the third weekend of every October has been dedicated as the official Bigfoot day. It's one of those things, again, that the mayor has declared. I think just having a town even insinuate anything related to Bigfoot at all is fascinating, because most people just laugh it off. They think maybe Harry and the Hendersons, they just think about the, you know, funny pictures that they see, or, you know, Jack Link's beef jerky, yeah, commercials or something just right. And this pop culture has had a big part, I think, in raising awareness, ironically, to the reality that we don't really know everything that's out there. And it's become sort of a catch all. Thankfully, it's something that we use as a way to describe a possible creature that may still exist, or that might have been here the whole time, that has just sort of evaded our detection. And I liked that idea, because it gives people sort of a fun, non threatening, I mean, ironically, that commercial detects, you know, him doing violent things, it's like, we kind of get this idea that it's fun, you know, and to me, I think that it can be a lot of fun. And, you know, there are a lot of things that we can challenge scientifically, and really get into some, some deep stuff. But I think for the most part, everyone who goes to an event like this, you find a mixture of information, and entertainment. And that's what you see in a lot of these shows, like you mentioned, too, it's not got, you know, a lot of just one thing, it has to kind of have a variety just so it can be broad enough to hit the base, public, and hit the base of the population. Because, you know, most people watching stuff like this, they're not might not be like hardcore researchers or anything, they just might be display people who are just flipping channels or just want to watch something and are have a slight enthusiasm in it with the people who show up at the conference, it gets all kinds of people. Oh, yeah. And that's something I think it really helps to establish a sense of direction for is that, you know, the shows are great, because it hit it hits something and the social awareness that the conferences can really add another layer to, because if you're really interested in you can say, Oh, wow, you know, there's a conference about this, there are people who are gonna go talk about it. Wow. You know, so that's something I think that really helps to build a sense of community beyond just watching the show. And I think that the Texas Bigfoot conference, now being over 20 years old, was it's been one of the longest running Bigfoot and cryptid, cryptozoology related events out there. And it's fun, because a lot of people don't think that Bigfoot has anything to do with Texas. But it's one of just like, with UFOs, I think, because of population density. And all of this too. So we can only think about all the things that are never reported by people who, you know, know, because they don't just want to or they don't feel comfortable with it, because they probably don't know how. So this also helps people to come out of the woodwork they, they say, You know what, I haven't thought about this in years, but I also saw something and so it lets people kind of have a supportive network of a community to share something which otherwise their friends and family or closest people to them might not really, you know, be willing to hear the nod on. So I liked that part of the community. It's always a wonderful experience.
