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Well, hello, everybody. Welcome to Episode 63. Chris Jordan, your host here, coming at you live from Austin, Texas. I'm very happy to welcome back our first guest this evening self talk. She's the author of you have the right to talk to aliens, we will be talking to her about not only the abduction experience, but the trauma that comes along with that. And the reason why MUFON has started things like the experiencer resource team to help experiencers and how is it that the number of experiences have grown? We'll be talking with self talk about that here in a minute. Then after the commercial break, we will be talking with our good friend Dr. John Hall, of course, about not only targeting technologies, but technologies that have specifically targeted America over the last couple of weeks, we'll be talking about some of the Intel behind the recent balloons being shot down the objects being shot down over. Well, we now know over Alaska over Canada, over one of the Great Lakes, Lake Huron. So it's been interesting, but are they really what people are making them out to be? That's the question, or is it really more, you know, maybe some kind of psyop by the enemy to literally destabilize us. Because like we say in the show all the time, it doesn't take a great majority of the population to destabilize something. It doesn't take like, oh, we need like 40% of people to make a mass movement happen? No, like you need less than 10%. So even if they sent stuff over to panic, less than 10% of people, would that be enough to literally destabilize our society? Could there be possibilities of an EMP attack? Were they poking and prodding for that? We'll be getting into some of that with Dr. John Hall. After our commercial break. Of course, before we bring up self talk. Let's head on over to the Facebook group real quick. Facebook is where we have our conversations come on by joining the curious realm group. That's where we post all kinds of articles about science, the strange paranormal, and we have conversations out of sight tech daily a reconfigurable antenna merges mechanical engineering and electro mechanics for next generation technology. As an audio engineer and somebody who's into radio this was a really cool article. super nerdy. This was a conversation going on in my talking sound group. Top DJ deepfakes Eminem into a song and it seems that it's totally legal. We need to we need to try and get Gordon fire mark the podcast lawyer on about that to talk about what the future of this deep, deep fake technology is and how rights can be protected. Of course, out of AP news

rumors swirl about balloons UFOs as officials stay mum and out of net geo a new Docu series featuring largest Mayan ruins ever discovered. That is just some of the news that is fit to print out there folks, make sure to stop on by facebook and join the curious realm group to join the conversation. While you're there. Of course, stop on by our website as well as the website of our amazing guest. self talk. She is the author of you have the right to talk to aliens. She is the one of the leads of the MUFON experience or resource team. Welcome back to the show. Sev how are you?

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Hi Chris. I'm so happy to be with you again and with your listeners. Thank you for inviting me back.

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I always love having you on set. Your energy is fantastic. And as I've said numerous times I cannot think of a better advocate for experiencers out there Your story is so absolutely incredible. And to have seen you really come to come to a point of comfort, you would come to a lot to begin with. When you wrote your book, you have the right to talk to aliens, you really come on a very big personal journey of acceptance, I think but, but to see where you are now, and especially the work that you're doing, with new and recent experiencers is is really beautiful. It's fantastic.

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Thank you very much. Well, it's my life passion now to help experiences. I learned that word. My first conference, I wrote my book, it came out in August 2018. And then a couple of weeks later, just as Hurricane Florence was descending. On my home, I get an email from Alien con in Baltimore, saying, congratulations, you're a speaker. And that was my moment to come out. That was the first time I ever came out in Baltimore 2018. And it was there that I learned that I want to help experiencers because so many people came up to me and wanted to tell me their stories. Until then, I did not realize how many people have seen a UFO or I've had ET contact because I was living in my own little bubble of denial. So I wasn't watching movies, I wasn't listening to podcasts or radio shows, I tried to stay away from the UFO et topic as much as possible, because it wig me out. So we were just talking about this a few minutes ago, when I wrote my book and entered this world. I really came in not even knowing who the major players were. I really didn't know anything about anybody. I was very green. And I'm really honored that I've gotten to know a lot of the experiencers a lot of the the well known ones and but mostly the ones that aren't well known 1000s of experiencers. I've been honored enough to communicate with and try to help them as much as possible because it is it shakes your reality man, and it's really hard to grapple.

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Well, I can only imagine that facts of I myself, as the audience knows, as you know, have ever had my own personal spiritual experiences, but to have an experience, like you had, especially especially coming out of the experiences you'd had in relationships things like that You You're сэрескину сонину ойс ог але скрепенсез уби и ний игтекисонзиру, аннуз нас анис, той той те so honest in your book about that. And the fact of you view your experiences through the eyes of trauma for a long time.

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Yes, I did. Good way to put it. I usually say through the lens of victimization, but it was because I but this was all my choosing. I chose to live as a victim. And that's why I have two marriages that became abusive because I was the perfect victim. So I thought well, if if my husbands are victimizing me then the greys are victimizing me too. I mean, that's just the way it works. Now I realize I don't play the victim anymore. I've dropped that vibe. It took a lot of personal introspection, but I dropped it. And now I see that the Grays were not hurting me at all. They were helping me. Wow.

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And once again to see that change in yourself. What was it that ultimately brought that change of mind about for you?

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Well, it was the two red x's that were burned into my tush. So I'm in an experiencer have conscious memories from the age 10. And then I moved here to the inner Banks of North Carolina in 2017. So here I am, in later in life, like in my 50s. And all of a sudden, I have an experience nine days apart, where I come face to face with greys and they burn two red X marks in my tush. And that is what made me realize, okay, I have got to face this like that was what did it. It's I joke. I say that, because I've been talking to me for a long time and I just keep ignoring them. I was ignoring them. Because I was afraid of them. And I joke that they were like What do we have to do to this woman to get her attention and once said to the other one let's just burn a red X and harass

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them and even that the fact that you joke about it. And now Now granted, you say that you they'd been talking to you for a long time. Let's let's explore that for a minute. Because like you said they had been in contact before abduction and physical contact Correct.

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Before the red X is Yeah, so yeah, I've been communicating with them for about five or six years before the two red X's were burned in my back. And I had a neutral experiences with them. I never had bad experiences with them. I always thought they were bad because I was afraid. That's why I thought they were bad. As many experiences do just because you're afraid of something, then and you don't understand something, you tend to think that it might be bad. And they've given me so many messages about personal messages about me, but also about us generally. Potential destiny, the hybridization program. They've been really actually very, how should I say, educational?

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Well, and you know, once again, to know that you were being contacted prior to your abduction prior to the burn marks coming about on you. And like you said, basically had ignored that fact not really paid attention to it. What was it? Do you think that kept that obscured for you?

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Why did I hide it? Yeah. Yeah. Um, well, okay, that's multifaceted. First, I hit it because it was I just couldn't believe it was happening. And I was afraid to tell anybody. And because I was really afraid of what people would think of me. And then as I started my practice, and I have clients all around the world, then I thought, well, there's no way my clients could No, I'm talking to aliens, because I will lose all my clients like this just cannot happen. Nope. You know that I'm talking to ETS. So I finally came out and all the things I was afraid of have not happened.

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Well, that's a plus. Yeah.

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Best thing I've ever done

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well, and you know, once again, to to see your transformation into what you are now from even even where you were, whenever I first interviewed you, as we were talking about, prior to the show on my previous incarnation, dudes and beer. That was it was it was certainly the name of what's my favorite thing is that I still Garner hundreds of lessons a month on a show that puts out zero new content. Okay. Took a long time to get out there. But man, yeah, I mean, it's funny that, and I think a lot of it is because people listen to this show, and then find out that there was three, four years of this content before it became this show. And guests like you things like that, where there are more interviews, people like Dr. John

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Huston, I'm sorry to cut you off.

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Honestly, it was a couple of situations, as you know. And as my audience knows, I spent my time in broadcast. It was a fantastic idea, great name. Whenever the show first started, it was literally myself and a couple people sitting around with different ideas, different points of view, and we're going to come back next week, and we're going to be friends, and we're going to disagree. And we're going to have beers over it, you know, like they did before America was founded. Like America was founded in a bar by a bunch of dudes that disagreed on a lot of things, but they agreed they didn't want that. Yeah, what do we do about it?

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Okay, but then, all right. And then then we

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started having conversations with people like you, and John Hall, and stuff like that. And the conversation moved much deeper. And as I started moving up guest rungs and things like that, you know, contacting good folk like Caroline quarry. Yeah. Love her work for easily the last 20 years of my life. But I know what it is to be handled at at an interview. Oh, because I've handled people that have interviews when they were contacting my host on broadcast. And we're like, we'd love to come on and talk about this. So yeah, when I was handled out of that, and a couple of other interviews, it was like, okay, you know, I should I should really examine this and take a long, cold hard look, you know, and yeah, you know, it was the fact of even the name like I'm pigeon holed. owing the fact of are women allowed to listen? Yeah, no, no.

Well, women dudes, I if someone calls me a dude, I tell them right away. I am not a dude.

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Yeah. Well, and that's just it, you know, so yeah, it was, it's been the best change that ever happened or could happen to us. We've gone out and sponsored events. We were sponsoring MUFON with you this last year, I don't think we would have been allowed to do that as dudes and beer. You know, even knowing you. Any cloud. Me when you know that when you when you have the emcee on your show, it's a little bit of clout.

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Fine. So kind. If you think I



didn't drop your name when I went in there, you're wrong. Me, but But yeah, it was it was

sincerely the fact of when it was time for an overhaul and time to really consider the fact of the numbers and what things were and where I wanted to go with the show. And I wanted to be able to go deeper and further with things. And the only way to do that was to expand and grow and become something

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different. Yeah, become curious.

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And you know, much like you taking taking a step outside of comfort zone. Yeah, but I'm not comfortable talking on a mic. But when when when you've built something for five years, there becomes a comfortability with it. And even stepping forth and renaming things and changing things and rebranding and coming up with new intro and everything else. Like it's it's an effort. And it's not always successful. This Yeah,

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it's fun, though. Oh, yeah. A lot of fun. We were talking about this earlier, how you and I are thing is to create, as long as we create, we're fine. And we each find different ways to create. But that's what you and I are all about creating.

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Well. And I think that's also a big part of you with the with the experiencer resource team is the fact that you have been there since the inception of it and gotten to help create a lot of this protocol. With with how to deal

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with beginning Kathy Martin started Oh,

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that's I know that I've



been on the ER T for I think maybe a year on the executive committee. I became a field investigator in 2020. And at first, I didn't want to become a field investigator or not. Some of the mentors within MUFON as suggested I become a field investigator only, okay, I think about it, because I thought I had to go to people's homes. And as a woman, that's not something that is appealing. I don't want to go to someone's house or person's house. And then when they said, Oh, no, we don't really do that anymore. Unless there's an actual landing, and you got to go take specimens and things. It was just everything is done online, zoom and all that telephone. And then I thought, Oh, what if that's the case, okay, then I'll do it. So to become a field investigator, you have to study you read, there's a handbook, there's lots of videos, you have to watch. It's quite a bit of material. And then you have to take a test. And you have to score I think it's 80% or more, and then you become a field investigator. And then from that, I was asked to join the executive resource team. And then I was asked to be on the executive committee. Now the experience resource team, there was about 50 of us around the world that said, and we come we deal with people who have had direct contact with a non human being or an ET.

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And that is a lot of the reason that I love having you on the show is because not only are you dealing with people that have that direct E T contact, but you are helping them hand in hand work through their trauma of their experience. And I say that word because most people that I've interviewed most of the books I have on my shelf have anybody that's had the experience that you've had Terry Lovelace has had Betty and Barney Hill any I mean even Kathleen Martin her your her Aunt Betty was like honey this ever happens to you you tell nobody. Like this will destroy your life.

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Yeah, that's part of the trauma is that being able to share it and if you do, often you have family members that just say okay, you know, you really shouldn't be talking about this in public and then you so some They did. And at the same time, your reality is completely different from everyone else's all of a sudden, completely different. And you feel like you're living one foot in the other dimensions and one foot in 3d and you're just trying to find your balance. Sometimes you're talking to ETS, and sometimes you're talking to humans, and no one else you know, is doing this. But this is your reality. But it's no one else's reality, until you start to come out. Once you start to come out to yourself, I'm not saying you have to write a book or be on TV or anything will start coming out to yourself getting some help, because all experiencers need help. Once you get that help, then you realize I am not alone at all, there are actually millions of experiences on this planet, but many of them don't even know it, because it happens in this multi dimensional, inner dimensional way that feels hazy and dreamlike. But a dream does not put two red X's on your touch. Well, that's what those two red X's really taught me. Oh, when you have that hazy, weird experience, but you know, it's real. But there are no words to describe it. That is real. And that's one thing that I tried to express to people when you have these experiences that feel like a dream, but you know, they're not a dream that you can't forget that you can think you remember every detail for decades. And also every time you have you rethink that experience all this emotion is evoked that is not a dream.

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Yeah. Yeah. That is that is as as as used in the term and experience. It is it is something that viscerally changes you from the inside out. What whether you have chosen to remember and recall all of that might depend on literally how much it either frightened or amazed or even

befuddled and confused you and challenged your paradigm of belief, you know, like, prime example is Wallace W. Wagner. We had him on a few weeks ago he was he was a fully religious man fully involved in his church. And all of a few years ago had a major experience and it changed his life. He is He is now a full on believer before that he would have he would have called people you know, courting demons. So, so, so biblical his life was

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so how did that transform his religious perspective?

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His religious perspective became a lot less staunch, he still has his full on belief in Christ and salvation and everything else, but he is much more accepting of his fellow man and their beliefs

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is instrumental then yeah, yeah, his

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I guess the way to put it would be his. His hellfire and damnation tamped down a little bit.

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Hey, that's good. I'm glad to hear it. Well,

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it's a it's an amazing and beautiful thing to hear. And it rings a lot to me, especially the conversations that we've had with Kathleen here on the show, where, where she talks about people being changed in a spiritual way, and how more people seem to be coming back from their experiences that more of these experiences seem to be, like you're saying almost in a multi dimensional state than in a physical reality.

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Although it does happen in 3d, too. I've had 3d experiences as well with ETs. Oh, sure.

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I mean, you gotta you gotta have 3d in order to get branded on your on on your backside.

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Yeah, yeah, that was a combination of both the memory of that feels doesn't feel 3d. Like when I was wide awake in the middle of my living room one afternoon is to light beings came in. That to me is a is a, what I mean by 3d. Gotcha. Well, those beings weren't 3d. They were clearly interdimensional, but I was wide awake in my living room. And so I just wanted to say in dealing with experiences, we have different types of experiences some of us have, how we perceive them to be a little differently. Some of us perceive our experiences to be scarier than others. And also it depends on what's happening in your experience. For instance, the hybridization program, which is men and women are part of this hybridization program. I'm talking about the one between the greys and the humans, and it exists and I've been given information about Have that and been shown hybridized babies, this is very hard, especially for the women, it tends to be more women that come up with these memories, very hard for women to deal with this because many of them view it as being raped. They would as something being done against their will. And I firmly believe that we have a higher self that really calls the shots. And there was a reason for every experience that we have. The reason to help us, help us transform help us to understand something. And so that is why I rarely use the word abduction because abduction implies victimization. And I do not believe that. Yes,

I was gonna say specifically, it implies use of force. That you're being forced, yeah, like against your will to go somewhere?

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Yes. And our lower selves might feel like that. Or if we look at it from the higher perspective, we can see, there's so much to learn from this and to grow from this, if we can just get to that place. But first, we have to combat the fear, which is so normal and really prevalent when you first start having ET contact.

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Well, if the fear especially, like you said, Whenever you first start having ET contact is, I guess, amongst the people that you have talked with, as are there, what percentage of people have become comfortable with their ET contact?

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No, I never really figured out the percentage. But now that I'm thinking about it now,

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just got figures out a few handfuls of people,

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maybe less than a quarter. Okay? Yeah. Now, most of them are still struggling. But what happens is, once you talk to somebody like me, or to anybody, it doesn't even have to be me, or to move on whoever you talk to. That is really the beginning of your healing. And that's why it's really important to talk to somebody, but first admitted about yourself, because if you don't admit it about yourself, you're not being authentic, and you're hiding something about you, that's really, we shouldn't be embarrassed to say that we have come in contact with a nonhuman entity, that's extraordinary. It's fantastic. It's superb. And we shouldn't be embarrassed about it anymore.

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Well, and you know, especially with all the research that is out there. Even Even right now with quantum physics in the concept of non local reality is it's really phenomenal to think about because the case that Kathleen speaks about, where where the person passed through the skin of the the UFO, when they when their vibration changed, oh, I literally heard how put off talk about the same case, at the International remote viewing Association, and coming at it from a point of view of physics, not coming at it from a point of view of, you know, spiritual frequency or frequency of of mind. And that kind of vibration. But But speaking of it as the reason why somebody can see it, and the person right next to them can't is because of the frequency at which they're vibrating.

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That's right. That's right. And also, where are they in terms of knowing the desire to know the truth. So one thing that really happened to me once I got these two x's put on my tush. I had recently started this path of authenticity, I decided, alright, I'm going to be the most authentic version of myself I can possibly be whatever. Well, however I can get there I'm going to do and then that's when I had to face my et reality. And then when I did, and I moved through it, I'm still processing it. I think you just process it forever, because it's still there very just still hard to believe.

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I can imagine that it's no different than losing a loved one. I can imagine that it's no different than my experience that I had in the seminary. You know that? Yeah, I will. I will process that experience, spiritually and psychologically for the remainder of my life. Yeah, for the rest of it. It changed me it changed who I am. It changed the way Think about the world around me.

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Yeah, yes. That's what happens. And even though we know it happens, without a doubt, I know what happened to me. But if here's the weird thing, it was by no, it happened. It kind of feels like Did it really happen? So in terms of a lie detector, would I pass a lie detector? I don't know. Because apart it's not like I can. I can talk about it was 100% conviction. I don't it's really hard to describe. I know what happened. I'm 100% convinced on I know what happened, but a part of me is still like, really? So I guess I'm not 100% I'm 99%. It's an all experiences are like this. There's still a part of her. It's like, can really?

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Yeah, yeah. I mean, even even talking with Terry Lovelace the few times that we've had him on the show, and even personally, there there is a part of him that still, like you said, wonders whether or not what happened was the reality. But

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he knows it was yeah, that's the weird thing. Like I can't it doesn't make sense what I'm saying, but that's the way it is. Yeah.

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No, no, I mean, it's it. I'm sure it's strange to begin with. I mean, most people do not have a sharp, vivid memory beyond five to seven years, says, even even when it comes to experience, that experience becomes psychologically muddled with other things that happen in life. You know. And even with situations like that, like a prime example, when my wife and I first got together, Facebook was still pretty well, infancy, like it was pretty close to still like you, you had to know somebody by going to school with them, in order to in order to have friendship. And I saw a person that I'd known for years from high school. We were in in different crowds, whatnot. I invited her to be a friend, and she sent me a personal message back, like, I can't believe that you sent me this invite. And I was like, Okay. And I remember a lot of a lot of things very vividly from my childhood, but I do not remember a lot of the things. But I don't remember that. And it was it was something that I dealt with for a long, long time, because it was like, did I that I blocked this out? Was this something that I mean, even even the knowledge of it, knowing this person and knowing that person and being stuck in the middle as a kid? Did I block that out?

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Now? Yeah, who knows what we block out, you know?

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So yeah, the fact of being able to, and that's just my personal example of, here's an experience that obviously happened, and should have been something that rocked me. The way I knew my cousin and the way I knew this person from my class, you know, so, but, but at the same token

I remember nothing about it. That's interesting. remember nothing about it.

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Wow.

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So I've got a pretty good and vivid memory. Yeah, there's a really good and vivid memory but that is one that breezed right past me.

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Even parts of it come back to you know, like,

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and I don't know I have no idea what what hidden traumas in my life are locked to or linked to that. No idea.

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Yes. Yeah. Do you want to find out do you want to go there?

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I'd love to go there. I've I've actively I was actively regressed on air by our friend Terry lovelies. Yeah,

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I didn't know this.

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Yeah, yeah. He did a regression session with me and I recorded it and aired it.



Oh, you are brave. What came out? Apparently, somewhere

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in there. I was. I was a I guess it was like a French farmhand. Here in America. I didn't speak English. I only spoke French. Really interesting. Yeah. Yeah, it was it was pretty wild. Um, But the year this was I don't know what the year was. But yeah, it was it was an interesting experience and a great episode to air. And yeah, I'm into doing a lot of things like that. Where it's like, let's let's see what it's about. Well, and I'm unabashed about it. I don't, I don't really care. I don't edit my show. closest thing that I come to editing my show was two weeks ago with with Mike Thurber. Before it was released that there were electronic materials on the balloon that got shot down. While I was pre recording with Mike Thurber, a colonel called him to be on a conference call with the NSA and other security people about the balloon and and mentioned that there were electronic material counter countermeasures and signals coming from the balloon. And I had to bleep that. out two days later, the story came out on the news that there were electronic devices on they're able to listen to conversations and all kinds of stuff, but it's like yeah, wow, I had to bleep that. Couldn't see that live on air? Because it wasn't public knowledge yet. Yes.

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Very interesting is happening right now. Why all of a sudden they're using the term UFO when they insisted on using UAP what's that about? So yeah, you it's like shoot down UFO shoot down UFO shoot dead? Some we've never seen that in headlines like, well, not never. But we just don't see that in headlines like that. Now, it's daily, what is going?

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Because I explained that to my brother, because he sent me the headline of, you know, fighter jet shoots down UFO. And I was like, you can tell that it's nothing major, because they didn't say UAP. They would have used the the modern nomenclature, if it was something of that type. But the fact that they're saying UFO to begin with will will tell you that

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kind of narrative going on. It's strange to prepare the people to get used to hearing shut down UFO, sat down UFO. And

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you know, it's interesting set because we talked with Mike turbo about it. We broke down about two weeks ago before the balloon, the new UFO UAP report from Congress. So whenever the first hearings happened, a lot of the questions that came forward were were formulated by MUFON. A lot a lot of the questions that were asked during that during that first congressional hearing from my understanding came from MUFON. And it was it was really interesting to see their responses.

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Talking about the live congressional hearing aid, I think it was May of last year yeah,

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what led to the first the first annual UFO UAP report the 12 pages of nothing,

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yes. pages of nothing, but at least you're keeping it in the forefront of our consciousness by talking about it and that

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well, and what I'm grateful for especially, and a lot of people, and I'm sure, you know, you're in a lot of communities that I'm in a lot of people don't like MUFON. I like MUFON, because they really care about the scientific research of it. And they were the first ones to really put forth protocol for scientific research of it, and saying, Here's what we have to do in order to get his even whenever I went to MUFON in Denver, one of the first things I heard from somebody was like, Well, this is no alien con. And it was like, No, this is an actual, like, you're gonna the people that are here today are taking an eight hour class. On Being a field researcher, they aren't waiting in line for the costume contest.

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Right? It's really serious and

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not that alien con. It's fun. Like I go to comic conventions all the time and speak and all kinds of things.

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We're all of it. But MUFON is the largest UFO research organization in the world and we're really ones that have created a way for people to contact us and and enter into a database. Our database is extraordinary. transforming every organization has its ups and downs. And just like humans, and swarm MUFON is transforming and we just have to give it time to goes through, it's a growing pain as human beings have growing pains.

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And as with a lot of communities right now, there's there's a slight change over of the guard. You know, as it's being passed on to new generations, new people are coming up through the ranks, things like that, because they it's time for that to happen. 3040 years into research.

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Yeah, there's no reason to live in the past. Because if you're in a relationship with somebody, and you keep living in the past, that relationship is doomed. Remember that, yeah. Bring up everything that person did for the past. You know, I was married to somebody and every time he got married to me, he's like, let me start the list. And he was things that he claimed I did wrong. All right. Like, I was in the car, and I couldn't get out.

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That's, that's a proper footing. This marriage.

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Yeah, very abusive. Well,

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you know, we, it's hard not to. It's hard not not to want everything to be what we want it to be sev. You know, I'm just up the mind of, if this was anything other than surveillance technology, or something of the like, we would be hearing nothing about it. Yeah, we would, we would be hearing nothing about it. Now, granted,

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alien technology is shut down aliens. Love to think that, you know,

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that is what I have seen in a lot of the discussion forums is like, you know, not saying that our dudes ain't good. But you really think that's what's going to happen?

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Yeah, exactly. I really think that it's not about that. It's about the terminology. Yes, exactly. Paying it. You want folks shot down you fo shot to I'm telling you, they're creating some kind of narrative to prepare ourselves to maybe brainwash ourselves, twist our, the way that we see UFOs as being evil or negative or bad and worthy of being shut down. This is what I really see happening. It's not about what they down. It's how the terminology that they're using.

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Oh, hold on. I have I have right here. And applause because absolutely, that is exactly what we have been saying since and not that all these things haven't led to fantastic stuff. Not that it has not led to more open discussions, people in Congress being aware that there are programs out there with the money that they've put out without ever realizing it. And that's where it really came down to is like, whoa, wait a minute, I'm right onto this topic, and why didn't I know about these people researching it? And why did the money come from my committee, we need to get into this. And granted, that's led to an annual now report. No different than the NDA where they're gonna bury things inside of it all day long. You know, and the conversation during that whole first hearing in the conversation ever since. has been air defense.

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Yes, they talked a lot about sources and methods and this and that, and this and that. On my YouTube channel, alien spirit, where I have a video where I go through that entire congressional Yeah, yeah. And give my opinions and talk about it and discuss it overall, the parts of it that were crazy, but overall, I was really happy.

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Sure, absolutely. Yeah, man. Granted, I loved every part. There were probably about four or five parts where they'd ask a hard question, it'd be like, we'll talk about that in the closed door session after this.

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submersibles? Yeah,



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yeah, exactly. You know, and lo and behold, yes, since then, all kinds of things have come out about submarines being buzzed by objects, all kinds of stuff. But once again, all of the talk forever and always is is about that budget. And about that defense budget and and what do we do? What do we do about these objects? And even even if these are balloons, what have you, it carries on once again, like you said, that mentality of fear. And what do we do about these objects? Well, we fund more weapons is what we do.

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we fund more weapons. We increase the defense budget specifically for this because we will wait a minute we don't have a defense budget for that.

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space for us what's the space was?

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Yeah. And that's one that even we talked about regularly on this show when it was coming about like they've been. They've been talking SpaceForce for years and years, that was nothing new. So yeah, like it's a really a foregone conclusion. And all of it seems I don't know, I almost buy into the idea of Project Blue Beam. Where, yeah, there, they are basically trying to set up for the mass panic of a slice of population through the means of alien invasion.

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I do believe that. That's what it looks like to from, from my perspective, that's what I think is happening. Because they can the masses are starting to believe more and more and more and more, and that is not that's not going to benefit the government.

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Yeah. Yeah. Well, and, you know, it's like we'd said with Reverend Michael Carter, that they're only going to disclose what it behooves them to disclose, right period, whether it's financially or, or even the fact of like, hey, we can only keep this technology on the shelf for so long. 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Yeah, there's something that's right. It's every time we play the game of life at my house I'm like career I'll choose career give me give me a job right now forget the college

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well in the you know, the cool thing is you know what, you know, and you know, my I've been a musician all my life as well and played in various bands and some professional recording. And so I definitely want her to grow up musically inclined, and it's funny, she's not even two yet. And I got her her own little nylon string pink guitar when we do our when I have her we do music videos together. And now she's to the point I grabbed my guitar. She grabbed her guitar and bangs along beside me and everything's I think she's it's good that she's actually picking up on that desire to be musically inclined. I hope it continues as she grows up. So

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yeah, me and me and me and my boy have been here lately doing a little show on Thursday nights. He got a record player for Christmas and has been loving 45 records. And he was like, I want to do a show. And I was like, Well, don't don't tell that to dead. So yeah, we're doing a live broadcast every Thursday night, just like playing classic 40 fives and things like that on Mixcloud it's super fun. Just kind of talking about music and he dances around and we play 45 records. It's great. He loves it.

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Dude, I remember I remember as a kid, my first 45 that I got, you know, of course I'm aging myself now. But remember, they had the battery powered 45 players you can carry around with like a little suitcase. And I had one of those and I have for Christmas one of the first 40 fives I got three dog night. Jeremiah was a bullfrog

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nice, nice pack. Yeah, we have been enjoying all kinds of fun stuff. I guess the big one that that he loved not too long ago was spooky. We got we got spooky. And he really enjoyed that one like a lot. So it's been interesting going back and forth with you over the last few days. With all this spy balloon stuff, everything else. We had my turbo rom when the first balloon was shot down. And since then, like I told them and then we had a we had him on the first week to talk about the UFO UAP report, which is now an annual report. Then that weekend, the first balloon incident happened over Montana and we had him on breaking the news that there was electronic equipment aboard and and surveillance and counter surveillance equipment aboard it since then there have been a couple of other balloons. Alaska was talked about whenever we did the show wasn't confirmed. But now we're into Canada, all kinds of things. We're into smaller balloons that don't necessarily look like balloons. But it's it's been interesting. And I think it's really raised the conversation of portable technology. And like, oh, you know, what are they gonna do with a balloon could do a lot with a balloon could do a lot. So let's let's start getting into some of those possibilities, especially whenever it comes to mass control and, and targeting of individuals, things like that, whenever you're talking about targeting technologies, Havana syndrome type stuff.

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Well, you know, it's interesting to see China kind of reverting back to an older technology because that's one of the things I mentioned in my book in Guinea pigs just you know, for some of us solutions when you know, people are, you know, having their homes broken into and, you know, having their, you know, their cars tracked and things like that trying to establish a security code in your home alarm that your home still being broken into. One of the recommendations that I made in Guinea pigs was to revert back to basically older archaic technology to catch the break and because the sad fact is when you when you can, when they can pick up on your brainwaves and hear your thoughts in real time, you're never going to have a security code that they don't know. So because you have to think about it to be able to input it. And you know, the people doing this, they're they're used to breaking into homes, they're used to calling ADT pretending to be you. You know, as a matter of fact, I mentioned in my first book, you know, I at first I was like, Man, I gotta monitor alarm, how are they getting in my house? Well, when I called ADT, my, all of the numbers had been changed by one number, you know, the numbers that you give ADT, to call when the alarm goes off, the fire department was actually changed to a public service recording number, my cell phone number was changed by one, my office number was changed by one, they called pretending to be me, and had all my data to do it. To change all of that I had to have it all changed the back. But when they know your code, they can just step in and shut the alarm off. And one of the ways they were breaking into my house was coming through the garage. Typically, in most homes, the garage is not not part of your alarm system. So the garage door can open and it doesn't set off the alarm. They do that because a lot of people wouldn't have time to open the door, get in the back room and turn the alarm off. So and then they were lowering my attic access stairs in the garage, the alarm was going off until the motion detector was picking them up when they came through the the attic inside the house. Never in no time was a front door or back door being opened. So I mean, they once the alarm started going off, they would either at first, the police were showing up. In that event, the police even told me we've been to your house about 16 times with your alarm going on. Maybe it's malfunctioning. So there were people in my house every time you can't, it's just they weren't breaking and entering the room or opening the garage door which you can buy universal openers that switch frequency search frequencies until they find the one that opens your garage door that that is easy enough to do. Or you can you use a coat hanger to open a garage door. I mean, it's really easy. So that's one of the things I put in my book is the riverbank older type here if you're worried that somebody's coming into your house, you know, sprinkle you know talcum powder or baby powder along in front of the entrance is in the exit you know, where you know at least you'll see if somebody tracks through it and tracks through your house they'll never don't never clean that up. You can also buy sprays that are fluorescent that are invisible to the naked eye and once it's on their feet or on their hands Everywhere they go with UV light you can see whose track through your home

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yeah, a little

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yeah late Yeah, little things like that are you know are setting you know the thing third breaking in and getting on your computer, you know, set a piece of paper between the keys, that's an assignment so minute that you know, when they manipulate the keyboard, it's going to blow off or move and and you'll see that it's you know, there's been manipulated Now, that being said, Now beloved, to break hands that are involved in targeting, they want you to victim to enough so I mean a lot of time, it's you know, they'll grab all your clothes and stick them on the island in the kitchen or leave a cigarette burning in your house when you don't smoke. Or, you know, intentionally leave the smell of cigarette smoke in there, you know, because they want you to call the police and say well, somebody was in my house they went through all my clothing and they left a cigarette burning and you know, the police say well was anything stolen? You know, well no. Yeah, well, well nothing stolen you you have no case. So you get criminal trespassing, that's a report it's not investigated. And the Chinese have figured that out apparently, that you know, with all of our surveillance, you know, technology that you can still float a balloon here at a certain altitude and you know, all of our you know, radar installations and satellites are geared for you know, looking at heat signatures and metallic large objects not not something that's most mostly vinyl with you know, 100 pounds of tech in it

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well now granted the first balloon that came across the package attached to it was approximately the size of three city buses. So it was no small thing that was one of the things I brought up with Mike turbo was that's the last thing you want to shoot down. If you don't, like a you don't know what's inside of it. Um, B unless you can track its exact trajectory on the way down who knows what it's gonna hit, you know, like you can land on top of a school. I mean, like I said, it was in the middle of Montana, so likelihood probably not. Felt like it was floating through downtown San Antonio, you know, but even then, whenever you're talking about anything like that, you have no idea like, you were just speaking of of the ease of which somebody could tap in and get garage door code I'm holding in my hand right now, a piece of RF scanning technology, I use it in my industry all the time to find competing signals in hotels like, oh, what frequency is their radio on, you know what frequencies are open for me to be able to tune my microphones to so that they don't have competition, all I have to do is turn this on. And if somebody hits their garage door nearby, I will literally see a spike and it will tell me the numbers of the megahertz like right there both it will give me the exact frequency that just popped up around me. Now the frequency technology to duplicate that and get it out there a little bit different but this is commercially available. Like it's sitting on my desk in front of me that's, that's how common it is in my life to have one around.

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Well, and the other the other. And the other thing was a garage door. A lot of people don't realize that. You can take a long coat hanger, go over the top of the garage, catch that little clip on the release from the lock, pull it back once it releases, then it's free to open and close

by hand.

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Yeah. So and we even whenever you're talking there was there was the article the other day. Hold on, let me find it. Because if you Google Chinese lasers Hawaii There we go. Here comes the article on screen right now out of kh a in working for Hawaii. Chinese satellite lasers recorded over Hawaii. This was this was like right up around the same time as this was February 11. So this was just a couple days ago that they active. And this was recorded by you can see the image here of the actual lasers coming out of the sky. It was recorded by the observatory. And there were all kinds of articles like what are these strange lights? And it's like it's lasers from a Chinese. That's that's the kind of technology that is out there right now. And when you're talking about the CNET article that I had up a minute ago from 2012. I'm tethered tech wireless sensors monitor brainwaves to to think of the fact that they could hover over an area and gather brainwaves. Not not impossible. Not in the least.

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No, no, you know, like, in my first book, you know, I made a point to, you know, illustrate that a lot of this was being done, lined up by satellite. Now with this type of targeting, there's always going to be a Plan B and A Plan C, you know, they're they're never gonna put all their eggs in one basket where it's all done one way now, you know, and certainly, you know, now you can, you can track somebody inside by, you know, by seeing what their position is within their own Wi Fi. So, and you know, and we're all bathed in Wi Fi signals now that we're using 5g, which is unified 5g Kochi with, you know, with Wi Fi signal just about everywhere you go unless you're truly in rural areas. But you know that that's one way to actually determine choose inside of a home and where is by tracking and within within their own Wi Fi.

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Yeah, yeah. And that that technology has been coming around for a long time. I remember, whenever we first met, was the first time that I heard about people using like, mesh networks, and that kind of stuff and, and Wi Fi signals from routers, to be able to basically do the same thing. Oh, like what they showed in Batman, where it's like, oh, let me use all the cell phone signals like a like a huge bat and get echolocation. And that's pretty much the same thing that's happening with this technology, being able to use the the known pulse quantitive to basically map an area and be able to see objects and even in real time be able to see that. So yeah, to think that anything like that wouldn't have been aboard this this balloon, even the first balloon had guote, Eclass materials. We had to beat that last week, folks, whenever we add my mic Tiburon that hadn't even been released to the media that came out in the media, that there was an electronic materials package on there on Thursday. Feel free to and I



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know that in the end, I know they're worried about these things, having exploited explosives and then personal, which I was trying to acknowledge and I would certainly have a way to destroy your robot Rut like you know if I were behind it too which was I know one of the

things we're worried about in, in shooting them down now the the other objects that they shot down, I don't think so far the media or what they haven't released to the press that their buildings just yet, you know, they're still referring to them as objects. And but obviously they're getting here and not being picked up, you know, until they're already here which, you know, with my mistrust of the government. And of course, you know, and we've talked about this, you know, one of my fears is, to some extent, are they being allowed, you know, to enter your space and, you know, night because it was a civilian that got a picture of a big one that they shot down after it hovered over Montana over our, you know, Minuteman missile bases for a while and then made its way out to the Atlantic where they shot it down. But, you know, you know, unfortunately, right now we have an administration that is, try has been pretty friendly, the China has made a lot of money off of China. And I just, I just worry, you had a civilian not taking a picture this balloon, would it would have, would we have ever known it was even here?

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I think that we would have, we would have never known. I don't think that they would have ever released the fact that it was over us, I don't think that I think that they would have downed it the exact same way that they downed it. Wait until it got over the coast, that's the smart thing to do. You have no idea what's inside of it. If there's an explosive package, if there's, you know, like we said, with Mike turbo, if there's a biological package, even inside of the air of the balloon, so to let prevailing winds push it off into the water. And, and far off close to where Yeah, lands in, the water splashes down there. And any airborne debris just dissolves into the air, not over a populated area. That's the safest bet. But like he said, a lot of the reason why they kept going and why they let it keep going, was because they were gathering intelligence from it. They were actively intercepting signals, all kinds of things. So a lot of it was the data that they were able to gather from the device as it sent things back was almost invaluable.

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Well, the what troubles me is then they made the comment that three of those balloons had flown over during the Trump administration. Yep. But Trump, his security adviser, and his head of the Department of Defense, said that they never worked hold that if it happened. So, you know, if the people that are in the civilian side of government, are being told by the Pentagon when something like that happens, then kind of got a problem with that too?

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Well, when it's a prime example of what we've said numerous times on this show, John, the fact of the people think the President is briefed on everything on a daily he's not. He's not, he's not, I'd love to say he is he is, as far as chain of command goes, the buck does not stop there. Unfortunately, he is only commander in chief quote in time of military exercise, you know, in time of actual war. So there he is not on a need to know basis for everything that comes across the plate. He is He is full on a temporary employee, he doesn't need to know 1015 year overarching military plans. That scope of any president's terms.

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Well, I think the security adviser should probably know when one was for foreign classes in our airspace, you know, and that which, which leads me back to what we've also talked about before, is, you know, has the intelligence community reached a point where there's so little oversight, that they actually are running the country? Yeah. So

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yeah. And you know, that I was discussing that with my wife earlier today. Because she, she queued into something, a show that I was watching in the background, and she was like, whoa, whoa, and I was like, Yeah, this is the oh, it was the fact that almost all the presidents share a common ancestor. And she was like, Whoa, set true. I was like, Yeah, you you start digging back far enough. They they all biologically traced back to one person in England. And that is where a lot of people get the get the quote, globalist globalist agenda concept and the idea that there's a, almost an Illuminati type society. He has been running America and putting somebody in charge. It seems like it's a random person, you know, because they're utterly not connected. But when you start digging back far enough, and yeah, they're all related to this one person. So it's like you'd love to say it's full on just hearsay and conjecture. But then there's that and it's like, wow, wow, yeah, that's wild. You start, you start digging and finding out things like Trump's direct uncle had hands on the documents that came out of Tesla's safe. Trump's direct blood uncle whose knee he likes, sat on it, family parties, things like that was there the day that Nikola Tesla's safe was broken open, and they took the documents out? That's just wild. It's crazy.

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Well, and you know, George Carlin summed it up perfectly about 15 years ago, and one of his last comedy specials went live. When he said the government is one big old good old boys club. And you and I aren't in it. Yeah.

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Yeah. Yeah. And, you know, it's hard to not say that. When you start seeing things when you start when you start peeling back, and it doesn't take like, shovels full of dirt. It takes like an archaeologist trowel of screen scraping. It's just under the surface. It's not like they buried at harden deep. To see almost the incestuous way. Things happen in government, the way that batons are passed from person to person. And even now, to see like my brother texted me today, while you and I were going back and forth with the articles and stuff like that. My brother texted me about, you know, UFO shut down over Canada. And I was like, Yeah, note the term used. It, it'd be a UAP. If, if they were using modern military nomenclature. Yeah, they're using UFO because it's not that it's, it's full on. What, what what they should be saying it is it is an object that they don't know what it is. But it ain't that.

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Well. and that's what that's been. That's the problem I had with the early reports when they

after the Alaska and they said, Well, it's an object was it was well, I mean, it was an object with a balloon attached to it. Was it a balloon? Was it a drone? You know, we know. Well, we're all we're seeing for now, it was an object. Well, I mean, you you had to see it either visually or electronically to hit it. You know. So I mean, I think you know, same thing they're saying with this latest one been, they said that it shut down airspace over Montana because of a radar anomaly. Then the senator from Montana got it? Oh, it's not a radar anomaly. There was an object he knows. And they just, you know, we're waiting till daylight to actually finish tracking it. And then they came out. No, no, no, there's no object over Montana. It's a radar anomaly. And then, of course, today, they said, Well, we shot one another one down over Lake Huron. So I mean, it's, you know, when, in which the media has always been friendly to this administration, and most of the media, but when they're even being lied to, or they're while they're passing along the the lie? That's troubling to you. I mean, especially with once they had to come to admit that these objects are flying into our space, like I said, a civilian not taking a picture of that first building. And I don't think we would have ever known they would have never announced it to the media. They did they had to.

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It's like numerous guests had said like Reverend Michael J. S. Carter, it's, they aren't going to tell you anything that they aren't, they aren't going to be disclosing anything that they aren't forced to disclose, or that it's not in their best interest or vested financial interest to disclose. You know, when it comes to UFO, UAP disclosure or anything like that, like yeah, a lot of what you're seeing and hearing is technological leap forward. You know, where it's like if we leaked the technology, then we can at least now admit that the technology exists. And at that point, we can put it into things and make money back from the black budget money that was made to create the technology. But right now, what's going on with this? I am almost more apt to think that it is it is part of almost a military SIOP by the enemy you know, we're Russia is doing crazy things right now. All kinds of stuff. The places that they're coming over from, other than the known Chinese balloon seem to be mad because

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of because we, because they're still not releasing any origin. Yeah, they're not, you know, the they matter of fact of the last news report I heard, the Pentagon was saying, well, we'll be real careful not to write these off as other crafts that are coming from China, because we just don't know yet. So

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and a lot of people forget the fact that the West Coast of America was bombed by the Japanese, there just was a whole lot that didn't go off. They had high altitude balloons that dropped bombs all across the West Coast of America. They just happened to go so high that the detonators froze. So when they landed, it was just dead weight. It was just a 500 pound bomb of weight hitting the ground. But there's plaques all over to the West Coast of America, marking places where 500 pound Japanese bombs were found with balloons attached to them.

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So well, and like I told you, when we were talking before the show is, you know, my my fear is I think, you know, that China, I'm sure has, you know, you know, reconnaissance and surveillance satellites that are, you know, on par with ours, you know, you can, you know, read the date on a penny. So, I mean, if I'm assuming that they have the same satellite technology, they probably can see everything they need to see it those Minuteman missile silos that they need to see via satellite. My fear is that, you know, which will be talked about, and I would love to get my Turner's take on this is, you know, are they searching for the best point over the continental United States to have an EMP to knock out the entire grid? You know, because the only way to get the entire grid, but you would, you would have to have the EMP blast, you know, over the interconnections where the East West, and there's an East grid, a West grid and a Texas grid, and they all do interconnect, and they enter to interconnect, right, they're kind of Midwest and Montana. You know, I mean, it's all around that area. And that you probably would want to have a little lower flying, you know, photographic capability and electronics, you know, capability to get that because otherwise, you're going to need three separate blasts to knock out the entire grid nationwide. Well,

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I've actually got the North American power grid up right now on screen. And you can see like you're saying there's pretty much a divide almost right down the country, Texas is just about on its own grid. We are interested and it's pretty much Yeah, but yeah, and in our private conversations, that's a lot of what I've been saying is it seems like something like that there has been there was the attack recently on the solar array for MGM Resorts in Vegas, there was an attack I mean, there have been numerous power grid attacks across the United States in the last month. Month and a half.

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Yeah, digitally Yeah.



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Not even digitally. Like people go out and attacking substations with like firearms and stuff like that it's there's been about three or four of them there was one in Pennsylvania there was there was a one I was talking about in Vegas and it's it's been entrusted there was the there was the attack at Hoover Dam dam

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and there has been some some state actions going against power stations and stuff to you know,

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it's been all kinds of hack attacks everything else. So to think of it something like that, because that's that's kind of what I've been saying is it seems much more like a litmus test or poking the bear to see like, Where's where's the weak spot? You know, what's what's what's your response time?

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And just in case your listeners don't realize this, I mean, most of them probably do. You have a pretty well educated listenership, but the you know, the thing with any MP that takes the whole grid out, just you all you probably were part of it, you know, recently we had a bad ice storm in Texas two years ago. We had a bad snowstorm that you know, I mean, I was without power and water for 10 days. And, you know, if you have a grid blackout, you can't get gas you can't use an ATM the trucks aren't gonna roll to the grocery store will hell in Texas, you know, we had to date not only you're not pumping water, you know, we had a, you know, an ice storm that you know, What, you know, 48, you know, three days power loss. And I mean, they're the grocery store runs out of food and water in the first 48 hours. So, I mean, the Chinese or any other bad actor would have to know that. If you shut the grid down with an EMP, it's not down for three or four days, it's down for six months to a year. And they know that they won't have to put troops on the ground. We'll kill each other.

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Yeah, yeah, exactly. We've had the discussion before we had the discussion. And not only with you, but we've had it with Dr. Robert Duncan, people have this concept. That is that it takes the overwhelming majority for something to either kickoff or happen. It does not. It takes the underwhelming minority prime example would be the overthrow of Hosni Mubarak. That was, that was a gathering of a few 1000 people, like 10,000 people. And they overthrew a dictatorship. That was that was from a random group on Facebook, in the infancy of Facebook, you know, brought to you by en que tal.

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Well, you know, and if you want to go we go back even further, the Bolshevik Revolution. Yeah, that was one that was one guy, one guy that had already been kicked out of Russia, you know, came back gathered up a following of about 1000 friends. And next thing, you know, you know, it's the Soviet Union.

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Man 1929. One dude walked into a bank in New York and went, you know what, man, I'm just not having a good time of it. I'm not trusting things. I'd like to get all my money. And that's all it took. Somebody else in the bank heard it, and somebody else heard it and somebody and then it spread. And yeah, it doesn't take much to upset the cart, or to cause the rot in in a barrel of apples, so to speak. You know, and when you're talking about these kinds of things, when you're talking about Deep State stuff, when you're talking about nefarious actors in in governments and alphabet agencies, things like that. Even the technology that we typically talk about with you and Dr. Duncan. It rings right up there with this stuff there. There have been numerous stories that I have posted lately about parents who just flipped like 180 degrees, just randomly one day, started hearing voices and ended up killing their children.

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That were Yeah, that recently happened. I think that that woman was a nurse. Yep. And she did have postpartum depression, she, you know, had been placed on you know, tri cyclic antidepressants, which husband thinks made her worse. was hospitalized with it, you know, said that she came back immediately after being hospitalized was really seem to be okay. Sent him on a trip to the grocery store, and strangled her kids. Yeah. While he was gone, yeah, and then tried to try to kill herself by jumping out of a second story when hitting her

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wrists and jumping out of the window. It was it was even right now I've got goosebumps thinking about it. horrifying story to think about and these cases are getting more and more. We're starting to hear more and more about things like this. We're starting to hear more and more about people. Like the gentleman that we spoke about a year or so ago, who just randomly flip script one day was a happy go lucky off roading guy and the next thing he's in a standoff with police after posting things on social media, like hey, you hear something going on about me it's not true. Just it's been interesting over the last year and a half, two years to see these cases popping up in the news a whole lot more. And to think of even once again, the the idea of a doesn't take an overwhelming majority it wouldn't it look at the recent freeze and what it did in places like New York and New Jersey where places were looted. You know, it wouldn't take an overwhelming majority to lose power for a few days to go off rails and in to start causing mayhem across the country. It

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really means Check a lot. And, you know, we don't make any of those components here anymore. All of those components are imported transformers are important. And, you know, and there's a backorder on those already just to replace the ones that are going out with routine use. Yeah. So and that's why, you know, all of the experts say that, if there's a widespread grid failure due to emp, that before they would actually be able to replace the transformers and get new wiring put up. I mean, it's, it's literally a year. Yeah, you know, so. And at that point, you know, when the food and water runs out, you know, that whoever the bad actor is, whether it's China or somebody else, they don't have the land troops on our coastlines. Nope, your neighbor, your fears are going to be from your neighbors, you know, and they're not going to be there to steal your money, they're going to be there to steal your water and your food and kill you if they have to get it.



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Oh, it's, uh, you know, sadly, it is a situation that I think people should at least be prepared for my grandfather was probably the first quote prepper that, that I ever knew. And I wouldn't even nut him in the in the quote prepper category. You know it wasn't anything crazy. He He was

So he had a good stock of shotgun shells, things like that more to be able to provide food for his family. But yeah, anything happened. He was ready for it more more importantly, it was the fact of he had a cupboard of canned goods, and dry goods that you just didn't go in. You didn't touch those Vienna sausages when you were reaching for some. Those were those were emergency use, he had like numerous five gallon jugs of water, stored things like that. So he was he was ready to be able to supply food for his family for a month, at a minimum. And I always found that pretty admirable.

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Well, and you know, over the last 20 years or so, you know, especially with, you know, un recommendations, is that there's fewer and fewer of us living rurally Yeah, you know, and that and that's by design, you know, as well rural people are, are harder to control. You know, if you can generate your own electricity, and you've got to, well, to get get your waterfront, as a matter of fact, I labor. And, you know, there was even, even in the state of Texas about 10 years ago, they were talking about coming out and putting meters on your will and start charging you for your own water. You know, and people came unglued. You know, they think they, they haven't done it yet, because I think they realize that, you know, we're probably going to be taken in coming when we try to come do this to people. You know, I mean, if you got the water rights, and you paid the drill, well, then you really shouldn't be having to pay the government for your water. So but you know, once they control the water and the food and realize that rural people are harder to control, and the whole point of agenda 21 was to drive the population in urban settings, you know, because it's easier to control people in an urban setting. You know, I mean, there's fewer and fewer people actually living rurally and man if you're living in an apartment complex or in and the grocery store runs out of food for a month, I mean, you're definitely in harm's way after that.

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Oh, most definitely. Most definitely. And I mean, we saw that at the beginning of COVID. You know, I mean, just hop in the Wayback Machine by not that far folk. Even right now whenever things were going crazy over the last week or so here like you were saying with the ice storm, my wife went to the grocery store, the day or so before that and things were limited to 20 items a person and even then like shelves were bare. You know, even right now like you are a happily lucky individual with the flock of ladies you have producing for you. I miss my chickens. Because eggs are crazy expensive. Right now we have a massive bird flu epidemic going on in the country at farming centers and it has been driving up the cost of egg production but even before this freeze and all that if you went to the dairy section, the egg the egg section was decimated, decimated and the price steady going up.

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So where and when and when eggs go down are on shorter supply then there's a lot of other things that use eggs and the ingredients if you've noticed, there's really very little bread on the bread aisle right now tonight. There's not the least novice election that you're probably used to see, you know,

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it's, it's interesting to see the chain reaction of things, you know, even even the concept of shipping and getting it there and all that kind of stuff, the infrastructure issues. All of all of probably about three years ago, it was the year just before COVID, there was a an event that I used to work every year in Boston. And I worked the the executive luncheon every year. And that executive luncheon, they had a person from MIT come in, who basically did like fuzzy math, all kinds of stuff, and he gave a presentation on automated trucking in America, and the coming of automated trucking, the fact that it will be inevitable, it's going to be happening. And one of the big questions at the end, this was all like CEOs of companies like a cat and all kinds of stuff like logistics companies, and they're like, Well, you know, what, don't you think people are going to be angry that you're taking all these jobs? News like to think that they would be spending millions of dollars to develop automated 18 wheelers that there were people who wanted to come drive the 18 Wheeler. It's like, that's the problem that we're facing. Now, and we have to find a solution for it, we have to figure out a solution. Because without trucking in America, without the rail system in America, you ain't get nothing, man. So much is still carried by that. And without the people there to work it with me, we just had the huge, the huge train strike. Like that, that whole industry almost halted. And that's scary to think about when you're talking about infrastructure, food distribution, things like that. Then you could it was made and

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you can't, then you compound that with the fact that we no longer produce anything in this factory. Exactly. You're talking, you're talking about the the things that were hard to get right at the beginning of COVID. Well, you know, in the real world, I'm also you know, and it got to the point so because all of our PPE was coming from China, we you know, we don't we don't make surgical gloves and masks and shoe covers, and hair covers and all that. So all that stuff was coming from China. And it got so bad, not a month into COVID that I mean, we were being told, well hang on your mask, you're going to need to use it for a week. Mask. Yeah, yeah. And if you're in any of your gloves aren't too bloody, you know, you're, you know, wash them off, and because you're gonna have to reuse them. I mean, we couldn't couldn't hardly get PPE, you know, and you would think that it would have you know, taught the government a lesson I said, you know, they can afford to produce you know, it's a tax break, so be it. But, you know, certain items need to be produced here, you know, and like, there for a while chicken was in short supply. Part of the problem with that is the chickens were grown here. They were butchered here, flash frozen or sent to China for the rest of the cleaning and the packaging and then sent back. So I mean, it's, you know, we, you know, we've allowed them to foster a dependence on them in this country, that should have never happened.

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Oh, absolutely. Absolutely. And what am I one of my favorite things that came out of all that was actually the fact that Master P, like the rap star, say what you want man, he started years ago, like a almost like \$1 Dollar General type company, you know, that like rebrands, a lot of stuff, things like that and puts out cheaper brands and cheaper versions of things. When the pandemic happened, he switched gears and like came out with his own line of toilet paper, his own line of hand sanitizer, like he was one of the only people in the country that you could go to and buy all of that was like the brilliant

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did he come out with him? Didn't he come out with his own line of chips? Yeah. Oh, yeah.

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Yeah, man man's got his fingers and everything. It's great. But it is the situation of Yeah. How would we deal with that? You know, I mean, you you see how feral people become without the internet for a week. You know, if they're put through that without it being voluntary, like, oh, yeah, you know, I'm gonna go to a mountain retreat and not have internet access or something like that. But if you are put through it forcibly, if you're put through a week with no hot water, no availability to water. You're literally stepping 100 years back, you know, like that. That was the point that I brought up with the Big Freeze that happened a couple years ago, John was the you know, everybody was really, really upset with our cotton. Don't get me wrong, there were some things to be upset about. However, most of our power in Texas comes from really, really big wind farms out in West Texas. And those things are made to run in like 120 degree heat, not negative temperatures. The the last time that storm happened, we didn't have a power grid. That's how frequently that storm happens.

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Well, and you know, the interesting thing is when you know, I said I was without power and water for 10 days. And when the power finally started to try to come back on. I had a buddy of mine, Brian, our, you know, Brian, was, you know, was living with me at the time. And we sat down and we kind of timed it. And we noticed, man, it's like, the power comes on, it's 15 till every hour. So there and then shuts off on the hour. So each hour, there's in this from this was for like three days, you get 5015 minutes of electricity, every hour. So we were I mean, I was about out of gasoline for the generator, and I was about out a diesel truck. So we ran up to the nearest spur. And sure enough, the pumps were down. And then we waited there till 15 until the pumps kick on. It took them about five minutes to actually calibrate, and then set where you could use them. And then we had 10 minutes to pump some gas and pump some diesel for it shut down for another 45 minutes. So it's funny because when we got up there to pump gas, then people saw us there pumping gas and like, yeah, that store had powering on again, gas. Next thing I know there was 100 people in line behind us. Yeah, that hadn't didn't didn't think about timing out when the power was on. And, of course, by time we were done and they got up there to the pump. Of course it was off again.

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Well, it's hard to I mean, all you have to do is once again we're getting here in just a few minutes Super Bowl will be on. All you have to do is watch a major sporting event in the aftermath of it. You know, like what were some of the only people I know in the world were when our team wins, we go jack up our own town. We like go overturn cars and light them on fire. Like our team won, like what are you doing? There is a mob mentality that goes on just earlier today. I was on Facebook, I was watching 2001 this morning with my son and recorded



the scene of recorded like 15 seconds of the scene with the with the apes freaking out around the around the obelisk and I was like Yeah, yeah, Kubrick got it right. Like that is pretty much our reaction to everything. Everything right there, like sums it up in 15 seconds.

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Now the one good No, no, the one good thing was if they floated EMP over and if they're doing all this surveillance right before the Superbowl, and they know that 90% of America is going to be occupied for the up. The one bright side of that is, you know, a good EMP that shuts down the grid entirely, probably will will, you know, cut down on some of the targeting.

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Yeah, it'll be it'll be pretty precise. And a you know, granted, that's worst case scenario. There's 100 Other things that could happen. There's 100 other technologies that they could be floating overhead to do all kinds of things. And that is kind of the point here is that we really do as a citizenry need to hold our government accountable. Like you were saying earlier if it weren't for a person with a camera, you know, somebody like me with like high powered binoculars and a telescope going like, Hey, what the heck's that thing? Would we have ever heard about it? And And much like the UFO UAP conundrum that we are in right now. When when wind of things got to the people who are in charge of that money in Congress, they were like, Yo, how come we didn't hear about this? And then hearings happened and now we have an annual report. accountability. And now we actively have a much more open conversation. We have an actual reporting protocol. There has never been an interdepartmental reporting protocol. Number one, it was never encouraged to report anything you report something you're lucky you keep your job. You know, well see something say nothing. situation, Doctor.

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Well, and you and I have been doing this long enough where we have such a healthy mistrust for her own government that, you know, when they, when they weren't word we were refusing to elaborate on object and then when they use older terminology, I call them UFOs. First thing I texted you as a ploy not about like, you know, launch this right here before the, you know, before the Superbowl, you know, but especially especially with this this administration, so in bed with China that they would blame it on certain aliens before they would blame it on China any well,

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and you know, that has been a big conversation that we've had with a lot of people especially with the UFO UAP report things like that is the the idea of everything that was said in that congressional hearing was airspace, airspace, danger, airspace, money, airspace, danger, national security, danger, money. And, and you know, that that's just it. Even now, with this is one of those, what hearings will come about from this? What agencies will come about because of this? What what, what things will be attached to bills because of this, and that, that's what you really have to look out for is not necessarily the incident itself, because the incident itself like like these incidents? Pretty, pretty small, nothing, nothing. Absolutely crazy. These were not explosive packages. These were not like, hey, yeah, you know, here's biological material, it was nothing like that. Even right now China has has an object near their base. So they say so they say, Yeah, we have one too. You have a lot of but when you're talking about technology, like wireless brain monitors, when you're talking about technologies, like laser beams literally being seen coming down from satellites from space, that kind of stuff there. There is no no,

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no, but wait, wait, no, wait, wait, Chris. Yeah, no, I was I was told 10 years ago by government officials that satellites can't get can't satellites can't get a laser through the atmosphere. Yeah.

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I'm not gonna say anything about the space lasers.

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Well, yeah, and, and that, and actually, that came up at the, you know, in 2010, we've never Obama had the bioethics commission, and I spoke at the back legislation. And Amy Gutmann was the one that was setting all that up. And, you know, there's actually a Facebook group that, you know, the conversation is basically all about that bioethics commission, because there was great hope that she was actually looking for the truth. Well, you know, and I've, you know, I think I posted on my guinea pigs Facebook page that, you know, Amy Gutmann was she headed up that as a bioethicists, then she was basically given the presidency of UPenn. And then she was promoted to a ambassadorship to Germany, and then was actually the president of the Biden youth hit that Biden 10 Foundation, where they found a bunch of classified documents. So I mean, for anybody that was, you know, placing any hope in that bioethics commission. Once I spoke at it, I realized that this woman was a partisan hack, and was really not looking through the truth. Because there were easily 100 people there that got up and gave her testimonies. And at the end of the commission, you know, her finding was that there's no non consensual experimentation going on in the United States. You know, if you remember, the whole reason for that bioethics commission was because Hillary had to come forward and apologize for experimenting on prisoners in Guatemala with weaponized syphilis and gonorrhea. So yeah, so I mean, it's you know, unfortunately in our government that's kind of the way the game plays

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My favorite meme I saw on Facebook regarding the first big balloon was, you know, fly that thing over Texas. And the guy said, Well, you guys need to take turns shooting at us. So we know which one of us hates it. Yeah,

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exactly. It's a you know, it's strange to see some of the stuff going on with our government right now. It's strange to see things like this happening in the news. And once again, like you said, quite possibly being forcibly put out in the news. The fact that they probably didn't want this story to be out to begin with any of these. But because the first one came out, the second one came out. And because that one came out, the third one came out. So now the conversation is what's to be made of balloons what's to be made of a technology as simple as this being able to basically circumnavigate what should be one of the best air defense grids in the world. Above Matt Malmstrom Air Force Base, not once but twice.

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Well, in my favorite was toward my my favorite is when China announced that it was a civilian weather building, just so your listeners realize there's nothing civilian that comes out of China.

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Well, we addressed the weather balloon question with Mike tuba and showed images of weather below weather balloons are when when they're that close to the ground, very small. Like they're very small laptop, very long, trailing bottom. That is not what this was this look like somebody oversized party balloon.

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Well, my point is nothing gets launched out of China as a civilian entity. Yeah. Yeah. The CCP controls everything.

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Absolutely. That's exactly and it's not



like it's not like here where you're gonna say, Oh, okay. Well, Northrop Grumman, you know, launched a weather balloon. That doesn't happen,



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or NASA. Yeah, yeah, exactly. So thank you so much for taking the time to come on and just kind of bang this idea around. Because once again, I I wonder about the psychological evaluation going on and the litmus test and even to see how our media reacts and how we react. It is once again such a subtle form of control, to do and use things like this to metrica society. And not a lot of people see that not a lot of people realize that.

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And I was surprised when you call me to to intervene. I thought for sure you'd be placed on a call. I was looking forward to listening to Mike term are we

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like, hey, like, I think they're just trying to make you a regular like a weekly segment.

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Because I think Mike Turner was probably right in the shotgun and that F 16 up in Alaska, shot the sidewinder into that object.

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He's been on the trail of a lot of stuff with this. And yeah, yeah, it was one of those like, I know right now, there's a lot that he can't talk about with it. But we are definitely having private conversations and chatting about it. As much as he can chat about it. It's always interesting to to hear him on the sideline and to see the things that he posts he put out a couple of videos today about the location of the stuff in Alaska, where things were last seen and all that kind of stuff so but I just want to thank you for always coming on always having such great conversations together again soon. So
