Great to have you back on I always love our conversations and the topic tonight of the Shroud of Turin, as I told you before the show is near and dear to my heart. It is really one of the first, I guess points of fascination and mystery that I hit. When I was very young, I remember seeing a National Geographic, that my grandfather had about it. And it just fascinated me fascinated me it was one of the lenticular covers that like changed whenever you moved it. And from that point on, I've been fascinated by this. Regardless of if you believe it's true or not ancient, ancient piece that is tied to the death and resurrection of Christ. Let's go ahead and get into the conversation here, Mary.

Okay, I'm all set, do you want me to start running at the mouth? Please, please. Okay. for about 2000 years, everybody thought that the shroud was authentic. And then in 1988, they decided to do carbon testing. And they sent it to several different countries. And the results all came back, that it was a medieval forgery. So that just, you know, crushed the RIP Christian world, and many people only remember the results of that carbon dating. Now here is why it gets really tricky. Back in 1532, there was a fire in the chapel where the shroud was kept, and the shroud was kept in a silver chest. And the fire was so intense that it melted the chest, and it burned the edges or scorched the edges of the shroud. And it was the edges of the shroud that they had taken for this testing are of carbon dating, carbon dated testing. And it all was, you know, based on that, well, the the nuns had taken that. And they took the shroud and they put

a new Baqi on it, they put patches on it. And because of all the smoke from the fire, it gave us a very false reading of the actual date. Since then, there has been a ton of really scientific research that has shown that yes, there are good reasons to think that this is a real real thing. And let me just for you just a tiny bit with the kind of institutions that have analyzed this at a very scientific level, the Los Alamos National scientific laboratories, NASA, the Sandia laboratories, the US Air Force, weapons laboratories, the Brooks Institute of Photography, and a whole bunch of world respected universities in the US, Europe and the Middle East. So this is not something based on just one person study. It's based on the results of many scientists doing the work. Now, of course, on the surface, even somebody who would try to forge it could try to duplicate the description of Jesus based on the Bible. And yes, the shroud shows The puncture wounds in his head from the crown of thorns, which was actually more like a helmet of thorns. All the wounds that are mentioned in the Bible are shown in the shroud in some way or another. But perhaps the the kind of evidence that convinces people more is what they found at the microscopic level. And one man, who was, let's see, he was a criminologist from Switzerland, and a botanist. And he studied it. And he took regular old adhesive tape, and started picking up debris from the shroud. And then he would analyze what he found in this debris under a microscope. And 75% of the debris on the shroud, according to his research, was from the remains of plants found in Palestine. Now, that's a pretty high percentage. But for him, the most convincing thing was he found pollen from the Tumbleweed thistle, that only blooms in and around Israel. And it only blooms between March and May, which helps confirm the April date for the crucifixion. So that's just one example of the microscopic studies that have been done. To prove that there may be real reasons to believe that this is authentic.

And that is where Nazareth is located. So that's another piece of kind of interesting, you know, information.

She said I have been interested in the Shroud of Turin since 1979 when working for one of the largest photographic labs on the East Coast. In Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, I was employed as a photo restoration artist, Barry and Homer, which was the company she worked for, received the contract to reproduce photos of the shroud for his members in the Shroud of Turin project. I had never seen such detailed photos and was convinced the image was a miracle, since its most significant details, were in the negative image, you can't fake that. And then she came up with some stuff that was new to me, and I have not had the time yet to really confirm this, but I will read it to you. Since then, I have watched some of the most informative videos on YouTube, in scientific analysis of the 2000 year old textile, using the most sophisticated techniques in spectral light, scanned imaging and 3d mapping in the last few years, the most extraordinary artifacts on the human figure itself are shown a necklace, a girdle, or a belt of a rabbi. And a floral wreath placed on the head before burial. And her final paragraph was also DNA of the blood was found to be a be negative, and fun, the maternal line to an ancient sect of Hebrews, that well could count for Jesus having light eyes, and light reddish brown hair. And so I thought that was a pretty interesting response, if beyond what you normally get on a Facebook comment.
