If she sees a mom who's struggling, maybe a single mom or mom, you know, you can see the anxiety, you can read the fear, you absorb that. Or you can see the understanding the compassion, and that sticks with you, too. There's something healing about looking at someone else in the face. While you're telling your story.

America and had just completed a few days in Gloucester. I was gosh, I just felt so inspired by Gloucester I went there and filmed on one day six locations that all had to do with this overarching umbrella topic. I really do I couldn't believe what I encountered and what made it so specialists Gloucester cathedral allows the public up into the upper galleries. I've never been in another cathedral that allows that and of course, that's where all the hidden carvings are the green men are and where real interesting research can happen. So Gloucester trusts their their public to take care of themselves on this, these tight spiral staircases going up and down, and with a rope for a guardrail. So and uneven steps. You know, people have been watching walking on the stairs for centuries. And the views up there are dizzying and the carvings are breathtaking. So I was truly able to walk and discover Templar carvings done by the Cistercian order. The Cistercians were first and developed into an international corporation really by Bernard de Clairvaux, who was the main mastermind behind the Knights Templar and the Knights Templar are basically Cistercians with swords, and they have the same exact rulebook the same, you know, rule of order. So the Templars by that were gone, unfortunately, by the time this gallery was built, but because there were Cistercian abbeys in the area, they had their own stonemasons, I was able to to determine that because of these carvings, that the Templars would have recognized and used themselves. This was a Cistercian stonemason that had done work on Gloucester cathedral and hidden carvings up in the gallery where where worshipers would not have normally been given access to. There's no such thing as standardization in the medieval world. You'll find that in the written language with lack of punctuation, a lot of it was phonetic spelling. So you've got copper saltpeter. And the image below Luna, the moon, that's from a 15th century, German hermetic alchemy text. Now again, it's not exact, but we're talking about codes here. Code SEC could help you win a battle. So code says that if you tried to break or steal you would have been killed for because these are codes that a king wanted to use to give himself an edge on the battlefield. So this is guarded stuff that day. You know, is highly highly guarded material. You know, you can't just walk into the Pentagon and take something however, you know, recently something like that. That kid Yeah, that's

And the animals in the stable the horses, the cows, whatever would pass water and over time, the urine would interact with the cave, the cellar underneath and form. Hi, Mick, I'm sorry, I'm getting this muddled up form a very acidic product that if you were to put on top of copper plating, the copper plating would very quickly form a top thin layer of Verdigris which was used in paint. Because they only pigments, they only had natural forms to to create art with but I found a reference that they used Verdigris in the notches where you place a feather as a antifungal agent to keep little critters from munching on the feathers. Before while you were stockpiling arrows before you went to war. That's huge. So Verdigris was used to protect feathers. And how many feathers? How many arrows Do you think and army would need to launch an attack? Either in the Holy Land? You know, or at home to defend, to defend? You know, and it took a good one to three years to prepare. Oh. So you don't want your feathers to be eaten by little critters while they're being stored? Yeah. But only a wealthy person could do that. Not everybody had that. We're not talking about standardization here. Yeah, we get so confused in the modern era about standardization that didn't exist going back. Even, you know, we're, we're still in the process of standards.

And if you can find the photograph of myself a screenshot where the number 440 404 cells and is represented, there you go. So this assertion cipher in Ross, you can see at the top right that what that's for your single digits. The other side 40 is for your 10s. And then below, you've got your hundreds and your 1000s. But this stage is a little bit wrong, that that triangle on either and isn't alchemy, because it's an open triangle. It's open. So that's kind of a problem. Anyway, the three videos cover a lot of ground, but I appreciate that my research friend noticed the nautical mile reference to Jerusalem and Jerusalem in medieval medieval maps is always depicted at the center of the world and wouldn't have been out of step for a Cistercian who is or you know, Cistercian slash Templar

I want to introduce to you, someone named his name is Sigurd the Crusader. He was the king of the Shetland Islands, the Orkney Islands, and Western Scotland on the coast lines. And he was kind of a, you know, a pretty brutal guy. But he predated the Templars, if you will. He was the first king to go on crusade in support of the first monarch of Jerusalem. And he had 5000 Men 60 ships. And he voyaged to there, and in support of, of the Holy Land, amazing individual. And he was a pretty, you know, a pretty rough fellow, but what happened is that he, because of his disciplinary and approach, he was able to usher in what is regarded as a renaissance of Norse culture. He was the King of Norway, as well. So what fascinates me is Oak Island has a deep relationship with Scotland and with with the Sinclair's that came along later in the 1300s. But he goes back to Hebron rained, you know, he was born in in 1089. And I believe he passed and 1130 and he was in action, the same timeframe as Bernard declarable. But here's the kicker. They've recently discovered that there was a Cistercian monastery. And in Norway, the big discovery was, and that that the the Cistercians were there at the same time as as the King of Norway. Sigurd Oh, wow, Crusader. But they used to think that metallurgy and copper mining or metallurgy of copper was not done there, that they would have had to import copper, but they were smelting us, they found that that one location on Copper River, that the Cistercians were smelting copper, but because of certain things that were happening in Europe over the centuries with the black death with war, this or that, that knowledge of smelting, of deep tunnel mining came and went because people died. The people with knowledge died. So you know, if you were the king, you want to grab hold of those people, get them working for you and leverage their skills. I think Sigurd the Crusader was in A Oak Island and also might have been responsible, someone in his pay was responsible for those markings on the beach there. Now here's the big, epic, epic aha moment. Here's why. Now if you didn't we know the Norse were in Iceland. They were in newfound love. They just kept coming south along the coast. They traversed all the inner waterways. I've just very proud to be working with Director Lucas and Tony on the series on Amazon Prime called the Templars. There are whispers anomalous artifacts, there. But here's the

And that's where you get the new Ross castle. On Nova Scotia, there is actually a fortress depicted on the 1530 map done by cartographer. There's a river. You also get at the far end, the Kensington Runestone, which I do believe is real. You get the site that I went into in Wisconsin on the reservation there. That's the subject of the Templar quest in North America that I wrote on that there is so much stonework so many carvings that are not Native American, but there are you aware of the copper mines and Lake Superior? It's an ancient location. Yeah, the Native Americans were digging these open mine pits, going back, I still can't believe it myself, you know, 1000 years ago, 7000 years ago. And these pits range anywhere from five feet across and just as deep to 30 feet across. And they never develop tunneling. So they mined there for centuries, millennia, and they never developed metallurgy and they weren't smelting. What they did was they broke the copper veins loose from the Matrix stone and pounded it into metal plates. South America was doing metallurgy. Now the majority portion of all that copper has not been found. There was an that's a mystery in itself. Then you get 1800 years where nobody was mining. There's not very much domestic waste because it was an encampment going with the weather scenario, because the weather is terrible there, you know, the snow everything so that the people came in, they mind they left with their tools, they had temporary structures. So flash forward to some point in around 1000 ad. People start mining again, but it's not the Native Americans. According to the Native Americans in that area and their lore. It there were white men mining and they were there up until 1320 When the mining ceased. And you have to ask yourself, Where did that copper go? A Norse crew Sibyl was found on Baffin Island missed a non anomalous excuse me, architecture. And they discovered traces of brass and glass having been in this crucible stone crucible, having been worked out with high high heat, and the ratio of the brass was such that it was pinned on to the Norse. They found similar crucibles in Norway that equated to this crucible founded Baffin Island that had been prior thought was strictly native, indigenous peoples. So, you know, a picture is building up here. I think that Sigurd was potentially there you go. That's it. That's it. He was the one that was mining. And you know, these dates are fluid because it's really hard to get back to an exact date. Unless you've got a lot of a lot of archaeology information. Yeah. Oh, Ireland is doing incredible work with their archaeology information, and they're dating. But unless you can find the the objects and mass it's really hard to pin down. It really is a tough old world. But I I was so astonished to see that carving in the in the tribune gallery, in Gloucester cathedral. And I feel like I'm forgetting to mention something to you. That it's just been it's been a wild ride. I also found in the upper gallery, the cross of Jerusalem, worn by Gottfried to Boolean, as an equal lateral cross in the middle ages, contemporary, as well as being depicted by the muddy cheese as you see in that mural on the left with Oranges, Oranges or tangerines in his hair, and Risa, and the cross of Jerusalem, became expanded over a few 100 years period time. So it was astonishing to find and there are a couple other carvings I found, too. I spent maybe four to five hours there photographing an amazing array of unusual

graffiti marks that I look forward to sharing in the new few near future. But the one that I related to Oak Island I've shared with you here, and in my three my three videos on on YouTube. But it all hinges on that copper mining. And it's very possible that you know, they would have their seafaring vessels would have been would have been moored on the coast. And then they would have taken their more shallowed vessels they could have you even traded with the Native Americans, they could have rented or rent a boat, and also a Native American that wanted to be, you know, paid for taking them further through the waterways. Not all experiences between Native Americans and Europeans were negative, they were trading. And I think they even figured out a way to get past the disease factor. The Native Americans were also fighting between each other there were political problems between tribes. But what what I think they ended up doing was developing a relay stations down the St. Lawrence River into the Great Lakes. And these little fortresses, whether they were wooden, whether were whether they were stone, the Native Americans would go out and hunt, because it was dangerous for the Europeans to do so. Bring back the furs, trade with them. And this was a great open secret prior to Columbus in 1492. And it was a secret that the French crown was trying to protect, but unfortunately the British Crown knew about it, the Spanish knew about it, and they were all duking it out to see who was going to control that great resource. We know that the Norse were, you know, bringing back timber because their timber was scarce. They lived in a harsh landscape, they had to go to other lands to gain resources that they you know, with with if they were having a bad winter, crops failed. There was a period where Europeans were actually being forced westward because of, of Mongol Mongol hordes were pushing People, you know, westward, the Visigoths, you name it, you know, so they were out looking for resources to take back home and survive and and they figured out a way to work with the Native Americans so that the Native Americans didn't get sick. You know, they bring the furs to the gate they trade the European knights that were there and these would have been low tier knights, Junior noble members related to the crown now that the name Roche for called is at the top of Xena helpers map. There were a lot of junior members from the Roche family, distant cousins who were going to that area for for the pelts France had nearly wiped out all their bears in around 600 ad. England the UK wiped out all their bears exterminated them because they were using them for pelts didn't think about the future. So you know, they had to go get it from somewhere else. So, so what I was gonna, say going to say is that so you've got that two by two, with the Templars, and it's even on their seal, to, to Templars on on horseback. And that's a thing in itself. But there the there is a legend that Bernard de Clairvaux, his mother is related to the counts of to loose and the counts of Toulouse protected the Cathars, who preached two by two. He went to Catholic country, and preached to them, tried to bring them in closer alignment to the accepted external church. And they wrote him out of town on a rail as as the old the old saying goes, and he wrote that they are more Christian than the Christians. And they need a great deal of talking to. So of course, fortunately, yeah, there's the simple right there. Yeah. Well, you know, fast forward 100 something years, and the Alba Jensen crusade took place, and they killed Ray men to the count of two loose, and it was a rich cultured area, an intelligent area, a learned area, and they were, you know, tried to wipe out the Cathar heresy didn't really succeed. It's still there. You can't kill ideas, especially if you come at it with a sword. You just make people mad. But the Templars, you know, you know, you make people mad when you destroy a culture.



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Yeah. Yeah. And what happens is ideas just go underground.



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Absolutely. And then they come when you can breathe the air again.

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Randomie astronomy, right up in the seven liberal arts because yes to understand your place in the cause. Most understand the the idea of being just a speck on the little blue speck in the universe. It puts, it puts your mind at a different level. And it prepares your mind for a spiritual journey that is different.

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And I love the images of the James Webb telescope. And when I see those images coming back at me, I'm in awe, and it makes me feel stronger. You know, look at all those universes out there. And that's only a, if it can be measured in understanding that we might have as a grain of sand held at arm's length, you know, in between your finger and forefinger and thumb, and that that isn't even all that's available out there. 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it took a lot of work and manifestation for you.

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Sacrifice, financial sacrifice, I lived 1000s of miles away from my family, blah, blah, blah, you know, it, everything has a cost, well, Nothing is for free. And that's where this physical world comes in. We have to, we have to respect our body, what the body needs, our environment needs. And I mean, you know, keep your house clean, so that your mind can be free to have bigger thoughts. Respect yourself, don't dwell on on what people are doing when you're out and around and see somebody who's a bit weird at the grocery store, you know, don't get in their face. You know, and if somebody gets in your face, that's a matter of law. And that's when you need to reach out to law enforcement. It calls it out. But it's about developing a human inner garden with multiple capacities or at least an understanding. I mean, some of us are better at other things. But it's also a spiritual understanding. My first book covers a lot of ground, it covers the seven liberal arts, it covers Christian mystic women, who were very deeply entrenched in learning. And proper skepticism means that you are well willing to have your mind changed? Yes, you are, you're willing and people forget that people think that skeptics are there to destroy everything and No, no, no, I am there to get rid of the known quantitative and leave the anomalous. Now let's look at the end. And now all

we got left is the anomaly. We got rid of all the everyday stuff it could be now we're left with this and there's a 2%. And I said on the show all the time, I don't know a carpenter, that would leave 2% of a wall and Bill. I don't I don't know of a chemistry person, a chemist out there that if missing 2% of a solution at the end of a reaction would be like, well, that's gone. Well complete, if you don't have the 2%
