Leslie how are you?

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Oh Chris, I am absolutely fantastic and I am so pleased to be back on the airwaves with you. And I've got to tell you, I just love that last typewriter sound Oh, you had during the the all the news that is fit to print. I mean, that's a sound that the young ones don't recognize now.

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It was a torturous sound for me as a kid. Man, the white out was my friend. Let's just say,

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white out. No one would do that. That sounds like something inappropriate to say now. Yeah, sounds politically incorrect. Does it? White out? Oh, for God's sake? No. So. But I remember being in typing class at about age 14. And can you imagine, you know, 30 kids going at it with those old Smith Corona offers Wow, wow, analog, completely analog, mechanical devices. Anyway, I love the sound. And oh, there's my book, and a nice picture.

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Well, and you know, it really is interesting, Lesley, whenever you start a just to start our conversation of hypnosis, even even your loving of that sound. Reality does not manifest the mind it is we've been thinking of it in that we are we are more or less pinky and by our physical conduct questions that we can see in one little part of the spectrum? If you know what I mean?

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Yeah, yeah, most definitely. And we we a tend to pigeonhole ourselves incredibly. We tend to pigeonhole our thoughts, we tend to really distill things down. And as I began to point out to a lot of people in the world, unfortunately, a distiller sitive mentality, the only thing that comes from any distillation process is volatile content. Yeah, that's it. So it when you get to that distillation mentality, instead of learning to see the forest in the trees, you can really start setting yourself up for yes, that monotone us mentality, which, yeah, puts you into almost a state of hypnosis, where other things just kind of bounce off your brain?

And it's my feeling, especially from a very good friend of mine, Mike Patterson is the is the founder of Sasquatch, Ontario, and he has some of the most compelling evidence in the form of vocalizations. And other evidence, it's guite something but I feel, I feel that these beings are, are native to Mother Earth, but they are also very special beings. And they are interdimensional because people have actually seen them, going through portals and coming out. And you know, it, it makes a tremendous amount of sense to me. Now, that's also the case of extraterrestrial beings. They can open vortices, sometimes they can open them. And the I know, there's been quite a bit of talk lately about the work that grant Cameron and other individuals are doing at Mount Shasta. And they, they use the term they called a Xandra. But one of the things that I have done in my past is I was a former on air producer for Alex Jones now, say what you want folks believe what you want, however, the man has to be held actionable for his words. And he had a lot of calls to action on air, things like that, dealing with that. And that's well steps beyond the bounds of protection of the First Amendment. That is not covering things as the news now Corey Goode come to find out now, as you were mentioning, secret space program, not not denying that it exists not denying that any of that is real. However, the case of Corey Goode and the way he put it out, not real. And he actively came out and said that in depositions, he has actively come out and said that and video deposition that we have played on this show. There was a good eight hours of that where he literally called the other people who at least say that the blue avians, things like that, that he talked about that were his meditation guides that he made up like if they're saying they saw that they are delusional, they're delusional people. And Cory I'm not saying they're not my question to you much like for Alex would be at what point do you stop spoon feeding the delusion? Yeah, no kidding. And that in and of itself is a form of PTSD that in and of itself is a form of divergent mentality that you are feeding and and can truly lead into with some people divergent mentalities, that divergent personalities, all kinds of things. So yeah, even even for him to have put it out there. There are some people have certain given mental faculty deficiencies. is the most easy way I can put it that yes, would absorb that and it would literally become part of their narrative and reality. Why No. Part of their part of their traumas part of everything, Leslie?

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Yeah, it's like Trump's syndrome, they'll believe anything. Well, I think that I, I knew quite a bit of stuff about Corey Goode before this before it came out in this in this way. Plus, I I hate to say this, I hate to say it, but I just never believed him. It was

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it. There was quite a bit that was tough pill to swallow. And once again,

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it was tough. And then you know, Chris, I in all of these years that I've been doing this work with experiences of 20 plus years. I had never heard not one of my people talk about Blue Avians Yeah, not once. Now. I'm not saying that. This is this is a endlessly creative universe. I'm not saying that these beings couldn't exist. I'm just saying that in the in the trenches here in working with recovered memory. Yeah. I have never heard a reference to these beings. And then there was also a little funny thing that happened. Before all this came out where he he got into a big stink with somebody he was trying to copyright. What was it? He was Secret Space Program.

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Yeah, no, all of that is what the whole end stuff the whole rigmarole is about. Yeah. Yeah.

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And that started quite a while ago. So I just kind of the, the, the experiencer, that I feel has the most credibility has got to be captain Randy Cramer. And he teaches Psyonix, which is, which is the name that that he uses to describe the kind of psychoactive telepathic kinesthetic skills that are taught in the secret space program.

And he came to you know, we you agree it he was accepted in the US government. And he, this, I believe, was during the Eisenhower, period. I think, oh, god help me I believe it is. Anyway, he, he got frustrated. He was here for three years and couldn't make any headway in ecological he they were offering us ecological tech technology, zero point energy, all kinds of things that would have prevented the destruction of the earth that has happened since the 50s, coal mining all of that shite. So, and he just got frustrated. So So I now think that oh, look, there you have it. There he is. Yeah, there's valiant Thor. Yeah. So this is a you know, this is a very interesting thing, because it's, it's, this is why we're not going to have a landing on the White House lawn. Because this disclosure is now a grassroots movement. And it is, it is a gift from the internet. That allows us to not only present ideas and interact and interact with each other but to communicate globally, and, and share information. So it's a it's a real gift. This could never have happened in this way. Before the internet. By the way, I think every advanced civilization goes through a period of time like this. I check it's like training wheels to pure telepathy. We have almost instant communication. Yeah, but Al it's technology, but it's technology with training wheels. So

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you know, we really do have to number one, as long as we can keep the training wheels on the better.

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I agree. I'm not ready yet.

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But like as as the Mayan calendar and prophecies stay, it's very much the the day and night cycle, the idea of the day being the burgeoning of a technology in the night being its application, we have 101 ways that we can apply that technology for the betterment of mankind. Yeah, probably about 1001 that we could use to the detriment of mankind and really advanced things and go amazing places. But would it be detrimental or beneficial?

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Well, we have sometimes we don't always understand what's beneficial. And it's completely I mean, my mother thought frozen vegetables were better than fresh ones. You know, I mean, we came out of the 50s I mean, you're young thing but I mean I'm lucky to be alive they

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sure to cook faster. Yeah.

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Between polio and the frozen vegetables. Oh, man. But But I think that people are waking up and becoming aware in a wonderful way that is not frightening. It's none of this. This is all meant to be natural, natural. And, you know, I have to wonder, because I have to wonder because this one of the things about Planet Earth, I think is so interesting. And maybe it's one of the reasons why the ETs are so interested in us is because we have such a diversity of development amongst bipedal, Homo sapiens sapiens, we have, you know, we've got Charles Manson, and we've got Hitler. And then we've got, you know, other we've got to evolve, we got Mother Teresa, I mean, we have a huge spectrum of development. Yeah. And I often think they talk about moving into the fourth or the fifth dimension. Do we all go? How does that work?

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And may, you know, when you when you start looking at ancient texts, religious texts, things like that, that that literally talk about exactly that Lesley? That ate all of us going?

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No, it must be it must be a question of perception. Like, for instance, this is a one of the one of the experiences I work with she she was she's been been involved with this particular group of ETs who are very much like Pleiadians are very humanoid looking. And, and she was being taken and almost kind of a little shuttlecraft for, you know, a trip into outer space. And she said to her guide, she said, can you show me? Can you show me the planet? Where are you from where you live? And she said, Well, the planet is right there and pointed and pointed to an area. But said you're you're not able to see it right now. Which, again, you know, our universe is teeming with life. Not only in this third density, this crude slogging about meatsuit kind of thing. But in other various subtle layers of vibration, there are other, we would have a whole different view of our, you know, of our solar system. If we could see it in that way. And yet, the it's a meniscus that separates us people, people tend to forget that the spectrum that we know is a spectrum that we see. And that we hear is a very minuscule, thin slice of the ultraviolet spectrum. Very slice, very thin slice.

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And most animals on the planet have a bigger chunk of that they can see but I have you Chris, have you ever had any paranormal investigators on your program? Working working with the ultraviolet spectrum cameras? Is that what I'm trying where they have

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really able to capture incredible phenomena, I saw one that was being used at Gettysburg. And the it was like there were soldiers walking all over the bloody battlefield literally bloody. Yeah. And and it was simply that they were in the infrared spectrum, I believe or the ultra violet, am I what am i Is it is it the ultraviolet spectrum? Or is it infrared?

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Most most cameras that folks have like that are infrared cameras. But but there there are some very, very expensive UV cameras out there things like that. But most most of the chips that you see in everything out there are made for light and light amplification which would amplify infrared faster.

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Right so that we can perceive it with our little rods and cones.

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But it is some remarkable stuff and like I even have a thermal camera and you can you can find some pretty remarkable things with heat signatures and stuff like that as well. And once again, that is all within a range of spectrum that we cannot see.

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Yes. So true. So the ability to see paranormal stuff that some people have and I will come out to your peeps today that You know, I've always seen stuff. All of my life was inherited from my grandmother by Swedish grandmother. Her grandmother before her was like a kind of a medicine woman for the Lapland tribes. So I know that it comes down through the maternal line for me. Now my sister feel stuck, but she doesn't see anything. So, but I, I have had more figures appear to me and sometimes they look very solid. Sometimes they are, you know, as Dan Ackroyd would say free repeaters, sometimes they're merely imprints on the atmosphere, that and there's no consciousness, no consciousness there. It's just like watching a movie. You know. So, because I think I think we can imprint things in that way on the atmosphere. I do. I think I believe in the stone tape theory, I think we can absolutely imprint trauma or moments of high emotion on the ethers as well. Sure. Sure, absolutely.

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And that, that is one of the concepts that I brought up numerous times. Even when you're talking about investigating, quote, known location, and going in, in a, an amped state of mind, you could just like how put off put forward so many decades ago in his first work that led to the ideas of remote viewing, the idea that the scientist at home thinking about his experiment is adversely affecting his experiment. Yeah. You could be adversely affecting your clean space, as you walk in for that paranormal investigation, just by thinking about what am I going to do on

that paranormal investigation? What might I catch? Yeah. And and that's, that's something that we phenomenologically have to take into consideration when doing science when going forth and trying to bring about proof of these things, Lesley?

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Yes, it is. And it's and the technology is only helping, I mean, look at the you know, I look at the weak connect technology now. It's using to perceive the spirit forms. And you know, it's it's a, it's a visual representation. And of course, all of the various like lexicon based gadgets that we have, where the discarded entities can actually use a dictionary and communicate. So we're, and of course, in the in the areas of are completely wrong ideas about history. A completely twisted up stupid timeline. Now we have, you know, we have LiDAR, and we're able to pinpoint and investigate huge structures that were never seen before that were hidden by the jungle. So we are curious people, I think, I think that's one thing, you know, is there was a whole Star Trek episode about that wasn't there? Where they, you know, we are, we are so curious. And there's nothing stopping us now. Technology is is is a tremendous help. And even in mainstream media. If you even without subscription television, you know, if you look at the amount of programming that is metaphysically, and you ufology wise, focused, yeah, it's huge. Oh man it's an honor to have you back on the show I'm sorry that we did not get to connect unfortunately the the event that I was going to be going to Marshall for ended up not happening this last year the Bigfoot film festival so I did not get to meet you in person but now you live so much closer so that opportunity is right up the road and mere beers away my friend.

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I'm happy to have you on tonight because coming up soon we will be having our good friend Gretchen Cornwall who is featured regularly on the curse of Oak Island for her work in the world of Chimpo research doing doing work into research into the Knights Templar in Europe and beyond. And your your book Jesse James in the last Templar treasure of very interesting. Let's let's begin with how did you become the such a Jesse James fan and researcher Dan?

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Well, it started with my late mother Betty Dorsett, Duke and she spearheaded the research proving that Jesse didn't die is history stated. Traditional history claims that Jesse James was shot in the back of the head by one of his fellow gang members, Bob and Charlie Ford. And that was the end of Jesse and 1882. The facts are here. They didn't shoot Jesse they shot Jesse's first cousin would hide who bore strong resemblance to Jesse. Jesse was in Texas when it happened. And the wild thing I wish my late mother could have seen it she'd always wanted. She'd always said wouldn't it be amazing if we can find a photograph showing Jessie at his funeral because there were legends that he attended his own funeral? And you know, we thought Yeah, that'd be amazing. It sounded like a pipe dream. And a few years, literally it just a couple of years after, after my late mother passed, my sister found the photo. And it shows Jesse standing next to his mother's a relative James and Frank, down in, holding the casket up with their cousin would hike. Jesse was at his own funeral, we have a photograph of it that just blew me away. It blew us all the way. I just wish my mom could have seen it. But that my late mom, my late mother, she she, she spearheaded the research, when it came to the treasure side of it. While she was doing the genealogy and the DNA work and all of that, and working with forensic photographic experts, I would have get a little extra time and I would start trying to you know, I would work on the treasure maps that were passed down through the family. And that's where that the first book came about.

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Now, now that that's the part that's the turn in the story that I love. I mean, number one, not just the fact that you had this family history and story of connection to Jesse James to begin with, via via actual relation, but the story of him faking his death. And then your family having pleasure Matt's like

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a diary. We have his diary from 1871 through 1876. And in the diary, there's mentions of it, he wrote it. He never said I'm very treasure here, but he would say he would give clues, different things. They used to put treasure maps on a calf hide, and he would grain a calf hide as part of attaining heights. He would mention that, and then he had a lot of encrypted writings in his diary. And I didn't mean to interrupt but a lot along with the treasure maps was the diary. And that that's the diary is worth its weight in gold. In my opinion. That's just just for historic value.

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Yeah, there was a letter written on my sister knows the name my sister's at work right now. Call it an hour ago, I

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need to call a conference room right now.

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I wish I could remember the lady's name. I think the lady's first thing was Joan, Joan Christo, I believe that was her name. She was a she was a handwriting analyst. She did. She's done work for law enforcement and other people. She verified that unknown signature. Wait, wait, I found a copy of a known legitimate signature from Jesse James. He'd written a letter about a crime they were he had allegedly committed and he wrote a letter and signed it in his name, that that handwriting matched with the handwriting in the diary and his signatures on other papers we have that were passed down. Wow. Wow, that, you know, that was it was a lot of it's like one piece of evidence. That's fine. But that's not going to convince anybody when you have to change. When you've got established history saying this. It takes a lot to it takes a lot to change established history.

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Well, that discussed that last time you were on and we discussed that a little bit with Greg wolf heater whenever we had him on here recently. Even the idea of like, there are old timers and people even new timers and Phalke that want nothing at all to do with the Phalke monster they don't they don't want that monster traffic. They don't they don't want that crazy in their backyard. And yeah, like we discussed last time you were on the town that Jesse James died in. That's pretty much their claim to fame like that. That would be like, welcome to that's like, on their welcome board as well as how many people live there. Yeah, but Well, yeah. Mass Death House.

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You know, like that's up in Missouri and he actually didn't die there but they claim it and they get a lot of tourists dollars from that.

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Well, that's just it like you're saying bye bye. All evidence that you have found forensic evidence, forensic photography, evidence, forensic handwriting evidence, Jesse James did not die. And what happened when you approached the town? What information

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they vehemently denied. They didn't want to talk about it. They didn't want it. Yeah. And this This was my mother first contacted and we thought we were so naive in the beginning, we thought they'd be excited to know. Oh, yeah, Jesse. Yeah, he wasn't shot in the back of the head. And they that's the last thing they wanted to hear. Yeah. And this was 98 or 1999. Mom had called them they hung up. I mean, it was a real quick, short answers. It was good day, ma'am. And they hung up. And then it just got worse from there. But they wait, wait, I thought Why would they do that? That didn't make sense. And then we found out just the the James Forman museum alone was bringing in \$7 million a year. And that was in 9899. I don't know what they're bringing in now. I haven't checked it. But I think money played a large role along with I guess bragging rights. Some of the guys love it. Some of the some of that crowd loved bragging that, you know, they were descended from Jesse and they actually weren't that were cousins. But they weren't descended. Yeah,

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though. Well, well, but but that's exactly what I'm saying. Like when you have a town who once again like my my family comes from Mamu, Louisiana, Daniel, and one red light town. It is known as the home of Cajun music for Cajun music was invented now. Come Come Mardi Gras. That town goes from one red light population of a couple 1000 to about 20,000 people. For about a half. It gets in Slough and their businesses on Main Street man that that are open for a week. They're open for amaze out of the year. They make all their money in 10 days done. Even Fred's lounge where Marty where Cajun music was born is open on Saturdays. Yeah, that's it.

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I agree. Yeah, I know what you mean. After when I was Director of Tourism up in Marshall. They're the home of boogie woogie music. Yeah. And I thought, wow, you know, this is something I don't know why they've never capitalized on much like,



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weighing things like that. That is Yeah. And that's one of those. If they found out that that wasn't the case. If they found out that, Oh, no. Cajun music actually started up the road and Appaloosas Yeah, not not a Mamu not in big Mamou, but, you know, it would change



everything. dynamically. Yeah. business wise. Everything. Everything. No, mainly Yeah, the motorcycles would not come through town on Saturdays.

Yeah, exactly. You know, so it money plays a huge role. Yeah. And then right up the road from Kearney, Missouri. We're Jesse James was, you know, he was born there. He grew up there. But right up the road to St. Joseph, Missouri. And that's where Jesse allegedly died and they make a lot of money. That's a very poor town. And a lot of their money comes from tourist dollars. They people going to visit the house where Jesse was allegedly killed. And he wasn't killed there. And that's why they fight it.

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Yeah, yeah. Precisely. And, you know, much like we talk about regularly on the show whether whether you're talking Bigfoot paranormal UFO UAP. There are people there researchers who've made their careers disproving there we are researchers that have made their careers with hypothesis and theory that is now being disproven by science. And what are you going to do?

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And yeah, and they if they, and we've run across people like that, you've got egos that get involved. It's not it's their, their, their career has been based on a lie. Egos on top of that it gets this the full gamut. All types of emotions and reasons fall into play for that. You can tell them and this happened for years Mom, mom would try to, oh, she would talk to him online. And it was usually through a forum like gin Forum, which is owned, I think by ancestry.com Now But it turned into such a circus. They ended up banning the forum. And it was it was just ended. But and that's why on the time of the death threats, they sent death threats to my late mother, they threatened to kill my mother me, my sister. Yeah, the FBI got involved and finally put a stop to it. So that was good. And the guy that caught the group behind it had paid this man and promised him all kinds of things. They paid demand to make these threats to try to scare them

off, and it didn't work. But and then when he got caught when the FBI knocked on his door, he named everybody involved. And he apologized to my mother, my late mother, but yeah, it was, it was it got really weird people, people

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honestly do not understand sometimes the the depth to which some of these communities go. And and the extreme to which some followers will go. Like you said, Donald read some things like

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that. It's like a cult mentality, you know, in a lot of ways.

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Wow. And I mean, just to speak to that, I want to say maybe it was on rumble. In your in your last appearance. There's a gentleman that had a comment that was, Oh, he's utterly wrong, you know, he's not related to Jesse James. I'm like, Okay, I guess all that DNA evidence is just like, I don't know, I've

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read the book.

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There's, there's quite a compelling story here and quite a quite a decent heap of evidence, comparatively to literally just colloquial accounts.

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Well, yeah, we've got, you know, the DNA evidence. And then we've got the photographic photographic evidence, which has been verified by various unrelated and we didn't pay for it either, which is another important thing. Texas Department of Public Safety forensics lab, they identified they verified that our photos match known photos of Jesse and his family members, the Austin Police Department, forensics lab, they did the same thing, verify their photos, and then a group out of New Jersey, that the time they were called Vizio comics than they were purchased by identic, or something like that. They were world leaders in facial recognition technology and sold their programs, their their software, to the Pentagon and to international airports around the world. We were mom, that was another thing I was so, so grateful. My late mother took care of she went to the best people she could find and those groups she found were some of the best in the world. So it's, you know, it's DNA. It's photographic evidence, handwriting analysts, just the whole gamut. It's that you it's too much evidence to just discount and they try to discount it. They won't. When when they ask you a question and you answer it. Their tactic online, especially online, they would they would ignore the answer and just keep asking the same questions. It never made any sense if they got to where it was almost. It was a waste of time. I told my mom you know, just talking to them. Period is a waste of time. Why bother with them? Just write the book. Yeah.

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Yeah, well, because it's some point you've you've got to stop asking permission and just do it. Yeah. Yeah. And it's one of those it's a topic that it's not like it's not like making a documentary about somebody and possibly getting sued or anything like that. Like even as the as the city the claims Jesse James death or anything like that ever, ever attempted suing you for your work for your books. Never like defaming their city or, you know,

they never did that. Okay. I don't know. We expected it but they never it never happened. And well, when you've got more evidence than they have that's probably one of the main reasons it did happen.

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It's a little hard to refute it when you when you have it. And and that's just and that's exactly what I brought up to the gentleman. I was like, feel free to go purchase his book.

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Like, exactly why they resorted to death threats. They couldn't win. They couldn't win fairly. They didn't have the evidence that we had. And I guess it just it frustrated them to a point they resorted to death threats.

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And you know, it's it's interesting to me that they would resort to death threats over that. But not, not for trash. Your Mets know

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knowing from the books that



you're holding treasure maps. Yeah,

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nobody made it through,

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like, Hey, give me the maps or else you know.

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And on the treasure maps, that first book I wrote, I had mentioned before it was published, I didn't know the public, my publisher had contacted the grand or the night Grandmaster of the Knights Templar, the current Grandmaster, the Knights Templar. And they asked they, they contacted him, and he wrote a glowing endorsement of my book. And that that his endorsement of my book, I thought, my God, this ties in with, you know, masonry way back in the day. And he, you know, it was the best compliment I could have ever had. He wrote a glowing endorsement for my book and said that, basically, I had cracked part of the code dealing with the treasures from the temple in Jerusalem. And I couldn't have had a better compliment than that, that made my my day it made everything worth it. You know, all the trouble. But

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interesting. Well, yeah. Because now let's, let's start getting into that. Because once again, like you said, you've you've got coded entries in in his diaries, you've got references to such things, and then you have maps. How do you how do you go about beginning that decoding process, Daniel?

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Well, the codes on the maps were the easy part. Actually. He had, the map was just a geometric design written on a piece of paper with it had well it had dollar signs written and had other other things were just different symbols. But the codes, we you know, it took a little while to crack it, but it really didn't take too long, it was actually just substitution for numbers for letters. And he would do it with the alphabet going forwards and backwards. And he would mix it back and forth. But eventually we cracked it. You know, there's so much money in silver, so much money in gold, and also another amount of money in greenbacks that he called them greenbacks that he had buried. It was after 1900. And but the problem was, it was just a geometric figure. It wasn't, it wasn't a topographic, there were no topographical markings, like a, like on the movies, you see a, you know, 40 paces from the old oak tree. Yeah, there wasn't anything like that. It was just a geometric figure. And I guess you had to have been in the know, to know where to start. And that's what it was. It, it kept me awake many nights for years, just off and on. Every time I thought about it, I thought, Where could it be. And then I came across information about the Knights of the Golden Circle, they were a pro Confederate



group, a secret society during the Civil War. They had a template, a treasure template, and I'm kind of jumping ahead of myself there a secret society during the Civil War, who their main goal during the war was to thwart and slow down union troop movements any any way they could, they would blow up bridges, tear up railroad tracks, all kinds of stuff. So that was their goal during the war after the after the South lost the war. They remained in existence, allegedly. And their main goal switched from that to gaining as much wealth as they could any way they could, in order to fund a second civil war. And, you know, I had no reason to disbelieve this, but, but finding a list. There's a lot of people out there who claim you know, Jesse James was a member, Albert Pike, all these different people, but there's no proof that no one has ever come up with proof that all of these allegedly and I think they do that as a way of adding legitimacy to to whatever their story is. So but I hadn't, you know, at the time, I thought, okay, maybe this was true. And they had a treasure template that I had found on treasure hunting forums, and then a couple of books also. So I thought maybe the template works. And I got started researching it actually did work. But I found later it's not a it wasn't a Knights of the Golden Circle template. It was a Masonic template. And I'm I'm cutting this real short. It. I'm trying to figure out the best way to explain it. The Masonic template. It came into existence long ago and I still to this day They don't know exactly who it was, who designed the template. But you can find the same design on like the Temple Church in London on the old Knights Templar monastery, there's there's the West, the Western door in London on the Temple Church as the template, the treasure template on the door in it's a wooden door with wrought iron designs on it and the design matches the templates. And it goes, there's a lot a lot. I'm sorry, I'm getting tongue tied. There's a lot more examples of that. But what when I found out about the template, I thought, okay, Knights of the Golden Circle, I have no reason to doubt that Jesse would have been in it was a fault for the South, although he was a gorilla. And the reason he fought was most likely not political. He was 14 when he started fighting, and it was mainly because for revenge from Kansas wrote down to his farm, they beat him severely, broke his jaw, all kinds of stuff. They pushed his pregnant mother around and hung stepfather. They didn't kill the stepfather, but he had brain damage from then on. And that was Dr. Reuben Samuel, you know that these atrocities hit people. And I can see a 14 year old boy who in that in his day, that was it was a rough area, it was the edge of the Western frontier. Yeah, and you had a lot of rough stuff going on. When that happens. I could see why he wanted revenge. He tried to join the Confederate army so that he can get revenge that he was too young. They turned him away. And quadrilles guerrillas accepted him. And that's where he got to start during the war. Yeah, but I'm trying to tie this back into the template.

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Well, I think it ties in very well to the template whenever you're talking about his gorilla work. And literally the stated purpose of the Knights of the Golden Circle. The state of their work was exactly the same. It was gorilla shadow work going out and blowing up trade, holding up trains robbing, it was kind of like robbing union supply lines,

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almost like a Confederate Special Forces. Yeah. And that's that he excelled at that he was very good at what he did all the guerrillas were. And then after the war, they were the only groups that weren't granted amnesty, like the rest of the Confederate Confederacy. So they were outlaws if you've ever seen the movie, The Outlaw Josey. Wales. That's a very good description of you know, they were hunted down like dogs and killed. So they didn't they I guess he had two choices. In my opinion, he could have left the country and moved somewhere else, you know, just completely left, or he had to stay in fight. He chose the latter. And he fought and they started robbing banks. But it tied in, I think it was more than just robbing banks. And it wasn't for their own gain. It was for some purpose. And I thought, Okay, that sounds just like the Knights of the Golden Circle. With this template. I started researching, and I'm getting ahead of myself. But back to the treasure map that passed down. I'd seen that treasure. I'd seen the map I didn't know where I knew it was somewhere around his house in Blevins, Texas, but I wasn't sure where. So a few years later, and this all happened over many years. We met Wagner car he was the former Attorney General for the state of Texas. He contacted my mother and Wagner car, by the way, was friends with LBJ. And he was also on the ward part of the Warren Commission. Oh, wow, who investigated the assassination of Kennedy. I never get into that area. I don't want to know. That's that's not part of my story. But it was an item of interest I like to bring up Wagner Carr was also interested in Jesse James and the gold. And he got he contacted my mother. They became friends over a year, three years. They started talking all the time. He wanted her to write his autobiography, but she was busy writing one of her other books. I think it was their second book. But he he had his driver he sent his driver out to pick my mother and I up and show us where several of the other known treasures were that were recovered by the state of Texas. And oh wow. According to Wagner, according to Wagner car and his driver, the while they were being recovered, they were guarded by Texas Rangers. And I had no reason to doubt that. I know there was a treasure dig back in the 70s in Waco, and it was surrounded by Texas Rangers. So I asked him where where the treasure went. He never would answer that question. But they showed us the locations where these treasures were. And I thought okay, now I've got three locations that according to Wagner car and his driver, and then I know where Jesse Lee In Blevins, so I got the template, turned it into a transparency, put it on Google Earth, and everything lined up with the template where all the treasures were located. In the meantime, we also were contacted by a man named George Roman. He was a former World War Two vet 32nd degree Scottish Rite Freemason and he when he was a kid, he knew Jesse when Jesse was old Jesse died in 1943. George was, I think he was 86 and 2005. Around that time when he passed away I can't remember the executive George passed. But when he was a child, he was around 10 to 11 years old Jesse swarm to an oath him and two other boys and higher George to help him move 700 bars of gold. From Blevins, Texas out near Belton, Texas and Jordi swarm to an oath George kept the oath. He said after World War Two the old men were dead it was they met a help Jessie with the gold. They drove about 20 miles away towards Belton, Texas near where the lake is, which is now on Fort Hood property. They they delivered the gold buried the gold eight foot deep, and that was it. They'd all sworn oath to secrecy. He went to he lied about his age, he was 16 when he went to World War Two and when he came back, the two other boys who were who helped him bury the gold died in the war. And the old men had died of old age, including Jesse. So he said he kept the secret. And he was he was out in El Paso called my mother and I to go visit him in the hospital and he drew a map out for us they'll just right where it was. So we went to look for it and it's on four hoods properties. I told him I wouldn't happen offense onto a military base looking for anything. It just kind of I don't I don't want to end up in a no tell him why.

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Vince is in Texas, much less military fences.

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A good way to get shot. Either way, it's a good way to get shot. So but the good thing is with George's location, and Wagner cars, locations that he the places they he showed this or his driver, I everything matched on the template perfectly. So I had the template. I thought, Okay, this shows where all the other locations are on that template. Each template has 33 locations. And then I got curious, I started wondering if it tied in with any other legend. So I was playing with the template, and I left the one template where it was on Google Earth. And then I placed another one next to it in all sides of it. And it makes a grid pattern. And I just I kept going every place it went there were a lot of places where it ties in with old treasure legends, including and this took forever it wasn't overnight by any means, but it lines up with the Los Lunas Decalogue stone in New Mexico, which has ancient Jewish writing that the Indians claim was there before they were there. Oh, wow. It lines Yeah, lines up with Scott Walters hooks to the rune stone up in Kensington, which Scott wrote Walter has written about he lines up with Oak Island area, also, the Newport Tower in Rhode Island. There's a lot of treasure areas where it lines up. And I thought this is amazing. It's not just treasure sites. It's also areas of historical interest and mysterious areas like the local anesthetic logs

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well and, and and things like once again, Oak Island, and the Newport Newport castle. Because Newport Castle specifically I was telling you before the show, David S. Brody. We have him on the show regularly. He has a series about Newport castle. Yeah, and all of the symbology in it. We've definitely talked to Gretchen Cornwall, about the Templar symbology. That's there. So the fact that this map whenever you put the template over it pointed to two places that have possible Templar ties. Yeah, that's that's pretty incredible.

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Yeah, and, well, I wanted to when I found that out, you know, just over time, yeah. It begs the question, why, why the dimensions on the template? I wanted to know why so many miles for you know, there's three templates. It's a large medium and small template of the large ones 161 miles across and then you know, then there's a medium template and a smaller one. Every number on the dimensions of these templates lined up with sacred geometry, different meanings cabbalistic meanings of Oh, and there's another template that this one I call the veil template. The one I'm talking about the Chris is a grid system, but it's kind of a crosshatch look. It it covers another template that is in the shape of the capitalistic tree of life. It runs from Newport, Newport, Williamsburg, I'm sorry, Williamsburg, Virginia, at all near the Bruton parish Vault, which is a whole nother that's a church actually. But there's a vault found by Manley Palmer halls wife, Manley Palmer Hall was a famous 33rd degree Mason and a lot of people playing the father of New Age, the new age. Yeah. Showing that marine

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power Hall Show on that map on screen right now.

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Okay. Marie Bauer Hall was his wife. Believe it was her second husband was mainly Pomerol. Anyway, she had discovered through the raid readings of shake the writings of Shakespeare, she found encrypted messages. She claimed that Shakespeare was their Patsy. Basically, Sir Francis Bacon, in her opinion, was the real Shakespearean. There's a lot of other people who claim that it was actually Sir Francis Bacon and some of his peers. But either way, she found encrypted writings and symbols in various work from Shakespeare and another guy I can't remember the name of John winter, I believe is his name, which led her to Williamsburg, Virginia, specifically the birth on parish church. She said she found the original foundations of this church, which weren't, it was near but it wasn't the same church building that there are now people said she was wrong. She didn't know what she's talking about. She proved them wrong. She on Earth, the original foundations and prove them wrong. And she found it through the writings, the codes that she deciphered and anagrams on fake headstones in the cemetery there in Williamsburg, Virginia. And then she went further, and claimed that it led to a vault 22 feet beneath the original church where the altar was, and that the vault contains information that would shake the foundations of accepted history, world history, and they would not let her. At first she was granted permission to dig in. Almost instantly, right after she was granted permission. Somebody shut it down. They put her in jail for a short time in Williamsburg and then ran her out of town told her don't come back. Wow. And that's that. She claimed I've heard other people just reading it. They said the Rockefellers bought most of the town. They don't own Bhutan church, but they control the board of directors for the church. And that's just that, according to her, that's what put a stop to all of that. But that the template I'm talking about in the Tree of Life shape, runs from Williamsburg, Virginia to Bhutan, parish church, to Victorian peak New Mexico, which was a treasure was found in the 30s, late 30s. Back then, it amounted in the 30s and 40s. That amounted to over 3 billion in gold. And that was back then when gold was \$32 an ounce roughly. I don't know what it would be worth today. That treasure is also mentioned in the Watergate hearings. So you know, it's got legs on that story, if it's mentioned in the Watergate hearings, and LBJ also had an interest in it as well. And shortly after that treasure came to light, White Sands Missile Range extended the range in which encompassed Victorio Peak where the treasure was, and there's also documentaries on that. But to make a long story short, you've got the tree of life. And I thought, Well, why is why is there Why are there two templates? Why is there a grid system? And then, in addition to that there's a tree of life, which led me to Kabbalah and a lot of other esoteric traditions. In in, I guess, well, when you start researching the tree of life, just for spirituality, reasons, it accompanying that is another. It's called the three veils of negative existence. And that's where the grid system comes in. It's a large, medium and small, it's three, three veils are grids, and they overlay the tree of life, and it tied in perfectly I explain it better, more in more detail in my book, but all at first, I wondered, did I just stumble on another treasure template that has nothing to do with the original, and then I found out later they tie in perfectly. It's all it all deals with Freemasonry, the Knights Templar and Kabbalah, and also Middle Eastern mysticism. I hope I'm not up on that rambling I feel like

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you or you're not rambling whatsoever, especially, I mean, especially for my audience who is used to this fractal concept of literally you, you have to learn to be able to see see the strands in the web, so to speak, the forest and the trees, as well as the path amongst it. You know,

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I've always had a hard time it's trying to condense, oh, God, 2025 years of research into just a short time, it's even hard condensing it into a book sometimes, but on top of, you know, so I discovered the dimensions, the meanings behind them cabbalistic and esoteric meanings behind all these various dimensions of the of the treasures, the treasure template, and I wanted to know who, you know, the next question is, who is, you know, who, what, when, where, and why. I wanted to know, who was responsible for it, and it all, all my research tied in with Freemasons, and then back to, I wanted to know, who came up with the template? And that was my, just the burning question, which and Jesse played a big part. He played the night of, you know, he was an important part in his day, but in the scheme of things, he after I concluded my research, he was just a small part of a giant machine. There were other there were other outlaws pirates, John Laffite. Oh, yes. Also, he was part of it. During the research that went back through Freemasonry, to the found some of the founding fathers passed them all the way back to Sir Francis Bacon. And I, when I came to him, I thought, Okay, this guy was known as the father of modern day Freemasonry, and I was satisfied for a few days and then I realized John D, the famous Alchemist, and you know, God, the guy was a spy. He was the original double of seven. Yeah. Yeah, just all kinds of there. That guy was amazing. But he was Sir Francis Bacon's mentor. Yep. And it led me on to another turd. The second half of that trail went through John D, various other famous in, in, in kind of unknown alchemists. Back to Jewish rabbis. Through a long line of Jewish rabbis, Abraham a bull Ophea. Back to a man named rashy. He was a he was a Jewish rabbi, famous Jewish rabbi, they call them rashy. He was the favorite court dentist, of Hue, the counter of champagne. And that was one of the founders of the Knights Templar. And I felt fine I finally found my answer and that that when I found that I was satisfied with who started this, it, it all stemmed from Kabbalah and other esoteric mindsets and thinking throughout the ages.

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Yeah, and it's interesting because whenever whenever we talked with Kathleen ball, about her work with the Knights Templar in Brazil, things like that, whenever we talked with Gretchen, Cornwall, even even grim, grim Phillips, about his work into the Templars. It all traces back to esoteric teachings. It does. And they they use the sacred geometry in their building. They use they use that same symbology all over the place in their stained glass work in all kinds of artwork, so it, it literally is a symbol logic code that is around for identification. For the uninitiated. You yourself, you yourself are a Freemason? Yes, there's very much the same thing. Within Freemasonry, where there is if you walk around local buildings, especially in older towns, you'll see all kinds of Masonic symbolism. You just have to know what it means.

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Exactly. In fact, before, before I left, Marshall, I left Marshall Texas yesterday, but before last Saturday, I was in Jefferson, Texas, right up the road from Marshall. And I was on the courthouse steps, looking at at the windows on the courthouse and a lot of courthouses around the country, especially here in Texas but everywhere they have what it looks like just a nice little design in the windows but it's symbolic of the stone of foundation. There's a lot of meaning. Yeah, and if you don't know I mean, you can a lot of that's not secret knowledge of it was at one time but now you can go online or read some books. Oh, sure. Find out a lot about that. It's just interesting and most people walk by not knowing not even thinking about

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one of one of my favorite places in the country is the museum in Lexington, Massachusetts. They have an entire Masonic wing.

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And I'd love to go to that.

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It is phenomenal. I mean, like huge stained glass, Masonic pieces you walk in, they've got the original lithographs of like George Washington and his Masonic garb, all kinds of things. And it really does break down quite a bit of the, at least the public symbology. That's there. That is, like you said, at this point, pretty well known. At one point it was all very anathema secret, things like that. But as anybody would say they are

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a society with secrets, not a secret society, that everybody pretty well knows about them. So they aren't secret.

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They got buildings and signs as you come into town, like welcoming. Yeah, so they aren't seeing

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ways for highway cleanup.

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But it's interesting to see that you were not a mason when you began this work. When you began this research, you weren't a Mason, I threw a familial line or something like that, where like your father was a Mason. So you know, because he went to meetings on Wednesday nights. Sounds like something you should do. Yeah, it this research brought you to that point of discovery within yourself.

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That's exactly right. I know Jesse was a mason under his alias anyway, and I believe he was \_ ... . .. . . . . .



also an English. I believe he was not an alias. I believe Jesse was also a mason before he lived under his alias, you know as as Jesse, but he was a Mason. I know one of his grandsons. Actually, one of his sons became a Mason, one of his grandsons. My grandfather was a Mason. And but my dad wasn't I, my research is exactly what what led me to that one, just searching for more answers. And reading about Albert Pike. He's often demonized by a lot of people. I don't believe he was a bad person at all personally. But he, he had written in some of his writings and said the beautiful thing about symbols is they have multiple meanings. And you know, they initiate can know one meaning but he doesn't know the rest of them. Until you go through the steps and then you start learning multiple meanings. For a lot of different symbols. Yeah.

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Yeah. Absolutely. And and as you as you move through the ranks, you learn even different meanings for the symbols like you said, and sometimes that even sometimes the new meaning you learn even destroys the old meaning entirely.

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Exactly what you thought was truth at one point turns out to not adventurous at all, but it was a necessary step to lead you towards it. Yeah, that

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point at that small point of revelation was what? Open the keyhole to the door.

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Exactly. And

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it really is, it's interesting. I've considered numerous times going it trying to find a Masonic chapter to join, because it really is, when it comes down to it that that search for truth that search for light, that that point of discovery of not only self, but where the self lies within the whole, you know, not just within you but within the world around you. So now with you being a mason Jesse being a mason with like you said the the Mason telling you that you've you've really got something here. It seems as though or not the Mason but the Knights Templar the head of the Knights Templar, saying that it really seems like you've got what would be an accounting of the Templar treasure or at least part of the Templar treasure what was what was known to have been held by the Templars at one point Yeah, with that, with that in play with you being a mason any any warnings from up on Hi, Daniel. No,

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no for many Mason's I live with my my late mother And I will warmed by that wasn't by Freemasons. Well, I could take that back, actually, when we've been warned by a couple of people before, let me do this chronolock, please. When my mother when my late mother and I would take her down to the State Archives, and often as often as I could, and you know, anytime she wanted to go, when I had a free time, we had some free time, I would take her down there. And every time we went, there was a period where we were there at least once a week. And two men followed this, we started noticing every time we were there, these same two men were there. And they were always watching us, but didn't. For some reason, we thought, Well, maybe it's a we thought maybe it was a coincidence. We didn't really think a lot about it. Yeah, until one day we went, walked into the archives went to sign our names. And the librarian who we've got to know very well, he told us don't sign that. And mom said, why you've told us to sign this. Every time in the past. He said they're watching Don't sign it. We both looked at each other. You know, who's who's watching. And he said nothing. He just turned around and went and sat down. He said, Just Don't sign it. The we didn't sign it. We walked in. And those same two men who had watched us in the past, came up, they approached, they came to our table. And they eventually one man was a former Dallas police officer. His name was Jay Harris. And I'll just go ahead and say it. He's passed away. He he was a Dallas police officer a couple of blocks away from JFK assassination. And again, I don't like getting into that area. I don't think my story ties in with that. And if it did, I didn't, I wouldn't want to know. There's some there's too many other things I'm interested in. But he was he wasn't a real nice guy. But he was kind of like a, like a funny. He talked spoken riddles. He never said anything straight out. It's like everything he said was a riddle. And he wasn't really friendly. But he wouldn't mean either. Not overtly mean, like his partner was a researcher for the Texas State Bar. And but the first time we met him, his partner said that he was a house painter. And I thought, Okay, your house painter, I don't know why you're following us around all the time. But they warned us not to mention any names that tied in with the Texas power structure. And my mother and I were so naive at the time, it was well whose Texas power structure and he just they both just kind of smiled and laughed a little and said you'll find out it no one from that day forth has ever come to us and said we're part of the power structure. So we've never really found out you know, exactly. We have theories but so he warned us on that. And then he took us out to a graveyard and showed us some names in the Texas State cemetery but he never said why he was showing us these certain headstones I to this day, I have no clue what he was getting it. But he warned us he said you don't want to mess with the Texas power structure. And that's all he said. So he died of cancer. The other guy we found out later was a researcher for the Texas State Bar. But in this jump years ahead, just a few years ago, a movie came out with Robert De Niro. I don't know if you remember it. It was about Jimmy Hoffa in the killing of Jimmy Hoffa. I can't remember the name of the movie. But Robert De Niro played an assassin in the movie, and I'm watching the movie. And author calls him in and says on the phone, I hear you paint houses. And I thought, Oh my God. Maybe that's what the guy meant, I don't know. Kind of sent a chill up my spine. I still don't know if that's what they were. But they warned us and then they disappeared. And that was that we never saw him again. We kept our word we didn't mention any names that we knew of that tied in with Texas power structure. Men and later on. A man started calling my mother and helped a lot gave a lot of information that we couldn't have found any other way and help piece a lot of the puzzle together. But I don't really know if he was a mason or if he wasn't, I think he is but I'm not sure and we've never even met the man face to face. And that's It's just strange stuff like that. Well, I've had one person liken it to the men and black kind of thing. I don't I I've read about men and black. I don't think it's I don't think it's to that level. But you

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never really know. You know, but I've never heard of in a minimum black story. Being stuck to the friggin library



has some hardcore businessman when they're following the library



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time when there were people who would call the librarians like



Hey, man, just so you know, they'll sign that they've been watching you. Well, Oh, yeah. You know,

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like, watch



them. You know, weird when the librarian comes up and warns you not? Because you're being watched. That's that. That's Wow, that was odd. That was an odd moment.

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So that's, that's incredible.



Yeah. Well, we were followed at one point by private detectives that were hired by the same group that sent us the death threats. But that was the old Ben, that was nothing on that level. And living in the country. And when you have dogs, it's kind of, you know, they are around. Exactly.



It's not exactly like living in the city where they get used to every sound that's around them. And they're just

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exactly man. Yeah. Yeah. Yeah. Out out in the middle of nowhere. And you got we had five dogs. So

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yeah, hearing something is excitement. at that. Yeah. The reason I ask is because, and I guess, the last question I would have for you, Daniel is. So how long have you had the treasure in your possession?

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I don't have the treasure. What Yeah, and I know this sounds corny. I would love to find the treasure. I don't know who wouldn't want to find the treasure. And you read about these. I see them on Facebook all the time on the archeology pages. Some guy just bought a brand new metal detector never touched one and goes out into a field and uncovers a historic Roman hoard of gold. That's, you know, worth millions of pounds British pounds. And I think that lucky sob, you know, but on the same token, the treasures that I was researching, I truly, and I know it sounds corny, but I do. I think they're they're meant not for one person. They're meant for the country. Or a greater purpose at the very least. And, and I know for a fact, some of the large the large ones anyway are watched. I know that for a fact. Interesting. Yeah. Wow. Well, I would love to find one. But yeah, I thought Why can't I just stumble on something that doesn't have all these purposes and meanings behind

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it because of course that's that's got to be the first thing people ask whenever you go well, yeah, you know, the family treasure maps and casual eight, because it's very casually mentioned the family treasure maps, Daniel.

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You know, right. You know, it's weird. In your reality,

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like the family Bible drains,



you know? Like, I grew up with him. He's a he's

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a weird, it is strange. I got to thinking about that not too long ago. Just surreal. It's, it's a it's my reality. I grew up knowing this. My mom grew up knowing that all my cousins, you know, they hear it. It's just the reality. It's like, oh, yeah, the family. And most people don't think a lot of people don't have that. And it is an odd thing. I don't go out in public telling people about my

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well, because

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once again, if you think you got threats at the archive, Oh, yeah. Not even looking for the treasure. You not trying to find additional parts of the map or anything like that, like that was still back in the day when you were looking things up with your mom. Yeah, no, that wasn't that wasn't like, hey, yeah, you know, I've, I've now join the Masons and I understand all the symbolism, and I'm breaking it down and decoding everything that that's why you were in the archives. You know,

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that's true. We're just doing genealogy. Yeah, that point. Yeah. And that was enough to raise some red flags for somebody.

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Exactly. Which, oh,



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yeah, it well. And I was also told mentioning that talking about treasure and stuff. I have a friend in the UK she's in was in London for a while she's a editor of the the square magazine is a free online Masonic magazine. But she she had warned me when I wrote the first book, she said, Just be prepared. Anytime you write about treasure and esoteric topics, you're gonna get nutcases from out of the woodwork. And I've had a few I had one lady from Arizona asked me telling me that she needed my blood to open a portal. My God, what have I brought on myself? Wow. So yeah, it was some odd stuff,



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but Well, yeah, and you know, there's one Once again, numerous, numerous, numerous stories of traceurs and Tayas things like that Oh weak Cate cross over to Calveston. And there is a

You'll read the jean Luffy the pirate defended that area. Right there. That's true. So yeah, there's pirate booty, Civil War, gold, all kinds of things. Here in Texas Mexican gold. It's it's pretty phenomenal. And once again, when you to know that you were warned away from things when you were just on the cusp of your research with your family. A man imagine what it would be. I mean, gold hunters get threatened all the time. Claims get threatened and jumped all the time. It can be a pretty dangerous thing, prospecting for stuff, such stuff, despite the ones that are guarded on federal property. What have ya, you know, they're there for

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another reason. That's another reason I gave the directions on how to make your own template how to build it. template the directions are in the book.

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They are they are there. They're right there. I was just showing them on air a little while ago. And yeah, it's it is the intricacies of this book are absolutely amazing. The information that you have coalesced together in this phenomenal Daniel phenomenal for somebody who like historical research was was there. It's not like you have a degree in that it's not like you know, that is that is what you do. This is something that a familial story took you down a rabbit hole and you have just continued continued to dig.

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It turns into multiple rabbit holes, gingers enough for a lot more than one lifetime of research.

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And I want you to know, Daniel, whenever you're ready to dig, you let me know. Okay, I'll be there. Sounds good. I'll help you with that.
