Yeah. Yeah. And it's really interesting just to study the human psychology of it, Jason and and the concept, two things sprung to mind while you were speaking, and I know, you basically grew up here in Texas. I'm I'm from Houston.

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but yeah, not many do. But two things that sprung to mind when thinking about the end, and and being comfortable with the end. Number one, the Branch Davidians. And this good this goes that this is the example that I give to anybody. When you were talking true believer, Jason, I wouldn't even say cult, anything like that. This was a gathering of people of like mind and spiritual belief. Yes. Who were targeted because of actions that they had on the outside that help pay the rent. And that led down a horrible, horrible rabbit trail of events that led to other things and repercussion after but but those were people who, even as the hammer was falling we're fully convinced First of their eschatology, yes. And I'm fully convinced of their vision of the end, my wife and I just watched the other one that sprung to mind. Also, because of Texas, was

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the Heaven's Gate cult. Oh, yeah,

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they actively met in the DFW area, tea and dough. And that was another one like come the end, my wife was like, oh my oh my god. And I was like you have to understand though that the in even even the people who were left and remaining who had a sense of guilt that they didn't complete their transformation. Yeah, that they left and these people had completed it. And she's like, how can they even still think of it in terms of completing the transformation? And I was like, there's, that is just the once again, the eschatology that they have come to terms with that they have come to a point of comfort with and when faced with it.

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So what's their worldview? Yeah, its worldview is before all of this, right? Yeah, in many ways, again, politics, culture, philosophy, all of these things are rationalizations out of that worldview. And we can see the same thing happening in cultures around the world, like how do people, you know, how is it okay to enslave people, right, everyone focuses on America. It's like it was a worldwide thing. Everyone had the same ideology, that it was okay to own people. Well, why? Because that was their worldview. Their worldview said, Yep. Owning pupils a good thing, getting them to do your work. That's a good thing. And they all came with it. Soviet Russia, how does Stalin starve? Over 12 million Ukrainians in one year, when there was nothing when Ukraine was producing nothing, the food? He had a worldview? That allowed for it? Right. And everyone's okay with it. You know, and there was a lot of people who agreed with that. They said, Yeah, you know what, it's okay, because they're Ukrainians, or whatever. These were enemies of the state in their mind. And again, let's look at cyber eschatology. Right now we're in we've got people, we tend to think of it as a religious term, but religion is just again, the worldview. Yeah, we have we have social religions, whether we like it

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or not, oh, there's my legend of science, my man, how exactly

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I was. Exactly, that's, let's, let's go there, I was gonna go a slightly different direction. Let's go with that one. We have people who if you were to get them at a bar and a few beers in and then be honest with you, they would say, everything that we have today, as a scientific theory is either over the next century, going to be completely up ended as just nothing but wrong, or the nuanced understanding that we would have of it will be so complete that again, it becomes functionally wrong, or it becomes wrong, even if it's sort of functionally right. That's everything. And yet, these are people who will stand up on television and tell you, they understand how everything works in that you need to do what they are telling you right now. When they don't even understand and they'll be honest, like, Yeah, we don't know any.

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Yeah, we don't actively know. And I mean, hey, man, I have for better than the last decade of my life run large scale, corporate, AV a lot of it for pharmaceutical, and have sat in the back of, you know, trainings, things like that. Just seminars about new medications, and to hear them

even even about the medication that I use for my anxiety, man, they, they don't know why. They know what works for some people. They don't know why. They know what it does. But there's no explanation why the same dosage would work for me and not for you. But there's there's 00. And

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in the last again, over the last year has been really bad for the pharmaceutical companies because essentially all a lot of the stuff that like yeah, okay, so the whole SSRI thing, okay, maybe we didn't know what we were talking about, at all. Like, whoa, what you haven't given this stuff to kids. You've been shoving these medications into people's mouths for 30 years. And you don't actually know how it works.

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No, no, they and I mean, I was a prime example. As a kid I was a distraction to myself and others as my wonderful high energy son is then probably up around kindergarten, first grade, they they put me on Ritalin, that was the solution back in like 7980 You know? And then a few weeks later, they asked my mom to to talk to the doctor and figure something out because we got to get him off of this. He's asleep. It took me completely the opposite direction, where it was like, All right, it's naptime now.

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Exactly. Everyone's like, Well, no, there's this hubris that comes with modernity, where it's like, oh, I can't believe those crazy doctors would give morphine and, and heroin to kids. And it's like, what do you think Ritalin is? Yeah, yeah, it's literally the same. It's literally it's heroin. Yeah, yeah. And, you know, speed. Sorry. Yeah. I'm not a druggie. No.

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Adderall is the same way. You know. And it's, it's the modern equivalent, and very much the same way where some people it will, it'll loop them. Like, I remember I had a boss many years ago who had a kid who it wasn't really an allergy to chocolate, but it was an aversion to chop, right? Where, where she had almost almost what you would see, if you saw somebody who had a drink and a half and was 180 degrees, a different person. If she had a chocolate doughnut, it was gone, dude. And in 30 minutes, she was huddled in the corner crying, like she was going through withdrawal. And it's interesting, because it's a different truth for everybody. Hey, man, it's just a chocolate ice donut. Like it may make the kid Crazy for 20 minutes, but they're gonna be looped out and sugar crash and 45. This one, it was totally different. You know, and it's interesting to see our society, I think what really got laid to bear over the pandemic, and everything else regarding this, Jason And regarding the topic of eschatology, and people's view of the end, and everything else was really the world of cognitive dissonance that most people live in. Oh, yeah. And I mean, I came to my point of understanding of cognitive cognitive dissonance years ago, after an experience with the paranormal, where I had a shadow person grabbed me in my room, and I took that to my spiritual director, the man with the collar, and he

was like, we don't have a teaching on that. And I'm like, like, I could I could have heard like, a truck break and slam into a wall, man. Yeah. Is what I is what I heard in my soul, and in my brain, like what do you mean? You don't have an answer for that? What do you mean, you don't have a question for that? What do you what do you mean, you don't have a teaching on that, like you're telling you that they're a dark entity stalking my soul around every corner and that you have a ritual called exorcism. But when I tell you this thing, reached out from the shadows and grabbed me, you're like, oh, I don't know.

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Yeah, did you have hit on a pain point for me? For the Western Church? It's like so let me get this straight. You believe that a supernatural being created the universe has supernatural beings working under him that there's other supernatural beings that want to get they wanted to me are immortal soul, which is a supernatural aspect of your as an individual. And you read a book that is entirely predicated on supernatural events occurring, but you don't actually believe in the supernatural?

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Yeah, right.

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That's the world that we live in. I'm like, I'm sorry. I've, I've got in trouble to saying this. Like, I don't know that you're actually a Christian. Well, and because you're the Yeah, that's it. Yeah. Sorry. We don't have room here. You know, you're telling me you don't believe the supernatural? And I'm like, but that's literally the entirety of your book. Yeah. That's the entirety of my book. Yeah, my book says these things are running around in there.

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Even the big red words say those things are running around. And my turn of phrase to him was I, you asked me to believe in the spectral without evidence, but won't won't accept the evidence of the spectral when presented, and that strange to me. And that is that is a leap of logic that I just can't make

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in a unique you and me here, brother. That's again, that's why we're, that's why we're here. That's why we're having this conversation.

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Me. Me and my god are closer than ever. We talk regularly do I need to step into that building

for that? Not necessarily, not if that is the line that is towed? Because I know too many people I myself have had the experiences. So you know, when when you're talking about the cognitive dissonance, it's the fact of I can't believe this wholeheartedly when I know that this has happened.

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And the worst part is it's there in the again, it's there in the book, there is a worldview for this there. Again, there used to be a teaching on these things. That's the worst part is there was a teaching a little over 100 years ago. Yeah. But at some point over the last over the last century and a quarter or so, everyone's like, no, no, no, we're going to let the ACS tell us the shape. You know what the universe really is? We don't want them we don't want them to, to think that we're crazy. So we're just gonna let them we're gonna let the these people decide what reality is. These people who believe that there is no supernatural, the people who believe that the world is nothing more than, than stuff that you can actually poke it with a stick and that that's it. And that's all there is to it, we'll, we'll still keep our beliefs, but we just don't think it actually interacts with us. And you're like, that is not what the book even teaches. And so people say, Why don't people read the Bible anymore? Like because you don't believe the Bible? Why are they supposed to read it when you clearly don't believe it? Yeah. Yeah, that's my problem.

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And and, you know, it really does come down to a point of effecting change in effecting change in life Jason because it there is once again that that eschatology that whether whether you follow a Christian belief or not, what happens after you know, and for me, I'm always reminded of the phrase from fourth degree Knights of Columbus, Memento Mori, Tempus few get time flies remember death? Yes, basically, how will you be remembered in the world? What What have you done to make it easier for the people underneath you coming up? What have you done to help your family? What have you done to help your community? Things like that, and that is a lot of the reason why I have this show, is to have these conversations to to expose people to these thought forms. And and to have the ideas of, you know, just because your concept of the afterlife, does not conform with your pastors, does not mean that your concept of the afterlife is not.

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Well, and I wouldn't even go so far as to say I would, I would point out that I think a lot of what a lot of what passes is pastors in the modern West. Their views don't really conform with the scriptures. They're supposed to be teaching. Yeah. I mean, straight up. That's that is the that's the big issue here is that we is that all this was abandoned. We've essentially made ourselves deists at best, you know that on a good day. Right. And so the issue is when you have, again, I just go back to the reason people aren't reading because they don't actually believe it, because they look at the world around them. And they say, but this isn't matching up with what you're saying. Right? And yeah, again, let's go back to again, to bring this all back to eschatology, right, I can, why do I focus on cryptozoology? Well, because I'm a creationist? Why do I focus on eschatology, because it's the beginning of the book and the end of the book. Again, I think that's what this is the timeframe we're living in, I did spend years working on the 2017

alignment. And it's convinced me that we're very, very close to the end here. I won't put a date on it, because I can't, I would never try to but I can certainly say we're in the season. Like, you know, again, that tab is going to come due pretty soon. But the simple fact of the matter is, I look at the beginning of the I focus on the beginning of the book and the end of the book, because for me, it's if those are accurate than the end, then it's the middle of the book that matters. Basically, in the middle of the book is about your life, what you live through how you and how you encounter and live through this world, right? The simple fact of the matter is a vertex coined this term. I hate the fact that I didn't, but he calls it acute demonic possession. And his point was this, right? How many times do we know people who seemingly have everything in their hands, everything like they're very, they're high functional, everything's fine. And then they've ended up, you know, committing suicide. And you're like, what just happened here? There's no note. There was no signs. Surely it's just over? Well, but you can carry that any number of ways people who just suddenly disappear, right? They just, they're just gone. We have no idea what what's happened to some of them and their bodies show up, sadly, somewhere else. People who everything's fine, and then they go in, they commit some heinous act, right? Yeah. Oftentimes you find Okay, were they 100% happy? No. But you also tend to find that maybe there was something else going on that opened them up to something. I have spoken to a number of police officers. I've asked him this question because You hear it all the time in shows, right? And I think people don't even begin to understand how much their worldview is has been shaped by Hollywood, right? About everything how the world works, how history looks, all of it. But I asked him, Have you ever heard this? People say, you know, if they've committed some terrible crime, I don't know what came over me. But I just like I saw myself doing this terrible thing. Every one of them is said, Yes, I hear this all the time, from people who and these are seemingly normal people, but then they just snap and they do some very horrible, heinous thing. Well, he's called, he's kind of calling it. He's taken say, maybe not all the time. But a lot of these times, they may be this sudden, acute possession, the thing goes in the demon goes in, makes you do something horrible, because you're open to it. And it was just the right time. You weren't, you didn't take the precautions. You didn't you weren't you were engaged in something that seemed innocuous, but left you open for them to come in and play you like a puppet, and then leave you with the consequences of it. Yeah, and this is where I think this is why I'm, I am where I am. Because I in why I do what I do. Because at the end of the day, the modern church doesn't even believe that the demons are real. The powers and principalities are real, that they toy with people. And I think this has caused so much pain in people's lives. terror, fear, torment, and just in and suffering. That was completely avoidable. By we're all going to suffer in life. Yeah, the world is what it is. But that doesn't mean that you should be running around doing stupid things, that or ignorant things that make you the believer, you open for more suffering, right. That's true of your life. And it should be true of the supernatural. But we don't do the things people used to do a couple centuries ago that would protect them from these things. I want you know, it's now becoming more common. If you hear the story of if you hear someone's voice that you recognize on your on a trail, you know, if you're if you're walking out for relation trail, don't go out into the woods, right? We hear that story now. But here's my thing, how often does it happen in a city? Yeah. How often is that happening? Where you're in a suburb, or you're in a city, and you hear someone familiar, and you go into that alley where no one is, and then you don't come out? We don't know how often these things are really happening. Because what are the police going to do? How are they going to determine what is or is not something supernatural? And even if they're like, Yep, the supernatural thing, you think they're gonna write down on a piece of paper, attacked by demon, or for or forced by demon to do something terrible, they're not going to do that. They're going to say, again, going back to your point about how we've made science, our new our new religion, they're gonna say psychiatric break, or psychotic break or whatever, they're gonna

find some way to hand wave, an event that is clearly not of this material realm out of the way, but how many people have fallen prey to something that if we'd had the normal safeguards we had just a couple just 150 years ago? Yeah, these people would still be alive.

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Yeah, yeah. And you know, you that even begs to question the whole concept of there may be many, many more missing because hey, the only only ones missing or reported missing are the ones that have people that care about them. And which ones would be the easier targets?

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Oh, exactly. So I'm 100% right there with you.

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That is that is a interesting twist to go down with that Jason just the idea of specifically being targeted because of these things because of an one of one of the big points that I brought up over the pandemic and since is it vibrationally weakened us I think individually I know myself I can I I used to be able to keep 1012 balls in the air now it's three or four and good Lord don't mention the chainsaw. You know, like it used to be like Yeah, throw something else in there, why not? Now man know, we all have a different bandwidth. Now. We all have a different a different way that we process information. And you and that has led to once again a point of cognitive dissonance that is just miraculously huge and massive. What Jason

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in to bring this into connect this again back with eschatology, is that eschatology says, word timeframe. These demonic in entities are going to become more prevalent. They're going to start interacting with people. This is a general understanding, again, forget, not just the Christian worldview, but basically everybody's worldview, that at the end, these things are going to start getting weird, things are gonna start getting wild. That's what we're seeing in the world today, which means we should be ever more present and more careful about how we live our lives in, in focusing on, on not falling victim to these things. And instead, we're doing the exact opposite, and we're inviting them into our frigging homes. Yeah, we're putting them on T shirts, we're, we're talking, we're talking about them by name. And we aren't even bothering to put up the things, you know, that we used to put up again, 150 years ago, to keep them out of our homes. And we and we don't do the simple things we shouldn't be doing. So it's like as in a time when we should be more careful, more cautious when we're told to do these to be more careful and more cautious. We're being less cautious. And maybe that's again, why. Why would these things become more prevalent because of our stupidity? of our arrogance of our Oh, well, hey, it's cool. Let's just play with it. Again, you don't give a loaded gun to a kid. Because you know, it's not going to end well. In when we're all bunch of six year olds with AK 40 sevens right now. Yeah. Yes. We're wondering why people are getting hurt.

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Yeah, it's, uh, you know, you brought up an interesting point a few minutes ago with the the acute possession, Father Malikai Martin, and his book hostage to the devil many years ago, brought up a stage just before demon I ek possession or before demonic possession called demoniacal obsession. And it was basically where somebody had given their will over to something and that that would cause them because of that energy to do things that are uncharacteristic. Yes, for instance, somebody may may give their will over to drugs and addiction and suddenly start stealing, to support that. All kinds of things. And he mentioned that. That is what he saw more than anything as he walked the streets was people who are walking around with a demon not demoniacal obsession behind their eyes. In our society today, be that be that, you know, pornography, what what have you, whatever dopamine fix, you have you have given yourself over to, though, use your day. And when you think about it, there there is kind of that idle, idle hands are the devil's playground concept. If you look back at things 2030 years ago, man, before we had the access and the easy access that we have to information that we do now. You didn't You didn't see the the necessary obsession over device or news intake? Or what's happening in your backyard? What have you,

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right, the local news actually mattered to you more in part of this thing. So this is where, again, something I've been exploring for a little for a little while now is, where's the line between the psychological and the spiritual? And I'm not convinced that line is as hard and fast as everyone tends to think it is. It is not. And I think that's one of the big mistakes we've that we make is we we sort of assume things our fears are our psychological and they're actually spiritual. And we and we often forget that the that our our mindset can be can be the thing that leaves us open to the supernatural. Yeah, in May, it just, there's a lot more going on again, the idea that maybe our understanding of the world isn't what we think it really is.

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It may be what is actively manifesting the supernatural Jason if if, I mean, go, go read any paranormal study. What have you about poltergeists? Oh, yeah. typically caused by a teenager going through some turmoil. Yeah, we're where literally they are just affecting the world around them. And even then, like, you may say, This is crazy. Who do even even the world of remote viewing. It blew my mind when I went to the remote viewing conference last year had a great opportunity to sit and have breakfast with Hal put off and talk with him. Read on to so many topics, but it was his paper on expired. meant in the lab and how scientists were affecting their experiment in the lab by thinking about it when they got home.

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Yes, no. So yeah, again, I don't want to get too far afield but yeah, I mean remote viewing psychic, psychic phenomena. It's all real. Right now again the question but here's where the here's where the real question comes in. What do we even mean by real? Because let allow me to choose off half your audience real quick. When we look at UFOs right, and alien counters let's get rid of the stuff that that is the government right just off the top just say look, a lot of this stuff. Disinformation we've known for a long time yet how the government is actively

manipulating all of this. Let's get that out of the way. Let's look at the truly exotic material the stuff that doesn't fit in that realm. John Keel jock, the lay everyone said, Hey, this thing, you know, even go back to Strieber right. In communion, it's clear his wife said that whatever this phenomena is, it is associated with what we call death. Joshua Kuchins in ecology of the soul has pointed this out as well. There is clearly a connection between the yeah you know, let's let's call them UFOs for a moment here are the you know the quote unquote aliens there's there is a connection between how we perceive the universe and what they appear to be. You go back 100 years, 200 years, they would have called them Fe or elves or goblins. In fact, the early days if you follow G, we have creatures aliens, quote, unquote, showing up that look like elves and goblins. The idea of the gray met sort of becomes normalized and really in the 70s. Even Betty and Barney Hills first descriptions of what the their alien abductors look like, weren't the great wasn't the greatest victim as now. Yeah, I'm sorry. What? No, I

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was saying it wasn't the greys.

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Right, exactly. Now, they became the greys later on. That's the interesting thing. It did. And now people see the greys Well, let's look at something that we've seen happen in real time. Slenderman. Yeah, Slenderman is not a preexisting thing. We know it was we know who created it when it was created, yet people are now starting to see it. Is it possible that a lot of this stuff is it's not that it isn't real, meaning that there isn't something behind it, but that the form the shape and how it interacts with us is more is basically being created by our by our brains? Yeah, it's a stimulating it. But our brains are the ones that are developing the story. So the way it looks to us how it interacts with us is dependent on our own, under on our minds. So this may be again, it goes back to the idea that maybe our world isn't exactly what we think it is. That our our minds may be actively participating in creating these things, which goes back to why you're not supposed to say their names, why you're not supposed to watch certain things or, like, let's throw this question out here. What if simply watching a cold behavior, even if you're like on the television, what if that makes you a participant in their for active and open to whatever it is that they're dealing with? They were trying to conjure? Yeah,

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yeah, I just popped up on screen a second ago, the definition of egregore, which is basically an occult concept representing a non physical entity that arises from the collective thoughts of a distinct group of people. One of my favorite stories regarding this is when Nightmare on Elm Street first came out. Oh, yes, yes, he's I know what you're talking with. Wes Craven came out in an interview, because shortly afterward, the Nightstalker killings started happening in California, and he actively thought that people's fear of Freddy Krueger had created an entity that had possessed the Nightstalker. Yes, and cause him to go out and commit his killings.

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Yes well that's why he writes the final nightmare Yeah that is literally why he did it I like

Yes, well, that's why he writes the final nightmare. Yeah, that is literally why he did it. Like people don't get what he was doing with that movie. Oh, it's beautiful. Yeah, it's my favorite one say because, yeah, it's my favorite one. Because what he does is he tells this story within a story within a story in the purpose is to kill Freddy Krueger. But the real ultimate purpose is to kill the thing that he believes he may have created. In the movie, it says, look, there's always been a demon trapped within stories, right? That's the story that he's telling. And he's like, that's why we're writing this movie. Of course, the end of the movie is him closing this book, which is the whole them manuscript for everything that you've seen. And but what he was really doing was saying he's trying to kill this thing that he thinks he created. Yeah. So I mean, again, I'm of the opinion that this world is a lot stranger than we want to think. And we used to be smart enough not to actively make ourselves targets of these beings. In now, we're just we're offering ourselves up as a veritable smorgasbord. And we wonder why people are going nuts. I literally had a conversation. Oh, I just forgot his name. I'm terrible at names on Friday. I was filling in for the for a friend on on their show. Anyway, long story short, we were talking about the Windigo spirit, right? Most people get Windows and skinwalkers confused. And so that was the bulk of the conversation was trying to say no, this is what's different. And essentially, the the Wendigo is just a possessing spirit, you did something. And it possesses you. And I'm like, this is a one to one parallel to what werewolves were in Eastern Europe 102 100 years ago, right. Our our modern concept of werewolves is not what they had, they had a very different idea. And they're essentially the same thing. And one of the CO hosts. Brandy said, well, it feels like that, you know, with all the you know, this, this Windigo spirit would be having would be having a field day today. Considering all the you know, taboos, the cultural taboos that are being violated, right. And I stopped for a second I'm like, are we sure isn't having a field day? Yeah. Because stop to look at all of the people who are doing I mean, these these, we make shows about them now about how these terribly sick people are going out and committing heinous crimes in which by the way does involve cannibalism a disproportionate percentage of the time. Yeah. What if the real issue here is that the reason we're seeing this rise of the sociopaths and these brutal, brutal killers is because we've opened up our entire society to the spirits, and they are having a freaking field day. Yeah, just going through in turning people into these monsters. And maybe these were people who, again, probably already had some issues, but they've pushed them over the edge into doing something truly heinous. Yeah, right. Mike, one of my favorite Twilight Zone episodes is the howling man. Spoilers for 60 year old episode. Long story short, this man is going through the you know, recounting this event of he's in the Carpathian mountain mountains right after World War One. He ends up letting Satan go. Right. And the end of the episode is him saying it was after that, that World War Two started. And he says, the moral being humans don't need help being evil. Yeah. But we do need help doing truly horrible evil things. That's what he does. He takes a little evil, he makes a much, much larger. What if that is what's happening in the world today we've we are breaking the taboos of every culture for the last 4000 years. And we've opened ourselves up in what and we're surprised to find that the pit of vipers that everyone in the world has said there's a pit of vipers in there don't open, we open it up and throw ourselves down. We're getting bit by all these vipers. And we're like, shocked. Yeah, like, what's going on? What's



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that about? Yeah.



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Why are we getting bit by all these Vipers that everyone said have existed for the last for the entirety of human history?

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Yeah. Which again, is what we see

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in eschatology is like, Hey, you're gonna open the pit of vipers, and they're going to bite you and you're all going to act surprised. And in the worst part, the worst part of the entire book of revelation for me is essentially it says, God would stop what he was doing. Like, if you stopped playing with the Vipers, yeah, this with all this would all end it would all stop,

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then we won't. We won't stop doing it. I want to I want to kind of wrap things up with the idea of prophecy. Jason and I think a lot of people get caught up in this concept of profit whether whether it's your your quarry goods, whether it's the people who follow the pied piper have folks like Alex Jones whether it's people who follow the Pied Piper of straight up every day media. Yes. We we have once again, this confirmation bias and this idea of looking for somebody to save us looking for somebody to give us the answer and the way to follow and people forget the fact that like you were saying Hang with Revelation, there's a way out. Never forget that an actual profit folks, and this is this is why I say Nostradamus not really a prophet, maybe a cool seer, maybe had some connections in other ways with the universe, but profit, not really, because profits give you a way out. Yeah, prophets will always say, if you keep doing this, this is going to happen. The option is you can stop doing it. You will not like what I'm saying, you may shoot the messenger, you may kick me out of the city, what have you. But there's an option to be had. And that's what we have to remember is that anything that paints you into a corner, religiously, spiritually, what have you. That's not prophesy? That's, yeah, that's something else. And it's something very dangerous that is there to control paradigm.
