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What let let's start off at the beginning. What was it that made the two of you guys want to venture forth and produce your own documentary on Bigfoot to begin with? Flash of beauty before we get into what led to flash a beauty paranormal Bigfoot?

So so I'll try and keep this quick. I'll try to keep this quick. Basically, you know, Jill and I growing up in shows the producer on the film, and her and I are married. And we've had a fast we both had a fascination with paranormal since the beginning of time, I guess. Maybe it goes back to a past life. I don't know. But there was never a time that we can remember when we weren't interested in mysteries and paranormal and. And living in the trees, if you will, Bigfoot was a huge kind of focal point of that. And I know that same is kind of true with Toby as well. And, you know, that is part of our culture out here. And so, you know, being that we were filmmakers, it was always in the back of our mind to do a Bigfoot documentary that we thought was kind of sort of missing from the genre, if you will. And after doing some some narrative films, some fictional films, the pandemic hit, and we realized that maybe now's our opportunity to get out into the trees and do some social distancing, if you will. And, you know, we figured that we would spend six months or so putting together a Bigfoot documentary, and that quickly, grew larger and bigger than we ever could have imagined. And through that process of making a flash of beauty, we wanted to put everything into one documentary. And we realized really quickly that we're not gonna be able to fit both the flesh and blood aspect and the paranormal aspect into one film. And so about a month or so into production, we realized that we had to split the two movies into two different chapters.

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Wow. And and, you know, with that being said, as I was saying, in our pre conversation, and as I've said on the show numerous times, I am of both kings, I fully believe that there is a large hominid ape in North America and in other parts of the world. But I also believe that there is something else that is that is basically using the tropes in our mind that we would be comfortable with. Whether or not that is a Bigfoot itself. Who knows? I don't know. But a lot of a lot of the instances that I talked to experiencers about the UFO UAP experience, abduction experience, Sasquatch, cryptid, experience and paranormal experience. There are similarities with all those that run so so deep. And for me to even even think about trying to separate them is is hard. But the fact that y'all decided to do two different movies, one about the actual factual, hard evidence, Alba vernix waxy oils, all kinds of things, and one about the paranormal aspect is awesome. That's awesome. Because there are not only two camps, but two totally different worlds of experience when it comes to these.

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Yeah, yeah. And what was interesting was we were finding, you know, doing interviews with folks that we thought we'd go into an interview and just, you know, talk to somebody about their flesh and blood sighting, if you will. And, you know, we'd have this great interview that would last half hour, hour, whatever, and we turn the cameras off, we'd be packing up and, you know, the individual would say something like, and there were also orbs, you know, like, whoa, wait, wait a minute, you know, like, yeah. And we started figuring out pretty quickly that that anyone that has had a, that has had multiple experiences with Bigfoot, and I think this is a large percentage of folks that are having ongoing experiences toe, Darrell, are great examples who have started having the paranormal happen. You know, and I think that, you know, in our film, not to give away too much Toven Darrell, they find these amazing knee impressions you guys are aren't gonna believe, literally when you see the video, and had they not found those knee impressions. They may not have become entangled with the paranormal as quickly as they did. But they they chose to bring those ni impressions back to where Darryl lives, you know, to shed outside of his his house, his residence, and the paranormal kicked off. It's like taupe says in the film The gates of Valhalla opened, and I can let you know, I don't want to step on toes toes.

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Oh, absolutely. No, but you're because yeah, I mean, Tobe you have been doing once again, the work with Al Moon lab, things like that for quite a while. And the the things that you have come to discover through that and the experiences that you've had, let's get into some of those real quick.

Okay. Yeah, I'm sorry, I'm playing hard to get here like a lot to get through with the Elman lab. In particular, you know, it's just kind of symptomatic of what Brad was saying in the documentary as a whole, is that it's an example if you engage the phenomenon. And we were all too happy to oblige to this phenomena, because inside of the short lives, so for us, when it came a knockin quite literally. We were all over it, you know, girl was recently retired, I was working full time, but I was able to embrace the phenomena as much as I could, and live on site or research on site. And throughout the documentary, you just go well, no, wait a second. What if these guys did that? What if they did what Darrell in tow did what would happen? And I'm telling you the story that we talked about, and the Almaden lab, really just kind of scratched the surface of weirdness. In particular, the ending of the documentary, but then we, you know, a lot of people don't know that part of the community is also in the Alman lab story, including a psychic by the name of Tara, who's in this documentary. So I was a little bit on the fence about her story. You know, here we have a town psychic running around saying that she opens and closes portals and sin spirit entities back to their home, and she has guardians that watch after and there's, you know, these three gals that are just kind of wandering around the small town thing, and he's saying, well, they end up kind of at the L Moon lab rather quickly when things start amping up beyond just the typical Bigfoot stuff. And they find their way in the documentary and the stuff that Brett caught on camera while filming this, the Torah. Now, right above the owl Moon lab, actually within rock throwing distance to some high strangeness we catch on some some really interesting stuff. So, you know, where I was, in the beginning with the high strangeness connected to Bigfoot is a whole different place than where I am now. So where we're talking about 2017 to 2023, I think this stuff follows you home. I think it is a psychic spiritual phenomena and, you know, throughout the documentary kind of ebb and flow as far as how this may work.

That is, that is one of the things that we talk about regularly on this show, guys is is that the Experience of things following you home? And are you sure you want that? You know? Yeah, behind me sit tons of books from experiencers all over the place. Very few of them start off, like, most of them start like a Disney movie, not like a song. You know, there's some sort of tragedy somewhere that either their experience led them to trauma, what have you. And that is, that is probably the biggest caveat that I get from more experiencers is, you know, don't, don't go playing around. You know, yeah, think things can follow you home, and be careful with what you do. More than anything now. Now, when you talk following you home, was it the fact that you had not just not just Sasquatch, but paranormal experiences follow you home?

Yeah. It's so addictive. Once you find out this is real. And you see the NIDA documentary rapidly? Oh, it can be totally maddening.

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I fully understand people that that utterly rat, I mean, look over my shoulder at my synthesizers, like, I understand people that rabbit hole on something they love, and something that they enjoy. You know, and especially if it's the fact of you have the opportunity to do like you guys were doing in and live and breathe it, not go out for a weekend not go out for, you know, a hard weekend hunt, of filming or something like that. But to be out in the thick for that long. Yeah, yeah, I could see how how you would want to tinker every day with it? And how it may not be a good idea to?

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Yeah, yeah, you have to be extremely careful with this stuff you because you don't mean the fact that you can't see it, you don't exactly know what you're dealing with. But we give examples in the film of these beings, having empathy having humanity having, you know, they, they care about people, they're gifting, you know, there's a certain sort of curiousness from them, too. So there's a reciprocal relationship between the two of us, that is a curiosity towards one another, we want to know more about one another. Now, with that being said, I feel like you know, there's, there's certainly a family unit in these creatures. And then there's going to be a protection of that family unit. And so if you're up, tripping and traveling around in the forest, doing things you shouldn't be doing, you're you're probably going to suffer the repercussions, you know, you're going to you're going to probably have a frightening time in the woods. And we've heard we've certainly heard stories like that. But we've also heard an abundance of stories of people having positive experiences, like Tom talked about, you know, in many of the stories that Tom Darrell taught, tell, in this film, really strike a chord. I mean, they kind of pull at the heartstrings, which to me is revolutionary, because you don't really have those stories from you know, like alien abductees. You know, you know, most people that are abducted are like, Yeah, you know, I, I had this horrible nightmare, you know, circumstance where I was like, on a metal table, and they were, you know, poking and prodding at me. And when I woke up the next morning, I had a scar, something behind my ear, whatever it was, it was very traumatic. And there's a lot of in the Bigfoot, in the paranormal Bigfoot world, there's a lot of a lot more. What's the word? I'm saying? It's more of an intrigue. I think it's more of this like relationship. And again, that that has a lot to do with the individual that's having the correspondence with these creatures. Sure. You really have to have, you really have to kind of

just wear your heart on a sleeve. And and if you're in the woods, if you're in an area that's near your home, or what have you, wherever you are, you've got to have that respect. You've got to have that positive energy and we cover that, you know, I think that they can sense that Whoa, but

just as somebody who was brought up hunting Things like that your your energy going out into the woods and your success or not, has such a huge part to do with it. Like if Yeah, if you're, like you said, traipsing around in the woods and stomping and moving around, like, they don't like that no animal likes that. They're quiet. Why wouldn't you be? You know, it's kind of how any deer looks at it. That's why they bolt away from you. Because it's a loud, scary sound, you know? And, and to know that, once again, that there is this humanity behind these contacts, the sharing of things. Now, we're either one of course, as you said at the beginning, Brett, both of you guys grew up in the Pacific Northwest, you both grew up with this kind of culturally just being there. But we're either one of you a believer of paranormal being tied to Bigfoot before you started this to begin with.

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I think in the case for myself, yeah, I think so because of the fact that it was always marketed that way as something attached to the stranger signs, you know, Robert Stack walking out the raincoat talking about Bigfoot along with it, and the Loch Ness Monster. But really, Brett and I share something in common and it's our love for Spielberg Close Encounters of the Third Kind and character of ordinary play by Richard Dreyfus. Yep, basically is driven by a vision, you know, he's an experiencer. He has this intense experience, but he knows that something is beyond the bin there is this rabbit hole that he just cannot not go down. And it's that, that yearning to know what goes around that corner. I think that drives Brett filmmaking, if I can speak on his behalf, you get the sense that breath is just intensely curious. Director, and that curiosity is so hard to find and really good cinema. Yeah. And, you know, I just trusted him and Jill, his wife so much with their artistic eye that and so did the likes of Ron Morehead, and Cindy and hi and and all these great people are in this doc, intensively trust these people to tell their story. And that's such a rare thing.

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Yeah. And Ron Morehead is an incredible individual, I've had the opportunity to sit and talk with him and interview him a couple times. And just he is so genuine with his experiences. And he's had tons of them. And to hear him talk about the tie with paranormal I was on I was on a panel about the tie with Bigfoot and dog man and in the paranormal and my, my whole my whole take was the fact of especially especially folks who have had UFO contact. They specifically are very much akin to a magnet, or a needle that comes near a magnet. They are they are put to a different frequency than the rest of us are. And it seems to attract the rest of this. You know, and it's really strange when you start really digging and finding how many people who have had paranormal Bigfoot experiences have also had abduction experiences or experiences with UFO UAP. There's there's quite a connection there. And it's really, really interesting to see that now. Let's get into some of some of the Whoo, that y'all talk about in this womb movie.

Because I am excited to to hear about a lot of this, that people have been talking about for years things like Bigfoot, being able to cloak Bigfoot stepping into portals. Let's, let's start kind of scraping the trowel across the surface there and talk a little bit about that experience that you guys had out in the field. Well, you know, we

could start off by saying, you know, a lot of the skeptics out there keep keep bringing up this idea that Bigfoot couldn't possibly be real because we don't have a body. Yeah. And, you know, I think that the cloaking side of things and the paranormal side of things really kind of helps. It's not going to convince a skeptic of course, but I think it provides us you know, us that are looking for these answers with a true explanation as to what could be happening out there. And, and the cloaking aspect of it too. is something that we really kind of put under the microscope in in the film and Dr. Simeon Hein talks about how scientifically, they can be cloaking, you know, we even show a squid, that literally, it's picked up in it goes. It's like transparent, you know, it goes from black to transparency instantly. And so it's not a stretch for us to start thinking about how, you know, biologically speaking, how some of these animals are able to do these certain things that we kind of think that, you know, well, humans could do that. That would be paranormal. Well, you know, Bigfoot is kind of taking advantage, some laws of nature that we haven't yet discovered. And, you know, it's it is a little arrogant, I think, for the scientific community to think that we know everything, because we don't we're making discoveries every single day. And, and we cover that and we talk about it, we talk and Dr. Dr. Hein is talking about some of these cutting edge theories that really kind of help us realize that yeah, cloaking can be real. And then we have, you know, this video evidence that I have thoroughly, thoroughly analyzed, that was shot by Bob shoop, in 2014, was a little iPod touch in 1280. By 720, up near Mount Rainier, I've scrutinized the heck out of it, and I would love somebody to debunk it because I think it's I think it's impossible to debunk, and it clearly clearly shows a cloaked figure of some sort. I can't definitively say it's a Bigfoot. But what she saw in real life with her own two eyes was a black figure. And it was like it cloaked for the camera, you know, which is, Wow, very interesting. It's very interesting to me and cameras, if people don't know this already, cameras can see things that humanized cat, a one way to prove that to yourself, you can take the remote control for your TV and you point turn on your camera on your phone and point point through remote control. And you're clearly see infrared light, yet blinking, flashing. It's really kind of a cool experiment. So these things are intelligent enough to realize in the moment that they're being captured by some sort of forever preservation device. That is that would clearly show them and they somehow intuitively, instantly cloak. And that's just the tip of the iceberg.

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Oh, yeah, yeah. And I mean, the example that I show all the time is this image right here. This is Proctor's ledge. In Salem, Massachusetts, I happen to be nerdy enough to have a full spectrum version of the exact same camera that I use for astrophotography. And yeah, all it is. Most people do not realize that the camera that they buy has an infrared filter in front of it has a UV filter in front of it to slim pieces of glass that help filter that out. So that glare and things like that are automatically gone. But the one thing I bring up on the show all the time is we we visibly and audibly hear and see a minimal slice like 450 nanometers.

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Yeah, we're definitely spectrum. Like, blood is so

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small when you when you start looking at the way that a parent sees, or a Tetra chromic if you've ever met a Tetra chromic individual where they actually can see yellow, as well as red, blue and green. Like, it's like another million colors that they can see. It's phenomenal. It's amazing. And there are so many things like that out there where it's like, yeah, I just I refuse to believe that. We have even scratched the surface of what that is, you know, even to know that like, Heck, polar bear fur is clear. Yeah. So so if you just transition that to another species, you know, yeah, there's there's all kinds of possibilities.

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Oh, yeah, I mean, look at look at a vampire squid, a vampire squid. There's some some great images on YouTube that people can look up. And there there's different species of vampire squids. But there's a famous video of of one that has, he has like, it has like these red and yellow and green like LEDs. It literally looks like a toy. You know, he's kind of just swimming through the ocean. And it's like, he's got these LED bioluminescent lights, you know, and then and then we tell stories. Jill and Michael fairy, the DP cinematographer. And I, the three of us saw eye glow in the Midwest. And and we're like, we tell the stories about how we saw the eye glow go out. No, that can't be possible. And I'm like, well, fireflies are possible. They're generating your own light. Yeah, so why Why couldn't you know a Bigfoot a humanoid that's that's kind of gone down a different evolutionary path to develop some of these skill sets have some of the same traits, because it would make a lot of sense as far as hunting is concerned. So on and so forth. Folks have said that they've seen eyes so bright. They've seen actual eyes shine, glow on the forest floor. You know, talk about again. Yeah. And Dr. Simeon Hein talks about in the film. So, you know, it's not some of these things are actually in nature. And we're used to them. We're used to seeing fireflies, we're used to seeing glow worms, you know. So it is it is out there. It's not that far fetched.

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Absolutely. I just posted the article the other day about 125 new species of fluorescent mammals that have been found 125 That's just in the last year of mammals that you know, fluoresce in their own way, we may not be able to see it, but other animals can who are sensitive to that light band. And that's just yeah, that that is one thing that I regularly say, I think we research wise have a problem with is that when it comes to Sasquatch, when it comes to alien, we really, really tend to anthropomorphize along. Yes, right. And we really, we tend to put a lot of intent behind things. And there is a phenomenon there. That that's what's wild is the and that, sadly, is what scares some scientists away is that anthropomorphize ation, you know, that that want to make things so human. And I think is the beautiful thing about using terms like, you know, non human intelligence, things like that now, because we're pulling it out of the box that scientists were afraid to go into. Because because it was pseudo science, not

actual science, which is, hey, I don't know what's Beyond that frontier, let's go find out. You know, we need a lot more Magellan 's in science that are just willing to sail to the horizon man, and see what happens.

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Well, there's nothing in my opinion, there's nothing in the universe that cannot be explained by science. It's just, it's just a matter of whether or not you have the tools and or the skill set to do that. Or, you know, if we're intellectually intelligent enough to, to be able to do that, you know, and that's why we have scientists, that's why we're working every day to make new discoveries. But the truth is, is that we still have so so far to go.

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Yeah. Oh, absolutely. Absolutely. Now tob specifically with our moon lab and the experiments that you've done in, in paranormal Bigfoot. Let's let's get into some of the ways that you guys were attempting communication, some of the ways that you guys were kind of poking poking the Squatch, so to speak.

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Well, yeah, I want to go back to the previous comments you made to cars. Yeah, you know, a flash of beauty paranormal Bigfoot opens up with Native American ceremony with TJ Raven Walsh. And, you know, he mentioned this Becky mentioned with us when we're in Vernal, Utah last month as a group, and we're sitting around, actually, during the premiere of the movie there phenomena Connie mentioned in his opening remarks, ceremonies, and, and before he talks of Sasquatch, he'll say, Forgive us for speaking so plainly. And I think there is this kind of absence of reverence for what we are talking about here. Because there is the science aspect of it, there is the son of collecting data and having the best tech out there. Sure. But there's this forgetfulness of the sacredness of what the hell we're talking about. I mean, this is such such a deep, layered issue beyond the commercialization, absolute love of Sasquatch, but it's a hell of a lot of fun, too. So I got both dynamics of the whole thing. But, you know, when TJ said that, I was like, yeah, there is this forgetfulness on all our shoulders here that we have forgotten that we're speaking so plainly about something so sacred. And I think that that's what we're talking about here. This, you know, I call these things a land sphere, because they are the perfect marriage of their environment, and the physicality of the flesh and blood being but they are of the spirit too. But so are we, I just happen to think these things live in the spirit of a lot more than we do. And maybe it's because they've embraced the land so thoroughly. But to get to your question, how did we communicate with these things, trial and error sitting back on the tailgate waiting for the phenomena to approach us because we knew we're in a hotbed of activity, but the quickest Order cameras won't do the trick. audio equipment seems to be the one piece of tech that they will tolerate. In fact, enjoy. People can take that for what it is, but I think they actually enjoy the idea of leaving behind some audio signatures.

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You know. I was just having a conversation with a field researcher the other day about the

concept of imagine being a creature that's mainly nocturnal. And people are just coming out, throwing like, infrared floodlights out in your forest. You know, just, oh, yeah, I'm gonna set up a trail cam with with high powered infrared light on it. Like talk about light pollution to the

a trail cam with with high powered infrared light on it. Like talk about light pollution to the natural land, lives there, right, like I'm finished. I'm a backyard astronomer, I go through great efforts to block out stray light. I can't imagine what it's like for them to just see trail cams everywhere in these flashing little lights all over the place. Well, I'm gonna stay away from it as well.

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If you go to the First Nations stories about Sasquatch, when they show themselves to a human, it is part of a ceremony themselves of growing up from a juvenile to an older Sasquatch, it's part of their rites of passage to allow to cross in front of a human and not be seen. So this whole idea of catching them on camera goes back to something that we don't even know them culturally, possibly. Yeah. And it's just no way to actually get closer to the phenomenon. It's a way to push the phenomena way, audio seems to be a way to bring it in.

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That's exactly what I'm saying is that if I were a nocturnal animal, I would be going nowhere near that huge array of infrared light, or ultraviolet light that you're trying to bathe me with that more than likely I can see in the range of because I'm a nocturnal animal. Right, you know, that that is just a logical thing for me. However, the audio like you said, that is that is a much more passive. And an almost toy like thing, whenever you're talking about hanging a microphone from a tree or something like that. I could see how it could be much more interesting to something now, you actually sent a clip that I would like to play at this point. Let me let me cue that up. Here we go.

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And I'll play that one more time and actually show on screen the the heat map because you kindly have the actual heat map received.

Well, you know, it's an example of just being patient. And perhaps everybody in the documentary has a different level of patience. But with audio, following the steps of Ron Morehead is the godfather of catching the language and sounds. You know, I was patient and

that's no patient means just two years in the making. I've never caught audio like that before until I went to this place. And so what do we have there? Well, we have a parabolic dish pointed up towards the Umpqua wilderness in a little town of Cottage Grove, Oregon on the backside of a property through an apple orchard. We can't say for certain what's going on there. But I can tell you that most of these experiences I think we're hearing two different individuals, probably an older one and a younger one if I had to get and these are usually followed up by Prince and Prince footprints. Yes, guiding strange lights, hitting banging air. Those kinds of things are preceded by sounds like this. But you know, it just it's one of those things that exists. And what are people going to do with evidence like that? I don't really know, isn't gonna hold up in the eyes of the court doesn't really matter. I'm just telling you that if you Want to go have an experience? You can record sounds like this on your own. You don't need to spin listen to them that much fun or to follow in the footsteps, like Breton Ville did, and go out and talk to these people. That's the way you really find out this phenomena is real is by seeing the quiver in their lip seeing a tear in their eye develop when they talk about seeing one, they will forever change you and then you'll have your own story.

Yeah, yeah, precisely. And that is one of the reason I love going to the events is being able to sit down hear people's stories, one on one, that kind of stuff. hear people's personal experiences that and especially in the cryptid Bigfoot community. There is an acceptance there amongst everybody that I do not see in other crowds. As far as like, hey, yeah, let's get together and go out tonight and go squadron or things like that. Now the one plus side is that we will soon be able to start leveraging things like AI in into the mix when it when it comes to, specifically animal sounds, that kind of stuff. I know that they're working on an AI database of animal calls, things like that, to be able to just rapidly compare and contrast samples to for regular wildlife work. And that is something that I highly recommend anybody who is out doing this kind of stuff with trail cams, what have you feel free to contact your, your local University, let them know what you're doing and guaranteed you there is a biology department that would love to get a hold of your trail cam footage that is utterly useless for you. You know, doing doing animal counts, things like that. It's awesome. The citizen science that can go on now, with all these tools that are readily available to folks. But oh, sorry about that. We were still open on the computer. Now, when it comes to finding finding people who have had the paranormal Bigfoot experience, like you were saying earlier, it seemed to be that they they told you about their experience then came to the paranormal. Afterward after after interviews were done things like that. Did you find as you did this documentary that more and more people came out? As opposed to the first one?

Yes, yes. And we're still getting that, too. So just to backtrack, just for half a second. Ladies are our new project that we're working on right now. We're we're just actually done in central California filming is we're adapting Ron Moore heads voices in the wilderness and crcm story into a new feature length documentary. Awesome. And I'll just kind of tease it a little bit. And that, you know, we're getting some guys to come and talk on camera that have never spoken on camera before the some of the original Sierra campsite members. And I was surprised to hear them talk a little bit about the paranormal. But we have had some folks, some other folks that have kind of, you know, they're starting to feel comfortable. It's, you know, we've been

able to build trust. And that's the most important thing, because, you know, this goes back to the ridicule factor that's out there. And we all know, we've all been on social media, we all see that, you know, the trolls, and whoever else is out there that ridicule folks about their experiences. Yeah. Which is just simply not cool. You know, and Dr. J. Allen Hynek, I can't remember the exact quote, but he said something to the effect of that ridicule is not part of the scientific process. You know, and it's important to listen to people. I mean, you know, there there are things that happen in this world that that may or may not be Bigfoot, you know, and that's okay. But I think by sharing stories, and comparing those notes, we're going to start finding a lot of commonalities with with folks, you know, and I think this is the way to really kind of combine the two camps, if you will, the flesh and blood in the womb is we really just need to listen to each other. And, you know, and I think it's, I don't think it's a bad thing for us to really ask the question, you know, why do you think it's just flesh and blood or why do you think that there's a paranormal factor to it, you know, and really hearing each other out I think is where we can kind of come together as a community and go out into the rest of the world, you know, calm strictly say that what is happening is real Bigfoot is real. And so, you know, I just like everybody else, I need to really kind of like, look at the footage and try and debunk something before I can definitively say that it was real. And it was true. And you know, it wasn't an error of the sensor of the camera. And, you know, I went, I went through the

footage. And you know, when I was editing the movie, and I got closer and closer to the footage, and again, I couldn't debunk it. I've you know, I've been doing video practically all my life, 30 years at least known 35 years. And I've never ever seen anything like this in my life. And, and these were talking micro micro balls. So sometimes what happens in videos, you get these things like dead pixels, or flashing pixels, or square. Yeah, and that's what these look like, initially. And so that's what I was thinking it was but I was like, this is a great sensor on this camera. It shouldn't be doing that. But what I ended up finding in the editing is I was finding like curly cues, which meant that these little balls of light were moving extremely fast, extremely fast. Yeah. And and then all of a sudden, this this particular part isn't in the film, because I discovered it after I finished cutting the film is I found those those little flashes of light on a second camera angle, which completely ruled out on the fact that one camera having problems Wow. And they did an ultrasound, there was no heartbeat, no, no fetus. So they did a DNC and there was no fetal tissue. And the doctor even came out and said, Are you sure you were pregnant? You know, and, and for new mother to be that was devastating.

What they do is not it's not pleasant. It's, it's terrible. It's it's heart wrenching to go through some of these things. And it's, you know, the amount of trauma that you go through and the amount of healing that it takes just to be able to talk about it. There are people I have heard, hundreds of people say they can't even look at the cover of like Whitley Strieber his book, because they, you know, and even though I don't think that even looks quite close to the ones that I've seen, it's close enough. I can't look, you know, it just the first time I saw it, I just jumped back and like, oh, yeah, you know, it was a shock. And it's triggering, and then you have triggers all these horrible emotions. So I don't know why anyone would want to do that to themselves, and put

themselves in a situation where it could possibly harm them or a family member, or put their children at risk. I mean, you know, where is it? Okay. In my book, it was never okay to abduct a child. You know, if you do that in this world, you go to jail? Yes, not. Okay.

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Whoa. And that's kind of the point that I brought up is that there may be some species out there that does have our best interests at heart. I would not doubt that whatsoever. I would assume that. And I think that we especially mistakenly anthropomorphize aliens a lot, and give them a lot of human quality, right. Which means that, you know, like, we we would strive to be one with all, that doesn't necessarily mean it's the case with them.

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No, I think that they are beings that were created before us by you know, I believe in God, I believe in our Creator God or one Creator. I believe that there are angelic beings that were created before us that these beings don't work in the same realm that we do. They don't apply the same laws of physics that we do, they don't have the same restraints that we do. Sure. So when we try to make sense of these abduction experiences, and we try to make sense of what's going on, we can't because it doesn't fit into our paradigm, it doesn't fit into a little box that we live in. It's a much broader space out there. And we don't understand it at all. Yeah. And we aren't built to be a part of that they aren't built to be a part of our space. And that's another reason I think these the greys, because they're not really built to be in our environment in our space anymore. That's why I think a lot of this happens underground underwater. I think that's what the greys are utilized. But, you know, I think there are good angelic beings. And I think there are fallen, and we know that has fallen from different books of the Bible, and non canonical books like Enoch and jassart. Lots of information out there about that, and those fallen ones, they're not blamed, they are not benevolent, they are out here to for their own purposes. And that purpose is not to help us well.

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And that that goes straight into the work of people like Nathaniel Gillis, who we have on the show who talk about a a race of basically half man, half spirit, right? Beings that require flesh to move forward. Like there's nothing there's a part of them that is eternal and will keep going, but they need flesh to move forward. They need flesh to a body. And and that's

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methylene Yeah, so talking about the Nephilim the ones that were killed, their spirits are then the demonic spirits that are looking for something to inhabit. And that's where the greys come in, that gives them nothing to inhabit. Yeah. And they're, you know, they're working for their, their predecessors, their fathers, they're the Fallen angelic beings. So those demons have have their bosses basically, you know, in the hierarchy, they're not as high up the food chain. So

you're gonna follow orders, because I've heard a lot of people say, Well, if they're demons, how come they're not attacking people, the greys? Well, they're kind of constrained in that little gray suit. Well,

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it's also the fact of much like why any demon who possesses you will not take you to the point of death. Right? Why a parasite doesn't want to kill the host is a draw all kinds of nutrient from it. It may now nourish the host and do damage to the host but it will not take it as it will rarely take it as far as killing the host like a virus. Unless the fact of killing the host means transformation into something else for it,

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exactly. Unless it gives it some sort of benefit. So yeah,

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like it becomes a catharsis cocoon. And now it grows wings and moves on. Right? Yeah, parasites normally don't want to kill the host. They embody.

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Definitely not they need that just like a virus, it shows that body.

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So with that in mind, because that that brings a whole new realm to the seeding program and the idea of taking sperm taking it taking flesh to create that. Man. That is a that is an incredible revelations.

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Right? You're talking about modern day naphthalene? Yeah. And you're talking about back to the days of Noah, you're talking about opening a huge can of worms, when you get into that, you know, that that subject because that is a huge subject to talk about?

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Well, well, and especially, I mean, opening the conversation like they have I love the fact that use the term taking it outside of the box. That is what I've been using on the show is that we define things by boxes, and for some reason, we want to put it all in the same van. And just call it Kleenex.

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You know, exactly.

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And when when that happens, it homogenizes things and it homogenizes research and it really puts a myopic view on stuff even even if you're saying alien research like okay, no, all we do is research aliens like now you've put it in the same box, the scientists who said it's not science, right put it in

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a little tiny box and you haven't given it anywhere to actually become what it actually is between him do it.

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And that's just it as of right now we we don't know. We don't know there may be some people that know what some of the job objects in our sky are that are more than likely manmade, things like that, you know, made perhaps interdimensional who knows but the fact that they are now using non human intelligence is great. But it also opens up the realm for that and and it also opens up the realm for especially when you start going back and reading ancient Hebrew texts and older texts and talking about things that live in the abyss

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or change things that live in the abyss things that have happened in the past that fell well in especially

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the the idea of us SOS and things being under a water that being the next next place where we should be looking. Yeah. A lot of that together. It really does.

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Oh, absolutely. Yes, it does,

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was especially whatever you look at LA's work, specifically la Marzulli his work into the Nephilim giants in America, things like that. Like there are numerous numerous stories right here in America. Oh, about that.

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Absolutely. Yeah, so much has been taken are hidden or obfuscated so that people won't know the truth why don't they want people know the truth? You know, it's out there what is the truth la says that all the time what is the truth? You know, I mean, why won't why would they share that they the powers that be you know, I mean? I grew up in central Ohio around the mountain the mountain earthworks we played around the Serpent Mound and, and on the ancient, they call them Hopewell earthworks. But you know, we knew the some of the tribal people around there, and they're like, these aren't ours. We didn't build these. And their names aren't Hopewell, either, by the way, that was the name of a foreign one. And then there's my smoke, Smithsonian. And then I believe the British Museum also came in and took all the things that were in the mountains. Yeah, all the skeleton. Relics. Yeah. And just all of it and took it away. And some of it was, you know, belong to these native tribes. They shouldn't have that. That stuff back. Yeah, it wasn't right. Absolutely. Hearing that. Well,

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and you know, when you're talking about possible, possible links to giants in the past, things like that, and beings that have existed that long and continue to exist. That is fantastical for a lot of people to believe for Fathom even.

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And it's what most people don't want to get outside their comfort zone, which is where you go to work, you come home, you go to bed, you get up you go to work, you come home, but it's so much more. There's so much more out here. And now some people are being forced to reckon with this because of Now we have government whistleblowers, now we're getting some forms of confirmation. 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D disclosure that we will see will be a legal disclosure, it will be a disclosure of the fact that there is tons of black money. Yeah. That is the disclosure that we get is the confirmation of the fact that yes, there have been reverse engineering programs,

But they're older or taller graves, they look older, they have expressions on their faces, their eyes move and change, their eyes will move back and forth. Little rays don't, they have wrinkled faces that so they show what looks like age, they're taller, they're more sturdy, men, you can tell that then hierarchy there, you know, they're ordering those littler ones around. So there are different types of them as well. And different races, of entities, just like you know, there are different types of things in our animal kingdom, they've got different types of beings. And biblically, you can find all different types of angelic beings described. So it makes sense that, you know, we've seen lots of different kinds, I think great, the greys that we see are really just a vehicle, a vehicle to get information back and forth, a vehicle that bring people back and forth a vehicle to be in our environment, in our atmosphere, and in our space. And to get around some of the rules, because you can't invite a vampire in but what about a robot? Yeah, can a robot come in? Then have the, you know, didn't have the same requirements, does it? No, no. So you got al gray or something like that? Well, maybe they can just come right in? Well, I believe they can't and they have?

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Well, and that is exactly the point that I brought up in numerous circumstances, whether it's whether it's seeing Bigfoot disappear into a portal, right? Or are you sure that that was the physical Bigfoot? Or was that something using the trope of Bigfoot that you're comfortable with

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Right, exactly.

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And once again, exactly, no different, no different using using that modality? Because you're comfortable with it, you wouldn't you wouldn't be shocked like you would if you saw them in their natural state.

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Exactly. Or maybe it's something that they created another hybrid type being and it kind of was able to maybe it was able to reproduce, because I've heard people talk about little ones and big ones. So I have no idea. You know, I'd love to know more. I'd love to see it, you know, well, I guess I wouldn't, I wouldn't, because I'm back, you're back to the same for the same quantity. Yeah, you're back to the same place. So no, you know, I've clicked I'm not gonna go looking for one. Yeah, you know, that's not on my radar. But because I've just everything I've seen from this other realm. Unless it's been, you know, I have had really positive angelic encounters beautiful and beautiful things happen. And I highly recommend everyone else. Stay away from that too, because we don't have you're messing with something you don't understand. You're playing with fire, and you gotta be very careful.

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Yeah. Yeah, precisely that isn't that Is the warning I give all the time. Like, right right here next to me is a copy of the Roman ritual life. That is the rite of exorcism. I don't think I'm gonna go out and start practicing the right exorcism like I don't I don't think

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I got the chops on, it's not your math, right, Your path is sharing information and you're doing a really amazing job at it, don't stop doing that.

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That's just it, though, is that it can be very hard, very hard for experiencers especially experienced or such as yourself, Where Where can somebody go for support? With something like this? Because of the cost? I mean, nowadays, it's much easier we have the conversation

with Michael J. S. Carter regularly, like, when he had his first experiences back in the 70s. It would have been almost like maybe you'd find a pull tab thing?

And I just want to talk about it. Absolutely. Now, when I go to conferences, and I'll have a conference schedule on my website for ones that I will be at. And next year. We just talk I just talked to people, you know, anyone who wants to talk come up on the talk. So there there are places there are people who will talk obviously, I know you've got a website, too. I'm not alone in this. And I'm trying to learn a lot of women writing about this. And there aren't a lot of people having the conversation and I'm trying to make it okay to do that. I'm sticking my neck out. I mean, you know, think this doesn't come with critical ridicule. Yes, it does. Go. This is not necessarily well received by all, but that's okay. Because this is this is my path. And this is something I'm going to do and I'm determined, determined to get this message out and to help people anyway, I can

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beautiful, beautiful that is absolutely amazing.
