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It is always lovely to chat with you both on show and off show seven I could not could not be prouder of the fact that you have you have made your way to state director there with MUFON. You know, one of the things that I hold in high regard about MUFON is that there are a few people that get some pitons from MUFON there's there's not anybody that's like getting Christmas bonuses from MUFON. I think I think Mr. McDonald, the utter head of MUFON gets gets a stipend for taking care of things. And aside from that, it's you know, to my tea folks, some office folks but all of you stake directors all of all of the field investigators all of you at the ER t this is a labor of love. This is a labor of what can we do to further the science and the cause of UFO UAP disclosure. And I have said for years since you first came on the show said that I do not think I could I could think of a better advocate for experiencers out there than you

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have such an incredibly large heart such an incredible personality and in such a caring way about you when it comes to these things. And that's that's what I love talking with you about is the experience of being an experiencer because it's it's not easy. It's it's funny because there's so many people in so many of the groups that I belong to sev talk about how they cannot wait until their experience you know, and I am a big believer that every experience happens for a reason, good experience and bad experience in life. And but but when it comes to paranormal experience when it comes to UFO UAP experience especially that close, close experience, like what you've had, I caveat people be Be careful what you wish for it because most of these experiences don't start off like a song they start off like a Disney movie, which, you know, the first five minutes is normally pretty bad for somebody involved. It's not normally a good experience for the character's parents, or you know, something like that. And that's how most of these experiences start off. Even your experience took you a long time to come to terms with and that was a lifetime experience before the experience that you were really consciously aware of. So let's let's start really cracking the nut of what it is to a be a lifetime experiencer to be able to trace back the experience of alien contact to your youth and how that changes as you become an adult and and how it changes when you when you come to a conscious realization of have your actual experiences.



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So my first conscious memory and ET contact is from age 10 to 12 And this spaceship would come in the middle of the night, I'd find myself outside and would come and I'd be really happy to see it. It was like I was being reunited with a family member, this being would come out and talk with me and make sure I'm okay. That experience was not scary. That experience was very loving. And every time I saw that ship, I was just so happy that it was coming. It isn't until I got older. And I started having contact with the greys that I started to get scared because the greys just they have, they don't have a good reputation. And they I have learned, I was told that there are three different sizes of greys tall, medium and short. And there's the smallest ones, the ones that a lot of us have come in contact with are more robotic in nature. And because of that, they have less sentience. And so they're a little scarier, because they feel like a robot, and you don't feel like you're emotionally connecting with them. That's why I was so afraid of them in the beginning. I was well afraid of them for decades, decades. And it wasn't until 2017 When I got those two red X marks on my back that were put by the grace that I started to process my relationship with them. And why am I in contact with them? And then I learned that they were helping me the whole time. They were not hurting me. Yeah.



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Wow. And once again, that that came to you through with through a lot of help. And through a lot of realization that you know, you were that you were personally viewing your experiences, specifically with ETs, through through other filters of trauma in your life? No,



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yes, absolutely through the filter and victimization. And so there is a direct correlation between spiritual expansion and understanding your ET contact, they're related. And just like you said earlier, we don't see a UFO, by chance, we don't make ET contact by chance, there's a very, very good reason for it. So what I have decided to do is to help experiences around the world if you've made ET contact, or if you're unsure, and you want to talk to about if you want to talk about it with someone I'm offering that for you. I know what it's like to hide, I know what it's like to try and ignore your ET contact. And all that does is negatively affect you. It affects your mind, your spirit in your body, it also affects all areas of your life as experiencers we cannot pretend that it didn't happen. And we cannot we cannot really choose to ignore our reality. Because that lie if you think you're just going to set that lie off the lie of Oh no, I'm not in contact. Oh, no, those are not ETS like that's not really happening. If you set that off here, you're gonna have to come back and revisit it if you want to find personal peace if you want to find fulfilment and if you want to really engage in that really fantastic personal journey of awakening your consciousness and so it's it's really impossible to delve into your ET contact with without it having a major beautiful, beneficial effect on your psyche and your spirit. 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in that was quite a bit of what you got into recently with George nori you had the opportunity to actively be on Gaia network and talk with him about what it is to integrate these experiences into your life and that is that is a lot of what the work is with the experience or resource team is. It's hard for experiencers to once again find their foothold in life sometimes seven that is a lot of what you spoke about recently with George nori on Gaia network. It was the integration of these experiences into life. What what are some of the things that first time experiencers come to the table with?

And I am now at the point where I'm I'm receiving so many emails from so many experiences, that I've restructured how I'm spending my time, I'm spending a lot more time helping experiences around the world. Or we can just email back and forth, if you go to my website, you'll see all the choices there. And you can also email me serve at Planet self.com. Thank you for doing all that. So when I talk to an experiencer, who has not processed what happened to them, often I'm the very, very first person that they're actually telling their entire story to. And it's quite an honor to hear this. There's a lot of fear. Because they don't understand what they're in contact with. They're not sometimes they're not 100%, certain of what they're in contact with has their best interests at heart or not. So they're worried about their safety. Also, the hardest part is not being able to talk about it with anybody, for fear that you're going to be criticized and ostracize. And whatever reputation you had is going to be

tarnished. Whether it's between family, friends, or even your career, that's really the hardest part, we have to talk about it to somebody, we just have to get it out. Not doing that, and just letting it just fester inside of you is really the worst thing you can do. It's the worst thing you can do. These days, it's so easy to get help. You can come to me, you can go to Facebook, a variety of different Facebook groups, there's so much help now that really wasn't even available just a few years ago. So I did suggest the most important thing is to face it and to come out to yourself. You don't have to come out write a book, you don't have to be on TV, but you have to come out to yourself. Because this is the magic in living authentically. And you know what happens when we live authentically as you do? Yeah, look what happened to you. You have a very fulfilling life. It's dynamic. It's exciting. You're happy is it's personal peace there. Yeah. And you can't have that if you have this huge lie that you're trying to hide. It's gonna somehow erupt. Yeah. So I get it to the point where it erupts and causes a lot of drama and chaos. Go to somebody come to me go to somebody go to MUFON and try and get some help.

Specifically, the conversation that we have whenever we have folks like Michael J. S. When it happened to him, you know, back in the 70s 80s, where it's like, what, what were you going to do find a pull tab at your local library or on the bulletin board at the post office? Like, have you been abducted come get help. There were in places like MUFON. But that was that was to make a report things like the ER T did not exist until Geez even even a couple of years after you met people like Kathleen Martin

started the ER T Kathleen started the EFT because she saw within MUFON that there was a void of experiencers who are reaching for interpersonal help for direct one on one help. So she created the ER T which stands for experienced resource team. And I'm on the executive committee. And there was about 50 or 60 of us around the world. And we deal with the MUFON cases that are directly related to ET contact if there's no ET contact and we don't get the case that it just goes to a traditional FYI. We're also looking for ER team members, you have to be field investigator first, but if anyone's interested in becoming a field investigator for MUFON it is really a wonderful fun thing to do. And then from there you can go and apply after you've been an f5 for about a year and I've had several cases under your belt you can apply for the ER T and and see if helping contactees is something that you'd like to do. We're always looking for more people because there really aren't a lot of people that can do this kind of work. That can help experiencers

Is and that's one of the things I bring up on the show regularly is it's interesting to see that that quite literal pivot mark in the dirt, where where they went from Uncle chats a weirdo for believing in UFOs to Uncle Chet to UFO denying neighbors. You know, like suddenly you terms like UFO deniers started being used by the media and things like that were the year before. If you came to them with a UFO report, maybe there was a local special interest story in there, you know, and you'd hit maybe like a minute of coverage, but most of it was done like, crazy man on Third Street says he saw thing over his house. Did you see something? If so call into the show and let us know. You know, give us your news tips. Like it was always a way to to feed into the news tip cycle or something like that. It wasn't really a true part of the news cycle, like it is now. You know, like now it is it is a full on conversation in the media.



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Oh, yes. Yeah, without a doubt, it's nothing new to have a new segment on the news anymore, which is crazy. If someone had said this to me three years ago, I would have been shocking. To start



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wondering your local news, right? What you were just on one for your local news. Didn't didn't they come and shoot one with



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you. I've been on the local news here a few times. But I was just recently there's a ABC TV program that just came to my house and was here all day long. And that show is supposed to be airing in the middle of this month, actually in the middle of this. I can't say what it is the show yet. We're gonna go back to something you said earlier about how Hollywood handles disclosure, which is they handle in the worst possible way you could possibly handle it, which is through the lens of fear. That's what brings money. But I'm really honored that I I'm a founding member of a brand new group called the Hollywood disclosure Alliance, just made up high level Hollywood people and UFO people. And together we'll come together to help Hollywood tell the truth when it comes to disclosure. Yeah, there it is.

Yeah, this is this is amazing. We had we had we had Earl Grey on talking about this not too long ago. And it's absolutely phenomenal. To to see this and to see this kind of work happening because it is it is so entirely important to to as you said that, oddly enough, it seems like there was a unified front in Hollywood as far as what to present because it seemed like every single thing since The Day the Earth Stood Still just about is about the fear of aliens, not about the the enlightenment or anything like that even even the big talk at all of the ad all of the hearings and panels on the Hill are about the air supremacy of the United States and the dangers presented to air traffic and get to prove that just the other week. There was an article about how a UFO was hovering over Air Force One at at LAX when this was quite literally got the USA Today article up this was the December 22 UFO or balloon An unidentified object spotted over Air Force One may have simple explanation. But that that was all. All the news cycle for that day was talking about UFO over Air Force, why like you're not going to you're not going to get a bigger way to skew the paradigm of conversation than to say that there was something hovering over the most powerful man in the world airplane that has all kinds of countermeasures and all kinds of electronic measures and all kinds of like that thing is a flying fortress that could literally fly through a nuclear blast. They make it like they think and fly at the proximity of a nuclear blast and be okay with the countermeasures as, but they made it sound really scary that there was a UFO flying in proximity next to Air Force One over lax and nobody was aware of it. You know? So yeah, it's like the paradigm is still being pushed to fear because when once you say that, you know, our skies are unsafe, you can get all kinds of money released. You know, you can get all kinds of funds released from from national coffers, because hey, we need to make sure to keep the airline traffic safe over America. I posted just the other day. I'm pretty sure we're the ones junking up their airspace. I'm pretty sure they got way better avoidance and collision systems than we do. You know, so I don't think they're necessarily the threat to the airspace. I think we are the threat to the airspace, we're the ones with the junky planes that get in the way and cannot maneuver out of the way fast enough. So yeah, but but that is the conversation is how can how can we keep this fear motivated, because Because fear is where money comes from, you know, that that's how we know, to untie the

purse strings of Congress is through fear. So trying trying to change that paradigm is, is a beautiful thing that the Hollywood disclosure Alliance is working on, is to try and change that message, that that is pervasive through everything, you know, and how do we because once you change what the media is saying, you change the perception of the public. You know, and I think that may have been some of the kerfuffle that happened whenever, you know, things like close encounters and stuff like that came out where it really did verge on on almost documentary, in in the way that some of these things are treated by the government and the way that some of these things, especially at the time were being investigated. You know, even even the fact of the the scientist in the movie being based on the character, or the character being based on Jacque Malay in his work. It was very much I think, a laying out of what was happening. So we are changing and the view of things are changing. And it's great because it is bringing out more people like Youssef who are willing to come forward with their experience and share their experience to help other experiences.

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Yeah, also, J. Allen Hynek was very closely involved with close encounters. Oh, yeah, absolutely. That's where we get our close encounters to the first second, third, fourth kind all that from Yeah. Yeah. Okay. I don't know what to say because which coin to go to first.

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That's okay. That's my job is to direct you where to go. So that's my job as a host is to give you questions. So, with that in mind, though, like when it comes to helping people, we talked about the initial people who come in scared, do not know what happened to them do not know how to express it to family, to friends. what point do you typically see the pivot? At what point do you typically see somebody come to the point of acceptance of their experience and have that willingness to come forward to talk to family to talk to friends, you know, because there there are numerous cases out there something that we speak about regularly, the fact that these experiences tear families apart, they they they tear relationships apart, they tear friendships apart, and not because of what happened, but because of the lack of talking. You know, at what point do you See that change for people, that's

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different for everybody. Sometimes I can see a change just in the first phone call or the first consultation with me. And sometimes it could take years, it really depends on the person and how deeply they're willing to go and look at themselves internally. Because this is a, you have to turn your eyes inward to understand 80 contact. And a lot of people don't want to do that. But that's the reason it's happening to you. So you can turn your eyes inward, so you can align with your heart. And so you can live as a human in a happier state. So the information that we're getting from the ETS is to help us live as humans, more connected, more loving and happier, all the information we're getting. And so in order to process that, and integrate that you have to do this internal personal journey and look at yourself, and look at why negative things are happening, or why the quality of your life is not the way you want it to be, you created the quality, we all create our reality. And we create this biosphere, energetic biosphere that we have around ourselves. We are we're like architects of that. And that is what creates

our reality. And it's all through the mind. And so these are, it's so multi layered, so multi layered from the first moment that you would maybe connect with me and we will start talking. And then I may help you realize some things you may not have realized before. I often suggest meditation for experiencers. Sometimes experiences want to make contact again, and they want to nourish contact, and I help them do that, too. And basically, I help the experience. So get rid of the fear and the confusion, there's always a little bit of confusion. And there might be always a little bit of fear. But what I'm doing is helping the experiences. So the fear and the confusion no longer keeps them from propelling forward and creating a happy life. Happy relationships, because hiding this comes in between your relationships, too. It's just hard to be happy and fulfilled. We have a huge lie. Yeah. And it's growing and growing and growing inside of you.

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Yeah, that you're literally perpetuating on the daily if you aren't telling like it's in granted, you know, like, I don't think anybody on the first date is necessarily going to go into like personal abuses in their life. You know, I'm

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just coast, Georgia East Coast to Coast has a dating app for people.

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Yes, they do. They have had that for like a decade for at least a decade that I know of. Yeah. Yeah. No, for for people in it. It's a brilliant idea. It's a brilliant idea because salve, like, you've met my wife. pretty fortunate man. She's an amazing, amazing human being and to find somebody who understands this. And what happens in this head and why it happens is something special to begin with. Much less, much less some of the ideas I can just lay out in casual conversation. You know, like the number of times I'm on the road and just quietly having my beer at the bar and somebody will go, oh, well, you want to talk about that. Hey, Chris. And it's like, they just pull me out of the corner and go, here's somebody with this wild topic of conversation. Oh, well, you want to talk about alien abduction? Well, all right. Let's get into that real quick. You know, like, yeah, that, imagine that on a date? If that's not your topic of conversation, you know, so the idea that they built a community of people who are looking for soulmates that are interested in the same thing, that's a that's a beautiful concept. You know, same thing as you know, plenty of fish or any Christian dating dating app, things like that where you're you're trying to find somebody who who has the same core belief as you and spiritual beliefs are one thing when you when you get into this it's a different story and much much like any relationship you know, friendship, what have you could be polarized it can be it can be just as polarized in the dating world once you find out like, Well, I mean, this guy was really, really great. And we got along and until he started talking about Alien seeding, and in the idea of, you know, alien program to bioengineer humanity like that. That's, that's when we stopped going to Fuddruckers. On afternoon. Like, I could see how that could be a sticking point for some people. And yet it's still a beautiful conversation for for other people. Yeah. And having that conversation is hard. It's hard. And yeah, trying to trying to find a mate is hard enough. Trying to find somebody who can empathize with with a thought form is different. And

when you're trying to find a way to express this thought form to people that may not be empathetic, it's hard. And that's what you're dealing with it with the ER T and with with new experiencers is trying to get them accustomed to being able to share this incredible experience, because it is an incredible experience. And it's something that given the opportunity can truly truly be life changing. To the to the the Euro prime example of that says, you weren't helping people in this kind of way you were doing readings and things like that. But

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I do still do. Purpose sessions. Sure. We're in a, it's interdimensional information that comes through and it's information that we all have access to. And what comes through for my client is their purpose and why they came and how they can manifest it. What the best career paths are, past life comes through that explains something that's going on now. And also a mental belief or two, we all have these mental patterns that really don't serve us well. And so some of those come out in this session. And sometimes my client knows about this negative belief pattern. And sometimes they don't even know they have it. Yeah. So we talked about that and how to eliminate it or maneuver around it. And basically, the sole purpose sessions are like a blueprint to help you align with your purpose to find fulfillment and personal peace. And so I'm still doing those, I do those via zoom. And I really enjoy doing those. And so they're it's interesting, because I started off doing those. I've been doing those readings for 13 years. Yeah. Now the ET stuff just started happening in 2018. I really haven't. I've only been in the ET world for about five years. Yeah. Yeah. And but now they're crossing the spirit of my spiritual work. I'm at work completely integrated, crossing their their hand in hand with each other. That's like the big new forefront of ETs are the spiritual growth. And that is that has been an ongoing hypothesis for a long time is that many abduction cases may may very well be abduction in disguise. In in order to.



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Okay. Are you talking about the Dr. Steven Greer hypothesis that or he claims that they're human beings dressed up as ETs and the government as these fake spaceships and they're bringing people on board and making nothing not



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there's that there's that but it's it's more the fact of using using bi directional technology to kind of in a targeted individual kind of way, the same way that they are using random samples of the public to possibly test mind control devices, things like that weaponry that is used in the ways of Havana syndrome, that kind of stuff to psychologically drive



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people. But I'd like to say something, please, please. Because I don't want to fall down this channel of fear and what the government putting ideas into our minds and all this kind of stuff controlling us, the most important thing, I believe, is when you have an incident or an experience, look at the quality of your life. So I have had experiences that have changed the quality of my life for the better. I'm a happier person much more fulfilled, it's just everything is better in my life, since coming out and since accepting and listening to the information that the ETs have given me as guidance as my personal guidance. So because of that, I refuse to believe that I'm in contact with demons, I refuse to believe that I'm, I'm in contact with negative things that want to hurt me, because my life does not reflect that. If I was in, truly in connection with demons, my life would reflect it, I would not be happy, I'd be having problem

after problem after problem, I would not be flourishing. So it's important to look at your life, your life is going to show you it's going to reflect to you the type of interactions that you're having. Now, if the government is indeed staging abductions, they're not staging them to put beautiful spiritual messages into the experience. Exactly forgetting that's why I know it's not the government doing this, the government doesn't want me to flourish.



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Yeah, yeah. Precisely, it doesn't



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want me to step into my personal power. So that's how I know it is not human beings that are staging these, if you have maybe, maybe if you have a kind of experience where it's you're not caring, nurturing information, maybe possibly they are faking these experiences. But these experiences are more than three D, there is like this whole you in this whole different dimension, and all kinds of other things are happening. So let's let's start at the beginning of all of this. Daniel, how did how did you come to find out that you were blood relative to Jesse James to begin with?

Well, my late mother Betty Dorsett, Duke. She, she grew up hearing the stories, you know, family stories that Christmas and birthdays and other get togethers that Jesse didn't die faked. His death moved to Texas, and he was her great, great grandfather, great grandfather. So, you know, she'd heard that all her siblings heard it. And that was always you know, it's just passed down through the family the same story. And then she always wondered but then she'd she said, you know, you go to school, you read a history book, or you watch a movie, like the long writers or any other Western with Jesse James in it. And history, hell always had it that Jesse was shot in the back of the head by Bob and Charlie forward and that was the end. But so she wanted to know which story was right the family story, or, or, or the historic, you know, traditionally accepted story. And that once my sister and I got started college, mom had more time on her hands. So she started looking. She went to you know, the Texas State Archives, different places doing Jeannie ology years of research and found out that it looked like when she found the photos that really helped there's a lot of photos passed down through the family. We looked at the photos she did. And I'm starting to get ahead of myself I start, it's like a million different stories. It all tries to come out of one. So, but anyway, she started she found proof with census records, documents birth and death certificates matched with the diary, Jessie's diary that was passed down through the family, and found proof that it looks like he didn't die, like history said, and, but we had our photos and we she wanted x, she knew that if she was going to go farther with this, she needed to get experts to prove whether our photo tell us whether our photos were the same people or if it was or if it was just in our minds, because they bore a strong resemblance to us. But we wanted experts so she went to the Texas Department of Public Safety. You know, our version of the state police went down to the headquarters, their forensic lab, and they verified that our photos matched the historically

accepted photos of Jesse, not just Jesse, but also Jesse's mom. My mother's great great grandmother would have been Jesse's mom she met are our photos of her match the photos of Jesse's mother, even the same dress, the same print on the dress, the same arm missing everything about a matched and it just kept going from there. There's a couple others that match but we're concentrating on Jesse, same scar on his face. She went from Texas Department of Public Safety to the Austin, the Austin Police Department, photographic forensic lab when McCain at the time was the head of that, and they verified that our photos matched. And then she went to a third group called visio. Onyx. It was a company in New Jersey, I believe. They were the world leaders of facial recognition technology at that time. And then later on, they sold now they're I think the last I heard they were now called identical. But anyway, they also verified and once we had verification from three experts, three, you know of some of the best experts we can find. We went forward with it. And mom contacted the James Forman Museum in Missouri thinking they would be excited to know this. That was the last thing they wanted to hear. They were rude. And that was when all the troubles with that with that group started. It ended up, Mom wouldn't quit. They were trying to shut her down on public forums and things like that. And I ended up late it ended up with them. Not not the James farm but people associated with them sending us death threats, there was about a half dozen people in total, and FBI put a stop to it. But I'm getting ahead of myself. Well, yeah,

that that is quite literally one of the many things that we have talked about previously. Daniel is the idea that these communities, especially communities like that, like Salem, Massachusetts, it's one of my favorite communities in the world to visit. But their money's made a certain way. And if you change the dialogue of Cotton Mather, if you if you start changing the dialogue of the pressing of Giles Corey, you know, these things that are integral to the history of this place of this town, and once again, like we've mentioned before, that that town that Jesse James was supposedly killed them, like, that's pretty much their bread and butter. He passed away shortly after that. Anyway, he told us one day said don't don't sign the book. And Mom said why? And he said it. He whispered it. And I thought this is odd. But you know, we were so naive at the time. That was our first contact was strange, you know, strange behavior like that. You know what, what mom said? What? Why don't you want us to sign and he said, they're watching. And I said, who's watching? And he just turned around and went and sat back at his desk. And I thought, okay, we won't sign in. So we walked, found out these two men, there were two men staring at us. One was older, the other was younger. They were both staring. Kind of and it was odd. You know, when you look and they looked down. It was kind of like a cheesy movie scene. Yeah. I'd look up and they'd look down. And I laugh about it. And the funny thing, it's funny, you brought that up, because I was talking with my sister about that the other day, that still asked, let me not go down that rabbit hole yet. That one anyway. So they're watching us, we leave, they leave. Then the next week, same thing happens. He they finally came up and introduced himself. The older elderly man was J Harrison. And his sidekick was a younger man named Jeff Adams. And J. Harrison was a former police officer with the city of Dallas. And then then he went on to tell us that he was a first cousin to President Bush, Bush Senior. And I thought, okay, I don't know what the ties are here. And that's where you go down a lot of other rabbit holes, but so he tells us that his sidekick Jeff Adams says, I'm a house painter. And that's all he said. He was part of the state investigation. He was the head of the state investigation on the assassination of JFK. He and this is this, it didn't happen overnight. It's piecing things together over time. But a Wagner car was interested in Jesse James in the treasures. So he would call mom constantly. He had his driver come out and take my mother and I to three locations where large treasures gold, mostly gold, some gold, some silver, but mostly gold word were recovered. He's his driver was there at each recovery and told us that the Texas Rangers oversaw the recovery of those gold catches. Well, like one over near Georgetown, Texas, it was there was the first one she showed us the driver. She said that there were several 18 wheelers, making several trips a day for several days, unloading gold

from that that site. And I thought my god, I said that's more gold than Jesse James. ever robbed. I mean, just one trip with a with a help. You could just even a pallet of gold. They never even robbed officially that much gold. So where did all that gold come from? And how was Jesse involved with that? Another story real quick. Around the same time. Wagner car was talking to us. There was an old man named George Roman. He was a 32nd degree Freemason. When he was a kid, he was about 10. Jesse was an old man in his 80s Wha Yeah, in his 80s, actually, late 80s, early 90s When George was about 10 or 12. So George lived near Jesse, Jesse hired George and swarm to an oath and hired him to help him move six 700 bars of gold in large Dray, it's a it's a large wagon. According to Georgia, each of the bars weighed about 15 pounds. And they moved to the bars. 20 miles they buried it. GEORGE drew a map for us where it was we went to go look for it. It's on Fort Hood Military Reserve. We're not Weren't you know, we're not that crazy.

actively defended the Gulf of Galveston there, as as you cross from Houston to Galveston over the bridge, there's a sign that says, you know, historical marker. And if you go and talks about gene the feet, defended that area.

But uh, it they've got holes in their ranch that are three foot in diameter and they go down about 140 feet. Yeah.

It's not like you went out and bought like, you know, hey, we got a mining Right, right. You don't have a mining right right here. This is our property. Yeah. It's like 20 foot deep holes that people have been digging for weeks. You know, things like that, because they're, they're on the same trail. You know, and that 1000 dangerous stuff, man, like if it no different than somebody cooking meth on your property. But you're

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exactly right. I mean, and it's actually instead of cooking math and all that. It's it is gold. It's like it's no different than having pallets of cash. I mean, people will kill for that help people who kill people for 30 bucks. So you know for a bar of gold or several 100 of them. You A lot of people wouldn't think twice about and

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some people even for the possibility of it, Daniel, and that that's the scary fact, you know, and that that's the thing and when you're talking about something, because I mean, Jesse James was a member of the Knights of the Golden Circle, the Knights of the Golden Circle was a

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band, he was alleged to be a member of the Knights Golden Circle. Just there's no, there's no proof on that. There's no proof that Albert Pike was part of it. Yeah, but it also wouldn't shock me if they were I don't think

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that they were. Yeah, that unlike I don't think unlike makes sense that they have an actual roll call for that stuff. Well,

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and I also know that Albert and Jesse were both masons, I've often wondered if they didn't use the Knights of the Golden Circle, as like a decoy or a patsy. Sure. Sure.

But He also claimed to have been a senator from New York. Kit Carson, a whole bunch of different people. And he anyway to make long story short, that guy claims to be Jesse, there's still some people who've who follow that. They follow him like he's Jesse. So back in it was around 2000. They exhumed the grave in Granbury, Texas and And so where they're at the exclamation just because a reporter wanted mom up there swell drive up there. Plus it's a party history, even though it was a hoax or he played a role in the story. So we went up there. We run into Wagner car Wagner cars there. We also found out people, the people egg exhuming the body believed there may have been treasure in the grave. And I think that's why the whole thing happened. But so we're up there, we see Wagner car, and then we are introduced to none other than Billy saw Estus. He was. I don't know if you've heard of Billy saw as this is one of the most famous or infamous con men in Texas, or in America. He was selling non existent agriculture, fertilizer plants to foreign investors back in the 60s, helping raise money for lb Jay's campaigns. He was also said to have been LBJ his right hand man or like a man in the shadows, or his hitman. Yeah, but I'll just say that we met him. He was a very nice man to our face. People want to find out where it said on their big ranch. And then at the last minute, that oh, well, I'm not my lawyer said it'd be too much liability if he got hurt. So we're calling it off. And I've never told anybody where it's at. It's, it's almost like they think you're so stupid. You're gonna tell them oh, yeah, it's right over there by that tree.



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Well, you know, and it's also the fact of a lot of a lot of people don't realize that. You know, even though it's been pulled out of the ground, smelted and turned into ink it fits under the ground, gold There's still just an element. Doesn't matter if it's been in good ties or not. If it's under the ground, you may not own the mineral rights to it. That's true. Now there are treasure to get up all day long, but the government can absolutely come and take it and go, sorry, you don't own the mineral rights. And that is a rare earth mineral we're taking from you. You



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can file a treasure trove claim. And but if you do that, what are you doing? You're alerting the government? Yeah. You're wanting your what you think is? That's what happened to us in the air. Yeah. Yeah. And Doc nos darkness out in New Mexico Victorio Peak, it was estimated 300 It was estimated \$3 billion in gold. Back in the 1940s. It was illegal for Americans to own gold at the time. But the way the UK goes about it, if you find something a hoard of gold, or whatever, any kind of treasure, they get three estimates from different museums and experts, and they average it out. And that's they pay you cash. That way the museum gets the artifact, or the you know, the government, they get the artifact, it ends up in a museum and you've got cash. So that, to me, is a lot nicer way to deal with it than just taking it from well, and



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that's just it. You know, they're they're a it's hard. It's hard. Yes, you do have a map, like you said, the consequences of digging are totally different thing. You know, and even getting involved with digging is a totally different thing. And even even trying to go and secure permits, puts you on the radar of people who may come find you at an archive and be like, Hey, man, I don't know if you want to get into this. Like we were we were one that pop up. Yeah.

If you know, if so, if I'm sure, you're, you know, if any large amount of money goes into my bank account, there's a red flag, I'm sure they're gonna research it.

Well, well, and you know, also just people in people in offices that dole out permits, looking for it, things like that, you know, those those things pop up and treasure hunters with deep, deep pockets and people like that, who called them up and say, hey, somebody was looking. Hey, you know, somebody else is interested in in what you were looking at. Yeah, you're exactly right. So, man, thanks so much for coming on.
