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But but that kind of springboards us into the conversation tonight, which is which is belief, pastor, and it can it can, it can be hard sometimes because you know, especially over the last many years, the last decade in our country, politically, belief has driven a wedge whether whether you're talking political belief, or whether you're talking religious belief and where you live politically because of that. It's gotten to a point where people literally don't have holiday like we have Easter this weekend. You know, I've got my family reunion. I'm sure many people whether many others around the country do too and I'm sure many others won't be getting together for their family Easter egg roll or what have you because of what somebody believes. Yeah,

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it's It's It's Yeah, well remember, we were going through this too, you know, imagining people at Thanksgiving getting together their family. And yeah, I want to bring up politics. Or maybe you do want to bring up politics. It's a tough thing. I have a half sister, who is evangelical. And we love each other bunches, we love each other to death. But there are certain subjects we won't go to. And in his we're not going to talk about UFOs. We're not going to talk about that we're not going to talk about psychic ability of which she has in bunches. You know, she doesn't like that word. You know, she's a prophetess. Or, you know, you got to say it the right way. You did the thing about belief is it's about your experiences, you've heard people say, I don't know there's a God, I don't believe there's a God anymore. I know there's a God. And you ask them why. And they may say, well, because I've experienced this, that and the other. And see, that's the key. It's your experience. And and we're still we still live in a time, that's taboo. If your experience doesn't fall into the box that we that we have set for you, then it's not valid. And I'm speaking specifically of religion here, but we find it in politics, and what have you, once you and you being a seminarian? Once you once you say, once you come to the belief, the perspective that we live in a populated universe, that we are not alone. Once you accept that as reality, then your whole perspective of God has to change of why we're here. What's the meaning of life? It has to change. And we all know that that's one thing that people find it very, very difficult to do. When those sacred cows are being challenged. And I don't know the answer, you can do what I do. You know, it's like an unspoken truths. We just agree to disagree. So we won't go there. I think that's the most healthy thing, if you if you've tried it before, and it gets to be heated, or if you really evolved. And sometimes I'm good. I'm good at this. You have to give up being right. You have to give I don't I don't need to be right on this. Absolutely. There's some headway that can be made. But and now we see it in our political life. We see it in our religious life. We see it in our economic life. We see it in foreign policy. It's, it's gonna it's the challenge of the 21st century. And it's global. You know, what is what is truth? What is real? Who gets to decide? Well,

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and that is a huge, huge part of things, you know, is what what is real? What is I mean, that that's something that we get into on this show all the time is by all ninth grade science, man,

we are not real weird, 90% empty space. So like, wouldn't you did just start breaking that down and then get into the thing get into your religious belief? You know, like, right, because,

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well, but but but l'm talking about and you're correct. I'm, I'm just saying that that's heavy, what you're talking about too, but I'm just saying, Can we agree that okay, there are some things that were wrong to do to an individual 5000 years ago, and there'll be wrong 5000 years from now. Yeah, so but now it's situational ethics is relative. You know, we don't have to Jesus, yeah, I believe in Jesus. Jesus is my Savior. But I believe in this over a year. You know what I mean? Yeah, well, that's Christianity those teachings, but it's so if they don't fit my, if they make it uncomfortable for me, or inconvenient, then all of a sudden they're not true. Or it's relative. It's relative. And so any any society that can agree on basic truths will collapse. Yeah. Any society and Do I sometimes think this is where we are? Now? What what's what's news? What is fake news? Obviously AI plays a part in this, but but it's just that we cannot agree anymore even to disagree. Or pardon me, what is real? Does two plus Tuesday still equal four? Well,

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and you know, that that is that is where a lot of issues start is what what, what can we agree on what what common ground can we find it especially when it becomes a the fact of common belief and the want of common belief, the wants of commonality and acceptance, that that want of confirmation of what you believe, you know, and when you marry that with, well, just straight up cognitive dissonance, and the idea of well, this goes against what I believe, and despite all evidence to it being true, I will accept it as false. And, and that makes it hard because at that point, you know, and I mean, that was that was a part, I say it regularly on the show that that was a big part of me kind of stepping away. And following my spiritual path instead of my religious paths path at church was, you know, coming to somebody with evidence of the spectrum. And being told, yeah, we don't have a teaching on that. That doesn't exist. Yeah. And it's like, but But you asked me to believe in the spectrum without evidence. Yes. You asked me to accept on faith. Exactly. And that was a hard leap of logic for me. Well, because

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you know, you come to a point, yeah. Where you don't have to have faith, you can know. You can know, the thing, but remembered to know is subjective. Yes, I could say when I hear people saying they believe that there's, there's life in outer space, who, you know, you know, I, you know, I don't come out and say, Oh, come on, I know, as if I'm an authority. But I will say, you know, I don't even start from that point of departure anymore. Whether I'm lecturing, whether I'm doing a conference, I just come out with the point of departure. Remember that all seminary talk? Is that, that we live in a populated universe. Right? That's it. That's where I'm at. That's my jumping off. Now, someone may say to me, they don't believe in God. And I can say, okay, because I respect that. i But to me, I know, there's something greater than me and I use that word, why we'll use the word about explain what it means. But I'd be why because I've experienced. Yeah.

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At least what you what you believe to be God. Yes, exactly.

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Yeah. And that's got to be okay. That's right. That's right. Well, God put it in many places, whether we're talking about UFOs and belief, and religion, or whether we're talking about anything, it's it's if it's not in our society, the measure of faith, it has to be you have to recite the party line. And heaven help you if you believe in UFO, the mode when I get people coming to me, I'm sure with you as well, with the religious background and training, can I still be a Christian? And believe in a populated universe? Can I still believe be Jewish simply? And I say, of course you can. But and I don't. I mean, that's the end of the sentence. But you're gonna have to get some flack. Because, yeah, obedience is measured, measured. Righteousness is measured. Faith is measured by you parenting, the party line. Yeah. And it's like, it's the greatest peer pressure you can ever have. Because you and I both know people who are in positions of authority. They could be religious, they could be even political or what have you. But if they come out and say, they believe in extraterrestrials, their tenure will be taken. They will lose their jobs. And I say that because I don't want to be so judgy because I know people who know, but I get it. They're not outline. Intentionally, they just have to say everything I've worked for, I will throw away and I don't want to do that.

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You Yeah, because that means everything attached to it gets thrown away. That means everybody else's good work attached to it gets thrown away, things like that. You You have to be willing to admit that and you have to be willing to take that on shoulders, you know, and realize that and and you know, here's the thing. Yes, a lot of that I will say, even even when it comes to research, it's one of those you got to double, triple quadruple check. You know, I mean, they it was double, double, triple checked before we figured out that no, the guy with the room temperature Semiconductor was in a room, similar temperature semiconductor. But it took a few people and a few people trying to replicate and a few people going through and looking at math and going I don't know, man, this like this pretty close, is pretty close. And,

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yeah, and so belief, belief and experience are two different things. Yeah. They're two different things. And, and so sometimes they never meet, and sometimes they can, ideally they can, because that's what religious faith is about. I think that I, you know, Dr. King said, faith is taking the first step when you don't see the rest of the staircase. And I like that, of course, what Paul talks about in Corinthians, but faith is you can move beyond faith to I know, when I was I just finished reading a book on Plato. And they were talking about Socrates, obviously, you have to, and that Plato, Socrates that said, you guys go to live and I go to die, whatever is best. I don't know. Yeah. But the way that the serenity that Socrates had, of course, he had his moral compass, and his integrity and what have you, but he didn't believe that he would live on. He knew it. Yeah.

You know, and once once you start getting to the points of manifestation, once you start getting good points of you know, even Gestalt therapy, where, which which is very, which is very much NLP, you know, whenever, whenever you start looking at the modern practice of neuro linguistic programming. Okay, let's go back. Let's find a trauma recognizing you. You see it now backup from it? Has it gone yet? Okay. Yeah. Recognize it again.

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We're not taught that. Yes. We're not taught that it is. I mean, for me, it was the saving grace was, like you, I appreciate the life of the mind. Love it. But I also was using it to not feel the pain I was feeling. Yeah, you know, I was hiding behind the intellect not consciously. And that, you know, Gestalt, Gestalt therapy, addresses that. It's a whole body mind spirit kind of modality. And I opened me up I got rid of, you know, the language they use. You get rid of the armor, the body armor, so you can start feeling things. Yep. That you didn't know were there. So that that's I'm a proponent of if you can get a good therapist or counselor. You can add years of happiness to your life. But again, getting back to belief and experience I don't want to make it versus the experience.

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No, no, absolutely not.

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Yet. Yeah, it just it just makes all the difference in the world what? What is the paradox is it's like. Listen, if we look at religion, religion wants you to experience God. But if you don't

experience the way the playbook says yes, yeah. And you are punished

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for that. Yeah. If it's not within the if it's not within the Kleenex box, yeah,

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God, and that's what's scary. And it's been scary throughout history. Yeah. What are you talking about? You know, the man we call Jesus when you're talking about Siddhartha, whether you're talking about Joan of Arc? Well, you know, yeah, yeah. If it doesn't fit this box, then the very thing we want you to experience. We will turn on you.

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Yeah, yeah. And some in a, you know, these experiences run deep these experiences are things that are frequently traumatic for people. You know, most of the books behind me Do not start off like a John Denver song. They start off like a Disney movie. Like, somebody dies, like horrible things happen to somebody at their things are redeemed by the end of it, and there's a happy song. But yeah, but yeah, yeah, they typically don't start off well for somebody involved

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in the book. And because it's what and this is for the atheist, the agnostic, those who don't know, and don't care, and even for the religious. Yeah, what we're talking about is the hero's journey. What we're talking about is this hero's journey. And so for people who you look at the Jesus story, which many of us will be looking at the Sunday, men tomorrow night, and Monday, Thursday. And you know, tomorrow night and Bible study, it's the hero's journey, it's you know, you come into the world, and the world has molded you are telling you what it's like to be a man what it's like to be a woman. And you take that on, what is it you're supposed to believe? What's fake news and what isn't? And you take that on, and then an event happens. And you start to question all that. And you start realizing that you are not what you were told you are by your parents, by your society, and whatever, and something wakes you up and snaps you out of that. And so then this this rebirth, it's this caterpillar becoming the butterfly, right? It's this metamorphosis, and then you become who you truly are. That is the hero's journey. And it's an all I don't care whether you're talking about Muhammad, I don't care whether you're talking about Jesus, and we're all called for it to beat to walk that journey. It's the story

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of Luke Skywalker man. Exactly. Like it's like, that's why Joseph Campbell called it the hero's journey is because when you start looking at journey, heroic, Hercules Hara, cleis, they got all of them, Gilgamesh doesn't matter. All of these people followed the same arc of a journey. And

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they went from belief. Yeah, at some point to knowing. Yep. Yep. You know, and, and he also had to shed the beliefs that they were told to have. Yes. Okay, so that could be UFOs. It could be nd ease. You know, it could be anything. And so that's, that's where the rubber hits the road. Yep. And we can get away with all the dogma and the doctrines but when you get a clearer way, the fat and spit out the bones. Religion is trying to make sense of life to try and make sense of death. But but in between, you know, what's the old thing about the dash is, you know, on your tombstone? Michael Carter born 1957 Dash, maybe it's, you know, 2054 or whatever. Like, it's not about the 5720 34 it's about the dash.

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Yeah, it's about the dash in between them. Yes. And what you did your life well in the you know, even even the idea of a fourth degree now to Columbus, I'll tell everybody a little secret about the NADA Columbus momenta tempus fugit momento Mori. Frequently on old old crucifixes, things like that. You will you'll see a small skull and crossbones on the bottom. That is a fourth degree Knights of Columbus cross. That is the skull and crossbones. Owens have of course, you know, John the Baptist. But along with that goes the Latin phrase, tempus fugit, memento mori. Time flies remember death? Yeah. And that does that doesn't mean be morbid. What that means is, remember that the only thing you're going to be remembered for? Is your time here. Yeah. And what you did? So how will you be remembered? How will your family's name be remembered? How is how will your legacy be seen by your children? Those are the things that you need to always have on your mind. Because yeah, you never know the day or the hour,

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right? And death gives life and urgency I'm going to be talking about that Sunday. I mean, you know, it's not going to be morbid, and we're going to go into life. But but death gives life and urgency, knowing that you're not gonna be here forever, gives an urgency to life, that whatever Mark I want to make, I need to be doing it. Yeah. And as you get older, I need to be doing it now. And so but that's what we're here to do. And you're here to do it, whether you've had a UFO experience, whether you've had an ND E, whether you've had an OBE, all those things are good things to have along the way. But they're not the way. Those are things that happen to you along the way. But But life is to be lived. And it's easy to lose sight of that as you and I've talked about before, with all the distractions, the lunar eclipse, the Mercury Retrograde when I say no things aren't important, they're

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there, they are there. And they absolutely influence things. 110%. Yeah, look at how they are.

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Vanh you have to navigate it. And you can get equality and all that that you miss the day

And if life and God or for you, or if you prefer life or God. Of what should you be afraid? Yeah, who can be against you at that point? Yeah. Of whom? Or what? Should you be afraid? Yeah. Yeah.

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And, you know, once again, these experiences in sometimes, you know, even even religious experiences. Reverend, I've told my story to you privately and on the show of my religious experiences. And the first time that happened, I I don't I don't know that I was I would definitely had wandering off. I was definitely the old school concept of fear of the Lord. Yeah, Connolly was there where it was like,

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I'm tremendum. Well, well, and you're in German. Yeah,

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yeah. And it's the idea of this is so much bigger than me. You know, like, they like literally the first time you step up to the edge of like, the Grand Canyon or something like that. And you, you get the 270 view of it. And you're like, Whoa, like the bottom just kind of falls out of you. And that was the first time that I felt that married with this sensation of I love you, honey, I love you so much. I'd love to say that that bliss is there all the time. It's not. And I can't even say that I've romantically felt it with somebody that I love or have loved. You know, it was a it was a form of bliss, and happiness and completeness and oneness that I don't I mean, I've strived for ever since.

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You know, I read a lot of the Catholic mystics and the Catholic saints and they had that kind of love they, you know, they were beloved they God was their lover. I mean, they had a whole other thing going on man. Hill God, Padre Pio, Allah. Yes. You know, and that was a special thing for them. Yeah. Not everybody is supposed to have that kind of experience or wants to or needs to, but for them, it was the oneness. Yes. And so God was To the beloved. I don't want to please anybody. But you. I just want to be you used the word married a couple of times. Today, you know, so a marriage between my belief, my knowing and that of my Creator, who was that Augustine said that we're wrestlers. I'm paraphrasing until we find or when I rest in you, yeah. And so but they were heavy heavy hitters advanced. I don't know their stuff going on. But that is, you know, you, you wouldn't say to Augustine believed and God, you would say Agustin knew. Yeah, Padre Pio knew. And

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granted though, and granted that that's just Augustine is one of those that lived such a life before his Yes. Before his transition me chase, but not yet the you know? Yeah. Oh, no, no, I confessions of St. Augustine as a personal. I mean, I probably shouldn't have tried to live the book so much. But But quite literally, you know, when when you live such a life that before you convert, like, your mom becomes a saint because of your conversion.

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He was a rascal, but you gotta love him. His hero's journey it is it's the hero's journey. It's going through the illusions, everything he wanted. The sex, the wine, the living, it was all fleeting. And you hear that in Buddhism, you hear that? And all the contemplative orders, whether they're Buddhists or Christian, or Muslim or whatever, you know, I'm wanting to hold on to what's real. I don't want to get so sidetrack into what's a loser. illusionary? And then because I know, not because I believe I may started out believing Yeah, but now. Oh, well, and I, you know, I think that's what the UFO phenomenon. I think it's near death phenomenon out of a menu of metaphysics. Yeah, I think it's about justice. You know, I wrote I wrote a couple sermons about justice. And there's a there's a, you know, you can use it. But Theodore Parker, a 19th century, Unitarian. Universalist Christian said that, the more the arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends towards justice. That's a knowing that's an I may not even live this. But I know in the end, justice will be served. Yeah,

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yeah. I actually just the other day watched the movie. exorcist three. I love that movie. And one of the one of the lines between the the detective and the priest is, you know, it all works out in the end. He's like, when's that? The End of Time? Oh, that soon? You know? And yeah, you know, there there is that idea that, yes, stoically, it will, it will all level out, you know, all boats get ballasted with the same water in the air. And, yeah, and there is that.

That's the long view. Because you got to know I may not be here to see it. But I know, I know that life will work out in the end will assure because

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at the otherwise you can get you can get mired in a never ending Coriolis effect of of being drawn into horrible, horrible things, you know, and that's just it, though, is that both both with religious experience as well as paranormal experience, you do have that that pull of separation of where either people don't want to talk about it. Or when they do talk about it, they they are ridiculed by people and both ways can lead either people to great things, or to horrible things like addiction, and wanting to not share their story anymore. Wanting to not share their experience wanting to no longer feel their experience. Yeah,

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yeah, yeah, you're right. I, you know, I think, you know, I meet people who have had these experiences, and they're being told that it's the devil, that is Germans. And so they shut down. And they repress, which is not good for your mental health. And, you know, and but they I try to say, and it's not just me, there are other people who do this, and then not all clergy. But you have to find a place where you can be you where you're not going to be judged, that you used to be able to go to be able to go to church and do that, but those days Girl. Yeah. Why shouldn't be so harsh? But it's hard to find that, yeah. You know, a support group or it could be 12 steps. You know, I'm jumping around and have to be NDAs. It could be, but there's something healing to be around people to see another human face. That empathizes that that in and of itself is healing. Okay? That in and of itself enhances your belief, your belief in what you believe in human beings, you believe in humanity, that there are good people out there, that there are people out there who are listening. And people why I experienced it, I would do a 12 step program for codependency. And that, you know, 12 steps are powerful for sex addiction for shopping for whatever, yep, those it's and it's a spiritual journey. But I gotta tell you to be not judge. I mean, you sit around, and you tell people, some of the most some of the most embarrassing and worse things that you've done, or that have happened to you, most people run the other way. People come up to you say here, here's my number, give me a call. Yeah. I just told you that. And you, you know, but that in itself is healing, and then restores your belief, and human beings and humankind. Why? Because people can talk about wars and rumors of wars and whatever. And you can say, but you know, everybody's not like that. Because I remember so and so. And I had that experience. And so you've gone beyond belief. Yeah, you've gone to experience. Yeah.

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Yeah. And once again, those, those experiences, much like belief can change your entire world, they can change your entire worldview. And, and it's interesting to me how experiencers frequently tend to experience other things. After they've had one experience, specifically people who have been on craft then been on board craft been abducted, taken, things like that. And one of one of the concepts that I think kind of exploring, Michael, is the idea of that, what if that what if that trauma, that even that perceived trauma, you know, because because frequently somebody will say, like, they were telling me telepathically that they weren't here to hurt me, but it really, really seemed like, like they were, you know, they didn't, but I kept getting this feeling. And I wonder sometimes, if that traumatic situation isn't, isn't like the shattering of the matrix in and like the pulling of the matrix, the crystal out of the hard rock matrix, and the idea of with some with some minds, without that traumatic issue, there may not be the spiritual reset.

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I can I can attest to that. I can say for myself, who certainly was. And you know, that that fear of just the bizarreness of where they looked and just the whole scenario, and you know, over time, my nervous system was kind of shot. But I had to put together the pieces of what I thought was real. And how I fit into that. What about my beliefs and something a creator or creation, all that I had to? It was it was like an initially it was a bootcamp where I had to it took away my false self, and it made me have to rebuild. Yeah. And it was trauma. And it was fear.

And I still have a little bit of that. When I'm home alone, sure, talk about that yet, but at night, but I wouldn't trade it. But like you. I was talking to someone last night. So it's interesting that you brought this up, Chris. They called it traumatic growth. Yep. Okay. Yeah. And I never really heard that term. But I think it's obvious what it means that, you know, there was some type of evolution and transformation that came through the trauma. That's what makes those incidences though. Is events so powerful again, but you know, the nd e the, we have the divorce, the death of a loved one yet the cancer diagnosis that you get those type of things, you're open to it. It can lead to doorway that can lead you to embrace yourself a larger reality. And, and and it can lead to transformation

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without stress on the plant. Fruits don't grow. They don't they have plants only fruit because of the stress on the plant. That's the only reason it happens. The only reason a Strengths stock on a flower strengthens is because it's been battered by the wind.

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know, I do believe that we can grow through joy. Oh, sure. But it seems like we, we tend to want to go the other way. Well, we got to go that way in order to get to get the message. A lot

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of that I think, Michael is the fact of you know, our brains for millennia, have been wired to learn faster from fire is hot than fast than fire will cook my food. Yeah, make it savory. You know, we didn't need fire to necessarily cook berries, we need to fire to keep us warm at night. You know, it was it was for survival or brains, even even eye contact. And the reason why we have eye contact and things like that evolved out of a non threat capacity out of out of I am here to disarm you right now and show you I'm disarmed. You know, it came from a point of survival to risk being vulnerable? Well, it did. Yeah, precisely. And the idea that, you know, our brains are wired to learn more from negative feedback than positive feedback, you'll you'll learn a whole lot faster from from a negative situation than a positive or not that a positive one doesn't make you feel great. But there's also a reason why, you know, negative words by somebody that you love about the exact same situation mean 10 times more and hurt 10 times more than words of encouragement with the exact same or LOD of the same situation. You know,

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yeah, that's true. That's true. Because when you don't care about somebody, you don't care what they say. Yeah. Yeah, you don't take him serious. Okay. Well, you know, that's just Michael, who cares? Yeah,

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yeah. And, you know, there's even that point of getting to the point of being mentally healthy enough to not care what other people think. And that's why you're able to tell your story.

But on the other hand, if you're a shareholder of pharmaceutical companies, you definitely would protect your own interest and a lot of the LED light therapies or color therapies are just, it's gonna cost like \$20 or \$30 to buy a light like that.
