Well, hello everybody. How are you doing this evening? Chris Jordan, here coming at you live from Austin, Texas. Hope everybody has had a great week so far. Happy World UFO day. Everybody, you gotta love the fact that there is a day around the world actively dedicated to UFOs, UAPs. Say what you want. Everybody. I am a fan of the term UAP I think it has actively brought science into the world of this investigation unashamedly and unabashedly now. So that's where I stand on it. Our guests tonight, in the first segment, we will be talking with Dr Simeon Hine. He is the author of such books as dark matter monsters, cryptids, ball lightning and the science of secret life forms. He is also the founder of the Institute for resonance. He also has the website Black Swan ghosts, as well as the book Black Swan ghosts. We'll talk about some black swan event concepts tonight, specifically tonight, we will be talking about Dr Simeons work into the world of crop circles. So welcome to the show. Yeah, no. Thanks. Thanks for having me. How did I get into the area cross circles? Is that the question? Yes, sir, it's a very good question. It came through a remote viewing which I'm sure your audience is familiar with. I took a class back in the 90s at the Farsight Institute, and one of the targets that we got towards the end of the week. It was an eight day class. You know, this ability we have to perceive non local information with a good degree of accuracy, sometimes very good accuracy. So I just got curious. I had never, you know, I had exist. A couple years out of grad school, I had been an assistant professor teaching statistics, I didn't know what a crop circle was. Remote viewing at the time, for me, was a stretch enough. And to see one of these pictures, I got curious. You want your feedback when you do remote viewing? Yeah. And I wanted to get some feedback. What was this? This was the triple Julia set from windmill Hill. That's what the target was. So, you know, you get, you do the session blind, then you see the picture at the end. I was curious about these workers, so I went with a guy named Ron Russell from the Denver area on a crop circle tour. I had met him at a UFO conference in in the Denver area. I mean, I got curious about UFOs, too after taking remote viewing. And he said, You know, I give these tours. We can walk around in them, go over to UK, see what happens. So I thought this would be a good way to get feedback on my session. We chatted a lot of strange aspects to it, in terms of the energy, the feeling of the target. It was different that you would get from like the Eiffel Tower or Washington Monument. It was a different type of energy, sure what you get in remote viewing. So I went with Ron, and I immediately encountered people that told me they were getting weird phenomena in and around these crop circles. We didn't have any idea. Idea how they were made back then. But, you know, talking to people from who were there once we got there, there were really odd things happening, people's cameras and batteries, not to mention seeing orbs. Yeah, ball lightning, things around crop circles and even occasional UFO. So I could see for myself that the people, even though I was new to the subject of people

around the phenomena, were very enthusiastic about it. So, yes, I wrote that book. I went there, researched it, and it became opening minds, which is about resonance in crop circles and remote viewing. The thing that really, I guess, sucked me into the topic was seeing our own cameras and batteries fail in and around crop circles, even a case at the dangbury triad of formation near Andover the first couple weeks I was there. I mean, first week or so was seeing Ron's camcorder have a mountain, actually a malfunction that led it to melt on the inside. Oh, wow. Power supply, while it was not filming, just sitting in the crop it melted. And I thought there's got to be something going on here with this, these patterns and energy. So that's how I got involved. It has seen evidence for myself that there was something about the space around crop circles that affected electronics and created orbs and space time distortions, you know, just sort of odd phenomena that we see around power, normal places, for lack of a better word, yeah. And that's how I got involved. Wow.

And it's remarkable that you got involved with that through remote viewing. Um, that that is that that is where that study led you. I might know, and yes, my audience is very familiar with the fact of the concept of a remote viewing we've had limb Buchanan on a few times. I normally go and cover the remote viewing conference. Every year, I myself take remote viewing classes with limb Buchanan. And it's, it's pretty remarkable. And I know, last time we had you on, we talked a little bit about the idea of quantum entanglement and how, how that really lays a great foundation for actual quantifiable proof, rather than statistical proof that's out there. And hit and miss catalogs things like that, and and with databases, a lot of people don't understand that there are a with traditional remote viewing, numerous protocols involved, including having a monitor like you were saying, getting your feedback on a session is very important from a monitor, things like that, right,

right? It's it's very important to get your feedback. And there are other quantum principles beyond entanglement that come into play here. One of them is called the Iran of foam effect, where you can have zero electromagnetic field radiating from an object or an area, but you're still going to get communication at a distance, kind of like what remote viewing is. And this was discovered in the 50s and and verified in ages six in Japan, and it's basically the way a particle can become correlated with another group of particles with zero electromagnetic interaction, only through this phantom property of what's called vector potential. It's just, it's just pure numbers that make quantum mechanics work. And if those numbers say that there's interaction going on, you will get this, this communication going up. And it turns out that Hal put off, who ran the RV program at SRI for the government with restart when he left the program, when he left the RV program and turned it over to Ed May, I believe, in the late 80s, he went on To get patents in the Iran Hong effect for communication, which I think indicates to us that there's something for someone who's spent more than a decade studying remote viewing to come out of it and go straight into an application of the Iran hug bomb effect, I think, shows us something. Yeah, that's going on there. But so it's not. Literally entanglement. In my view, it's not the particles, because entangled particles, in theory, don't exchange information. It's sort of like a statistical correlation, but the arama effect does. So I'm leaning more towards

the AB effect. And the types of things associated with the AB effect are things called fractal, magnetic toroidal moments are these types of electromagnetic configurations that are not typical, that are not direct, but lead to non local, distant interaction,

interesting. Now, especially whenever you're talking toroidal fields, things like that. That's specifically some of the things that have been hypothesized for years as possible sources of crop circles.

Well, there's a lot of overlap here. Chris, I mean, I think we need to accept, at the end of the day, all the phenomena that a lot of us have been interested in over the years. You cannot escape the commonalities between the types of symptoms you see around these phenomena that we call power, normal or psychic or psi related, yeah and the donut shaped magnetic moments, in contrast to these ordinary, 90 degree electrical magnetic configurations that Maxwell explored and showed us in Maxwell's equations, which are just standard, ordinary electromagnetic interactions. When you begin to push those relationships between electricity and magnetism beyond a certain angle, you end up with other forms of electromagnetic phenomena, some of which don't radiate anymore in any conventional way, but still create long distance interactions and create something called magnetic monopoles and exotic materials that even create magnetization of non magnetic materials. You're in a whole different realm. Yeah, I don't call it paranormal in physics, but that's what we ended up calling it, for those of us who've experienced it or studied these topics, yeah, but I don't think you can escape the conclusion that this is all the same thing. We're talking about another type of electromagnetic space that's in the same space you and I are in right now, and it's working differently than our computer and electrical technology, which is based on Maxwell's equations and 90 degree angles and all that ordinary stuff. It's predictable and it works, and we're able to communicate right now like we aren't communicate out to our audience and so forth. This is a whole, not another range of phenomena with inverse properties like negative temperatures and the ability to cool an environment when they rev up the opposite of our electronics, which tends to heat things right? Yeah, it's all the attack opposite and to have this non local, distant interaction, yeah. Uh, even ability to cloak, to become invisible, to form orbs and ball lightning, yeah, micro bowling. This is what you see across all these phenomena, whether it's crop circles, Bigfoot or UFOs. And I think it's our, maybe our modern professional egos that just want these topics to be separate, because the conferences are, you know, they're about or they're about into all the UFOs crop circles. But why do you get the same phenomena happening in all of these phenomena, unless there's some fundamental underlying reasons, which I think are these exotic quantum principles. Yes, that had not been explored very much. And, you know, you listen to people talk about being around where a Bigfoot was, and they say that it was their hair stood on end like it was static charge, yep, just in the area where the Bigfoot had been standing. And then they feel a little nauseous or a weird and they're trying to understand why. It's because the physical space had its properties changed by being around such a life form. In the same way that the crop circle, regardless of who made it, whether you and I went out and made it in my view, or a UFO left it with propulsions of something about that shape is Bill Tiller, who spoke at the Urban conferences a number of times. Called it a conditioned space. Yep, it has a different resonance than ordinary space. Yeah, and it operates kind of in an inverse way.

But we can see these symptoms over and over again. Then you get the orbs, then you notice your battery. These are draining. It's always the same thing every time you even read UFO reports from nicat from the 60s, 70s, strange effects around UFO. Same thing. People said they're Radio One of the Fritz. Car engine stopped working. Yeah, I interviewed a lot of Bigfoot voices. They said their car stalled right around the Bigfoot. I mean, I don't think it's a separate phenomenon. It's there's too many similar things going on. What we're dealing with is another type of space. Call it a parallel reality, but it overlaps with ours. And we call it paranormal, because we can't totally go where it is. We just see some of the overlap. That's my view of it. Yeah, no,

no, absolutely. And I mean quite literally, we, this is a regular topic of conversation on the show Simeon. Is the idea that vibration specifically, specifically the range in which our eyes can see, that very locked in range, there's, there's a whole world slightly adjacent to us, that that is gamma waves, all kinds of things like you know you you have to have almost imperceptible detectors to detect them, however much, much like an analog watch is changed whenever you get it near a magnet. Somehow or another, people are changed. And I've held for a long time, and whenever I've spoken at conferences, I hold the fact that people, specifically people who have been in close contact with UFO, UAP, people who have been taken aboard craft, you are in something that is able to warp space and time and vibrate between vibrational fields like I've played with some Tesla power and stuff in my home studio. My wife made me stop when my radio clock started looking like the predator language. But I got to a point where copper was magnetic, and and that's some pretty high order RF field, you know, like when you're talking about people like Hutchison, who was able to make metals basically become liquid, things like that, achieve, achieve levitation of pretty heavy objects in his in his home Garage, you know? And this was decades ago, yes, um, so, there, there. But like you said, that that changes that atmosphere. It's no different than turning on uh tesla coil for 10 minutes and then walking in the room it smells like ozone. It changes the atmosphere around it. The whole field does,

right? That's right. I was just at a conference a couple weekends ago called The cosmic summit in Greensboro, North Carolina, organized by Randall Carson, the kind of historian, archeologist he looks Asian societies what sort of technology they had. And Bob greener from the Martin platter Memorial Project was presenting there, and he brought along these Tesla metal samples so I could actually hold them. Everyone could pass them around and look at them. And these Twisted Metal samples that look like they've been liquefied. But it was done at room temperature, just with electricity, yeah, and not enough electricity to, like, totally destroy something. It's just going in and creating some sort of coherency in the atomic structure where there is this sort of the ordinary bonds that create and maintain the elements, chemical elements we know about, they change into something else, very briefly, and in that moment, they completely release their ordinary electron configurations and melt at room temperature. This is sort of one of the phenomena we see happening in these contexts is materials liquefying at room temperature, And that is very powerful.

And one of my students, who was a brain surgeon, took me to see this guy who could do PK. What we're talking about, Chris is something called PK, yeah, right, yeah. And it's, it's the ability to influence materials that you would normally think would require huge amounts of energy, but certain humans that have this training, Nina khalina in Soviet Union, was able to do this, and their videos of her on YouTube doing this in front of lots of scientists Back in Soviet Union was around their project this coherent energy that literally takes matter apart, it strips it apart and then lets it reassemble. I saw this with my eyes in Japan. This guy could twist coke bottles into spirals. In French, ordinary glass cobalt like they would temporarily become a liquid, and it wasn't hot. When he was done, we could touch it. It wasn't heated. It wasn't doing it through heat. It was doing it through some sort of coherent energy transfer that changes the structure of the atoms that they're not found into their charge configurations like they normally are. And I think that's part of the secret here, Chris is what holds everything together as we know what are charges. And if you neutralize those charges, even for a millisecond, the atoms don't know where they are anymore. They're not they're not oriented the way they were across these huge metal lattices at a subatomic level, and they instantly change. And I think this is why we don't

know very much about this. It has a lot of military applications. You're talking about melting materials with very low amounts of energy. Yeah, I can't, you know that has national security implications, which I by my opinion, I don't I think this is why we haven't heard very much about this, is everyone who's gone in this direction has had their programs, their experiment, sucked into black budget, yeah, operations, because it has a lot of implications, but it's a real

metal. Also we bent spoons. He could levitate objects, just like Hudson. He could levitate it over his palm. He didn't need any electrical sources. Body was the source. This is what we're talking about in terms of the fundamentals of what we call paranormal phenomena.

well, what it's like to me, Chris, is that if you had the proper shape of a crop circle, and not just ones made by plasmas or ball lagging or UFOs, those are some of the sources in the past of crop circles, but even human made ones, if you got the mathematical ratios correct the spiral shape of the way the wheat is sort of spiraling around the center of the crop circle. Sure, it seemed that if you got it very precisely constructed, it would be electronically active for a period of time, maybe a couple days, and that it would literally affect cameras and watches and batteries and even create occasional space time distortions, people going in these circles, feeling like they also were thrust back into the past, another time period, encountering people speaking in different type of English and from the past or in different clothes. didn't think people could make these really big ones. And there were people that came to the conferences that were circle makers, that were just curious about the state of knowledge of drop circles. And they saw Ron and myself, and they thought we were approachable, and they offered to show us how they made theirs at first in the daytime and then at night, the ones in the daytime were for like advertisements and things, but the ones at night, they would just pick a field that they felt had good Feng Shui or something and go place very carefully, place a pattern. And they convinced me that humans, with practice, could make really good big ones. Yeah. But the surprising thing was that they had electrical activity that we could measure with our static meter, and that would affect our equipment and so forth. No, and so I didn't believe this, but if they showed me that human made ones could be electrically active, that

is very interesting, because one of the things I bring up regularly is especially when it comes to paranormal investigation, things like that. And preparing for paranormal investigation is when you're preparing your equipment that you should try to be as blank slate as possible. You know, don't, don't think about the location you're going to rumors you've heard about it, stories you've heard about it. Don't watch any documentaries about it, you know, things like that, because you may actively be charging the environment itself with your intent,

right there, they're definitely, they're creating an interaction with those shapes in FIS the material science, it's called helicity, which means that there's a directionality the way the wheat stocks are spiraling, left, right, yeah. And there's a top concept called anisotropy, which, again, is that everything is facing the same direction. I mean, it gives liquid crystals their ability to create all the cool things that liquid crystals do, like our computer screens. Yeah, yeah. And that's because they're all lined up one way or another, and they create reveal colors behind on the screen, or however the particular screen you know you have works. It has to do with these crystals all changing directions, like little soldiers in precise ways at the exact right time to create these sort of fixed images, or looking images on our screen with the right colors and the right contrast and so forth. And it seemed to me that what you had in the fields were like liquid crystals made of wheat, because two had that precise directionality in the precise ratio. And some of the ones that seemed more active to me seemed like fractal shapes itself. Similar fractal shapes, circles within circles, sure, more circular formations than square ones had that

activity to them, and the biggest surprise to me was when I started looking into cryptids at Bigfoot to see that people were experiencing the same phenomena around Bigfoot, encrypted with their cameras and watches and devices that we had seen around the crop circle. I mean, what could be a bigger stretch than saying there's a Bigfoot crop circle connection, but there is a daily there is.

What's interesting is that there, there have been numerous, numerous cases over the last probably five years to decade. Doctor, where? Where these worlds of paranormal investigation are beginning to cross paths? Where? Where the the fields of evidence out there? I will say proof, but I will say evidence. I will say that it's, you know, laboratory evidence, things that we can bring forward that there is a growing body of that there to show that there is connection between these phenomenon.

There is, and the reason we don't know more about this is because there's tremendous around these top when people experience it for themselves. Yeah, and it's easy to not talk about it or forget about it, if it just doesn't fit in the mainstream social consensus view of reality that we're taught. So on one hand, people are afraid. And speaking as a sociologist here, there. Afraid of the ostracism and the ridicule and the hostility of being a UFO or Bigfoot experiencer, and it's just easier to forget about it or never talk about it again than to say, Hey, I saw something that's really strange and just and then you got to throw in decades of government disinformation campaigns, yeah, creating their own ridicule and stigma around the topics for whatever reasons the government wanted to do that. Yeah, and you sort of have this dull whammy on either side for witnesses. But yeah, evidence that this is true, you just have to look like someone like Stan Gordon, the researcher from Pennsylvania. You know, I've talked to him a couple times. I've read his book Silent invasion, creepy cryptids and the silent invasion about the Bigfoot UFO connection. Yep, he didn't, he wasn't looking for Bigfoot. He was a UFO, and he answered the phone for the Westinghouse informal UFO club that met after work. Stan Friedman was a part of in Pittsburgh. Oh, wow. And he was the phone boy. He answered the phone starting in 1959 he's been researching this longer than any of us have been alive. 5990 and he said he was looking for UFO reports. And people started reporting Bigfoot in the same areas where the UFOs were seen starting in 1965 two years before the Patterson Gimlin film, the famous somo Patty walking across at Bluff Creek. And so this is someone that's just a really good example of how these phenomena cross. It wasn't looking for it, right? Yeah, you get, why would you get Sasquatch and Bigfoot in the same field as a UFO around the same times are in the same general vicinities and other creepy cryptids, some of them are kind of creepy. Just saying that kind of lightly, but we don't understand what exactly what they are, except that they they're living bipedal creatures. It's hard to say what they are. You know, you wouldn't get them happening around UFOs, unless, again, there's some fundamental underlying principles that involve both of these phenomena. In other words, it suggests to me, Chris, that UFOs are not just spaceships from other planets with little guys and coming here to do some test the plants, or, yeah, do some experiments or something, or duck people or whatever. There's something more to it going on. It's almost like a veil is being lifted, and we're seeing another stage with its own cast of characters. And those characters come in groups. They're not inseparable, they're not separable. They come together because they're part of the same

frequency, like you use that word, they're part of that same general canvas. Yeah, they could appear to be extraterrestrial. Maybe some of them are. But you know, you have to really come up with a good reason why you would get, often people have UFO experiences, and then they get strange experiences around their homes, yep, for a while, yeah. And it's not just that there's a hitchhiker thing following them back from the UFO field. Or there's something more to it

than that, well, and that's where, that's where, like I was saying earlier, that concept of the watch and the magnet that that person themselves is now vibrating at a different frequency. You know, which, which to me, which to me, explains, at least somewhat, you know, phenomenologically, how these experiencers, of these events, end up having other experiences, you know, end up becoming, sometimes a magnet for experience, right? And some people even come back, you know, as fully changed people. Some people come back with wounds being healed, right, illnesses being healed. Some of them come back able to help other people. It's, it's pretty, pretty interesting.

Yeah, no, it's pretty interesting. And it's, you're just mentioning a whole topic in and of itself. It's fascinating. Is the spontaneous healings, yeah, around UFOs and Sasquatch and other phenomena, people felt they were healed. Crops circles, there were cases of people feeling that they were healed, yeah, and cases of people having their cars repaired overnight in areas where Sasquatch were seen on the front lawn and they had some bad accident and the next morning, it's completely fixed up, you know, about 100% but pretty good. Like, how it makes you think of these people that can do PK, like maybe these Sasquatch have some PK ability that they use rarely, and if they really like a certain person, they'll see. Something's off, and they'll fix it. You know, they'll just do their best to fix it with their energy systems, their natural biological system. I mean, this is what the evidence suggests it see. I know it seems hard to believe, but this is what people say they experience. I had a friend, Julie from Alabama, that had one of these experiences. She had had a Sasquatch sighting as a 10 year old in Indiana, Marion, Marion, Indiana, and she saw one of these Sasquatch at the end of the street picking berries. It was white hair. And then she had a UFO experience over the Marion, you know, supermarket saw something hovering there. A number of people did. And years later, she was in need of a pipe wrench in Alabama, and she's deep in the woods, far away from everything, and there's flooding going on, you know, inside her house, she goes outside just to compose herself, to take a couple breaths, and there's the perfect pipe wrench sitting in the driveway, the exact thing she would need at the exact moment. It sounds like a fairy tip, but it happened, and it's happened to many people around the Sasquatch phenomena. It's like they're either listening in or they have another like the way remote viewers can go in and remote view a distant location and see it from a bird's eye view, yeah? And get a feeling what's going on there. It's like the Sasquatch can do that with certain people, for better or for worse, to resonance, you know, yeah. And they're able to take action that is beneficial to you, not to mention healings. There are cases of them, healing people too, just like that. I know these aren't really common. They're kind of rare events, but they have it, and it it demands that we come up with some bigger scientific paradigm than the one we've been dealing with, which isn't really doing a particularly great job. Anyway, I think it's time we moved on to a larger

scientific paradigm. I suggested recently on Twitter X that every university should have a department of paranormal sciences. Absolutely. Why not? You have, you have all these you know, you got the data, you got the cases. It repeats over and over again, rare, but it's the same thing over and over again, decade in, decade out. What are the commonalities here? What does this tell us about physics? Yeah, I think it has something to do with what we call coherent matter, which is like lasers and Bose Einstein cond and say it's masers before lasers that were microwave, yep, amplitude stimulated emission made it was a similar thing with microwave to get with lasers. But we all know what lasers look like. They have that incredible intensity. But if you're looking from the side, unless there's a lot of dust, you don't see them. Yeah, these phenomena seem to be laser focused like that, which suggests that there's some coherency going out between the atoms, between the matter itself is correlated, and it's able to do what seems like magic. It really seems like magic, but it happens, and it happens around UFO sightings, and it can go the other way too. It can create really strange effects. But as you pointed out, it changes people's lives. They sometimes, after experiencing orbs or these phenomena, like orbs, ball lightning. They become a different person. The day family, I mentioned this in Dark Matter monsters, and Andrew Collins wrote about this in his book The New Circle makers. The day family, encountering this blue mist down the road outside of the London suburbs area. And they had missing time. They saw these arms, they encountered beans, and then they all changed over the next couple weeks, they became interested in the environment. They quit smoking. It became different people. So, yeah, it's fascinating. And

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you know, it's even more fascinating whenever you start getting into the messages that experiencers get, the overwhelming feelings that they get that are very similar between experiences the messages that abductees receive seem to be very familiar the messages from indie near death experiencers. It's, it's pretty remarkable when you start and this is, this is what I've said about AI the whole time, is that fields like this, fields of data like this, like being able to take all of the all of the Bigfoot research organization sightings, and feed them into an AI, we would be able to cull data so fast, so fast.
