And our first guest in the show is Mindy topfish. She is the author of dying to meet them. She is Director of Online Education and everything for MUFON and for MUFON University. She is also the curator of the Hayden Hughes archives and the current owner of the International UFO Bureau, founded by Hayden Hughes, welcome back to the show Mindy topfest. How are you doing? Thank you. Thank you. I had the great pleasure of coming up there and hanging out with you. I mean, we, of course, know each other through MUFON and through your book and through your near death experience. But um, while at MUFON, we got to talking about this incredible archive of Hayden Hughes that you had, and the importance of archiving such things. And how did you come to be in possession of this archive to begin with, because it is a vast, vast tome of data. It's huge. It's a massive amount of stuff. So how did you come to be in possession of this to begin with, and come to carry on the the task of the International UFO Bureau, as started by Aiden Hughes, I know it's a big shoes to fill here to be carrying on his name and his legacy, and I had, whenever I first got involved with move on, about a year into it, I became state director of Oklahoma, and I figured, well, I guess I'm the expert here now, so let me go back up and see you know, some of the history of UFO sightings here in Oklahoma. I had read through stuff before, just kind of out of curiosity, but I knew that I really needed to submit my knowledge of past sightings. And when I was doing that, I kept coming across Hayden Hughes, and I was flabbergasted to find out that he had actually been out in Hartshorn, which was the site of the the schoolyard encounter that I investigated a few years back for move on and living here in Oklahoma City, I had never heard of hearts. Or find out that Hayden was actually out there in the 60s and 70s, just blew my mind. This little town only has maybe 2000 people there, and for the amount of sightings that they've had, it's just incredible. So my main goal at that point was to get a hold of Hayden and see if I could collaborate with him and find out more about what he was doing out there and what he was finding in hearts. Well, whenever I went to find his contact info, I found out that he had passed in 2017 and that led me down the path to finding his widow. And funny enough, she lives across the street from me. Wow. So I contacted her, and I said, you know, I would really like to look through Hayden's files, if you still have them, and kind of see what he was doing out in the hearts or region. And she said, Well, honey, I've still got all of his files, and you're welcome to have them, because I think you would know what to do with them. And at the time, I thought, Okay, I'll go through them. I can get them all, you know, put it in order. And I reached out to move on with their initiative, with Project Aquarius, and said, Hey, I've got these hidden use files if we want to put them on Aquarius. And of course, they said, Yeah, let's get them up there. Yeah. And then, you know, with you coming out last weekend, I and the listener should know you did not sleep. I mean, you got what, three hours of sleep a night. It was about three or four a night. Yeah, yeah. It was some it was about 4044, 45 hours of hardcore archiving over three days. So, yeah, putting up with me, and it was funny enough just let the listeners know. One day I was so tired, so I'm gonna go take a nap, and I woke up. It was like, one in the afternoon, and I was like, oh my god, Chris is here working, and I've been asleep. I run in here and find Chris. He's gone through all the boxes, and he's pretty much completed. Granted, granted, I don't I don't know if I would have had the spare time to coalesce the idea of, you know, a lot of these archives belong in a book. I don't know if I would have had time to coalesce or think about that idea. Had we been sitting there and cutting up and talking while I was scanning things and doing stuff as usual, you know, yeah, you did your best work while I was sleeping. So whenever I came out, you know, here you come with all these wonderful ideas, and just over the last two weeks, the amount of work that you put in and that we've been able to come together and bring to life, yeah, here we go the Hayden Hughes UFO Research Center, which we're launching now to make all of these files available to the public and some of the amazing technology you're going to be putting behind it. I just, I cannot wait. I am tickled pink. It is exciting. It is very exciting. And you know, when it, when it comes to things like this, Mindy as, as I've said numerous times on the show, research does not happen in a vacuum. It can't like, by definition, the whole reason for the birth of the Internet to begin with was for labs and researchers to be able to share data in real time, you know, right? So the idea that, yes, somewhere out there,

there are other vast troves of data and, and it doesn't matter if it's clipped newspaper articles because somebody was into it, if it's if it's collected pictures, you know, that were, that were purchased because there were, there were literally things, things within Hayden's archive where it was, like he had purchased them somewhere, like it was, it was a couple of negatives with the story and things like that. Like he had, he had clearly purchased these from a person, you know, who was like, Okay, I'll give you the negatives, you know, but it has the price written on there all kinds of things. It was pretty fascinating to see that, and even even to once again, see how an archive like that is collected and put together. You had probably about at the beginning, five or six bankers boxes full of stuff, you know, I think we, I think and, and just to get obsessive on it, we, we probably sat and watched, because I know I watched quite a bit while you were asleep, but we probably watched a conglomerate 3040, hours of footage on Heaven's Gate. It after a week, and you wonder why I might be a little sympathetic. Now, you know, maybe the 40 hours did something to me, Mindy, but, but quite literally, uh, that was a that was a huge thing, that that Hayden was largely into and and so deep into, I'm not going to say deep into it, because he wasn't like, he was involved, involved, but they came to him regularly, like, with updates, things like that. They came and talked to him. And he even said, like, they, they came to my office, and they just like, I turned around, and when I turned back around, seconds later, they were gone. There was no car, there was nothing like, they gave me a code to contact them, and after I used the code, I got a phone call, like, after I used the code. So, yeah, interesting. That even over. And that was one that, as opposed to a lot of cults that are pretty fast burn, you know, maybe a decade or something like that, Heaven's Gate went on for 20 something years,



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right throughout incarnation. There's



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actually an article on my website, on Mindy Todd fest, calm, and I'm sure we're going to be bringing some of that over to haydennews.com because a whole section of my website is dedicated to some of the stuff before we even got it digitized. Yeah, there it is. And, but under um, just so if you scroll down right there, it actually has an article on there that says that Hayden Hughes was almost convinced, yeah, right here, and it was written by Sean Castille. And I reached out to him, and he said, Sure, absolutely, put it on the website, but it talks about those different instances that you brought up. And then there was a third one where he had had one of his colleagues draw, draw three different types of commonly reported aliens, and the humanoid type of alien actually looked like Marshall Applewhite. So that was one of the main things that Hayden was like, This is what people are reporting. And I have this guy sitting in my office that says he's an alien. And, you know, are they telling the truth? There's the picture. Yeah, there it is, right. There. Similarity, yeah, and, and, you know, there's tons of stuff in there. I mean, I mean, of course, the International UFO Bureau is famously where President Jimmy Carter filed his UFO report, right? Well, and you know, as you were looking through some of the archives, Hayden was so good about reaching out to people. He wrote to people constantly. So whenever he heard about Jimmy Carter having a UFO sighting while on the campaign trail, he reached out to him. He sent him a note, and he said, Hey, would you mind filling out this UFO report form for me? And Jimmy Carter did and mailed it back to him, and so

the original one was filed with the International UFO bureau. Wow, wow. And, and, yeah, you know, once again, correspondence from Isaac Asimov and their correspondence from people like Wernher von Braun. Yeah,

that's this one right here. Yeah, yeah,

and, and, just an amazing volume of things. Let's, let's start getting into some of the cases that Hayden actually investigated real quick. Okay, which ones you want to start with? Let's, let's start with the I'm trying to remember the one that you were mentioning earlier. The first one we can go into Aurora? Well, let's go into Aurora for a minute, because that is one that we both went to during MUFON and of course, we've had Daniel Allen Jones on numerous times talking about Aurora, and he had teamed up Hayden had teamed up numerous times with Jim Mars from DFW. He was an investigative reporter, and he teamed up with him to go out and investigate Aurora numerous times. So yeah, that was back in the 70s. And Hayden's widow, Bonnie, was actually there for that. So she's, we have a living witness to what kind of transpired at the time, and in the files, there's actually archive of the analysis carried out on the well water and the soil around there. I don't know if those have ever been published, so it would be interesting to put that out and. Be able to compare it to any more recent samples that have been taken from that area, and of course, to back up some for your listeners that may not be familiar with Aurora. It was back in 1897 whenever an airship was said to have crashed into a windmill and the occupant was said to be not of this world. And they supposedly buried it there in the town cemetery. And when we went out there in July, you and I and Daniel and Melinda Leslie and others, they had actually moved this big rock that you see there in the picture. And they've put in like, four little headstones now, so I don't know what they're doing at the site, but we were checking it for radiation and whatnot and metal detecting and whatnot to see, you know what we could pick up in the area. Yeah, and it is been a long, storied case. And interestingly enough, you know that is one of the first UFO flaps in the United States. Was the summer of 1897 there was one that I was literally about to text Daniel about earlier that I didn't know if he was even aware of in Beaumont in 1897



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just just months before



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this happened. So, yeah, there was, there was a whole flap of airship sightings. And even even the idea of a UFO flap, the fact that, you know, there's a series of sightings that happens in an area that was, that was quite literally the case



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with the with the heartstorm

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flat right out in hearts, or, yeah, oh yeah. Well, hearts horn is, I mean, obviously it's continuing. People are still reporting things. The interesting thing about that there was actually the wife of the postmaster. Her name was Alex Claire Morgan, and she had seen the first UFO just like a day or two prior to the outbreak there in 1965 which was July 31 through August 2. And I believe hers was like on July, yeah, there we go. It was right there day or two before. So she actually saw the first one in Hartshorn. Well, she knew exactly what was going on. And so she started taking reports from people there in town and holding sky watches so people would sit around and watch. And they saw two, two types that they had called the Red blinkers. And then there was a silver one that they called the leader. And I mean, she had hundreds of reports that she had logged. And then Hayden, of course, went out there and really kind of teamed up, and she had started writing for his interplanetary intelligence report, supplying information about what was going on there in Hartford. And, you know, I went out there a couple of years ago with a reporter and spoke to witnesses that are still seeing things. And remember these sky watches and it really there's something weird about hearts horn, and I continue to be intrigued by it and look into it, but I think that it's fascinating that the entire 1965 flap really kicked off there in that small town, interesting. And, you know, once again, the idea that it was dependable enough that they could have, you know, sky watching parties for it. Yeah, we actually made contact with Alta Claire's granddaughter, and she still lives in the same old house. And so when we were out there, we had a sky watch with her, and she was so sweet. She had lawn chairs set up out there, just like they used to. And of course, had a couple of adult beverages for us. And it was just so nice sitting out there and just thinking, wow, this is what they were doing back in the 60s, you know, doing the same thing, watching the skies. And unfortunately, we didn't see anything that night, but it was just a neat experience to be there with the family and really, you know, taking it all in with the locals and their memories of Alta Claire and just everything that was transpiring back in the day. Yeah, now as an investigator yourself, how frequent is it that flaps like this occur where there are numerous sightings back to back, or sightings that occur over a span of time in an area? Yeah, you know, I've been with MUFON for about five, six years now, and. And I have not seen anything declared a flap within that time. So, I mean, there are few and far between where there's just multiple sides. I'd say probably the last quote, unquote flap would have been when the Chinese spy balloons were going over, if that's what you want to call them. But we knew, you know, something was going on during that time. And then, of course, you know, when Starlink was first started, everyone was seeing motherships and, you know, fleets coming through, yeah, so they would be false flaps that I've seen so far. So for something to still stand there was something going on, and I'm looking forward to the next one. Yeah, yeah. And, you know, there have been numerous cases over the last even, even decade, that have been massive, huge sightings, things like that. But when it comes to something like this, flat that happened there in Oklahoma, it is, it's on another scale. Well, the 65 flap actually took place across like seven states. I believe there was a airplane that was flying over Kansas that saw some of the objects. There was people at a Air Force Base over in New Mexico that were reporting the objects. Tinker, Air Force Base had caught several objects, excuse me, several objects on their radar. Um, at the time. So it was, it was across several states throughout those few days here in central US. Wow, wow. And you know, once again, to to know that this kind of stuff is out there. The Archives of it that he had covered this in real time, as it happened to begin with, and that these archives are out there. Is there anywhere else that this data exam? I mean, I'm sure that

there's copies of the interplanetary report kicking around somewhere at garage sales or in somebody else's private collection, you know, something like that. But do you know of anywhere else that all of this data has been gathered together in such a way on on this specific flap of sightings? I don't know. I think that as we see more and more archives getting actually digitized and put out there, we're going to be able to put a lot of this data together. Right now, there's so much lost knowledge that we've got to play catch up. I think that right now, we are learning new stuff, but we've forgotten the old, and that's data that we could be building on. So it's important that we do get all of these historic documents together so that it they're easily accessible to, I mean, just at the your fingertips. And that's, that's what I'm just become so passionate about I've got another archive that's going to be coming to me that I'm going to start working on after we finish up with the Hayden stuff. Awesome, but Hayden has just been incredible to be one to kick it off with. And like I said, it'll be added into project Aquarius there with move on, which also has the Leonard Stringfield files, Rupal files, and I forget the other one that's on there as well. And they have all the the Newspaper Archive of drawings gallery. They have all the old, yeah, there we go. Um, all the old. Move on. Journals are on there so it they have started building such a huge library of of all these historic reports and writings from really great researchers from back in the day, I just think that it's it's incredible that we're going to be able to build on Our understanding with what's coming to light now, you know, yeah, yeah. Because once again, it it takes data. It takes mass, mass, mass amounts of data to research something like this. And that is something that we have said on this show time and time again. We are just getting to the point where science is even even peeking its nose through the veil on some of these topics, much less, you know, fully investigating them. I mean, it took it, it quite literally, took relabeling UFO to UAP for NASA to go. You know, we have been woefully disregarding our duty as scientists by not investigating something simply because of a name. But well, and what's interesting, as you saw in the files, look how many things that we have from astronauts that wrote to Hayden about their belief in UFOs. And what's so. Funny is, there's actually one in there from Oh, Edgar Mitchell, yeah. And it was before he believed in you. At the time, he said, No, I don't believe it. Yeah, yeah. And even, even Wernher von Braun was like, No, you know, I don't, I don't know about this phenomena that you're talking about like most of this has been explained. And with that in mind, you know there, there were numerous things, like the Condon report, all kinds of stuff in in the history of UFO and government work and the military and government looking into UFOs, but project grudge was one that was really at the beginning of a lot of it, and to know that one of the things you had was an actual unredacted copy of project grudge, not just unredacted copy, but a copy with addendums pasted into it, and an actual reference like used as a desk reference for somebody at Wright Patterson Air Force Base, pretty, pretty impressive, and going through that, and Seeing that, knowing that, at least from our research, thus far, we we have not found a complete project, grudge document that has everything, much less pasted in redact, not redactions, but additions changes to make sure that things are up to date for the reference of it. And that's that's pretty incredible to come across one



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of the interesting things about Hayden. So to back up a little bit, to tell a little bit about Hayden, we started the international UFO Bureau when he was 14, and he had written to the premiere of Russia, Nikita crutchob, and was asking about photos of the Dark Side of the Moon. And surprisingly, he wrote back to him and some new pictures. So Hayden had the FBI come knock on his door, and his mother was like, you want to talk to my son? He's 14. What has he done? And they were, they went and talked to him about, you know, what did you receive from, you know, the Soviet Union, and that kind of really lit the fire in in Hayden. And in time, he ended

up making contact with Wright Patt, and they invited him to come out to the base. And he did. When he went out there, they showed him photos of different UFOs, and said, We know you've seen these. You have not seen these. And if you come across these, don't talk about these. And he said, Okay. And they sent him on a bus back to Oklahoma City, and there he was with his knowledge. So I believe that he continued his relationship with Wright Pat and somehow someone gave him this actual, you know, metal bound loose leaf copy of project grudge. And like you said, it has actual taped in addendums to it that as far we were looking, I don't think they've ever been released. So there's going to be some more new information of what the military was actually thinking that has never been released, but it's a lot of them are clarifiers, or linking different cases to other cases. In there just little notes that they that they wanted to put in with the individual case reports. So that'll be released to the public soon. And I mean, I think that Hayden continued that relationship, and then he went on to work with the Condon report, and we actually had some of the original UFO report forms from the Condon report, and they had different codes and whatnot if they thought something was promising or not. And we have those codes in there,



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I don't think that's not it. What is



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that? No, no, this is more a project grudge. This is just wow, look at but yeah, the Condon report had those different codes and stuff that they used to see if they thought something was a promising case to actually use. So he he really kind of flew under the radar. He didn't make a huge name for himself. But, I mean, he held conferences here in Oklahoma City, and he went on radio shows and had his own radio show that had over a million listener. Person, but it most people don't know who he was, which is just incredible. Yeah, yeah. And once again, just a fascinating whenever you go through an archive like this, you really do get a fascinating snippet into the mind of somebody, into the way that somebody's mind works, into what cases they specifically found interesting. Prime example, once again, would be Marshall Applewhite. They he had volumes of data, volumes of data on on Heaven's Gate. So obviously coming to him well, and they kept coming to him, Yeah, Brad Steiger, and they actually, they ended up writing inside Heaven's Gate, which had a lot of the writings from Marshall Applewhite, and a lot of his beliefs, which we listened to hours and hours of which, it's interesting with me. Yeah, there we go inside Heaven's Gate. It's kind of hard to find now, but yeah, it really gives you a good look into the investigator side. And then what, what Marshall and his followers really believed? And I guess I'm the first release of the book, Marshall wasn't happy because the publishers had cut quite a bit of his gospel, and so they had him re release it with some more of the information from what he had written. So it just, it's interesting. I know you have a religious background. I have, you know, a religious background, being married to a pastor, and to kind of hear his take on things. He was the the son of a pastor as well.



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There he is with





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that's in the international UFO bureau with them, sitting with, I believe that's Brad Steiger, yeah, recording their interview there and, and that's just it. Like you said, with this religious background, it's it. It's fascinating to see the way that somebody really delved into this case and the idea of it because, um, once again, to to have an actual and one of the things that we transferred was an actual copy of the intake video the you know, Earth is Earth is recycling, you know, and to hear the words of Marshall Applewhite, to hear his teaching, to hear what he said, once again, it's, it's always been fascinating to me. Was something that happened during my lifetime, you know, when I was a young adult, shortly after I left the seminary, things like that. And, yeah, I don't know. I guess I, I always identified with that quote, true believer aspect. And, you know, when they first came out, they were going by him, which was human individual metamorphosis, yeah. And he talked about, you know, kind of transforming, as in, like a butterfly being in a cocoon, yeah. And then, of course, then they, they moved over to Heaven's Gate, where they talked about the level above human, and that's where they believe that they were going. Was that next level above human?



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Yeah, so, and it weaves



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in a lot of Christianity, absolutely, and a lot of new age beliefs, and some of the things really aren't that that far out there, and some of them we hear from, you know, different belief systems still today, just in different places. Yeah, he's kind of, you put it all together. And it was sad, you know, how it ended, but they truly believed in what they were doing,



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absolutely, absolutely. And a you know,



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even even to explore the concept of once again, how, how long the air quote cult lasted, which was a long time, long enough that once again ABC, or what it was, either ABC or CBS did a made for TV movie about them at one point, called, called the other two, you know, I believe that was the name of. It may be wrong, but yeah, like, they did a whole made for TV movie about tea and dough and and the teaching that they had about, yeah. So it's like it was fascinating enough that 1982 television caught a hold of it for a made for TV movie, you know. So it was a, it was apparently a fascinating doctrine and and something that they didn't. They. Didn't hide or squirrel away or anything like that. They didn't ask people to give them everything that they had upon entering. It was, it was pretty fascinating. And then just to, just to give a little bit here, here is a little bit of the intake video. Pretty





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bold in terms of religion, in terms of anybody's intelligent thinking, to most people who would consider themselves intelligent beings that say, oh, that's That's absurd. What's all this doomsday stuff? What's all this prophetic stuff? You know, intelligent human beings should realize that everything has their cycle. They have their season, they have their beginning, they have their end, they have cycles. We're not saying that planet Earth is coming to an end. We're saying that planet Earth is about to be refurbished, spaded under, and have another chance to serve as a garden for another human civilization.

Interesting, interesting stuff. Once again, to hear from Marshall Applewhite himself. And when, when, when we watched all of that, the predominant thing that I got, and this is, this is not about Marshall's teaching or anything like that. Remember, folks, this was 1997 this was the infancy, not, not the beginnings of the internet. All right? Because the internet began in, like, 1978 like, back in the day when you could, like, put your phone on a receiver for your computer and dial into a bulletin board system. All right, like 1982 things like that. The internet existed. That's how war games happened. All right, but the beginnings of the Internet as we know it, where it was an online shopping platform. It was where you went to get news, it was where you went to find things it was where you went for chat rooms and bulletin board systems and things like that. And the one thing that kept being echoed in all of these news reports from sociologists, from from experts, everything was these lonely people on the internet who have no friends other than on the internet. Marshall Applewhite and Heaven's Gate used the internet and their website to spread their message, to bring people in and people are no longer able. This was 1997 sociologists were saying people are not able to take the information on the internet and disseminate fact from fiction. This was, this was 1997 we were having the exact same problems with the internet that we are having now. Many you know, where, where, quite literally, if, if, if you post a picture and don't give proper data on it, you could convince anybody of what's in that picture, you know? So, yeah, it's, it was interesting to see that. Here we are, almost 30 years later, dealing with the technology, and we're having the exact same hurdle with the technology. We're having the exact same issue when it comes to this community, when it comes to and I'll play the video that I normally play at this point, that I recorded right here in my backyard. You know where it's like if I was to post this video anywhere on the internet with no, no information other than Hey, I recorded this flashing colored orb in my backyard last night, floating across the sky. You know, I could probably get a whole lot of responses from people about it. Now, if I give the data with that and explain how high it was, what time it was, everything else, you could probably figure out that that is the dog star Sirius, unfocused in a telescope with just the natural motion of the earth zoomed in through a telescope, being exaggerated as as motion moving pretty rapidly across the screen, but without data. We don't we don't have that you know if it's happening in a vacuum. If that information is happening in a vacuum, we don't get that. And it's very much the same way when it comes to how people process things on the internet, how people were drawn in to the message of Heaven's Gate, and people ask all the time, you know, like, how. How



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does a logical person?

How does a logical because, like, they made their money making websites for people. They were SEO masters, like before, SEO, as we know it exists, you know, like they were, they were great at that kind of stuff. So that's how they made their money. They were step forward in in the new world of the internet. So it's interesting to see that, and interesting to see that even investigation wise, things like that, we are still faced with the same hurdles right now. Right now, we still have the same information bias as a society, when we find information on the internet right now that we had in 1997 almost 30 years, I think it's worse now, because now we have AI, you know, and you see these photos, Wow, that's Incredible. You know, trying to differentiate between what's AI generated well, and it's not that great yet, but we're getting there. Because anytime that there's a picture a person, you know, they have seven fingers, two mouths, or they're conjoined or something, but it's gonna get to where it's indistinguishable from reality. And, I mean, it's darn good already. Oh yeah, yeah, there was a whole show that we watched that we had an archive that was talking about the the usage of the Internet to put these, this information out there and and just the different belief systems, if people were able to catch on and look how many cults and different belief systems are out there. Now, yeah, but it's one of those things where the more you learn, the more you realize you don't know. Because some things that when I first started in investigating UFO encounters, I thought that's kind of silly, but then you hear it over and over and over again from different experiencers, and you're like, Well, maybe it's not that silly. You know, I would never discount someone completely, but there's some things that you just have personal bias, and you think, well, that's not likely, and you have to maintain some semblance of, you know, straight thinking. So, yes, yes. And I've said, I know you have had your experience, not only with nd, but with the divine. I have had mine with the Divine and with shadow people, things like that. I will, I will never discount anybody's experience. However, there, there was a situation recently where I heard an experiencer start talking about their experience, and then start expanding on their experience and how they they had contact with, you know, 15 different species. And these, these things happen to them about 1520, nights a month, you know, things I and I'm not doubting anybody, but immediately to me, that's not red flags, that's flares in the sky, you know, like, hey, wait a minute, there's, there's a person on social media who I don't see post much anymore, but they used to post pretty regularly out of San Antonio, like I see these in my backyard, like, three, four nights a week, you know? And it's at that point, why aren't you selling tickets? Yep, because it's no longer, you know, unidentifiable, I would say, I wouldn't say it's an anomaly at that point, it's a pretty known quantitative if you can, just like, hop out three, four nights a week and take pictures of them or take video in your backyard, that is, that is no longer anomalous. That's a that's a regular occurrence, you know. And you have to consider that. You have to be willing to consider that research wise, you know. Unfortunately, you do. You do have to let that be a possibility, even though it may be. And that's something that research wise, you have to be ready for, you know, I think that's why it's so important with, like, what I do with director of training with MUFON, yeah, just to make sure that our investigators can rule out what's able to be ruled out, we have such technology now. It within an hour or two, you can do a full workup and check everything that we're able to check within the night sky. Now this isn't going to include military things, you know, but regular aircraft and meteors and placements of the stars and planets and every we can check all of those things. And. And rule out, you know, satellites that are going over. And if, if there is someone that's having a regular occurrence like that, normally it is satellites that are being misidentified. And if we're able to pinpoint that, then we can show them. Hey, next time, pull up this app and look and see if that's lining up with what you're seeing. And so we're able to cut down on the false positives and really get it down to the real unexplained sightings. And that's been pretty I used to get

pretty upset with Project Blue Book, how they would, you know, explain everything away, until I became a researcher and an investigator, yeah, and I started realizing, okay, a lot of these really are misidentifications, and I can understand where the frustration is, because there there is something going on that we cannot explain, but A lot of things are explainable, and we have to really be open minded to those that we can't explain. But within reason, yeah, yeah, precisely, you know that is that is actively a lot of the effort that we have at curious research is the idea of being able to bring this kind of research to science, and what we have to be willing to do is it's say, Okay, what what we have is data. We need to start looking as at it all as data, until we get to a point that we can call that data evidence. You know, because evidence should be held to a different standard evidence. Evidence should be, as we say on the show regularly, something that exonerates you in a court of law, like you should have that kind of confidence when you say we have evidence, you know. And again, when the moo bond side, I know your book that you just put out is wonderful for people to go out and be able to document what what they're seeing on move on side, we're putting a book push towards getting out in the field and collecting the evidence. Yeah, there you go, your field observation and encounter log. And that's the thing, though, is that it it starts with observation like that is the beginning of the site. As soon as you have seen something, you are now the scientist, like your observation begins the scientific process, people. So it does. That's what the intake of the report, and then people like me or other field investigators, we can go out and collect this evidence, send it off to our lab and get hard science behind it that actually helps prove the phenomena. And with the hard science, when people say, Oh, I saw this. I saw that. Well, let's put that to the scientific test. Let's run the analysis on it and see if we can back that up. And that's where we're gonna, you know, really start making some good breakthroughs

well. And you know, that is also



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where things inside of red circles start being explained sometimes Mindy, and that can be hurtful to people. You know, that can be hurtful to a paradigm of somebody's belief. And I get that. I understand that, but we have to remember that just because the picture or the video that we took, or the audio that recording that we have ends up being explained, does not mean that we have not contributed to the science of the cause. The Science of the cause is is once again, honing things down to the point of unexplained, honing it down to the point of phenomenon that that three to five percentile range. So the more data that we have of known quantitatives, the faster that happens for the rest of them. So just because what you brought to the table has been explained in the realm of known quantitative, that only expands the realm of known quantitative so you still added to the scientific data set hugely well. And Case in point would be the starlinks. I go back to that because when they were first being launched, we had so many different reports. Some people saw another ship. It was a long, oval one, one, big, solid bar light. Some people saw a fleet and they saw dot.dot.in, the sky. Some people said, I saw one light go over a minute later, another one went over in the same direction. So you're getting all these different reports, but it's from the same source. And then. And Falcon nine started launching and returning to the launch pad. Then we had the separation of the first and second stage, and we had the spirals that the squids

Oklahoma. Yeah. So my phone was lit up that night with all these fantastic I'm like, Oh my gosh, is this another mass sighting? But took an hour or two to start looking through what's going on here. And it was, it was the launch of that first Falcon nine with the separation stage, and it created that spiral. So we have all these different explanations for one single phenomenon, and we wouldn't have understood that if we didn't have the the observations from all of the witnesses reporting to be able to understand this is all part of the same thing, and it's all explainable. Yeah, so it does it. It all contributes to our understanding, and I hope people really take that to heart well, and it's important. And with that comes the importance and the onus upon people like yourself, Mindy, who have possession of archives like this to digitize them, to get them digitized, to make sure that the research, because the the metric research done by someone like a Hayden Hughes, the metric research done by somebody like a Jim Mars, is just vast. It's vast you and it is irreplaceable, irreplaceable when it comes to hypothesis theorem, when it comes to the the case files that they have, and even the even the marriage of those case files with things like MUFON, where, once again, as as MUFON says all the Time, if it happened 30 years ago, let us know your your report of your event 30 years ago. Our guest in the next segment, Doctor, Doctor,

and I believe he is doctor also, if I'm not mistaken, but Archbishop James cloud, he he reported his incident from when he was a early child, like 910, years old, I believe just this last year and a half, two years to move on, you know, but your report 20 years later may confirm three other reports that were given 20 years ago, the night of or the night after. You know, it's funny, my mother, with me growing up, my mom, was never into UFOs or anything like that, but she had always told me that her and my aunt had seen a UFO hovering at treetop level right outside of my grandmother's house. By definition, you've got to have a ride or die research buddy, something you know, like you and Chris, you're such a godsend. You really are with your knowledge and IT capabilities and being able to connect with people like myself that have these kind of resources here, that just that, that partnership, we would not be able to put it out to the public on the scale we are, we are going towards without you. So thank you so much. I mean, really from the bottom of my heart. You know, I just adore you, and I hope that people will really look at reaching out to you if they have archives similar, even if they're small, archives. All of this data that we can put together for researchers to add to our collective knowledge of this phenomena. It all helps, absolutely, and that's why, you know, I was more than happy to help out with Project Aquarius, with things like this, to to be able to get this information called together and brought together and under under roofs where it's accessible to people where it's no longer hidden away in a basement, that kind of stuff. You know, somebody was asking me not too long ago, why? How? How does stuff like this just vanish? And it's like, you know, because it doesn't mean the same thing to everybody. It's, it's like, how did, how did dad's, you know, half million dollar baseball card collection vanish? Because when he died, mom was like, Oh, my God, I can finally get rid of these things. Ah, and she doesn't care about him. She doesn't know what they are. They're just baseball cards. Man, like, yeah, yeah. I, at one point, I'm sure, had tons of toys that whenever I left, my mom just up, nope, you know, things like that. So, yeah, it happens rapidly. And we as humanity lose that knowledge rapidly if it's not shared, if it's not kept around, you know. So the idea of archiving these bringing these archives together, putting them together. It's it's fantastic. It's great. So I love what you guys at move on are doing with Project Aquarius, and when you asked if I would help with the Hayden Hughes archive, I could not resist. So thank you for the opportunity. It's been great, and I can't do great, great things with it. It's amazing. It's fantastic research, and it's going to be great to be able to share it with the world. So where do these really begin in biblical tradition? Archbishop, where do these, I guess apocalyptic doctrines start from in the Bible? Well, you have it starts really in the Old Testament, from the books of Daniel and Ezekiel. You got the Gog Magog war prophesied to happen near the end. You have the psalm 83 war, which could be happening currently in the Middle East. You have, of course, the book of Revelation. You also have Second Thessalonians, First Corinthians. That speaks about at the time of the end, what the temperature shall we say of people will be like, you know, unloving, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy, etc, etc. That pretty much marks the current world as when you when you look at that passage of scripture. I mean, it's right there. Then of course, you have in Revelation, you know, John the Apostle saw all of that that was to happen. You got a choice there well, and it's, I think it's very important to note at that point, also Archbishop, the fact that it is, it is a perceived socialism. It is a deception upon humanity. It's not A, not an actual socialism that's there for the betterment of mankind, that that gets taken advantage of by by the other side, by the by the Antichrist. It's set up for the Antichrist like from the get go, it's, it's not something that's like, ah, you know, let's do this for the best of humanity. And then it gets corrupted. It is of corruption. You got swallowed by a whale and spit up on our shores to come tell us a message. All right, man, get out of here, you know. And that's what tends to happen to the prophets of old is, is when you read their stories, they were ignored most of the time. Their warnings were not heeded. But once again, they were warnings. They it wasn't just a sooth saying of doom. It was, Hey man, fix him in your ways, or else this will occur and be incurred. Yep, and Revelation is no different. You know, we have the free will to either accept the plan of salvation, because, you know, God is saying these events are going to happen regardless of what we want or anything else. So you have the choice you can either accept Christ as a savior, or you can accept him as judge, and at the end, you know, we have that free will. Choice we can in the Bible guarantees we're going to escape God's judgment. If we're aligned with Christ, that's you could go to the bank on that one. That's a foundational promise that we're given in the scriptures to keep us out from the time of trial, to keep us from now that could get into ideas of the rapture or whatnot. And there's a load of you know, you. Opinions on that too, but that is the escape route, because God's already set in motion a lot of these things, and we don't have the time to play around much anymore. That's the thing. But I think a lot of churches today, they're playing around. They're playing church. They're not being the church. You know, they're like, even when I was a parish priest, and I would warn people about what was coming, you know, to get their lives right and to Hey, you got go to confession, go do what you need to do to get your life right, because it's coming. I was called schizophrenic. I was called mentally ill. I was even usurped in my parish. Oh, wow, and the Anglican Church. I was

the priest of at the time the vestry, which is the voting board, took the entire church out from under me and my bishop, and went with another jurisdiction, just so that they could do their own thing. Also make money, you know, because I, I'm, I was always about, let's live for Christ, you know, let's, focus on the scriptures. Let's see what the Bible say. Be a good Berean, you know, you are looking at the scriptures and divining rightly with the Holy Spirit, and they wanted nothing of it. I mean, we've had more than one conversation there. There are some things that I fully disagree on, but I'm perfectly willing to have the conversation about it, you know, because, because we've got to be willing to have the conversation about it. We've got to be willing to have the conversation. Sadly, folks, about the End of Time and about the fact of you know, whether or not I still practice Catholicism a couple few days a week within the bounds of a church, doesn't mean that I don't follow the modicum of Tempest fugue memento mori from the Knights of Columbus and the idea of time flies. And once Jerusalem has three, I think it's three quarters of Jerusalem is destroyed. That's when Christ comes back, sets his foot on the Mount of Olives and a great Earth. That was one thing that the UN did say recently on a news article, the UN wants to have a global digital currency, like Security Council, so that the g20 nations can oversee a global digital currency, and they all can work on one central bank, digital currency, basically One Ring to rule them all. Here's their website. The loosest trust is dedicated to the establishment of a new and better way of life for everyone in the world based on the fulfillment of the divine plan for humanity, its educational activities promote recognition and practice of the spiritual principles and values upon which a stable and independent world society may be based. The esoteric philosophy of its founder, Alice Bailey, informs its activities, which are offered freely throughout the world in eight languages. Now, once you start digging into things and start seeing things you start seeing messages about like the confusion of Lucifer, things like that. And it's, it's really interesting to see where they start going into Lucifer, the light bearer and and that kind of stuff. Very, very much the same thing that's talked about in in the works of, mainly, P Hall, things like that. You know which of which is, of course, a lot of the reasons why the Catholic Church has always said, like, you can't be a Catholic and be a Mason, because, well, they're talking about the Luciferian knowledge system and the idea of Lucifer the light bearer, and, you know, things like that. So, but that is, that is the loosest trust. And it's interesting to see that, once again, here is this religious organization that has the support of the UN as a means by which to get, get a global spirituality going. Yeah, and, and ultimately, it'll be the deification of man, the apotheosis of man. That's, that's the ultimate thing that will start. I mean, you already see that. You know, man is basically God. Man is the Master and Commander of their own destiny, and they don't need a divine figure to give them any form of meaning or. Anything else. Well, why do you think atheism, even agnosticism, to a degree evolution, all of these other things show and point to a natural progression of of human, I mean, and you look at the post human, the post humanism, things that are taken off right now. What is his name? Noah. He's second in command of the World Economic Forum. I know, but I can't that's okay. Name is, but Noah Harari, I think is his name. And he totally lambasts God, Christ, religion. And he says, man is God Yuval. Nora Yuval, yeah, his middle of all. Nora Harari, yeah, yeah. And you you take a look at some of his books and the interviews he's given, and that man is the spitting image of what the Antichrist will be saying. And I don't know if he is, I'm not saying he is by any means, but his mentality and his words, that's backed up the World Economic Forum and by the UN is exactly what blasphemies that the Bible talks about when it talks about the man of Sin, exalting himself above all other gods, because it's really about man becoming God. And in post humanism, you're talking about cyborgs, AI implantations, you're talking about enhancements to the to the human body, and especially in the especially once you get it and you know, we've we've definitely had Grace Scott on the show. He's a futurist. We've had Zoltan Istvan on the show before, back in the dudes and beer days, talking about just the world of transhumanism. What you're talking about the coming singularity, the idea that eventually there will be no barrier between humanity and machine, and it will go beyond arm implants, things like that. That's what we're doing right now. Don't get me wrong, but the idea that wetware will soon exist things beyond the idea of just the neural implant for for seizures and that kind of stuff, even even the technology that's been seen with MIT coming out of that where they did a recent study with a bunch of people that had the the cerebral implant in the back of their head for control of seizures, and decided to study the way that their brain was able to work and what

kind of information they could pull from that. So while under an MRI and receiving data from this, they had them listen to a Pink Floyd song, and then two weeks later, had each person in the study come back, go back into the MRI, and this time, they hit record, and had them think about the Pink Floyd song, and they were able to reconstruct it. Wow, from these people's individual thoughts, they were able to reconstruct



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the actual song, and it sounds creepy as hell. Oh, it's



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wild. It's wild. But even, even just the fact of this was something that they were repeatedly able to do, that is that is a new realm of technology for brain computer interface, clearly, and I've heard, heard of studies that they've been doing. I'm not sure if it was MIT or someone else, but to able, being able to influence the mood and thought patterns through, uh, interface, like a chip. And, you know, I've always wondered why. When the Bible says, once you take the mark of the beast and your right hand or forehead, it you're damned. There's, there's no more, no more chance of salvation after that. Well, if your mind is being manipulated by an implant, you're not going to even care. I heard scientists, brain scientists, say one time on an interview that they were actually able to knock out through an implant a person's connection with God, so that they didn't care about God, or think about God, anything like that. Now I'm not sure where that was, because I heard the scientists Yap. About, and he was all proud. And isn't this wonderful? And I'm just thinking, wow, if that's not part of the mark of the beast, I don't know what is. And that's really interesting. I mean, we talk a lot about we talk a lot about targeting technologies, things like that, on this show, and just the idea that, yes, you could absolutely use an implant, you could absolutely use a regular message, something like that, to break somebody's connection to the divine, to to, I mean, the there's a great study that we've been showing a lot on the show that actually came out during covid from the National Institute of Health, showing that even negative news cycles actively cause bruising damage to the hippocampus, which is, which is The soft, velvety glove that protects your amygdala, the little almond shaped part of your brain that is, that is the reticent reptilian brain, the home of fight or flight panic mechanisms you know that kept us alive for millennia. So when you damage that gentle hippocampus, you you're basically leaving somebody exposed to fight or flight mechanism all the time, and the idea that even a negative news cycle can beat up the hippocampus so much that it leaves you in that state, so that in and of itself is a means of control, that in and of itself is a means of breaking down that barrier and even bringing some people to the point of disbelief in the Divine, the fact that there ain't no god out there, look at the horrible things happening in the world. Yeah, and that doesn't shock me at all, that they would look at that, because I from from just a control perspective, a fearful population is more controllable because they can offer a solution that that population might not have considered before, but now everyone's So scared and nervous and anxious about what's going on now. Oh, they have the solution to this. It'll, it'll solve a bunch of stuff, you know, the immigrants, the world economic issues, the, you know, identity fraud and identity theft and all this is it's terrible. And as they push, push, push, push, people are like, yeah, Give me. Give me that chip so I can be more secure. I need. I feel insecure right now. Give me something to make me feel more comfortable and safe, even though they're signing away their rights to freedom. And it is interesting to Yes, I think, and I've said it for years on the previous show and on this one, we

are rife for this as a people right now in America, we are so entirely divided. We are so entirely upheaved with not only our own communities, our own families, but ourselves, our beliefs, our core beliefs, as individuals, as people. And you add that two years of lockdown and panic stricken modes and everything else to that it doesn't help things. It doesn't help things and when? When, yes, when you start seeing things folks like red heifer ceremonies getting ready to start happening. You know, here it is from Al Jazeera. What are Texas red heifers have to do with Al acasa or Al Aqsa and a Jewish Temple, the idea that, yeah, there is a quote, red heifer ceremony that is supposed to take place, according to Jewish tradition, before these things happen, before these things occur. So when you start seeing things like that in the news, and you may you may be of religious fervor. You may be of deep seated religious belief. You marry that headline with with all these other things and with the panic and yeah, it can be hard not to think that rapture is directly around the corner, father. It can be hard not to believe that. Yeah. The interesting thing is, Hamas said they did the October 7 attack to actually thwart the red heifers being sacrificed. They actually came out with a news article on that you could probably search that I will, I will admitted it. Yeah, because it the Israel was getting ready to do the red heifer sacrifice. I think it was going to be in April, around Passover or whatnot. And so Hamas jumped the attack plan by Hezbollah and Iran and went in by themselves, because they wanted to stop the red heifer sacrifice. So even the Muslims believe heavily in the red heifer sacrifice. Wow. So yes, that's another angle that a person can look at this with. Well, and you know another one of those quote from Matthew signs of the time. You know that is, that is quite literally the the theme for this episode is, is the signs of the time as as we talk about in the Bible. So when, when you get into that, and when you start looking at the actual things that are there, you know, the Great Tribulation, beginning of calamities, things like that, like once again, it's it. I could see how numerous times over, um, and I've been pretty fascinated for years, and getting ready to do a couple of episodes on various cults, not only in America, but across the globe. You know, Moonies, things like that. And
