But in March 2023, my book right here, my little my baby, after they came. This is my this is my life. I have a son, a daughter, a dog, and this book is my fourth child. In fact, it's on it's on audio book. Chris, it just came in on audio on Amazon. Please tell all your people it's on Amazon to help a poor, struggling. Beverly Hills, publicist, that's right. There it is. Audio Book, \$0 with membership. Yeah, I'm gonna make a lot of money. Clearly, you on the audio book. \$0 I'm cleaning up there, huh? Now I can retire to

okay, there you go. It took me a year and four months to record like it better not be free. It better not be free. My book came out March 23 I met Steven Bassett. Now the story behind the book is just the reason I'm here tonight, and I'll do this really quickly, because I've done this so many times. But in March 1970 when I was 13 years old, my father picked me up one day from school in suburban New Jersey. So he drove me home from school. Daytime, a huge UFO craft, silver V, like the letter V, like a victor, hovered above my father's car. Daytime, my father's driving me home. Three o'clock in the afternoon. I looked through the windshield. I said, Dad, stop the car. There's a UFO above us. Stop the car. We got out. We looked up, Chris, there's this enormous, unbelievable, you know, eighth wonder of the world, V. It's just this enormous silver V. It's hanging above my father's car for no apparent reason. And I'm now, I'm 13, and I'm jumping up, Dad, look, Dad, it's Star Trek. Dad, it's Star Trek because you and I would be like, Oh my God, my father looked at it. My father was bored to tears. He couldn't care less. He looked at this thing like I had a cabbage at the supermarket. No interest. Okay, I forgot about that. And I did this story with you before the summary. You know, I forgot that that happened for 47 years, which is probably the most amazing part of the whole story is I forgot that that happened for 47 years. So 47 years later, 2017 my father passed away in Florida. He had a bad death. He died. I get the call. I'm here in LA. Couple days after he died, I went to a local deli here in LA to get a pastrami sandwich and to mourn my father, and as I'm sitting at the restaurant, a beam of light, or a beam of energy, hit me in the head hard, and then through my eyes projected. And I've told you the story, and it's true. Steve Bassett said, Dan, that's the most amazing story I've ever heard. Steve Bassett told me that to my face. It played the whole movie from 47 years earlier, home movie of the 1970 UFO sighting played in the air as a color 3d hologram with audio. I'm now watching in 2017 I'm watching me, my father, my father's car, and if silver V from 1970 and it's playing in a deli when I'm waiting for my sandwich, right? So that was just, I still can't believe it. Every time I think about it, I'm like, how, why? What? Who? What, what? Now after that, I heard in my ear, right after the it played for 2030, seconds, and then it dissipated, and then it was, get a pen. I heard my hand wrote. My hand did automatic writing. My hand wrote. Write a book about benevolent aliens, lead characters. Father knew about UFOs, ATC, all capital. So that's then everything stopped. That was supernatural. I held this piece of paper, yeah, and I'm like, ATC, ATC aliens. What could that be? I came up with after they came and I ate my sandwich, I drove home. Okay, I had to write a book. Now, here's what's very interesting, and some of this I may have told you last time, but I don't remember. I go home, Chris. I called my mother. My mother was my father's first wife. Now, my father worked for the US Army for 45 years. My father was a physicist and electronics engineer at Fort Monmouth army base in New Jersey. Top secret we knew he worked on radar and missiles. That's all we ever knew. We never had any specifics about what my father really did for a living. Nobody even knew, including my mother. So I called my mother right after my father died, I said, Did dad ever talk about UFOs? She said, in the early 60s, they took your father deep into the Vault at Fort Monmouth base. They showed him something above top secret. He came home, he was very upset that night. He was pale and shaking and nervous, my mother said, and she said to him, Honey, what's wrong? My father said to my mother, I saw something today in the vault at the base. It's above top secret I could never tell you or anyone as long as I live. Wow. My father walks down the hall. My mother said, your father was never the same after that day. Okay, now that's part of the story. Now, after that, I have this. I have my little props here. Okay, okay. After that, I go through my scrapbooks after my father died in 2017 I went through my scrapbooks to look at pictures of my dad. I found this in one of my scrapbooks, Chris, this is a profile of my father at his workplace from 1985 Oh, wow. My my father invented laser driven drones for the army. Proof, I have this right here. See my hand. My father invented drones with lasers for the US Army in 1975 he tested the first one ever at White Sands Missile Range, October 75 it's right here. Okay, my father invented drones. Okay, nobody knew that, so that's pretty cool, right? Now, the story continues. You. Uh, as I'm writing this book, thinking

about my father, I happened to be reading Richard Dolan's famous book, UFOs in the national security state. In the back of this book is a glossary of UFO sightings above US military bases in 1951 and 1952 right when my father started working at Fort Monmouth, there were famous UFO sightings above Fort Monmouth on radar. My father worked in the radar branch. He had to have known about it. Had to absolutely had to have known about it. Yeah, okay. Now moving on. I just read this book a month ago.

Where my dad worked, see, this is the US Army's house of magic. So where my dad worked was, like, it was like the geniuses of American scientists. Yeah, we're creating FM. Think about just alone. FM radio. Just alone. FM radio, how about that? Okay, yeah. Okay, so that's that next part of the story is in 2023 Steven Greer did a press conference on TV from the Washington press club, yep. And he showed a chart of 150 US military bases that he has proof of through his whistleblower network that worked on recovered reverse engineering of recovered et craft. Okay, so I'm watching this on my TV. We all have a big TV. I freeze framed this slide. It was a slide of 150 us basis. So Chris, I freeze framed it. I got up on my TV with my finger, and I went number 51 Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. Yeah, just to According to Stephen Greer, he has proof, proof that they worked on it. Okay, and now, here's the last here's little cherry. I just read this book, Joe McCarthy, Fort Monmouth in the deep state. Someone just told me about I read it this summer. This book, long story short, Joe McCarthy uncovered in one of his army hearings the fact that where my father worked fort, Monmouth radar division was involved with Project Blue Book first and only time it was ever revealed this in here when I saw hackers, I'm like, That's it. That's it. So my father knew about UFOs. Wow, that's good. And when he looked at that craft when I was 13, and he looked at it bored to tears, that's why now, when I had that home movie, it was three days after he died. Here's what I truly believe. In my heart. I believe that my father went to heaven and sent me that home movie from heaven, from the other side to say, to say, Danny, remember the UFO we saw 47 years ago. I knew about that. I was involved with that. That was part of that research I could never tell you or anyone because of my NDAs. I'm dead now. I have no more NDAs to protect. That's right, my father sent that to me from heaven, okay? All of that comes together, and then I write my book after they came. Was born. It was given, I think it was a gift given to me from my father, beautiful. Okay, and the book is about two benevolent aliens. It's sci fi inspired by true events. They come to earth to save mankind. They save the life of this drowning lead character page one. He's drowning his 70th birthday. Hates his life. He's suicidal. Is killing himself in the Pacific. This huge craft comes out of the Pacific be beams him up, saves his life, travels across la deposits him at Dodger Stadium, live in front of the world's press corps and the army and the military and ambulances and fire trucks, everything's there. And these two beautiful aliens, seven foot tall, Pleiadian, male and female. They come down, gorgeous people of Earth. Don't be afraid. We're here. We love you. Everything's cool. We've come to save mankind. We have a relationship with this guy. They beamed down, this guy who just was drowning. We saved his life. Bring him your problems. He is our Ambassador to mankind, and

we will work through him to use our technology for peace and good. They leave this shmucky guys on the ground, and now he's the most famous man, right? Because he's on live Global TV. Because once, once a through line for anything, it doesn't matter if it's a comedic through line, like, hey, if it's a buddy cop comedy, like, that's a 10 year through line. Like every studio is on it. Everybody's making a version of it, things like that, you know. And when you're talking aliens like that, that his road crests and troughs, you know, from the time, and there was a huge lull between, almost, almost between et and fire in the sky, as far as like major alien movies that really made money and had any kind of impact like that. But even then, it's interesting to see the way that those movies are portraying the alien contact experience and and the way that alien contact would be handled

absolutely right. Okay, so, yeah, this was a pivot. Exactly was the pivot. So when my book came out, it was March 2023 I went to a number of UFO conventions. One of them was UFO con in San Francisco. I met Steve Bassett there, march 2023 I gave him my book. We became friends, we exchanged phone numbers, and he lives in Washington. I'm in LA. And I said, Are you ever in LA? He goes quite often. So then two months later, at the end of March 2023, he came to LA. Let's have lunch. We had a very long lunch in Hollywood. He told me his life story. I told him my life story. We were. I knew who he was, but we were stranger. And at the end, Chris, he looks at me, he goes, Dan, you're a Hollywood guy. I'm a disclosure guy. What can we do together? Literally, said those words. I looked up at the ceiling, and I said, Steven, we're going to create the Hollywood disclosure lines. And I shook hands with him, and he said, That's it. That's exactly right. Now neither of us knew what it was, man, we didn't know what it was. It

was literally three words. That's all we have. Four days later that year, was contact in the desert, 2023 Steven invited me there. I was his guest. He introduced me to Richard Dolan and Nick Pope and George norri and Ron Janus and Ron James and Paul Heineck and Katie pace and everybody you could think of. And we were telling everyone we're going to create the Hollywood disclosure lines. The first person, literally, that we told Chris, was George Norie. He put his hand on my shoulder. I'd never met him before. He goes, Danny, I want to be your first member. I go, George, you're the first member. Nick Pope was the second member. George Richard Dolan, I think was the third so you know. So at the end of that contact Chris, we had three words. Hollywood disclosure has three words, and we had every major UFO researcher in the world. We had no logo, no website, no mission statement, no business plan. We had nothing. That's all we had. Summer, Fall, 2023 Steven and I met countless times. What is it? What is it? What can it be? What is it? What we don't know what it is. Steven came up with. It's a networking group, a networking group by which we blend together two disparate, historically disparate groups, UAP et experiencers, researchers and disclosure advocates with Hollywood. And the word Hollywood means the entertainment industry, okay, but Hollywood is a sexier word with Hollywood, writers, producers, directors, performers, podcasters, radio show hosts, content creators. Okay. Now with Steve's years, 30 years in disclosure, and my 40 years in Hollywood, we literally and there you go. There you can see some of our affiliates. We cut and pasted together our friends, our peers, our colleagues, our clients, people we know and love. Might my daughter create? The logo and the website, my daughter's there's Anjali right there. That pink one, that's my daughter's logo, right? She created the uhca logo and the website, and we put together all our people together. We launched. We only launched officially in November 2023 we are less than two years old. Today. We have 225 members. You know you are one of the members. Yep, we have members all over the world. Half again are on the UAP, let's call them experience or researcher side. The other are on the content creation side. And we have a live event every quarter in LA, if we had money, I would do them all over the country. But we don't have money. We are a 501, c3, if anyone's listening wants to make a donation, absolutely go there and donate. If anyone out there wants to become a corporate sponsor, contact me and then you will instantly become my new best friend. We need a corporate sponsor. There's so much I want to do with this group. We need, we need a hero with 50 grand. I mean, really, to be honest, I want to do an annual Holly HDA Media Awards Banquet event in Hollywood. And yeah, you know, best, best portrayal of ufology and feature films, documentaries, books, TV shows, Lifetime Achievement Award. Of course, Steven Spielberg would get the first Yeah. I mean, right, and I can reach I can reach these. I don't, I met Steven once, but, I mean, I can reach them, yeah, I have the means by which I can reach these people. So we have a live chat room. That's really where a lot of activity takes place. People talk in there. If a documentarian is saying, Hey, I'm doing a new project on people who have had contact with Pleiadians. Well, I have a good friend named Mark. He lives in the Bay Area. He's been contacted by Pleiadians for 60 years, and they have helped him along his whole life path. Or if a documentarian says, I'm making a film about women who've been abducted and given birth to hybrid children, okay, I know three women in the HDA, right off the cuff, who have had that terrible experience. It's we have an agent on our board of directors. His name is Sean West. He goes Dan the HTA is the ultimate UFO casting call resource. If you have a film, feature film, a TV show or a documentary, and you need any one ufology, you go there and you're going to find five, six people that are gonna have either interest or experience or knowledge about about the subject that you are pursuing.
